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REGISTRATIONS OF BIRTHS, DEATHS AND MARRIAGES, MARCH, 1939.

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics issues today the number of registrations of births, deaths and marriages during the month of March, 1939, in 67 cities and towns of Canada having 10,000 population and over.

Births registered in these cities and towns in March numbered 7,316, deaths 5,422 and marriages 1,679, as compared with 7,179 births, 4,796 deaths and 1,927 marriages in March last year, showing increases of 2 per cent in births and 13 per cent in deaths and a decrease of 12½ per cent in marriages.

Births registered during the three months January - March of this year totalled 20,944, deaths 14,603 and marriages 6,389 as against 20,528 births, 13,575 deaths and 6,713 marriages during the corresponding three months of last year. This comparison shows increases of 2 per cent in births and 7½ per cent in deaths and a decrease of 5 per cent in marriages.
