REGISTRATIONS OF BIRTHS, DEATHS AND MARRIAGES, FEBRUARY, 1930.

The Dominion Eureau of Statistics issues to-day the number of registrations of births, deaths and marriages during the month of February, 1930 in cities of Canada which had a population of 10,000 inhabitants or over at the last Census. Stillbirths are registered both as births and deaths, but form only a small proportion of the total.


These figures are based on summary monthly reports of registrations furnished either by the Provincial Departments charged with this work or by city Registration Offices with the approval of the Provincial Departments.

Except where otherwise specified, the registrations include all births, deaths and marriages which occurred in a given city.

As compared with January, births registered in February in the cities listed showed a decline of 2 per cent. In the Maritime Provinces there was an increase of 3 per cent, but registrations were fewer in Quebec, Ontario, the Prairie Provinces and British Columbia, the reductions being 2 per cent,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  percent, 1 per cent and 7 per cent respectively.

Deaths registered in February in these cities were 7 per cent less than in January. The reduction amounted to 19 per cent in the Maritime Provinces, 10 per cent in Quebec. 1 per cent in Ontario, 7 per cent in the Prairie Provinces and 14 per cent in British Columbia.

Marriage registrations in the cities in February showed  $9\frac{1}{2}$  per cent less than in January. There was a decline of 14 per cent in the Maritime Provinces, 20 per cent in Quebec, 13 per cent in the Prairie Provinces and 12 per cent in British Columbia. The cities of Ontario recorded a very slight gain in the number of marriages.
