

ANNUAL REPORT ON CURRENT BENEFIT YEARS UNDER THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT - 1945

The basic material for this report was supplied to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by the Unemployment Insurance Commission, through the Treasury Offices.

PART I - THE INSURED POPULATION :

It is impossible to provide a specific figure for the number of insured persons at a given time that will satisfy all requirements. For some purposes it is useful to know the number of insurance books issued in a certain year. For other purposes the number of persons who have fulfilled the minimum contribution requirements necessary to establish benefit rights under the Act would be appropriate. Again, the number of persons employed in insurable employment at a given time may be used.

The last is the concept used in this report. The insured population, as presented here in Tables A, B and C, consists of those for whom insurance books and contribution cards were renewed in April 1945 and those to whom a new insurance book was issued for the first time in that month. This is substantially the population from which those who established benefit years in 1945 could have been drawn. A minimum of 180 days' contribution in the past two years is required to establish benefit rights. Therefore, those who entered insurable employment for the first time after June 1, 1945 could not qualify during that calendar year. Those who renewed their books after June 1st, are obviously engaged in insurable employment for only a portion of the year. As at May 31, 1945, the total of insurance books and cards issued in that insurance year was 2,237,277. Tables A, B and C, of this report, include 2,198,840 persons (1,444,450 males and 754,410 females) who are classified by sex, age, industry and province, and by sex, occupation and province. In Tables 11 to 16 of Part II, persons establishing benefit years and the benefit days paid to them in 1945 are classified in the same categories as used for the insured population.

PART II - BENEFIT YEARS :

A benefit year is established under the Unemployment Insurance Act, when an insured person, upon becoming unemployed, makes application in the prescribed manner and it is proved that at least 180 days' contribution has been made on his behalf during the two years immediately preceding the date of his claim. In addition, a second or subsequent benefit year for a person requires that at least 60 of these contributory days be recorded since the commencement of his immediately preceding benefit year. (Effective October 1, 1946 the Act was amended and, as a result, two additional statutory conditions must be fulfilled. This does not, however, concern the benefit years recorded in the present report). The establishing of a benefit year is merely a device whereby a person's right to benefit and the amount of his entitlement can be determined at any time. The duration of benefit authorized is determined by the number of days contributed in the preceding five years and the number of days benefit drawn in the preceding three years. The daily rate of benefit authorized is determined by the daily average contribution made on behalf of the claimant during the preceding two years.

The fact that a benefit year has been established does not necessarily mean that the insured person concerned draws benefit. It only indicates that he considers himself to be unemployed, has applied for benefit in the prescribed manner and that his contribution history fulfills the minimum requirements of the law. A benefit ledger card is then set up for him in the Treasury Office (to record his entitlement and the payments made) and it is from the initial claim form and these benefit ledger cards that the basic data used in preparing this report are derived.

The benefit authorized can then be drawn upon during one or a number of spells of unemployment until either the rights are exhausted or twelve months have elapsed since the benefit year was established, whichever occurs first. The circumstances surrounding each individual separation from employment must be investigated in order to determine whether or not benefit is payable in the case.

Generally speaking, the Unemployment Insurance Act is designed to provide benefit during a spell of involuntary unemployment suffered by a person who is normally attached to the insured working force. To be considered unemployed within the meaning of the Act, an individual must either have separated from his previous employment or have been put on short time. If he has separated, he may still be deemed to be employed during any period for which he received an amount substantially equivalent to his normal earnings in the form of dismissal pay or payment in lieu of notice. Again, he may be considered employed if, having separated from his major employment, he yet earns more than an average of one dollar a day in some subsidiary employment.

Certain days of proven unemployment are rendered non-compensable through special provisions of the Act. For example, the first nine days of unemployment in any benefit year are not compensated ("waiting days") nor is the first day of unemployment in any claim week unless it forms part of or immediately follows a full claim week of unemployment.

Unemployment may be considered voluntary if the claimant voluntarily left his employment without just cause; if he was discharged because of his own misconduct; if he refused an offer of suitable employment or neglected to avail himself of an opportunity to work. In such cases as these the claimant is subject to disqualification for a period not to exceed six weeks. In other words, to be eligible for benefit the claimant must make a statutory declaration that he is "capable of and available for work but unable to find suitable employment". Thus, days of illness, voluntary vacation, etc., could not be compensated on the basis that the person was not capable of employment or not available for employment.

Normal attachment to the insured working force is indicated by the individual's past contribution history and his circumstances at the time. Thus, the provisions requiring at least 180 days' contribution during the past two years, at least 60 of which must have been recorded since the establishment of the immediately preceding benefit year. The factors mentioned above regarding capability and availability for work are also pertinent here. In addition, there are provisions that benefit cannot be paid to a person who is : an inmate of an institution wholly or partly supported out of public funds, not residing in Canada (with some exceptions), under sixteen years of age, etc.

The above survey of conditions surrounding the payment of benefit is given merely by way of illustration and should not be construed as exhaustive.

During 1945 there were 224,205 benefit years established, 270,415 benefit years available (some, established in 1944, were still available for part of 1945) but only 181,428 persons actually drew benefit. The others either were reemployed before the expiration of the nine waiting days or were considered not entitled to benefit at the time because of the circumstances of the case.

Tables 1 to 19, comprising Part II of this report, set forth in some detail data respecting benefit years established in 1945, benefit years currently available in that year, the personal characteristics of the persons involved, benefits paid and benefit years terminated in 1945.

Tables 1 to 4 are summary statements derived from the more detailed analyses that follow. In Table 1, for example, the benefit days available in 1945 are compared with benefit days paid. Of a total of 45,521,951 days available only 8,375,138 (or 19 per cent) were used. It would appear, therefore, that the benefit rights available in 1945 were more than sufficient, on the whole, to meet the requirements for them. Table 2 summarizes the number of benefit years established during 1945, total benefit days authorized and number of persons who established benefit years, by province. The 224,205 benefit years established in 1945 were

established by 225,286 persons, 919 of whom established two benefit years during that calendar year. In Table 3, the persons with current benefit years, persons who drew benefit, benefit days paid and amount of benefit paid are classified by sex and province. The benefit days paid and amount of benefit paid as presented here exceed by about 1,000,000 days and \$2,000,000 the total of the twelve months in 1945 already published in the Monthly Statistical Report on the Operation of the Unemployment Insurance Act. This discrepancy arises because of a difference in the time period for which reports are received. To obtain a monthly figure on about the last working day of each month, the Treasury has, until recently, followed the practice of closing the books on the 20th of each month. Thus, the amount of benefit paid as recorded in December 1944 was actually the amount paid from November 21st to December 20th, 1944 and so on. Ordinarily this would have no appreciable effect on an annual total, but the great difference between benefit payments in December 1944 and January 1945 compared with December 1945 and January 1946 makes a very significant difference. These amounts were : December 1944, \$337,220, January 1945, \$546,569; December 1945, \$3,450,853 and January 1946, \$4,495,252.

The amount of benefit paid as presented in this report is obtained from the number of days paid (as taken from the benefit ledger card at the end of the calendar year) and the daily rate of benefit (as obtained when the benefit year was established from the computation section of the initial claim form) both of which are punched on the punch card prepared for each benefit year established. There will always, therefore, be a slight difference between the amount obtained in this way and the amounts published monthly, due to changes in daily rate of benefit arising from changes in the claimant's dependency status during the life of the benefit year. This difference should not, however, exceed 5% since many of the changes are compensatory.

In Table 4 the persons with current benefit years and the benefit days paid to them during 1945 are classified by dependency status, sex and province. A claimant with one or more dependents is paid a higher rate of benefit than is one with no dependent. The dependency status of each claimant is recorded here as at the time his benefit year was established. Since a person's status with regard to dependents is subject to change over time it is felt that this method yields as accurate results as could be obtained by any alternative method. Those who established more than one benefit year during the calendar year are classified as at the time the first benefit year was established.

Persons with benefit years current and the benefit days paid to them during the calendar year 1945 are classified by number of days benefit paid, sex and province in Tables 5 and 6. In the case of both males and females the largest single group drew no benefit, i.e. 66,559 of the 200,096 males (33.2%) and 22,446 of the 70,817 females (31.9%) fall into this category. The second largest group of each sex drew from five to nine days, while the third largest group of males were paid from fifteen to nineteen days and the third largest group of females from one to four days. In all, 91,582 males (or 45.8%) and 29,482 females (or 41.9%) drew either no benefit or less than ten days. This can be compared with 38.4% of males who drew no benefit in 1944 and 52% who drew no benefit in 1945 while the percentages of males who drew either no benefit or less than ten days were 65 and 58.6 respectively in 1945 and 1944. In 1945 and 1944, 46% and 42.8%, respectively, of females drew no benefit, while 61% and 56.2%, respectively, drew either no benefit or less than ten days.

In Tables 7 and 8 persons to whom benefit was paid and the benefit days paid to them in 1945 are classified by daily rate of benefit, dependency status, sex and province. The daily rate of benefit payable to a claimant is determined by the daily average contribution made on his behalf during the two years immediately preceding the date of his claim. Those with a dependent are entitled to 40 times and those with no dependent to 34 times the daily average contribution. The insured person contributes either 1.5, 2.0, 2.5, 3.0, 3.5, 4.0, 5.0 or 6.0 cents for each day he is employed in insurable employment, the amount being determined by the rate of his earnings (see the second schedule of the Act as amended in September 1945). Since an individual's earnings may fluctuate during the period, the daily average contribution need not correspond with any one of the schedule rates. Thus the maximum daily rate of benefit for those having a dependent is \$2.40 and for those with no dependent \$2.04.

Of the 85,289 male beneficiaries having a dependent, 44,051 (51.6%) drew benefit at the top rate of \$2.40 a day, while 30,435 (34.3%) were paid benefit at the rate of \$2.00 a day or more. This indicates average weekly earnings of \$26.00 or more during the two years immediately preceding the date of the claim for those paid at \$2.40 and average weekly earnings in the same period of \$20.00 or more for those paid \$2.00 or more a day. The males with no dependent are slightly less concentrated in the higher classes of daily benefit rates, 25,134 (47.9%) being paid from \$2.00 - \$2.09 a day (the maximum for those without dependents being \$2.04 a day) while 37,811 (78.3%) received \$1.70 a day or more, indicating average weekly earnings of \$20.00 or more.

The proportion of female beneficiaries claiming a dependent is much lower (10.4%) than of male (65.9%). Partly for this reason females as a whole are distributed in lower daily rates of benefit than males, but in addition this distribution of females indicates their generally lower earnings. Thus, only 424 females with a dependent (8.6%) were paid \$2.40 a day while the largest single group of females having dependents received \$2.00 to \$2.09 a day, indicating average weekly earnings of \$20.00 to \$25.99. The largest group of females without dependents drew \$2.00 to \$2.09 a day, the second largest from \$1.90 to \$1.99 a day, while almost the same number drew from \$1.70 to \$1.79. Thus, 14.7% of female beneficiaries without dependents had average weekly earnings of \$26.00 or more in the preceding two years, 47.9% had average weekly earnings of \$20.00 or more and 85.5% had average weekly earnings of \$15.00 or more.

Tables 9-16 include only those who established benefit years during 1945 and the benefit days paid on those benefit years in that calendar year. The persons who established benefit years and the benefit days paid to them are classified in Tables 9 and 10 by age group, sex and province. In Table B, the age composition of the insured population is presented, by sex. Insured males 55 years of age and over constitute 16.9% of the male insured for whom ages are given but they established 25.2% of the benefit years set up by males and drew 33.8% of the benefit days paid to males. These data, then, confirm those from other sources indicating that males in the older ages are somewhat more likely to become unemployed than are younger males and when out of work find it more difficult to obtain other employment.

The age composition of the female insured population is quite different from that of the male, insured females being mainly concentrated in the age groups under 30. There is no clear pattern of differences in the unemployment experience of women in various age groups during 1945. Thus, although the average benefit days paid to males ranged from 21 days for those under 20 to 54 days for those 65 and over, the average days paid to females shows a surprising consistency by age. In the age groups above 30 the range is from 42 to 47 days while in the groups under 30 the range is from 28 to 39 days. For all males, average days paid are 30, and for all females, 39.

In Tables 11 and 12 persons establishing benefit years in 1945 and the days paid to them are classified by industry, age group and sex paralleling Table B for the insured population.

Persons who established benefit years and the days paid to them are classified by industry, province and sex in Tables 13 and 14 in the same categories used for the insured population in Table C.

Tables 15 and 16 classify the persons who established benefit years and the benefit days paid to them by occupation, sex and province in a manner comparable with the insured population in Table A.

Tables 17 to 19 are concerned with benefit years terminated during the calendar year 1945. The benefit years terminated are classified, in Table 17, by days benefit authorized, benefit days paid and sex. This table indicates the extent to which the benefit rights available were used at the time of termination. A benefit year can be terminated by exhaustion, lapsing, death or other reason. Exhaustion means that the benefit days available have all been paid. If, however, the rights available have not been used up within twelve months of the date on which the benefit year was established, it automatically lapses. Death, permanent disability or other permanent removal of the person from the working force terminates the benefit year.

In Table 18, benefit years terminated during 1945 are classified by daily rate of benefit, number of benefit days paid, sex and dependency status. The total benefit years terminated in 1945 and those terminated by exhaustion of rights are classified, in Table 19, by age group and sex.
