## REGISTRATIONS OF BIRTHS, DEATHS AND MARRIAGES, JUNE, 1937.

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics issues today the number of registrations of births, deaths and marriages during the month of June, 1937, in 67 cities and towns of Canada having 10,000 population and over.

Births registered in these cities and towns during June numbered 7,218, deaths 4,510 and marriages 4,541 as compared with 6,673 births, 4,059 deaths and 1,504 marriages in June last year, showing increases of 8 per cent in births, 11 per cent in deaths and one per cent in marriages.

Births registered during the six months January - June of this year totalled 40,250, deaths 28,479 and marriages 16,756, as against 40,290, births, 26,690 deaths and 15,779 marriages during the corresponding six months of last year. This comparison shows practically no change in births and increases of 7 per cent in deaths and 6 per cent in marriages respectively.
