

PREFACE

This edition of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics Reference Paper 55 is the first revision of the original January 1955 publication. It is hoped that in future it will be brought up to date every other year, alternating with new editions of the biennial Reference Paper 21, Post-graduate Scholarships and Fellowships Open to Canadian Students.

Considerable reorganization has been done for this edition. All member institutions of the National Conference of Canadian Universities were invited to submit details of their awards; awards tenable at more than one institution are listed in separate sections and not under each institution; and an index of awards open to students from other countries is included.

The awards listed are limited to entrance scholarships and bursaries valued at \$100 or more. Most of the institutions included also have various loan funds and in-course awards, details about which can be found in the calendars of the individual universities or colleges.

This Reference Paper was prepared in the Education Division of the Bureau under the supervision of Ralph D. Mitchener, Chief of the Higher Education Section.

INTRODUCTION

Method of Compilation of Material:

In addition to notices of awards that have come to the attention of the Education Division of the Bureau since the publication of the previous edition, the following procedure was used incompiling the entries:

- 1. All institutions included in the 1955 edition were invited to revise that listing of their awards.
- 2. All other institutions not included in the first edition, but who were members of the National Conference of Canadian Universities, were requested to submit details of their entrance awards.
- 3. Various national groups, including the Canadian Federation of Catholic University Students, the Imperial Order Daughters of the Empire, and the Canadian Legion of the British Empire Service League, were asked to give assistance in compiling various new entries.

Method of Listing Awards:

A somewhat different grouping of awards, under three main sections, has been used for this edition. It includes:

- I. Awards open to residents of more than one province at institutions in more than one province.
- II. Awards open to residents of single provinces (exclusive of awards tenable only at one institution).
- III. Awards tenable at single institutions only. These awards, listed by province and institution, are classified for each institution in the following manner:
- A. National: Awards open to students throughout Canada.
- B. Provincial: Awards open to students from one province only (usually the province within which the institution is located, although some awards, as for example at certain Maritime institutions, are for students in more than one Maritime province).
- C. Other: Awards open either to students from specific localities within a province or to certain specific groups of students.

Information in Section III is printed in the language of instruction (English or French) of the institution under which it appears.

In order to explore fully all available sources of awards tenable at any institution, the prospective student should consult all three sections.

Réunion des matériaux:

Outre les avis de bourses qui sont parvenus à la Division de l'éducation du Bureau depuis la publication de l'édition précédente, voici le procédé utilisé pour réunir la matière du catalogue:

- 1. Toutes les institutions figurant dans l'édition de 1955 ont été invitées à reviser leur liste de bourses.
- 2. Toutes les institutions qui ne figuraient pas dans la première édition, mais qui sont membres de la Conférence nationale des universités canadiennes, ont été priées de soumettre les détails de leurs bourses d'entrée.
- 3. On a demandé l'aide de divers groupements nationaux, dont la Fédération canadienne des universitaires catholiques, l'Impérial Order Daughters of the Empire, et la Légion canadienne de la British Empire Service League, pour relever les nouvelles bourses.

Groupement des bourses:

Dans la présente édition, les bourses sont groupées un peu différemment, sous trois grandes sections. En voici les titres:

- I. Bourses accessibles aux résidents de plus d'une province et valables aux institutions de plus d'une province.
- II. Bourses accessibles aux résidents d'une seule province (à l'exclusion des bourses valables à une institution).
- III. Bourses valables dans une seule institution. Groupées par province et institution, ces bourses sont classées, pour chaque institution, de la façon suivante:
- A. Nationales: Bourses accessibles & tous les étudiants canadiens.
- B. Provinciales: Bourses accessibles aux étudiants d'une seule province (habituellement la province où est située l'institution, bien que quelques bourses, par exemple dans certaines institutions des Maritimes, s'adressent à plus d'une province Maritime).
- C. Autres bourses: Bourses accessibles, soit à des étudiants d'une localité déterminée dans une même province, soit à certains groupes déterminés d'étudiants.

Les renseignements contenus dans la section III sont rédigés dans la langue d'enseignement (anglais ou français) de l'institution sous laquelle ils sont donnés.

Afin d'explorer à fond toutes les sources de bourses pour chaque institution, le futur étudiant doit consulter les trois sections. Les bourses valables à Awards tenable at more than one institution are not included in the listings in Section III, but appear in either Sections I or II.

Information that was received after the main sections were compiled is included in an addenda at the end of this publication. These later entries are not indexed.

General Notes on Awards Listed:

The closing date for application means the date by which completed application forms, official reports of standing, and other supporting documents must be in the hands of the awarding bodies. Initial contact should be made as early as possible before the closing dates in order to allow a sufficient interval for any exchange of correspondence and for the collection and forwarding of the necessary documents. As in most cases no personal interview is possible prior to the granting of the awards, applications and other material should be as complete as possible.

Awards Open to Students from Abroad:

The index on page 8 lists those awards that are open to students from other countries.

Graduate Awards Open to Canadian Students:

D.B.S. Reference Paper 21, Post-graduate Scholarships and Fellowships Open to Canadian Students, (latest edition December 1954), gives information on awards open to Canadian university graduates. It is intended that it will be revised every two years, alternating with this publication so that new editions of both will appear biennially.

A detailed listing of institutions and faculties of study, together with general information on entrance requirements and fees, appears in D.B.S. Reference Paper 48, Canadian Institutions of Higher Education, 1955-56.



1. American Can Company Scholarships

Field of study: Arts and Science, or Engineering.

Value: Full tuition fees.

Number: Variable. Duration: 4 years.

Conditions: Available to junior employees of the American Can Company who have completed at least one year's service with the Company, and to children of employees who have completed at least five year's service and whose salaries do not exceed \$700 per month. All applicants must have completed a high school education or its equivalent and must have a scholastic standing in the top third of the class. Candidates will be required to take the scholarship aptitude test given by the Col-lege Entrance Examination Board, French-speaking applicants in Canada will take a special test prepared and conducted by the University of Montreal.

Where tenable: Any approved privately controlled college or university in the United States or any Canadian college or university belonging to the National Con-

ference of Canadian Universities.
