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PRELIMINARY MONTHLY REPORT

VITAL STATISTICS

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This Bulletin gives a preliminary report on Births, Deaths and Marriages for the month of August, 1929, for the nine provinces of Canada.

In comparing the figures for August, 1929, with those of the same month for previous years, it should be remembered that for previous years the reports represent final figures while those for 1929 are provisional. Attention is further directed to the fact that previous to 1926 the province of Quebec was not included in the Registration Area.

BIRTHS

The total number of births reported for the nine provinces of Canada in August, 1929, was 19,312, as against 19,948 for August of last year. The only provinces which showed increases were New Brunswick and Manitoba.

There were altogether 19,684 confinements. Single confinements numbered 19,468, resulting in 18,897 children born alive and 571 children born dead. Twin births numbered 212, in 197 cases both infants were born alive while in 9 cases one only was born alive and in 6 cases both were born dead. There were four sets of triplets, in which all the children were born alive.

Stillbirths reported in August were distributed as follows: Prince Edward Island 1, Nova Scotia 22, New Brunswick 23, Quebec 173, Ontario 212, Manitoba 56, Saskatchewan 40, Alberta 44, British Columbia 21; making a total of 592. Stillbirths are not counted either as births or deaths.

MORTALITY

MATERNAL MORTALITY - The number of maternal deaths in each province is given by certain age groups in Table 4. The maternal mortality rate computed on the basis of 1,000 living births was 4.8 for August, 1929. The rates for the same month in the preceding years were as follows: 1928, 5.3; 1927, 5.2; 1926, 3.9; 1925, 5.3; 1924, 5.2; 1923, 3.9; 1922, 5.1; and 1921 4.4. As already indicated the province of Quebec previous to 1926 was not included in the Registration Area.

INFANT MORTALITY - In Table 5 mortality of children under one year of age is given for the principal causes of death. Of the total number of infant deaths reported for August, 89 per cent were attributable to the causes of death listed in the table. The mortality amongst children under one year of age was 82.4 per 1,000 live births; the rate for males was 93.6 per 1,000 and for females 70.7 per 1,000.

GENERAL MORTALITY - Table 6 gives deaths among the population generally from certain specified causes, by provinces, while Table 7 gives similar information for cities of 30,000 population and over.

MARRIAGES

The number of marriages reported is shown by totals and percentages in Table 8.


