

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PREFACE

It is common knowledge that the Canadian education system presently faces more problems than at any other time previously. Education must keep pace with the rapid development of our modern society, despite the difficulty of maintaining an adequate balance between ever increasing enrolments and the comparatively small number of young adults from whom the teaching staff must be recruited.

The data in this report not only convey measurable characteristics of the teaching staff but they also reflect a continuous movement from rural areas to urban centres and the relatively larger increase in the populations of some provinces such as Ontario and British Columbia.

Considering that every fifth Canadian is enrolled in elementary or secondary school, an annual report providing information on the persons responsible for the formal education of this large group of our nation is timely.

For the year 1954-55 the number of teachers reported for the nine provinces outside of Quebec increased by 5.6 p.c. to 75,500. Of these 18 p.c. were instructing in secondary schools. About 25 p.c. of the teachers were employed in cities of 100,000 or over while 41 p.c. were in rural districts or in centres of less than 1,000 population. The percentage of women among the teachers dropped to 70.1 p.c. but the percentage of these who were married rose by 4 p.c. to 39 p.c. The median salary for all teachers increased by \$186 during the year to an all time high of \$2,840.

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INTRODUCTION

A report on salaries, qualifications and experience of teachers in the publicly-controlled schools has been published annually since 1939, except for the years 1950-51 and 1951-52. Prior to 1950 most of the data were for eight provinces, excluding Quebec. Newfoundland entered Confederation in 1949 and data for that province have been included beginning with 1948-49. In 1953-54, for the first time, the numbers of teachers in Quebec were included, and in the present report an additional table (No. 94) showing Quebec salaries is added.

As one result of the Federal-Provincial Conference on Education Statistics held in May 1952, a new report form designed for punch card use was devised and has been used since the fall of 1952 by all provinces except Ontario and Quebec¹. Provision was made for tabulating considerably more information than had been available previously. Tables showing turnover and losses to the profession, teaching load, migration of teachers, married women teaching, grade level, and special subjects taught have all been added. In the present report, more extensive use of available data has been made and more tables included. Wherever possible, teachers instructing elementary grades and those instructing

secondary grades are given separately. Data are also given for teachers in Roman Catholic separate schools and for permit teachers. Because of a pronounced socio-economic divergence among various areas and centres, greater emphasis was placed on the breakdown of all teachers according to the type of community. New tables for study supervisors, teachers new to the province, teaching load (cross-classified for rural schools with number of grades taught), and for teachers holding ordinary and special certificates have been added.

Quebec data are given only in two tables (Nos. 1 and 94), and Ontario data in most of the historical tables (Nos. 1, 2, 6-8), in the tables on numbers of teachers (No. 9), salaries (Nos. 10-36, 38, 39, 93), certificates (Nos. 42, 43, 46), and university degrees (No. 47). Data for the eight remaining provinces are found, whenever appropriate, in all tables. The data for Ontario were obtained from *Schools and Teachers in the Province of Ontario*, Parts I and II, published by the Ontario Department of Education, as of November 1954, and are limited to whatever was available in this publication. The figures for Quebec teachers were taken from the *Rapport du Surintendant de l'Instruction publique, 1954-55*.

CONCEPTS AND METHODS

Count of Teachers

As in previous reports the data cover only **full-time regular classroom teachers instructing elementary and secondary grades in publicly-controlled schools**. The differences between the count reported by certain provinces and the counts in this report may be explained from this definition. Whereas some of the provincial departments of education account for every teacher, full- and part-time, employed for any period of time during the school year, this report tries to avoid duplications of teaching positions, i.e., it counts only one teacher for one full-time teaching position. Teachers, supervisors of special subjects and classes, principals, supervising principals, assistant principals and substitute teachers are included, provided that they are full-time employees on an annual salary. Excluded are superintendents, inspectors and their equivalents, usually employed by the provinces or by the larger centres, and part-time teachers usually paid on a daily basis.

Unfortunately, 698 teachers in the eight provinces outside of Ontario and Quebec failed to report and are included as "unclassified" in the "all schools" tables at the beginning of each section. But since nothing was known about these teachers, except the "province where teaching", they are not included in the detail tables. The teachers shown as "unclassified" in some of the detail tables are those who completed a return but failed to report the item under consideration in the particular table.

For the purpose of this report publicly-controlled schools comprise all those operated by local school boards or boards of education and supported by local taxation. This includes the Roman Catholic and Protestant separate schools, where such exist, and the denominational schools of Newfoundland, as well as the larger group popularly termed "public" schools. Teachers in private schools and in schools operated directly by the provincial and federal governments are not included.

Type of Community

In previous reports, except for British Columbia, location in incorporated cities, towns and villages was the basis of classification of urban schools despite variations in requirements for incorporation and in actual size of population groups. Schools outside such centres were classified according to number of classrooms as one-room, two to five rooms, and six rooms and over. The latter group was added to the towns and villages.

Beginning with this report the basis of classification is:

Urban centres:

- (1) 100,000 population and over
- (2) 10,000 to 99,999 population
- (3) 1,000 to 9,999 population

Rural (including centres under 1,000 population):

- (4) 6 or more classrooms
- (5) 2 to 5 classrooms
- (6) one classroom

A comparison of the two classifications may be made from Table 5 and from the introduction to the report for 1953-54, p. 7-8.


Certain tables were prepared for 16 selected cities (including 5 in Ontario). In the tables for these cities only those schools located in the city proper are included. In contrast, the tables on urban centres (e.g. "centres of 10,000 to 99,999 population") include selected suburban areas adjacent to the larger centres—St. John's, Halifax, Saint John, Ottawa, Toronto, Hamilton, London, Windsor, Winnipeg, Calgary, Edmonton, Vancouver and Victoria. These centres were circumscribed on the basis of the socio-economic nature of the area in question. The following is the list of urban centres classified according to population (1951 Census):

Teaching Level

In Table 9 which gives the number of teachers by teaching level, elementary teachers are those who teach elementary grades (kindergarten to Grade 8) only, secondary teachers are those who teach secondary grades (above Grade 8) only. Those who teach both elementary and secondary grades are reported separately. In all other tables the teachers

in this latter category are included with the elementary teachers.

Certificates and University Degrees

Over the past few years the D.B.S. classification of certificates for this report has been developed from four categories into eight categories. The chart above illustrates this progressive development.

The classification in this report using "Levels", attempts to equate the various certificates of all nine provinces on the basis of the minimum number of years of academic and professional training required for the certificates related to the base of junior matriculation level¹.

Tables 42-43 represent a classification of teachers according to the certificates—ordinary (basic) or special—under which they teach. The teaching certificates are normally issued by the provincial departments of education according to the professional and academic training of the teachers. Certain provinces however may not give as much credit for academic training as others, so that some teachers with Level 4 certificates in a province where this is the upper limit of certificates may have the qualifications for a Level 5 or Level 6 certificate in others. This discrepancy between the levels of certificates shown here and the actual qualifications of teachers seems to be particularly pronounced in the case of New Brunswick. Since this province recently made considerable changes in the certification system, it is expected that beginning with the report for 1958-59 these discrepancies will be removed. Teachers holding a basic certificate from another province, but teaching on a permit (Level O), are classified according to their original certificate.

Table 44 classifies all teachers according to their certificates; Table 45, all those with special certificates, whether or not they teach under them.

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE TEACHING STAFF, 1954-55

Numbers of Teachers (Tables 1 and 9)

In 1954-55 there were 75,540 teachers in the nine provinces other than Quebec², an increase of 5.6 p.c. over the previous school year. The number

Table 1, footnote 1. The total number of teachers for all ten provinces was 114,816.

Table 85 shows the numbers of teachers and supervisors of special subjects or classes regardless of whether they hold a special certificate.

Table 47 gives a count of teachers holding one or more university degrees as one characteristic of the qualifications of the teaching staff.

Experience

Tables 48-58 show data on total teaching experience, and Tables 59-66 on experience under the same school board, or tenure. In interpreting the salary tables, all of these elements, i.e. certificates, university degrees, experience and tenure, should be carefully considered before any conclusions are drawn.

Movement of the Teaching Staff

The tables on turnover, losses from and acquisitions to the profession (Nos. 67-75) together with those on migration of teachers (Nos. 79-84) give information on movement in and out of the profession, movement from one province to another and movement from one school board to another. These elements also are related to the salaries, qualifications and experience of the teachers.

Calculation of Percentiles

In this report all percentiles were calculated from the distributions as given in the tables. Salary percentiles exclude "unclassified" and teachers drawing no salary. Wherever the total classified was less than 30, the percentiles were not shown. The median rather than the arithmetic mean (commonly called the average) is used to represent the average, in order to avoid the effect of extreme cases. The median is the middle point in a distribution. Where the teachers are classified from low to high according to salary, the median salary is the salary of a teacher half way up the scale. Half the teachers received salaries lower, half received salaries higher than this figure. Commonly the arithmetic mean of the salaries of teachers is higher than the median, and this difference may in some cases be as much as two or three hundred dollars. This is because there are many more teachers at the lower levels of the salary schedule and relatively few at various stages to the top.

of teachers had been increasing every year since 1944-45 when there was an increase of 0.6 p.c. over 1943-44 and this increase became more pronounced year after year.

Ontario³ had 43.8 p.c. of the 75,540 teachers, while the smallest province, Prince Edward Island had only 1.0 p.c. of this total.


The total of all teachers for the nine provinces combined was distributed according to the type of community as follows:

Teachers instructing elementary grades only, represented 73.9 p.c. of all teachers, those instructing secondary grades only, 18.0 p.c. and those instructing both elementary and secondary grades, 8.1 p.c.¹.

Almost 30 p.c. of all teachers were men, about the same proportion as in the years preceding the war. The war caused considerable changes in this proportion, as shown in the following chart.

There were pronounced variations among the provinces as to the sex distribution of the teaching staff, British Columbia having the highest proportion of men (41.4 p.c.) and Prince Edward Island the lowest (13.7 p.c.).

As shown in the list below, there was a definite correlation between the type of community and the proportion of men.

It was found that larger centres have more secondary schools which employ many more men than women teachers. Whereas 64.4 p.c. of all teachers, instructing secondary grades only, were men, the proportion was only 19.0 p.c. at the elementary level, while men instructing both elementary and secondary grades represented 54.3 p.c.

As it appears from the following table, there was considerable variation from province to province in the proportions of all women teachers who were married. This is due to a number of factors which vary from province to province and area to area. Similarly, the proportion of married women among all teachers varies greatly as can be observed from the table.

This is equally true for variations in the proportions of married women found in the various types of community.

Again, these proportions are probably influenced by the fact that in the larger centres there are more secondary schools than in smaller communities. The secondary schools have not only more men than women as has been shown above, but also fewer women teachers at the secondary level (25.2 p.c.) were married than women teaching at the elementary level (40.7 p.c.).

Salaries (Tables 6-8, 10-41, 86-89, 93, 94)

All teachers (Tables 10-16)

The median salary for all teachers in the nine provinces combined was \$2,840; British Columbia had the highest (\$3,644) and Newfoundland the lowest (\$1,407).

As will be noted throughout the discussion of the tables these median values do not always provide comparable data since they do not take account of the elements involved. The proportion of elementary schools to secondary schools in a province, the proportion of rural schools to urban schools, and the average teachers' qualifications in terms of training and experience, vary greatly from province to province. These variations are related to median salaries.

Since 1938-39 the median salary for all teachers in the nine provinces combined increased by 233 p.c. (see Table 7). Among the provinces the largest increase was found in Saskatchewan (411 p.c.), followed by Alberta (272 p.c.), and Manitoba (258 p.c.). The smallest increase was in British Columbia (181 p.c.), Ontario (195 p.c.) and Newfoundland (196 p.c.). It should be kept in mind that greatest increases are likely to be found where initial salaries were lowest.

In every province the medians for women were lower than those for men. As already indicated, women teachers were more frequently found in

smaller centres teaching elementary grades and at the lower level of the salary schedules. Moreover, as seen below, they have lower qualifications in terms of training.

Considering the various types of communities, it was found that for the nine provinces combined median salaries are generally higher in larger centres. The same was true for the provinces.

Elementary¹ and secondary teachers (Tables 17-29)

The median salaries of elementary teachers were lower in all provinces and in each type of community than the median salaries of secondary teachers. The median for elementary teachers of all nine provinces combined was \$2,613 as compared with the median of \$4,191 for secondary teachers. British Columbia had the highest median for elementary teachers, \$3,065, Newfoundland the lowest, \$1,394. British Columbia had also the highest median for secondary teachers, \$4,869, and Prince Edward Island the lowest, \$2,358.

Women teachers had lower median salaries than men in all provinces, at both the elementary and secondary levels of teaching and in all types of communities, with the exception in Newfoundland, where the median for women instructing elementary grades was slightly higher than that for men.

In general, for each of the two teaching levels, teachers in larger centres had higher median salaries than those in smaller centres. The only exceptions, and these were minor ones, were at the elementary level in Prince Edward Island, for schools with 6 or more rooms and schools with 2-5 rooms; Manitoba, for centres of 10,000-99,999 and 1,000-10,000 population; Alberta, for rural schools with 6 or more rooms, and those with 2-5 rooms; and British Columbia, for centres of 100,000 population and over, and 10,000-99,999. In those cases, elementary teachers of smaller centres had higher median salaries than the teachers in larger centres.

Teachers in Roman Catholic separate schools (Tables 30-38)

In the three provinces where there are Roman Catholic separate schools (Ontario², Saskatchewan and Alberta) the median salaries of the separate school teachers were lower than the median salaries of all public and separate school teachers in those provinces. This is true for all types of communities combined as well as for each type. The differences between median salaries of elementary separate school teachers and elementary public school teachers is shown in the tables giving the salary distribution in selected cities (Tables 38 and 39).

Table 93 offers a comparison between the salaries of elementary public school teachers and those of elementary Roman Catholic separate school teachers. Here again, the medians and the two quartiles are higher for public school teachers. However, it should be kept in mind that a large proportion of the Roman Catholic separate school teachers are members of religious orders and some are not paid salaries.

In the case of all teachers, the median salaries tend to be lower in smaller centres. This is not true for Roman Catholic separate school teachers. Here the medians for one-room rural schools were higher than those in centres of 1,000 to 9,999 population; and were lower for schools with 6 or more rooms than for schools with 2 to 5 rooms. This is especially noticeable in Ontario. As in the case of all women teachers, women teachers in Roman Catholic separate schools had lower median salaries than men.

Permit teachers (Table 40)

The median salary for permit teachers in eight provinces without Quebec and Ontario was lower than that for all teachers. The median salaries for permit teachers were lowest in the Atlantic provinces, highest in the Western provinces, and reached the peak in British Columbia with \$2,846. In all cases the median was lowered in proportion to the number of permit teachers employed in the province.

Newfoundland (Tables 86-89)

Considering the classification by denominations, the salary medians showed some variations. These differences are to a large extent accounted for by various proportions of certificated, licensed and temporary supply teachers, as apparent from the Tables 87-89.


Quebec – publicly-controlled Roman Catholic schools (Table 94)

As illustrated by the chart on page 161, there were pronounced differences in median salaries between men and women teachers, and between lay and religious teachers. Comparing median salaries of Quebec lay teachers with the median salaries in other provinces, it was found that the Quebec median was below the average of the nine remaining provinces. Whereas the median for male lay teachers in Quebec ranked fourth, the median for female lay teachers was the lowest of all the provinces.

Certificates (Tables 2, 42-46, 90)

All teachers (Tables 2, 42-45)

In 1954-55 of the 75,540 teachers reported there were 71,915 teachers employed under ordinary and 3,625 teachers employed under special certificates. The following chart illustrates changes in the distribution of certificates by level within the last 17 years.



Following is a percentage distribution of certificates by level and sex of teachers for nine provinces combined:

It is apparent that the average woman teacher was employed under a lower level of certificate than the average man. This was true not only for the nine provinces combined, but also with some variations in size, for each individual province. This is one of the factors which affects the remuneration of women teachers and men.

Combining the four highest levels of certificates (Levels 3-6) it was found that British Columbia and Alberta had the highest (41.0 p.c. and 36.1 p.c., respectively), and Prince Edward Island, New Brunswick and Newfoundland the lowest proportion of them (0.0 p.c., 9.2 p.c., 9.9 p.c., respectively). Clustering the two lowest levels of certificates (Levels -1, 0), it was observed that the highest proportion of them was in Newfoundland (57.5 p.c.), and lowest proportion in British Columbia (1.6 p.c.). It may be seen that these provincial differences correspond roughly to the provincial differences in median salaries.

Similarly, it was found that larger centres generally had more teachers with higher levels of certificates than smaller centres.

Teachers in Roman Catholic separate schools (Table 46)

Teachers in Roman Catholic separate schools in Ontario, Saskatchewan and Alberta had, on the average, fewer certificates of Levels 3-6 than teachers in all public and separate schools in these provinces, and more certificates of Levels -1 and 0. This would lower the median of certificates for all teachers in these three provinces.

Newfoundland (Table 90)

Combining the two lowest levels of certificates (levels -1 and 0), it was found that the highest proportion of them was in the Salvation Army schools (80.1 p.c.), followed by Church of England schools (64.1 p.c.), United Church schools (61.5 p.c.), Roman Catholic schools (49.0 p.c.), and "other", predominantly Amalgamated schools (41.8 p.c.).

University degrees (Table 47)

Out of 74,842 teachers classified, 16,389 or 21.9 p.c. held university degrees, diplomas and university certificates. The proportion of men with a degree, diploma or certificate was 45.8 p.c., that for women was 11.7 p.c. This in part indicates that men had, on the average, higher levels of certificates than women teachers, and likewise higher median salaries.

The highest frequency of teachers with a university degree was found in British Columbia, 35.3 p.c., followed by Alberta, 24.3 p.c., Ontario, 23.2 p.c., Manitoba, 20.8 p.c., and Nova Scotia, 20.1 p.c.; the lowest in Prince Edward Island, 5.2 p.c., and Newfoundland, 6.1 p.c.

Teachers with degrees were generally found in the larger centres.

Total teaching experience (Tables 3, 48-58, 91)

All teachers (Tables 3, 48-54)

The median experience of all teachers in eight provinces combined (Quebec and Ontario excepted) was 7.8 years. Alberta had the highest (9.5 years) and Newfoundland the lowest median (3.9 years). Women had a slightly higher median than men for all eight provinces combined (7.6 vs. 7.9), as well as in the province of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Manitoba and British Columbia.

It was also found that teachers in larger centres, on the average, had more experience than those in smaller centres throughout Canada.

Teachers in Roman Catholic separate schools (Table 57)

Median experience was lower for men in both Saskatchewan and Alberta than for women. The median experience of teachers in Roman Catholic separate schools was higher than the median experience of all teachers in public and separate schools in these two provinces. In other words teachers in Roman Catholic separate schools in Saskatchewan and Alberta increase somewhat the median experience for all teachers in these provinces.

Permit teachers (Table 55)

Median experience for permit teachers was considerably lower than for all teachers. Women teachers instructing under a permit had higher median experience than men in all provinces.

Saskatchewan had the highest median experience (5.2 years), followed by British Columbia (5.0), Nova Scotia (3.8) and New Brunswick (2.1); Manitoba (0.0) the lowest.

Newfoundland (Table 91)

Teachers in "other", predominantly Amalgamated schools had the highest median experience (5.6 years), followed by those in Roman Catholic schools (4.5), United Church schools (3.7), Salvation Army schools (3.4), and Church of England schools (3.3).

Tenure (Tables 5, 59-66, 92)

All teachers (Tables 5, 59-66)

The median tenure (experience with the present school board) of all teachers in eight provinces combined was 2.4 years. British Columbia had the highest (3.4) and Newfoundland the lowest median tenure (1.2). Men had higher median tenure than women teachers in the eight provinces combined (2.2 as compared with 2.8 years), as well as in all provinces except Newfoundland and New Brunswick.

It was generally found that larger centres had teachers with higher median tenure.

Newfoundland (Table 92)

Teachers in Roman Catholic schools had the highest median tenure (1.7 year), followed by those in "other" schools (1.2), United Church schools (1.1), Church of England schools (0.8), and Salvation Army schools (0.3).

The following table summarizes the basic data for salaries, certificates, university degrees, experience and tenure — for all schools, urban schools in centres of 10,000 to 99,999 population, for rural schools with two to five rooms, and for one-room rural schools. This table is added in order to facilitate an appreciation of spurious and real salary differences among the nine provinces.

Turnover, Losses, Acquisitions, Migration (Tables 67-75, 79-84)

In midsummer 1954 the eight provinces lost 18.5 p.c. of their staff, not counting those teachers who moved from one province to teach in another. In other words, this percentage represents a net loss to the teaching profession in these eight provinces. The highest loss occurred in Newfoundland (32.2 p.c.), followed by Prince Edward Island (22.5 p.c.), Manitoba (22.2 p.c.), Saskatchewan (20.4 p.c.), Nova Scotia (18.7 p.c.), New Brunswick (18.7 p.c.), Alberta (18.2 p.c.) and British Columbia (15.3 p.c.).

The average turnover, the number of vacancies in midsummer 1954 as a percentage of all teachers reporting in the fall 1954, for eight provinces was 32.5 p.c. Except in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, the order of individual provinces was the same as in the case of losses. It was noticed that the provinces with higher median salaries, higher median experience and tenure, and higher levels of certificates, had generally the lowest percentages for losses and turnover.

Considering the types of communities, it was found that smaller centres had higher losses and greater turnover than larger centres which was similar to the relationship found for median salaries, experience, tenure and certificates.

Acquisitions were distributed more evenly among the provinces. The highest proportion of acquired teachers was in Newfoundland, 25.9 p.c., and the lowest in British Columbia, 16.3 p.c. The eight provinces outside of Quebec and Ontario acquired 7,990 new teachers, or 19.1 p.c. of all classified teachers. Out of these, 875 of the teachers classified were transferees from other provinces or countries. The highest gain for teachers from outside the province was registered in the Western provinces, Saskatchewan 3.2 p.c. of all classified teachers, Alberta 3.1 p.c., British Columbia 2.7 p.c., Manitoba 1.5 p.c.; the lowest in the Atlantic provinces, Newfoundland 0.5 p.c., New Brunswick 0.8 p.c., Prince Edward Island 0.9 p.c., Nova Scotia 1.1 p.c.

In the fall of 1954 there were in the eight provinces outside of Quebec and Ontario 4,558 migrated

teachers, i.e. teachers who had obtained their original ordinary certificate in some other province or country than where they were presently teaching. This represents 10.9 p.c. of all classified teachers. The proportion of these migrated teachers increased regularly from the Eastern to the Western provinces (from East to West: 1.8 p.c., 2.8 p.c., 4.4 p.c., 5.5 p.c., 9.2 p.c., 8.1 p.c., 16.7 p.c., 20.5 p.c.). Considering the provinces which issued these original certificates and lost those teachers, the following picture arises: Quebec lost (or supplied to the eight provinces) the least of its teachers (0.5 p.c. of all classified teachers in the fall 1954), followed by Newfoundland (0.7 p.c.), Ontario (1.2 p.c.), British Columbia (2.4 p.c.) and New Brunswick (3.4 p.c.). Saskatchewan lost by far the most of its teachers (22.5 p.c.), followed by Prince Edward Island (8.1 p.c.), Manitoba (7.1 p.c.), Alberta (6.2 p.c.) and Nova Scotia (5.9 p.c.). In the fall 1954 there were 748 teachers in the eight provinces who were issued their original certificates abroad. Most of them were teaching in the three Western provinces. Tables 80-82 give additional information about migrated teachers, and Table 83 distributes teachers with extra-provincial teaching experience according to the length of this experience.

Teaching Load (Tables 76-78)

The median enrolment for all schools varied among the eight provinces from 27 pupils in Prince Edward Island to 35 pupils in Newfoundland. Generally speaking, the median enrolment was lower for the secondary than for the elementary grades (for all eight provinces combined 31 pupils as compared with 28 pupils in secondary grades). It is also true that the median enrolment tended to be lower in smaller centres (for centres of 100,000 population and over in all eight provinces combined 34 pupils as compared with 19 pupils in one-room rural schools).

Table 77 cross-classifies the enrolment in a class with the number of grades taught in this class in rural schools of 2 to 5 rooms. It will be noticed that classes with lower number of grades taught had generally higher median enrolment. This tendency ran in an opposite direction in one-room rural schools.







(QUEBEC EXCEPTED), 1954-55






