# EIGHTEENTH

## ANNUAL REPORT ON BENEFIT PERIODS ESTABLISHED AND TERMINATED UNDER THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT

Calendar Year, 1959

This is the final statistical report dealing with benefit periods established and terminated during the calendar year 1959 for regular benefit and in the interval from December 1, 1958 to May 16, 1959 for seasonal benefit. The data are based upon tabulations of claimant forms supplied by the Unemployment Insurance Commission.

The material is arranged in accordance with the subject matter covered. The summary tables following the charts show the year's highlights in a comparative statement covering a five year period along with percentage distributions of persons covered and of claimants establishing benefit and average duration of significant groups of claimants. The detailed tables are concerned first with persons covered by insurance, then with claimants establishing and terminating regular benefit, and finally with claimants establishing and terminating seasonal benefit.

The report answers such questions as the following: How many males are covered by insurance,

how many females? What is the age distribution of all workers covered? What is the distribution of the insured by province, by industry, by occupation? How many of those covered are married women? Who establishes regular or seasonal benefit? What is the distribution by sex, province, marital status, dependency position, age, industry and occupation, weekly rate authorized, duration authorized and paid? What proportion of claimants establish more than one regular benefit period in a year? How long is benefit authorized on the average? How many exhaust all their benefit rights in a benefit period? How do males and females compare in this respect? How do weeks of benefit paid differ on the average for each province, age group, industrial group, for males and females? Do claimants collect the maximum number of benefit cheques possible? How do weeks authorized compare with weeks paid? If the claimants in Ontario are ranked by benefit paid, what proportion of the total benefit paid in the province goes to the top 10 per cent of claimants?

### The Insured Population

#### Insurable Employment

All persons employed in Canada in wage earning employment under a contract of service were insurable in 1959 unless specifically excepted. Exceptions broadly included those working in agriculture; hunting and trapping; private domestic service; teaching; medical, nursing, technical and domestic staff in hospitals or charitable institutions not carried on for gain, unless insured under arrangements with the institution; private duty nursing; members of the armed forces; police forces, unless insured under arrangements with the municipalities and provinces; permanent employees with the federal government or a municipal authority except in municipal public utilities; employment in provincial public service, unless insured under arrangements with the individual provinces; persons paid by commission, such as insurance, real estate and securities salesmen; workers paid on other than hourly, daily or piece rates and earning more than \$4,800 (changed to \$5,460 on September 27th) a year, unless election is made to continue insurance. There is no age limit or means test applied for unemployment insurance.

Coverage was extended to any person engaged in commercial fishing on April 1, 1957 notwithstanding that such a person may not be an employee. The "employer", responsible for making contributions on the fisherman's behalf and for keeping records is the actual employer, if he is not a member of the crew; the buyer, if the actual employer is a member of the crew and he or one of the crew sells the catch to the buyer on a face-to-face basis in Canada; and, otherwise, the actual employer or head fisherman or agent acting for the fishermen.

This brief summary of insurance coverage is intended as an aid to those using the tables in this report and should not be considered exhaustive. Reference should be made to the Unemployment Insurance Act 1955 and the regulations passed by Order-in-Council under the authority of that statute for an authoritative statement of coverage. Additional information regarding changes taking place over the year is published in the monthly Statistical Report on the Operation of the Unemployment Insurance Act and the Annual Report of the Unemployment Insurance Commission.

**Tables 1 to 5**

The data on the persons covered in Tables 1 to 5 are obtained from returns in connection with the renewal of insurance books and contribution cards at June 1st together with new entrants in June. Included in the figures are those who were employed in insurable employment and whose books or cards were therefore renewed through employers, as well as those on claim whose books were renewed at their first visit to a local office after June 1st. As indicated in the headnote to the tables, the data are based upon a 10 p.c. sample of returns (consisting of those with insurance numbers ending in 4) and therefore the smaller numbers are subject to a relatively large sampling variation.

Data on the insured population provide a base to which the figures on benefit periods established and terminated can be related. Table 1 which distributes persons by sex, age and industry is comparable with Table 25 for regular benefit periods terminated. Similarly, Table 2 may be compared with Tables 12 and 24; Table 3 with Tables 14 and 23; Table 4 with Tables 6, 19 and 36; while Table 5 is related to Tables 9, 20, and 37. However, the incidence of benefit periods or benefit weeks paid determined from these tables should be used with caution. The occupations and industries recorded in Tables 1 to 3 are those in which insured persons were engaged at June 1st, whereas those indicated in Tables 12, 14, 23, 24, 25, 34 and 40 relate to the last job held by each claimant at the time of his claim. Thus, each must be taken as approximating the "usual" employment characteristic of the group covered and it cannot be assumed that a claimant's past contributions (on which his benefit rate and duration depend) were paid while engaged in the last job recorded. Nevertheless, comparison of provincial, occupational, industrial, marital status and age distributions of the insured when compared with those of persons establishing benefit periods and of benefit weeks paid show significant concentrations connected with known shifts in employment.

Table 1 distributes the insured by sex, age and industry. Teenagers accounted for 7.9 p.c.; those 20 to 24 years, 15.6 p.c.; those 25 to 44 years, 48.7 p.c.; those 45 to 64 years, 24.7 p.c.; and those over 64 years, some 3.1 p.c. Factory workers comprised 35.8 p.c. of all insured. While women made up 27.8 p.c. of all insured, they accounted for higher proportions of younger insured and lower proportions of older insured persons. The proportion of insured

employed who were women varied greatly from one industry to another, from a high of 71.1 p.c. in the clothing industry to a low of 1.2 p.c. in fishing, hunting and trapping. Factory employment accounted for 35.8 p.c. of all insured, and 50.6 p.c. of those 25 to 44 years but only 2.1 p.c. of those over 65 years.

Table 2 groups the insured by sex, province and industry. The Atlantic region accounted for 8.5 p.c.; Quebec for 28.1 p.c.; Ontario for 40.2 p.c.; the Prairies for 13.6 p.c.; and British Columbia for 9.6 p.c. Women formed 27.8 p.c. of the insured nationally but varied provincially from 29.9 p.c. in Ontario to 14.3 p.c. in Newfoundland. Factory workers varied in importance provincially from 43.8 p.c. in Quebec to 13.2 p.c. in Saskatchewan.

Table 3 is concerned with the occupational attachment of the insured by sex and province. Managerial and professional workers comprised 3.8 p.c. of the insured; clerical and sales workers; i.e. clerical, commercial and financial occupations, 27.1 p.c.; unskilled and service workers, 25.3 p.c.; and others, skilled and semi-skilled workers, 43.8 p.c. The proportion of insured who were women varied from a high of 64.4 p.c. for clerical to a low of 0.1 p.c. for electric light and power workers. Manufacturing and mechanical occupations accounted for 21.4 p.c. of the insured (23.1 p.c. of men and 17.0 p.c. of women) nationally but as much as 24.8 p.c. in Quebec and 24.1 p.c. in Ontario to as little as 10.1 p.c. in Prince Edward Island.

Table 4 shows the marital status of the insured by sex and province. Married women comprised 14.3 p.c. of the insured nationally, but varied by province from a high of 16.9 p.c. in Ontario to a low of 5.2 p.c. in Newfoundland, and 49.0 p.c. of the female insured.

Table 5 provides the age composition of the insured by sex and province. The proportion of teenagers in the insured population varied from 10.5 p.c. in Prince Edward Island to 5.9 p.c. in British Columbia; the proportion of those 20 to 24 years from 19.1 p.c. in Saskatchewan to 13.5 p.c. in British Columbia; the proportion of those 25 to 44 years from 51.0 p.c. in Alberta to 41.5 p.c. in Prince Edward Island; the proportion of those 45 to 64 years from 28.7 p.c. in Nova Scotia to 22.4 p.c. in Alberta; and the proportion over 64 years from 5.0 p.c. in Prince Edward Island to 2.1 p.c. in Newfoundland.

**Regular Benefit Periods Established and Terminated****Qualifying Conditions**

Tables 6 to 15 are concerned with regular benefit periods established in 1959 and Tables 16 to 28 with regular benefit periods terminated in 1959 (whether established in 1958 or 1959). A regular benefit period is a period of 52 weeks starting with, and including, the week in which it is established. It runs for 52 weeks from the date of its establish-

ment unless termination comes earlier by exhaustion of the amount of benefit authorized. Tables based on benefit periods established indicate the volume of claims from insured persons with some recent attachment to insured employment who are entitled to unemployment compensation and provide information on the personal characteristics of such claimants. The tables based on benefit periods terminated provide figures on benefit paid as well as the

number of cases so that the total number of weeks paid and weeks paid per entitled claimant can be secured for any significant group.

To establish a regular benefit period in 1959 a claimant had to satisfy these conditions when his initial claim was made:

1. He must have made at least 30 weekly contributions in two years preceding the date of claim;
2. He must have made 8 of these since the start of his last preceding **regular** benefit period or within the year preceding the date of claim, whichever was the **shorter** period;
3. He must have made 24 of the 30 since the beginning of the last preceding benefit period, either **regular or seasonal**, or in the year preceding the date of claim, whichever was the **longer** period.

These qualifying periods could be prolonged up to four years by spells of sickness, non-insurable employment, self-employment, stoppage of work owing to a labour dispute, or (after September 27th) time spent under sentence in a prison.

Having established his right to insurance benefit, a claimant is usually entitled to receive payment for any week during which he finds he is unemployed, but he is disqualified for every day for which he fails to prove he is (a) capable of work, subject to an exception for illness; (b) available for work, subject to an exception for illness; and (c) unable to obtain suitable employment. Benefit can be paid during spells of incapacity due to illness,

injury or quarantine, if he was entitled to receive benefit at the time this occurred and if it was not because of the incapacity that he stopped working. It is considered that a woman during an interval, generally six weeks, prior to and following childbirth is not available for work. As to "suitable employment", a claimant should be offered a job in his usual occupation if a vacancy exists. He should then be offered any other job which is available after a reasonable interval. If he refuses an offer of any employment, disqualification for benefit depends on whether there was a stoppage of work or a labour dispute at his plant; if the employment offered was in his usual occupation, whether the rate of earnings was lower or conditions were less favourable than those prevailing; if before a reasonable interval has elapsed, or after, and the employment was in other than his usual occupation, whether the rate of earnings was lower or conditions less favourable than those prevailing; and whether acceptance would affect the claimant's rights to membership in, or to refrain from membership in, an association of workers.

#### Rate and Duration

The rate of benefit authorized to the claimant who had made the required premiums; i.e. passed either the 30-weeks test and the 8-weeks test; or had passed the 30-8-24 weeks tests in the case of a subsequent benefit period, was based on the average of his most recent 30 weekly contributions in the 104 weeks preceding the starting date of his benefit period. The contribution and benefit classes are shown below.

The schedule of contribution rates was extended with the addition of two new higher classes by 1959 amendments to the Act so as to provide a more realistic benefit rate for employees in the upper earnings range in view of rises in wage levels, and with an increase in other classes to provide additional revenue to the Unemployment Insurance Fund. This revised schedule made no changes in the proportionate share of contributions paid by employees (5/12), employers (5/12), and Government (2/12).

Prior to September 27th, if a claimant had 30 weekly contributions amounting to \$17.40 his weekly benefit rate would be \$30 where he had a dependent, and \$23 if he had not; and, in addition, he could earn \$13 in casual, subsidiary or short-time earnings. With the amendments, he would require 30 weekly contributions of \$22.50 for benefit of \$30 (dependency) or \$23 (single), although he could earn, in addition, \$15 (dependency) or \$12 (single) in casual earnings. However, with more contributions it was possible to improve his position with the two new benefit classes.

Under the old 1940 Act, prior to its 1955 revision, when contributions and benefit were based on days instead of weeks, a claimant's rate of benefit was not so quickly affected by a drop in his earnings as was later the case. On the other hand, the revised benefit provisions allowed a claimant to requalify for a new benefit period more quickly when he was working less than the full working week. To minimize the effect of a reduction in earnings

and contributions, the 1959 amendments provided that where successive **regular** benefit periods occurred within two years, the rate of benefit during the new **regular** benefit period would not drop more than one class below the last **regular** benefit period in which benefit was paid.

The new schedule of allowable earnings has different values for claimants with and without dependents. The old schedule had the same values.

The benefit rate to which the claimant is entitled, i.e. single or dependency, is established at the beginning of each benefit period, but is subject to change during the currency of the benefit period. A claimant with a dependent is either (a) a man with a wife maintained wholly or mainly by him; or (b) a married woman with a husband dependent on her; or (c) a person who maintains wholly or mainly one or more children under 16 years; or (d) a person who maintains a self-contained domestic establishment and supports there a person connected by blood, marriage or adoption.

Prior to September 27th the Act specified **one** week of full benefit for every **two** contribution weeks in the last two years, with a maximum of 36 weeks and a minimum of 15 weeks generally. However, on a subsequent benefit period only contributions made since the start of the previous benefit period, or within the last year, whichever was the longer period, could be counted giving a minimum of 12 weeks.

Before the 1955 revision of the Act, the maximum duration of one benefit period was 52 weeks. In 1955 the maximum was reduced to 36 weeks. The 1959 amendment restored the maximum to 52 weeks. This increase in the maximum duration also applied to benefit periods in existence on September 27th, although established at an earlier date where the original duration was 36 weeks.

The maximum entitlement for a claimant under the 1955 Act prior to its amendment effected September 27, 1959 was \$828 (single) or \$1,080 (dependency), i.e. 36 weeks at \$23 or \$30. However, under Section 121 of this Act, during a transitional period of three years, any claimant who exhausted his benefit on his first claim from October 2, 1955 was entitled to any excess benefit which he would have received under the 1940 Act had it been in force. This applies only to claimants in this report who prior to October 2, 1958 established their first claim since October 2, 1955 and who drew all their authorized benefit. The maximum entitlement for a claimant under the 1959 amendments is, of course, \$1,404 (single) or \$1,872 (dependency).

Under the provisions regarding allowable earnings from part-time employment while on claim, a claimant with earnings over the prescribed amount will find his benefit cancelled or reduced to the extent of the excess.

#### **Benefit not Paid**

Benefit was not paid in 1959 in the following cases:

1. At the start of the benefit period for a waiting period equivalent to a week of full benefit. When one benefit period terminates and a claimant immediately requalifies for benefit, the waiting period could be waived if certain other conditions were met. The waiting period provision, like a deductible claim on an automobile or personal property insurance policy, saves expenses to the Fund by eliminating claims for very short periods of unemployment and the investigation of the genuineness of such short spells.
2. For a period not over six weeks: (a) if he lost his employment by his own industrial misconduct, or if he involuntarily left it without just cause; (b) if he had, without good cause, refused or failed to apply for suitable employment or failed to accept it, or neglected to avail himself of an opportunity for such employment; (c) if he had, without good cause, failed to attend an instruction or training course under certain circumstances, or failed to carry out a written direction given him by the Commission to assist him in finding suitable employment.
3. For any week in which he worked the full working week in the place where he was employed.
4. For any week in which the only unemployed days were Sunday, a recognized holiday of one day, the day before or the day after such holiday.

5. If he lost his employment by reason of a stoppage of work resulting from a labour dispute at the plant where he was employed, unless he proved he was not participating in, financing or directly interested in such labour dispute and did not belong to a grade or class of workers who were. This disqualification lasted for the duration of the stoppage of work.

6. If he failed to prove he was unemployed, capable of and available for work, and unable to obtain suitable employment. The claimant had to sign a written statement affirming this each week at the counter of the local office on U.I.C. Form 489 (Claimant's Weekly Report) or if reporting by mail on U.I.C. Form 497 (Postal Claimant's Report).
7. If he ceased work because of illness, injury or quarantine, he was disqualified for the duration of his incapacity or until he proved he was capable of doing some other kind of work.
8. While he was an inmate of a prison or institution supported wholly or partly out of public funds, and while he was a resident out of Canada.

Benefit was reduced by earnings while on claim such as (a) wages for part-time work; (b) holiday pay, including payments through vacation stamps; (c) money received at or after separation in consideration of returning to the same employer after a seasonal layoff, as retirement leave credits, in place of notice, bonuses or gratuities; (d) room or board when part of wages; (e) Workmen's Compensation for total or partial temporary disability; (f) money from services for any person or a contract of employment; and (g) reinstatement pay for wrongful dismissal.

#### **Tables 6 to 15**

Table 6 distributes persons establishing regular benefit by sex, province, and marital status. The table shows the Atlantic region accounted for 10.6 p.c. of claimants; Quebec for 31.7 p.c.; Ontario for 35.5 p.c.; the Prairies for 11.3 p.c.; and British Columbia for 10.9 p.c. Women comprised 24.2 p.c. of claimants nationally but varied in importance provincially from 28.0 p.c. and 27.1 p.c. in Manitoba and Ontario to 9.7 p.c. in Newfoundland. Married women made up 15.1 p.c. of claimants nationally but as much as 20.4 p.c. and 19.2 p.c. in Manitoba and Ontario and as few as 5.0 p.c. in Newfoundland. Married women who were 49.0 p.c. of insured females comprised 62.4 p.c. of female claimants establishing regular benefit.

Table 7 shows claimants by sex, province and number of periods established. The proportion of all claimants establishing more than one regular benefit period in 1959 was 1.8 p.c. (2.1 p.c. for men and 0.8 p.c. for women) nationally and varied by province from a high of 3.4 p.c. for New Brunswick to a low of 1.1 p.c. for Alberta.

Table 8 is concerned with the dependency position of claimants establishing regular benefit by sex and province. Some 47.0 p.c. of claimants in 1959 had dependents and were authorized the higher

benefit rates (47.3 p.c. in 1958). The percentage of claimants with dependents was 60.0 p.c. for men, but only 6.1 p.c. for women. The rate varied by province from 69.0 p.c. in Newfoundland to 41.9 p.c. in Manitoba.

Table 9 provides an age distribution of claimants by sex and province. Teenagers comprised 6.9 p.c. of claimants; those 20 to 24 years, some 17.6 p.c.; those 25 to 44 years, 48.5 p.c.; those 45 to 64 years, 23.1 p.c.; and those over 64, some 3.9 p.c. Women comprised 24.2 p.c. of all claimants, but accounted for a higher proportion of those under 25 years of age. Among the provinces, the proportion of teenagers varied from 9.8 p.c. in Prince Edward Island to 4.7 p.c. in Alberta; of those 20 to 24 years, from 21.9 p.c. in Saskatchewan to 15.2 p.c. in Newfoundland; of those 25 to 44 years, from 50.0 p.c. in Ontario to 42.0 p.c. in Prince Edward Island; of those 45 to 64 years, from 28.5 p.c. in Nova Scotia to 20.2 p.c. in Quebec; and of those over 64, from 5.8 p.c. in Manitoba to 2.2 p.c. in Newfoundland.

Table 10 shows the average benefit weeks authorized entitled claimants by sex and province. The overall average was 26.4 weeks in 1959 (26.2 weeks in 1958). The average duration authorized was 25.5 weeks for men and 29.2 weeks for women. Among provinces, the average duration ranged from 27.8 weeks in Ontario to 22.4 weeks in New Brunswick.

Table 11 is a four-way breakdown of authorized regular claimants by sex, province, age and marital status. The median ages were: for single claimants, 23.9 years (24.3 for men, 22.5 for women); for married claimants, 37.6 years (39.4 for men, 32.1 for women); and for other claimants, 49.6 years (51.4 for men, 48.3 for women).

Table 12 classifies persons by sex, province and industry. Factory workers accounted for 33.8 p.c. (31.1 p.c. of men and 42.2 p.c. for women) of claimants nationally but as much as 42.9 p.c. in Ontario and as little as 12.3 p.c. in Saskatchewan. Women accounted for 74.1 p.c. of communication workers establishing but only 1.1 p.c. of claimants attached to general contracting.

Table 13 is a four-way classification of persons establishing regular benefit by sex, dependency position, weekly rate of benefit authorized and duration authorized. Compare duration authorized by sex. The median duration was 23.3 weeks (men, 21.9 weeks; women, 30.1 weeks). Then, compare the weekly rate authorized by sex. Women comprised 77.8 p.c. of claimants at the rate of \$6.00 weekly but just 1.4 p.c. of those at \$36.00 weekly. The median rate authorized was \$22.00 (men, \$25.30; women, \$14.40). Next, compare dependency position and weekly rate authorized. The median rate for claimants without dependents was \$17.45 and for claimants with dependents was \$28.08. Now, compare duration authorized with weekly rate authorized. These authorized 36 or more weeks accounted for 30.9 p.c. of all claimants but higher percentages for claimants at rates of \$15, \$19, \$23, \$30, and \$33.

Table 14 furnishes an occupational distribution of claimants establishing regular benefit by sex and province. Managerial and professional workers accounted for 1.8 p.c. of claimants; clerical and sales workers for 15.8 p.c.; unskilled and service workers, 29.4 p.c.; and others, skilled and semi-skilled workers, for 53.0 p.c. Women accounted for as much as 69.8 p.c. of clerical workers who were claimants and as few as 0.2 p.c. of logging and mining workers establishing. Manufacturing and mechanical workers accounted for 21.2 p.c. (men, 19.4 p.c.; women, 26.9 p.c.) of claimants nationally but a high of 27.7 p.c. in Ontario and a low of 6.9 p.c. in Saskatchewan.

Table 15 shows a distribution of claimants by weeks authorized regular benefit by sex and province. The median weeks authorized were: Newfoundland 19.4 weeks; Prince Edward Island, 17.9 weeks; Nova Scotia, 22.4 weeks; New Brunswick, 18.5 weeks; Quebec, 22.1 weeks; Ontario, 25.5 weeks; Manitoba, 22.7 weeks; Saskatchewan, 21.2 weeks; Alberta, 23.5 weeks; and British Columbia, 23.6 weeks.

#### Tables 16 to 28

Table 16 shows the number of benefit periods terminated together with that portion terminated by exhaustion, classified by sex and age of claimant. Reflecting in part the economic recovery of 1959 and in part the longer duration authorized the exhaustion rate was 29.3 p.c. (32.4 p.c. in 1958). The rate was slightly higher for women (30.8 p.c.) than for men (28.8 p.c.) and varied from 58.6 p.c. for claimants over 65 years to 27.7 p.c. for the 25 to 34 year olds. The average duration for exhaustees was 21.00 weeks ranging from 27.73 weeks for those over 64 years to 19.28 weeks for teenagers.

Table 17 distributes terminations, weeks paid and amount paid by sex and province. Benefit paid averaged \$298.90 per claimant (men, \$314.67 and women, \$244.77), varying provincially from \$345.03 for Prince Edward Island claimants to \$270.69 for Alberta claimants. The overall average duration paid was 13.54 weeks (men, 12.95 weeks; women 15.58 weeks), varying by provinces from 15.38 weeks in Prince Edward Island to 12.12 weeks in Alberta.

Table 18 shows terminations and weeks paid by sex, age, marital status, and cause of termination. The overall exhaustion rate was 29.3 p.c. For the 42 basic groups (two sexes, three marital status classes, seven age groups) the percentage of exhaustions averaged from 60.7 p.c. to 18.3 p.c. By sex, the rates were 30.8 for women and 28.8 for men. By marital status, the rates were 28.0 for single claimants, 29.3 for married and 37.4 for other claimants. By age, the rates averaged from 58.6 to 24.7 p.c. Looking at sex and age, the excess of the female over the male rate held for four age groups but not for the two youngest and the oldest. Looking at sex and marital status, the excess of the female over the male rate held only for married claimants. Looking at age and marital status, differences between age groups were about the same for each group.

Table 19 distributes terminations and weeks paid by sex, province and marital status. Married women averaged 17.27 weeks compared to 12.09 weeks for single women. By contrast, duration for single men (13.00 weeks) was almost the same as for married men (12.75 weeks).

Table 20 shows terminations and weeks paid by sex, province and age. Average duration was 12.95 weeks for all males compared to 22.30 weeks for males 65 and over and 13.03 weeks for teenagers. This reflects the relative difference in authorization plus in the case of older workers difficulty in regaining employment.

Table 21 distributes terminations and weeks paid by sex, province and cause of termination. The exhaustion rate reflecting differences in authorizations and opportunities for employment varied by provinces from 51.0 p.c. in Prince Edward Island to 22.3 p.c. in Alberta. Duration averaged 10.46 weeks for termination by lapsing and 21.00 weeks for termination by exhaustion.

Table 22 gives terminations and weeks paid by sex, province, dependency position and weekly rate authorized. Claimants for single benefit averaged 14.09 weeks, while those for dependency benefit averaged, 12.96 weeks. Average duration of benefit varied for single benefit from 15.55 weeks at \$6.00 to 13.16 weeks at \$23, and for dependency benefit from 17.17 weeks at \$12 to 12.12 weeks at \$30.

Table 23 groups terminations and weeks paid by sex, province and occupation. Average duration varied among occupations from 18.97 weeks for claimants attached to protective service work containing a high proportion of older men employed

as janitors and watchmen to 11.60 weeks for manufacturing work in which many young workers get their first job.

Table 24 is a companion table to table 23 presenting the same information by industry.

Table 25 shows terminations and weeks paid by sex, age and industry.

Table 26 is concerned with a distribution of terminations by sex, weeks authorized and weeks paid. The proportion of terminations on which the authorization was 35 or more benefit weeks was 36.2 p.c. (men, 33.6 p.c.; women, 44.9 p.c.). However, the proportion paid this long was only 6.3 p.c. (men, 4.6 p.c.; women 12.1 p.c.). Some 6.5 p.c. of entitled claimants (men, 5.9 p.c.; women, 8.5 p.c.) drew no benefit. The median duration authorized was 24.94 weeks (men, 23.74 weeks; women, 31.20 weeks). The median duration paid was 12.99 weeks (men, 12.79 weeks; women, 14.16 weeks).

Table 27 gives terminations classified by sex, amount authorized and amount paid. The median, for entitlement (and payment) was: \$532 (\$265). For men, it was \$580 (\$286). For women, it was \$428 (\$193).

Table 28 shows the distribution of terminations by weeks paid for sex and province. In 1959 the highest tenth of beneficiaries (before adjusting for those who drew no benefit) obtained about 27.0 p.c. of total benefit paid on regular benefit periods terminated. The figure after the adjustment was 25.6 p.c.

The top 5 p.c. of beneficiaries fared best in Ontario followed by Manitoba and worst in Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland. However, the

bottom half did best in the latter provinces and worst in the former provinces.

**Seasonal Benefit Periods Established and Terminated**

**Qualifying Conditions**

A seasonal benefit period may be established only in the interval from the start of the week in which December 1st falls to the end of the week in which the next May 15 falls, and only for a claimant unable to pass the tests for regular benefit. A claimant can establish but one seasonal benefit period in the interval. There are two classes of benefit periods: Class A with easier tests than those for regular benefit; and Class B, an extension of benefit to certain regular benefit claimants.

To establish seasonal benefit in the winter of 1958-59, a claimant had to satisfy these conditions when his initial claim was made:

**Group A – Seasonal Benefit**

1. He must have been unable to qualify for regular benefit;
2. He must have made at least 15 weekly contributions since the preceding March 31st;
3. His claim must have been submitted in the period from December 1 to May 15.

**Group B – Seasonal Benefit**

1. He must have been unable to qualify for regular benefit and seasonal A;
2. He must have had a regular benefit period terminate since the previous May 15.
3. His claim must have been submitted in the interval from December 1 to May 15.

**Rate and Duration**

The weekly rate of benefit was determined as follows:

**Group A**

The average of all the claimant's weekly contributions made since the previous March 31st;

**Group B**

The same rate (subject to redetermination of dependency or single position) as the claimant had in his regular benefit period terminated since the previous May 15.

The duration of seasonal benefit was determined as follows:

**Group A**

1. Five weeks benefit for every six contribution weeks made since the previous March 31st, or
2. The number of possible benefit weeks (exclusive of the waiting week) in the period from the date of claim to May 15, **whichever is lesser**.

**Group B**

1. The number of weeks in the immediately previous regular benefit period, or
2. The number of possible benefit weeks (exclusive of the waiting week) in the period from the date of claim to May 15, **whichever is lesser**.

The minimum duration of seasonal benefit in the 1958-59 winter was 13 weeks for Group A, and 12 weeks for Group B unless the interval between the rate of claim and May 15 was less. For both groups, the maximum duration was 24 weeks.

After March 31 no seasonal benefit periods were established under Group A. For claimants eligible to have the waiting week waived, the starting date for a seasonal B period could be as late as May 10.

Seasonal benefit periods established from May 18, 1958 to June 28, 1958 under "An Act for the Temporary Extension of Seasonal Benefit Periods under the Unemployment Insurance Act" did not

affect qualification for seasonal benefit during the 1958-59 winter, although they did affect qualifications for regular benefit periods.

All of the provisions of the Act apply to seasonal benefit with the exception of these sections pertaining to regular benefit; namely, qualifying conditions, extension of qualifying periods, rate and duration. However, in the case of fishermen the requirements covering the determination of the "full working week" and "availability" are waived during the seasonal benefit period. Payment of benefit to a fisherman is limited to unemployment during the seasonal benefit period except where he is engaged in fishing the year round, he has no control of his employment and unemployment, and has lost his job because of a shortage of work. Most fishermen would be expected to be claimants under Group A seasonal benefit.

#### Tables 29 to 42

Table 29 gives the number of claimants establishing seasonal benefit periods and the amount of benefit paid for the five periods terminating 1955-59.

Table 30 distributes persons, weeks paid and amount paid by sex, group and province. The table shows the Atlantic area with only 8.5 p.c. of the insured population accounted for 20.8 p.c. of entitled claimants while Ontario with 40.2 p.c. of the insured had only 25.2 p.c. of seasonal claimants establishing benefit. Women comprised 20.1 p.c. of claimants (14.9 p.c. of SBA, 27.2 p.c. of SBB). The proportion of claimants who were women varied from 29.2 p.c. in Ontario to 4.2 p.c. in Newfoundland. Some 61.4 p.c. of men on seasonal benefit and 42.6 p.c. of women were A benefit claimants. Some 57.6 p.c. of claimants established A benefit. This proportion ranged from 83.5 p.c. in Prince Edward Island to 47.7 p.c. in Ontario.

The overall average duration of paid benefit was 10.52 weeks (men, 10.51 weeks; women, 10.57 weeks; A claimants, 11.18 weeks; B claimants 9.62 weeks). Among provinces, duration averaged from 12.67 weeks in Prince Edward Island to 9.57 weeks in Alberta. The benefit paid averaged \$221.43 (men, \$237.62; women, \$157.08; A claimants, \$234.32; B claimants, \$203.90). Among provinces benefit for entitled claimants averaged from \$258.88 in Newfoundland to \$207.33 in Manitoba.

Table 31 classifies persons and weeks paid by sex, group and marital status. Married women accounted for 13.7 p.c. of all claimants, and averaged 10.91 weeks of benefit (A claimants, 10.68 weeks; B claimants, 11.06 weeks).

Table 32 is concerned with the age distribution of persons and weeks paid by sex and group. Teenagers comprised 9.9 p.c. of claimants; 20 to 24 year olds, 16.9 p.c.; 25 to 44 year olds, 42.3 p.c.; 45 to 64 years olds, 24.7 p.c.; and those over 64 years, 6.2 p.c. Women accounted for 25.7 p.c. of teenage claimants but as little as 6.2 p.c. of claimants over 64 years. Almost three quarters of all seasonal claimants under the age of 20 were found

in Group A illustrating the fact that many in this age group were new entrants into insurable employment.

Table 33 presents claimants and weeks paid by sex, group, dependency position and weekly rate of benefit authorized. Single claimants comprised 53.7 p.c. of all claimants. Those authorized the top benefit rate of \$30 weekly made up 13.0 p.c. of all claimants. The proportion of women with single benefit was very high at 93.4 p.c. The proportion of A claimants with single benefit was 51.7 p.c. compared with 56.4 p.c. of B claimants. The top benefit rate of \$30 accounted for 16.2 p.c. of men but only 0.4 p.c. of women, for 10.9 p.c. of A claimants and 15.8 p.c. of B claimants. Duration at 10.37 weeks for single benefit claimants averaged slightly less than the 10.69 weeks for dependency benefit claimants.

Table 34 distributes persons and weeks paid by sex, group and occupational attachment. Managerial and professional workers covered 10 p.c. of claimants; clerical and sales workers, 12.0 p.c.; unskilled and service workers, 36.8 p.c.; and others, skilled and semi-skilled workers, 50.2 p.c. Manufacturing and mechanical workers accounted for 11.1 p.c. (men, 8.7 p.c.; women, 20.6 p.c.) of all claimants but varied in importance by benefit group for 8.4 p.c. of A claimants and 14.8 p.c. of B claimants. Duration averaged from 14.39 weeks for fishermen to 8.49 weeks for "other" service workers.

Table 35 shows persons establishing seasonal benefit by sex, duration authorized and duration paid. The proportion authorized 18 or more weeks was 24.5 p.c. (men, 23.2 p.c.; women 29.6 p.c.; A claimants, 18.0 p.c.; B claimants 33.3 p.c.). However, the proportion paid this long was only 13.9 p.c. (men, 13.1 p.c.; women, 17.2 p.c.; A claimants, 9.5 p.c.; B claimants, 19.9 p.c.). Some 4.7 p.c. of entitled claimants (men, 4.2 p.c.; women, 7.0 p.c.; A claimants, 3.5 p.c.; B claimants, 6.4 p.c.) drew no benefit. Table 32 showed the relatively higher proportion of older workers among B claimants.

Table 36 classifies claimants and weeks paid by sex, province and marital status. Average duration was 10.91 weeks for married women compared to 9.47 weeks for single women, which is a much smaller differential than noted earlier for regular benefit (see Table 19).

Table 37 gives persons establishing seasonal benefit and weeks paid by sex, province and age. Among the provinces the percentage of teenagers ranged from as much as 12.3 p.c. in New Brunswick to 6.4 p.c. in British Columbia; of 20 to 24 year olds, from 19.9 p.c. in Quebec to 13.7 p.c. in Newfoundland; of 25 to 44 year olds, from 45.9 p.c. in Newfoundland to 37.5 p.c. in Manitoba; of 45 to 64 year olds, from 29.1 p.c. in Manitoba to 21.1 p.c. in Quebec; and of those over 64 years, from 11.4 p.c. in Manitoba to 2.8 p.c. in New Brunswick. Average duration for those over 64 years was 13.20 weeks but varied from 13.72 weeks in Nova Scotia to 11.76 weeks in Saskatchewan.

Table 38 allots persons and weeks paid by sex, province and cause of termination. The figures show 46.0 p.c. of claimants (men, 45.9 p.c.; women, 46.5 p.c.) exhausted their benefit rights. Newfoundland at 70.3 p.c. had the highest exhaustion rate and Alberta at 29.5 p.c. the lowest. Duration averaged 13.54 weeks for exhaustees, ranging from 14.35 weeks in Newfoundland to 12.63 weeks in Manitoba.

Table 39 distributes claimants by sex, dependency position, duration authorized and weekly rate authorized. The median rate authorized was \$16.19 weekly for single benefit claimants and \$26.18 for dependency benefit claimants. The percentage of claimants authorized 20 or more weeks was 14.3 p.c. ranging from 19.6 p.c. at the rate of \$23.00 weekly to 10.1 p.c. at the rate of \$12.00 weekly.

Table 40 is a companion table to Table 34 and classifies persons establishing seasonal benefit and weeks paid by sex, group and industrial attachment.

Table 41 shows persons and weeks paid by sex, age, marital status and cause of termination. The overall exhaustion rate was 46.0 p.c. For the 42 basic groups (two sexes, three marital status and

seven age) the percentages ranged from 100.0 p.c. to 16.6 p.c. By sex, the rates were 46.3 for women and 45.7 for men. By marital status, the rates were 44.8 for single claimants, 46.2 for married claimants and 47.5 for other claimants. By age, the rates ranged from 56.1 p.c. to 42.7 p.c. Looking at sex and age, the excess of the female over the male rate held for six age groups, but not for teenagers. Looking at sex and marital status, the excess of the female over the male rate held only for married claimants.

Table 42 allocates claimants establishing seasonal benefit by sex, province, duration authorized and duration paid.

In the 1958-59 winter the highest tenth of beneficiaries, before adjusting for those who drew no benefit, obtained about 23.4 p.c. of total benefit paid on seasonal benefit periods terminated. The figures after the adjustment was 22.5 p.c.

The top 5 p.c. of beneficiaries fared best in Ontario and worst in Newfoundland. However, the bottom half did best in the latter province and worst in the former province.

## Review of Unemployment Insurance Benefit in 1959

The foregoing comments on the detailed tables have been concerned with what the data for 1959 show, with particular reference to the characteristics known to distinguish the different groupings of claimants in this report, such as differences in sex, province, age, etc. Apart from this, something has been written about the requirements for establishing ordinary or special benefit and about instances when benefit is not payable. Some comparisons with earlier years are noted here.

The gross national product, which is a measure of the market value of all goods and services produced in Canada, showed an advance of about 6 p.c. over the year 1958, and with prices higher by about 2 p.c., this represented an increase of some 4 p.c. in the physical volume of output. This change

in the physical volume of total output compares with practically no change in 1957 and 1958, and with a post-war average increase of 4 p.c. per year. Average civilian employment increased by 156,000, and the number of persons without jobs seeking work dropped to 5.6 p.c. of the civilian labour force compared with 6.6 p.c. in 1958, and 4.3 p.c. in 1957.

The highest volume of claimants among the insured labour force was recorded in March when there were 796,000 persons on benefit or seeking benefit, down 73,300 from the same date in 1958. The lowest level of claimants was recorded in October with 201,600 active claimants, some 81,000 less than at the same time in 1958. The figures on active claimants are shown below.

The insured labour force showed little change between 1958 and 1959. The number establishing regular benefit dropped 9.7 p.c. from 1958 to 1,091,484. The number who either were not entitled to ordinary benefit or whose ordinary benefit had been exhausted and who established seasonal

benefit declined by 5.6 p.c. from the 1957-58 seasonal benefit period to 444,310. This report does not consider claimants for seasonal benefit in December of 1959, but is concerned only with the seasonal benefit period 1958-59, i.e. December 1958 to May 1959.

Beneficiaries who terminated regular benefit in 1959 drew benefit on the average for 13.5 weeks, or about 0.8 weeks less than in 1958. The average payment for ordinary benefit dropped to \$298.90 in 1959 from \$313.87 in the previous year, a fall of 4.8 p.c. The fall in the duration of paid benefit was accompanied by a slump in the number of claimants who exhausted their ordinary benefit from 363,348 in 1958 to 306,300 in 1959. The exhaustion percentage rate slipped from 32.4 to 29.3 p.c.

Seasonal benefit claimants drew benefit on the average for about 10.5 weeks, or about 0.7 weeks less than in winter months of 1957-58 when a temporary extension was allowed entitled seasonal benefit claimants. The average payment for seasonal benefit dropped 5.1 p.c. from \$233.37 in 1957-58 to \$221.43 in 1958-59. The exhaustion percentage rate for seasonal benefit was a little higher at 46.0 p.c. than in the longer seasonal benefit period a year earlier.





