



## PREFACE

This survey presents the statistical records of Canadian universities and colleges during the first three years of war. It shows an increase in the enrolment in Science courses, maintenance of the pre-war level in Medicine and Dentistry, a decrease in Arts, Agriculture, Education and some other faculties. The net result was practically no change in the over-all number of undergraduates enrolled, but a slightly higher proportion of women than in pre-war years. There was a considerable reduction in the number of post-graduate students, which has since become more marked.

Staff members were maintained but many of the senior members, on leave of absence for the duration of the war, were replaced by less experienced teachers.

The survey appears for the second time without an analytical section preceding the tables, due to wartime conditions. It was prepared by Miss S. A. Feeley in consultation with J. E. Robbins, M.A., Ph.D., in the Education Statistics Branch of the Bureau.

Moreover some institutions have given the information in some years for more of their students than they were asked to report, i.e., more than their full-time students of university grade; where pre-matriculation or part-time students have been included in the reports it has not been possible to separate them in compiling the table.

## BIBLIOGRAPHY

In the editions for 1932-36, the "Annual Survey of Education in Canada" contained a "Bibliography of Canadian Studies in Education," including a section on "Professional and Other Higher Education," another on "Historical and Biographical Studies," etc., in which new publications relating to higher education in Canada were recorded. Since the separation of statistics of higher education from the rest of the Survey in 1936-38 the corresponding bibliographical items have been published in this report. The Education Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics will welcome advice of important omissions, so they may be included in the next edition. No systematic attempt has been made to include articles appearing in the periodical press other than the several university reviews; beyond these the list includes only articles that have incidentally come to the attention of the compilers.

### Annual Reports
