REGISTRATIONS OF BIRTHS, DEATHS AND MARRIAGES, APRIL, 1933.

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics issues today the number of registrations of births, deaths and marriages during the month of April, 1933, in 70 cities of Canada. Stillbirths are registered both as births and deaths.

Births registered in April numbered 6,878, deaths 3,892 and marriages 1,982, as compared with 7,375 births, 4,500 deaths and 2,254 marriages in April of last year, showing decreases of 7 per cent in births, $13\frac{1}{2}$ per cent in deaths and 12 per cent in marriages.

During the four months January-April of this year, births registered in the same cities totalled 27,279, deaths 16,115 and marriages 7,503 as against 29,571 births, 17,632 deaths and 7,889 marriages during the corresponding period last year. This comparison shows decreases of $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent in births, $8\frac{1}{2}$ per cent in deaths and 5 per cent in marriages.
