## REGISTRATIONS OF BIRTHS, DEATHS AND MARRIAGES, DECEMBER, 1939.

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics issues to-day the number of registrations of births, deaths and marriages during the month of December, 1939, in 67 cities and towns of Canada having 10,000 population and over.

Births registered in these cities and towns in December numbered 6,536, deaths 4,505 and marriages 4,967 as compared with 7,263 births, 4,659 deaths and 3,158 marriages in December last year, showing decreases of 10 per cent in births and 3 per cent in deaths and an increase of 57 per cent in marriages.

During the whole year 1939 births registered in the same cities and towns totalled 86,170, deaths 52,585 and marriages 51,108 as against 84,608 births, 51,709 deaths and 41,194 marriages in 1938. This comparison shows increases of 2 per cent in births,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  per cent in deaths and 24 per cent in marriages.
