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ANNUAL REPORT ON CURRENT BENEFIT YEARS UNDER THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT - 1944

The basic material for this report was supplied to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by the Unemployment Insurance Commission through the Treasury Offices. Daily reports, monthly reports and annual reports on benefit years established, benefit years terminated and benefit days paid are supplied to the Bureau of Statistics.

PART I - THE INSURED POPULATION :

No definite figure can be given regarding the number of insured persons on a given date, because of the many interpretations given to the term "insured person" for various purposes. Some who hold an insurance book may never contribute sufficiently within any two-year period to meet the minimum requirements for the receipt of benefit. Others who do not hold a current book may have made sufficient contributions in the past to qualify for benefit. The minimum contribution credits required are : 180 days within the two years immediately preceding the date of the claim and in the case of the second and subsequent initial claims, 60 days contributions since the commencement of the immediately preceding benefit year.

For purposes of the present report the insured population may be taken as those to whom insurance books for the year 1944-45 were issued up to May 31, 1944. Since at least 180 days contributions within the preceding two years are necessary to establish a benefit year, those who entered insurable employment after June 1, 1944 could not qualify during the period covered by this report. Tables A, B and C classify those to whom insurance books were issued during April 1944 by occupation, sex and province; industry, sex and age group; and industry, sex and province. These three tables cover 2,209,850 persons (1,447,530 males and 762,320 females). The total number of insurance books issued during April and May was 2,278,195. Tables 7-14 of Part II classify the persons who established benefit years in 1944 and the benefit days paid to them by sex, age, industry, occupation and province, the categories used being identical with those used for the insured population in Tables A, B and C.

PART II - BENEFIT YEARS :

A benefit year is established when an insured person, upon becoming unemployed, makes application in the prescribed manner and it is proved that at least 180 days contributions have been made in his behalf while working in insurable employment during the two years immediately preceding the date of his claim. In the case of a second or subsequent benefit year it must also be proved that at least 60 days contributions have been made in his behalf while working in insurable employment since the establishment of his immediately preceding benefit year. The daily rate of benefit and number of benefit days authorized are computed at the time the benefit year is established. The benefit rate is determined by the average rate of the employee's contribution during the preceding two years and the duration is determined by the number of days contributed during the preceding five years and the number of days benefit drawn during the preceding three years.

The establishing of a benefit year does not necessarily mean that the insured person concerned draws benefit. It means, merely, that he considers himself to be unemployed, applies for benefit, has satisfied the minimum contribution requirements and that his benefit rights as at that time have been established. The circumstances of each individual case determine eligibility for benefit payments.

An insured person may, for example, be deemed to be employed if, having separated from his major employment, he yet earns more than an average of one dollar a day in some subsidiary employment. Certain days, though unemployment is proven, are declared to be non-compensable. These include the first nine days of proven unemployment in a benefit year (called "waiting days"), the first day of unemployment in any claim week which does not immediately follow or form part of a full week of unemployment, statutory holidays, etc.

Then, the Unemployment Insurance Act is designed, on the whole, to provide compensation in cases of involuntary unemployment for those covered, while restricting or eliminating compensation in cases of voluntary unemployment. Thus, if it is shown that a claimant voluntarily left his employment without just cause, was discharged because of his own misconduct, refused an offer of suitable employment, did not avail himself of an opportunity to work, etc., he may be disqualified for receiving benefit for a period not to exceed six weeks.

In addition, the claimant's circumstances must indicate that he is normally attached to the insured working force. To some extent the minimum contribution requirements constitute proof of recent working experience. Other factors enter, however, and the Act prescribes that benefit cannot be paid to a person who is : not capable of and not available for work, an inmate of an institution wholly or partly supported out of public funds, not residing in Canada (with some exceptions), under sixteen years of age, etc.

The above is given merely by way of illustration and should not be construed as an exhaustive survey of the statutory regulations concerning eligibility for benefit.

In 1944 for example, although 67,515 benefit years were established by 68,954 persons and although a total of 87,663 persons held benefit years currently available (some of which were established in 1945) only 52,950 actually drew benefit. Some persons did not draw benefit because they were re-employed before the expiration of the nine "waiting days", others because they were considered not entitled to benefit on account of the circumstances of the case.

Tables 1 to 17, comprising Part II of this report, set forth, in detail, data respecting benefit years established in 1944, benefit years currently available in that year, some personal characteristics of the persons involved, benefit days paid and benefit years terminated.

Table 1 is a summary statement indicating the extent to which the benefit rights available in 1944 were utilized. It will be noted that of 8,642,643 benefit days available only 1,815,070 (or 21%) were drawn. In 1945 this percentage was 22 and in 1942 it was 24. Thus, the benefits available for those who applied for them, were in general, more than ample to meet the need during 1944.

Table 2 is also a summary statement classifying the benefit years established and total benefit days authorized in 1944 by province and the persons involved by sex and province. A total of 378 persons established two benefit years during the calendar year and one female established three.

In Table 3 the 87,663 persons with current benefit years available in 1944 (this includes those whose only current benefit year available in 1944 carried over from 1943), the persons who drew benefit, the benefit days paid and amount of benefit paid, are classified by sex and province.

The amount of benefit paid as given in Table 3 is not exactly the amount paid out of the Unemployment Insurance Fund in that year. The precise total of benefit payments during the calendar year 1944 was \$3,265,708 (or 96.3% of the \$3,590,010 shown in Table 3). This difference is unavoidable if the amount of benefit paid is to be shown by sex and province as a comparable figure to the number of beneficiaries and number of benefit days paid. Each punch card representing a benefit year contains the daily rate of benefit authorized and the number of days paid. The daily rate as originally established appears on the card although the rate may change during the lifetime of the benefit year because of a change in dependency status. These cards are sorted by daily rate of benefit for each sex and province and a total of days paid at each daily rate is obtained. The amount of benefit paid is then estimated by multiplying the total of days paid at each daily rate by that daily rate. This is the only method available for securing the amount of benefit paid by sex and province.

Table 4 classifies the persons with current benefit years available and the benefit days paid to them by dependency status, sex and province. Under the Unemployment Insurance Act, claimants with one or more dependents are paid at a higher rate than those with no dependents. The dependency status of these persons as at the time the benefit year was established is recorded. If a person

established more than one benefit year during the calendar year, for purposes of this report, his status is taken as at the time he established his first benefit year during the calendar year. Persons whose only benefit year available in 1944 was carried over from 1943 are classified according to their status at the time that benefit year was established. Since a person's dependency status is subject to change over a period of time, it is felt that results obtained by this method portray the situation as accurately as it can be presented under the circumstances.

In Table 5 persons with benefit years current in 1944 are classified according to the number of days' benefit paid in that year and the benefit days paid in each category are given by province. Of the 64,172 males, 24,651 (or 38.4%) drew no benefit, while the largest single class drew from 5-9 days and the second largest from 1-4 days. Thus, 34,581 males (or 53.5%) drew either no benefit or less than 10 days. This may be compared with the 52% of males who drew no benefit in 1943 and the 65% who drew either no benefit or less than 10 days. The females follow a similar pattern with 10,062 (or 42.8%) drawing no days and 15,211 (or 56.2%) drawing either no benefit or less than 10 days in 1944, compared with 46% who drew no benefit and 61% who drew either no benefit or less than 10 days in 1943.

Table 6 distributes the persons who drew benefit in 1944 and the benefit days paid to them by daily rate of benefit and dependency status. Under the terms of the Unemployment Insurance Act, a claimant's daily rate of benefit is determined by the daily average contribution made in his behalf during the two years immediately preceding the date of his claim and on whether or not he has a dependent within the meaning of the Act. Insured persons contribute either 1.5, 2.0, 2.5, 3.0, 3.5, 4.0, 5.0 or 6.0 cents a day while employed in insurable employment, depending upon the amount of their earnings (see the second schedule of the Act). As the individual's earnings change beyond the class limits prescribed, his daily contribution changes, so the daily average for the two years need not coincide with any one of the schedule rates. The daily rate of benefit is calculated by multiplying the daily average contribution during the preceding two years by 40 if the claimant has a dependent or by 54 if he has no dependent. It will be seen that 9,518 (or 43%) of the 22,197 males with a dependent, drew benefit at the top rate of \$2.40 a day and 19,847 males (or 89% of those with a dependent who drew benefit) were paid at the rate of \$2.00 a day or more. This indicates average weekly earnings of \$26.00 or more per week during the preceding two years for the 43% paid at \$2.40 a day and average earnings of \$20.00 or more per week for the 89% paid \$2.00 a day or more. Similarly, the males without dependents are concentrated in the higher classes of daily rates, 7,405 of them (or 43%) being paid from \$2.00 to \$2.04 (the maximum for those without dependents) while 12,908 (or 75%) received \$1.70 or more a day, indicating average weekly earnings of \$20.00 or more.

The females are distributed in a different pattern with respect to daily rate of benefit. This is due in part to the much smaller proportion of females having a dependent (4.7%) as compared with males (56.2%). The largest single group of females with dependents appears in the class paid from \$2.30 to \$2.39 a day but the largest group without dependents is found in the class paid from \$1.50 to \$1.59 a day, indicating average earnings of about \$15.00 a week. Among females without dependents 4,762 (or 35.8%) were paid \$1.70 a day or more, indicating average earnings of \$20.00 a week or more. Thus the different distribution of females with respect to daily rate of benefit is also due to the generally lower earnings of females.

Tables 7-14 include only those who established benefit years during the calendar year 1944 and the benefit days paid on those benefit years. In Tables 7 and 8 the persons who established benefit years and the benefit days paid are classified by age group, sex and province. Table 8 shows the age composition of the insured population for Canada by sex. Insured males over 55 number 252,060 (or 16% of the male insured population), yet they established 15,136 benefit years (or 27% of the male total) and were paid 425,145 benefit days (or 59% of the male total). The experience of 1944, in common with previous years, would indicate, then, that males in the older age groups are not only more likely to become unemployed than are those in the middle and younger ages but they tend to be unemployed for longer periods.

The female insured population has a different age composition, its numbers being mainly concentrated in the ages under 30. The age group 20 to 24 contains both the largest number of benefit years established and the highest percentage of insured females establishing benefit years. Yet in this class the percentage establishing benefit years was only 3.4. As with males, however, the average

number of days paid per benefit year increases with age, the averages ranging from 14.2 days for those under 20 to 45.7 days for those 65 and over.

In Tables 9-12 the benefit years established in 1944 and the benefit days paid on them are classified by industry and age, and industry and province, by sex. The categories used in these tables are the same as those in Tables B and C for the insured population.

Tables 13 and 14 classify benefit years established in 1944 and the benefit days paid on them by occupation and province, by sex, in the same categories used for the insured population in Table A.

Tables 15-17 are concerned with benefit years terminated during the calendar year 1944. In Table 15, total benefit years terminated and those terminated by exhaustion of rights are classified by age and sex. A benefit year can be terminated by exhaustion, lapsing, death or other reason. Exhaustion means that the benefit rights authorized have been entirely spent. If, however, the authorized rights have not been exhausted the benefit year automatically terminates (lapses) twelve months after the day on which it was established. Death, permanent disability or any permanent removal of the person concerned from the working force will automatically terminate a benefit year.

Table 16 presents a cross-classification of the number of days authorized by the number of days paid for benefit years terminated in 1944. This indicates the extent to which the benefit rights available were used at the time of termination.

Table 17 classifies benefit years terminated during 1944 and the days paid on them by daily rate of benefit, sex and dependency status. This table can be compared with Table 6 which presents the same data for all who drew benefit in 1944.
