PREFACE

This edition of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics Reference Paper 55 is the second revision of the original January 1955 publication. It is now published every two years, alternating with new editions of the biennial Reference Paper 21, *Awards for Graduate Study and Research*. Formerly titled *Undergraduate Scholarships and Bursaries (Open to Students Entering Canadian Universities)*, it has been retitled *University Entrance Awards*.

In this edition details of awards tenable at several institutions not previously included have been added; and there is a more complete coverage of awards given by professional and service organizations, and by business and industry.

The awards listed are limited to entrance scholarships and bursaries valued at \$100 or more. Most of the institutions included also have various loan funds and in-course awards, details about which can be found in the calendars of the individual universities or colleges.

This Reference Paper was prepared in the Education Division of the Bureau under the supervision of Ralph D. Mitchener, Chief of the Higher Education Section, with the assistance of J. Beattie MacLean, of Victoria College, Victoria, British Columbia, who was a Summer Research Assistant in the Section. The Industrial Foundation on Education, Toronto, Ontario, assisted by collecting information on the award programmes of many Canadian business and industrial organizations.

PRÉFACE

La présente édition du Document de référence n° 55 du Bureau fédéral de la statistique est la seconde révision de la première publication de janvier 1955. Elle paraîtra désormais tous les deux ans, en alternant avec les nouvelles éditions du Document de référence biennal n° 21, *Awards for Graduate Study and Research*. L'ancien titre *Bourses d'études pour sous-gradués (accessibles aux étudiants qui s'inscrivent dans les universités canadiennes)* a été changé en celui de *Bourses d'admission à l'université*.

La présente édition contient des renseignements sur des bourses valables dans plusieurs institutions qui n'étaient pas mentionnées auparavant et présente un relevé plus complet des bourses attribués par les organismes professionnels et sociaux, les entreprises et les industries.

La liste se limite aux bourses d'admission de \$100 ou plus. La plupart des institutions énumérées disposent aussi de fonds de prêt et de bourses de promotion; on trouvera des précisions sur ce sujet dans les annuaires particuliers des universités ou collèges.

Le présent document a été préparé par la Division de l'éducation du Bureau, sous la direction de M. Ralph D. Mitchener, chef de la Section de l'enseignement supérieur, avec le concours de M. J. Beattie McLean, de *Victoria College*, Victoria (C.-B.), assistant d'été aux Recherches dans la Section. *L'Industrial Foundation on Education*, de Toronto (Ont.), a collaboré en recueillant des renseignements sur les programmes de bourses de plusieurs entreprises et industries du Canada.

INTRODUCTION

Method of Compilation of Material

In addition to notices of awards that have come to the attention of the Education Division since the publication of the previous edition, the following procedure was used for this edition:

1. All entries in the 1956 edition were sent to the awarding agencies for additions and alterations.

2. All Canadian institutions not included in the 1956 edition, who were members of the National Conference of Canadian Universities, were requested to submit details of their entrance awards, as were many affiliated and independent institutions.

3. Over 1,000 associations, service groups, and the like, were circularized directly by the Bureau.

4. Over 1,000 business and industrial organizations were contacted by the Industrial Foundation on Education, with information obtained being forwarded by the Foundation to the Bureau.

Method of Listing Awards

The awards are listed in three main parts, as follows:

I. Awards open to residents of more than one province at institutions in more than one province.

II. Awards open to residents of single provinces (exclusive of awards tenable only at one institution).

III. Awards tenable at single institutions only. These awards, listed by province and institution, are classified for each institution in the following manner:

A. **National:** Awards open to students throughout Canada.

B. **Provincial:** Awards open to students from one province only (usually the province within which the institution is located, although some awards, as for example at certain Maritime institutions, are for students in more than one Maritime province).

C. **Other:** Awards open either to students from specific localities within a province or to certain specific groups of students.

Information in Part III is printed in the language of instruction (English or French) of the institution under which it appears. Parts I and II are bilingual.

In order to explore fully all available sources of awards tenable at any institution, the prospective student should consult all three parts. Awards tenable at more than one institution are not included in the listings in Part III, but appear in either Parts I or II.

Réunion des matériaux

En plus des avis de bourses qu'elle a reçus depuis la publication de l'édition précédente, la Division de l'éducation a préparé la présente édition de la façon suivante:

1. Toutes les inscriptions de l'édition de 1956 ont été envoyées aux organismes qui les attribuent pour les faire mettre au point.

2. Toutes les institutions canadiennes qui ne figuraient pas à l'édition de 1956 et qui étaient membres de l'Association des universités canadiennes, de même que plusieurs institutions affiliées ou indépendantes, ont été invitées à donner des précisions sur leurs bourses d'admission.

3. Plus de 1,000 associations, groupes sociaux et autres, ont reçu des circulaires directement du Bureau.

4. Plus de 1,000 entreprises et industries ont été questionnées par l'*Industrial Foundation on Education*, qui a fait parvenir au Bureau les renseignements obtenus.

Groupeement des bourses

Les bourses sont groupées sous les trois grandes rubriques que voici:

I. Bourses accessibles aux résidents de plus d'une province et valables aux institutions de plus d'une province.

II. Bourses accessibles aux résidents d'une seule province (à l'exclusion des bourses valables à une institution).

III. Bourses valables dans une seule institution. Groupées par province et institution, ces bourses sont classées, pour chaque institution, de la façon suivante:

A. **Nationales:** Bourses accessibles à tous les étudiants canadiens.

B. **Provinciales:** Bourses accessibles aux étudiants d'une seule province (habituellement la province où est située l'institution, bien que quelques bourses, par exemple dans certaines institutions des Maritimes, s'adressent à plus d'une province Maritime).

C. **Autres bourses:** Bourses accessibles, soit à des étudiants d'une localité déterminée dans une même province, soit à certains groupes déterminés d'étudiants.

Les renseignements donnés sous la III^e rubrique sont rédigés dans la langue d'enseignement (anglais ou français) de l'institution sous laquelle ils sont donnés.

Afin d'explorer à fond toutes les sources de bourses pour chaque institution, le futur étudiant doit consulter les trois rubriques. Les bourses valables à plus d'une institution ne figurent sous III^e rubrique mais plutôt sous les I^e ou II^e.

Two indexes appear in this publication. The first groups the awards in the three main parts, and includes a listing of awards open to students from outside Canada. The second index is designed to facilitate the location of information when only the name of the awarding agency, the name of the award, or the institution where the award is tenable (if specific institutions are named), is known.

Information that was received after the main parts were compiled is included in an addenda at the end of this publication. Where possible, they are included in the second index.

General Notes on Awards Listed

The closing date for application means the date by which completed application forms, official reports of standing, and other supporting documents must be in the hands of the awarding bodies. Initial contact should be made as early as possible before the closing dates in order to allow a sufficient interval for any exchange of correspondence and for the collection and forwarding of the necessary documents. As in most cases no personal interview is possible prior to the granting of the awards, applications and other material should be as complete as possible.

Awards Open to Students From Abroad

The index on page 14 lists those awards that are open to students from other countries.

List of Graduate Awards

D.B.S. Reference Paper 21, *Awards for Graduate Study and Research, 1957*, gives information on awards open throughout the world to Canadian university graduates, and on awards from Canadian sources open to graduates from other countries. It is revised every two years, alternating with this publication so that new editions of both appear biennially.

Further Information on Canadian Institutions of Higher Education

A listing of institutions and faculties of study, together with general information on entrance requirements and fees, appears in D.B.S. Reference Paper 48, *Canadian Institutions of Higher Education, 1955-1956*. The National Conference of Canadian Universities (140 Wellington St., Ottawa, Ontario), issues a biennial publication *Canadian Universities and Colleges* which gives more detailed information on most of the Canadian institutions.

La présente publication contient deux index. Le premier groupe les bourses en trois grandes parties et comprend un répertoire des bourses accessibles aux étudiants venus de l'étranger. Le deuxième index vise à faciliter la recherche des renseignements quand on ne connaît que le nom de l'organisme donateur, celui de la bourse, ou celui de l'institution où la bourse est valable (quand l'institution est nommée).

Les renseignements reçus après la rédaction des grandes parties sont portés à l'addenda à la fin de la publication. Là où la chose a été possible, on les a indiqués dans le second index.

La date limite de demande signifie la date à laquelle les formulaires dûment remplis, les rapports scolaires officiels et autres documents à l'appui doivent parvenir aux organismes attributeurs. Les démarches initiales doivent être faites assez tôt pour permettre un échange de correspondance et pour recueillir et expédier les documents nécessaires. Comme dans la plupart des cas, il ne peut y avoir d'entrevue personnelle avant l'octroi des bourses, la demande d'admission et les autres documents doivent être aussi complets que possible.

Le Document de référence n° 21 du B.F.S., *Awards for Graduate Study and Research, 1957*, fournit des indications sur les bourses accessibles partout au monde aux étudiants diplômés des universités canadiennes et sur les bourses canadiennes accessibles aux diplômés des autres pays. Il est révisé tous les deux ans, en alternant avec la présente publication; ainsi une nouvelle édition de chaque document paraîtra tous les deux ans.

1. American Can Company Scholarships

Field of study: Any undergraduate course leading to a degree.

Value: Full tuition fees.

Number: Variable. *Duration:* 4 years.

Conditions: Available to junior employees of the American Can Company in Canada, U.S.A., or Hawaii, who have completed at least one year's service with the Company, and to children of employees who have completed at least five years' service and whose salaries do not exceed \$850 per month. All applicants must have completed a high school education or its equivalent and must have a scholastic standing in the top third of the class. Students who have begun their college career will not be eligible. Candidates will be required to take the scholarship aptitude test given by the College Entrance Examination Board. French-speaking applicants in Canada will take a special test.

Where tenable: Any approved privately controlled college or university in the United States or any Canadian college or university belonging to the National Conference of Canadian Universities.

Apply: The Administrator, Scholarship Programme, Canadian Division, American Can Company, 92 King Street East, Hamilton, Ontario.

Awarding agency: American Can Company.

2. Beaverbrook Scholarships

Field of study: Any degree course.

Value: \$1200 per annum, plus cost of travel from the candidate's home to the university in Canada and the return fare at the end of the course. *Number:* 5.

Duration: Each year of a complete undergraduate degree course (maximum 5 years).

Conditions: Open to sons and daughters of employees of national and provincial newspapers in the United Kingdom. While no age limit is set, candidates should be at least 17 and not more than 21 years of age in September of the year the award is made. Scholars will be permitted to take any degree course providing they are properly qualified for admission. Passes in five subjects in the General Certificate of Education are normally sufficient to obtain admission to a Canadian university. Passes in six subjects, including three at advanced level, may enable a student to enter a course at the second-year level.

Where tenable: University of New Brunswick, University of Bishop's College, University of Toronto, University of Western Ontario or McGill University.

Awarding agency: The Beaverbrook Foundations.

Open to Students from United Kingdom.

3. Canadair Scholarships

Field of study: Engineering, or allied sciences.

Value: Up to \$1000 per year, with an additional grant of \$500 per year to any privately endowed college or university where candidate is enrolled. (\$750 of the scholarship is paid to the university for tuition, fees, etc.; \$250 is paid to student to help defray living expenses).

Number: 3, yearly. *Duration:* Maximum 5 years.

Conditions: Awarded to sons, or stepsons of Canadair employees who have been in the employ of the company for at least 3 years at time application is made. Applicant must be in upper half of his class scholastically at Junior or Senior Matriculation level. Extra-curricular activities, leadership, and character will be considered in addition to academic achievement.

1. Bourses de l'American Can Company

2. Bourses Beaverbrook

Disciplines: tout cours conduisant à un grade.

Montant: \$1200 par année, plus les frais de voyage du lieu d'habitation du candidat à l'Université au Canada, et retour à la fin du cours. *Nombre:* 5.

Durée: chaque année d'un cours de sous-gradué complet (maximum 5 ans).

3. Bourses de la Canadair

4. Canadian Allis-Chalmers Limited Scholarships

Field of study: Any full-time day course which leads to a Bachelor's degree in an approved college or university.

Value: \$500 per year. Each educational institution attended by students who are awarded new or renewal scholarships also receives \$500 each year.

Number: The scholarship plan is associated with that of the American parent Company. In all, 10 first year scholarships are awarded annually, of which 1 was won by a Canadian applicant in 1956-57.

Duration: 1 year, renewable yearly for the duration of the degree course.

Conditions: Candidates must be sons or daughters of Allis-Chalmers employees with 3 or more years service with the Company. Scholarship winners are selected each year by a committee comprised of impartial persons having no official connection with the Company. Candidates are required to take the scholastic aptitude test given by the College Entrance Examination Board, but other factors such as moral character, scholastic record and financial need are weighed in deciding the relative merit of applicants.

5. Canadian Association for the Deaf Scholarship

Field of study: Unrestricted.

Value: Variable, to a maximum of \$600 per academic year, payable in parts for each term or semester of study, dependent upon satisfactory academic progress.

Number: Unspecified.

Duration: According to course duration.

Conditions: Candidates must be bona-fide deaf persons who hold university entrance qualifications; must have been resident in Canada at least 5 years; must state college objective; must enrol in a college for session following award, except with permission of scholarship board for any postponement; awarded on bases of academic record, letters of recommendation from principal and others, character, determination to succeed, social adjustment, leadership, and proof of financial need.

Where tenable: Gallaudet College for the Deaf, Washington, D.C., or any approved university or college if the scholarship board is satisfied that the candidate may attend without handicap in his studies.

6. Canadian Federation of University Women- Local Club Scholarships and Bursaries.

Field of study: Generally unrestricted.

Value: Generally \$100 to \$200. *Number:* About 70.

Duration: Usually 1 year.

Conditions: The following clubs and alumnae associations grant university entrance awards of \$100 or over. The awards are generally only open to women students.

4. Bourses Canadian Allis-Chalmers Limited

Apply: Superintendent of local Institute for the Blind.

Awarding agency: Canadian National Institute for the Blind.

8. Canadian Osteopathic Association Scholarships

Field of study: Osteopathy.

Value: \$500 applicable to tuition fees, with a supplementary grant to college(s) where applicants are enrolled.

Number: Two a year to members of either the first or second year classes of recognized and approved colleges of osteopathy. (Two special scholarships of \$500 awarded to past recipients in 1956).

Duration: One year only, renewable by special application to the Board of Trustees, Canadian Osteopathic Educational Trust Fund.

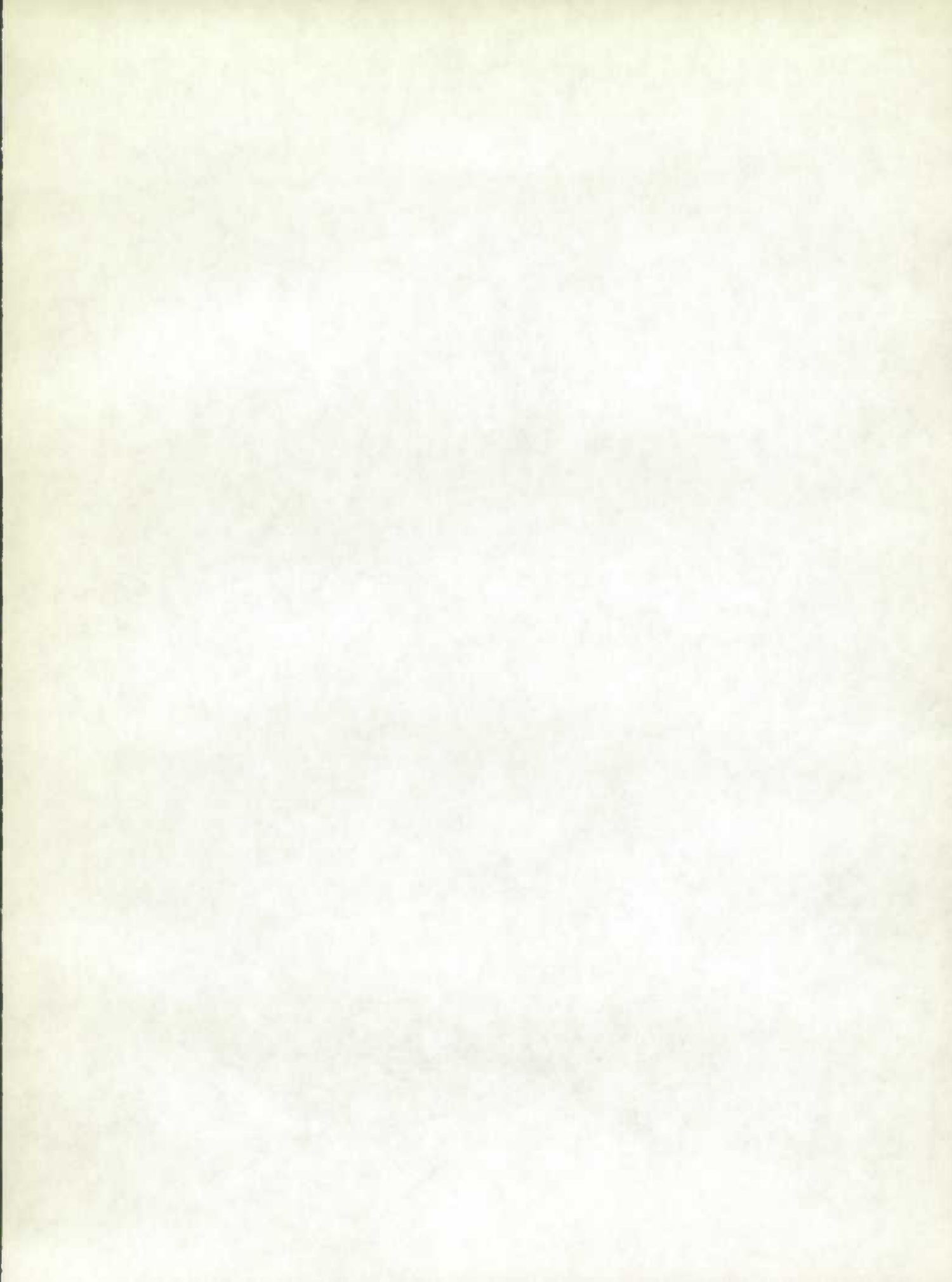
