POST GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS AND FELLOWSHIPS OPEN TO CANADIAN STUDENTS

The first catalogue of awards available to Canadian students for post graduate study and research was issued in January 1951. The demand for information on this subject was so great as to exhaust the issue within a few months of its release. The present revised edition contains a more representative coverage, in that a larger number of universities and Foundations located in the United States is included.

The data from American universities were obtained through the generous cooperation of the Heads of the Graduate Schools. A letter suggesting that these schools might wish to be included in the Canadian catalogue was sent to a selected group of American universities. The selection was based on the number of foreign students enrolled. The response was immediate and cordial. A great majority of the replies indicated that Canadian students are eligible for awards in American universities on equal terms with American students and that the universities are pleased to receive applications from Canadians. Only such universities as replied before December 15th are included in this catalogue.

The omission of awards in United States Schools of Medicine was due to lack of time to circularize the Medical Schools individually. Information for this field of study was not usually available from the same source as for other studies.

The list of awards from British sources was compiled from the International Handbook, Study Abroad, published by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization; and the document, Inter-Commonwealth Post Graduate Scholarships in Science, compiled by the British Commonwealth of Nations Scientific Liaison Officers, London. The selection of British entries was restricted to plural awards or in the case of a single award to those open to qualified Canadian students.

The awards for graduate study in Canadian universities do not include those restricted to graduates of particular universities, in the belief that it is only between universities that more information is required.

Little attempt has been made to list openings for part-time employment as instructor, lecturer, assistant, etc., although many more students are helped by such means than by scholarships. Where definite data were available from the Canadian university calendars or from the universities in the United States, they were included.

SECTION 1. AWARDS OPEN TO ALL OR SEVERAL DEPARTMENTS OF STUDY

(A) Canadian Sources

1. CANADIAN FEDERATION OF UNIVERSITY WOMEN, TRAVELLING FELLOWSHIP.

Field of Study: Unrestricted.

Value: \$1500; Number: 1 Duration: One academic year.

Conditions: Open to women graduates of Canadian universities; age limit 35 years.

Preference given to women who have had one or two years of graduate study and who have a definite course of further study or research work in view.

Where tenable: Unrestricted.

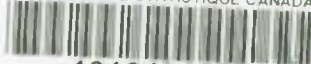
