The pamphlet replaces the usual mimeographed bulletin. The pages will be included on the main Report on Criminal Statistics when the latter is issued later.

The subject has been treated in a more detailed and extended form than previously—which it is hoped will make it of added value to those interested in work on Child Welfare.

JUVENILE DELINQUENTS, 1927

INTRODUCTION

In compiling the returns which are included in this report, it has been the policy of the Bureau of Statistics to deal with persons rather than with cases, with offenders rather than offences. Thus it is the number of convicted delinquents that is considered rather than the number of delinquencies, which is necessarily somewhat larger, as in certain cases the delinquent commits more than one offence on the same occasion.

The number of cases in which juveniles are charged with offences is naturally larger than the number of juveniles convicted, as shown below. The following tables do not deal with the cases where the disposition is given as "withdrawn", "adjourned *sine die*", etc., or where charges for minor offences are reported as "dismissed". While the disposition "adjourned *sine die*" is somewhat indefinite, it is used in certain courts as final disposition of the case. In previous reports those whose cases have been disposed of in this way have been included with delinquents, on the assurance of the courts concerned that there was guilt in all cases so disposed of; thus this disposition of a case has in the past been regarded as equivalent to "suspended sentence". Recently, however, objections have been made to this method of treatment, particularly in Toronto, where about 60 p.c. of the cases are thus disposed of. Consequently, in the present report all cases adjourned *sine die* are treated similarly to those dismissed, but are entered separately, while only those are considered delinquents in whose cases delinquency is definitely proven. Yet these cases are a disturbing element in the statistics, as they occur not only among the minor but also among the major offences, such as theft, house and shop-breaking. A dismissal means "not guilty", but there is obviously a doubt where adjourned cases are not proceeded with, as here.

The dispositions made of the juvenile offenders are naturally more varied than are those of adults. A term in a reformatory or house of correction is the maximum penalty, and usually not more than 7 or 8 p.c. are disposed of in this way. Others are "detained indefinitely", that is, in most cases, in detention homes. The largest number are placed on probation, fined, or ordered to pay damages and make restitution, while "corporal punishment" and "sentence suspended" are other methods of disposal. In this connection it may be pointed out that, though not definitely provided for in the Juvenile Delinquents Act, (R.S.C. 1927, c. 108) the two last-mentioned methods are shown in returns. Corporal punishment is variously entered as "strapped", "whipped", "spanked", etc. In some cases it is stated that corporal punishment was administered "with the consent of parents", but it must be presumed that the parents' consent was always obtained.

The proportion of cases dealt with under the Juvenile Delinquents Act is not definitely shown in the returns, but in most of the cities this Act has been adopted. The cases from the 32 cities shown in the tables, which amounted to over 80 p.c. of the total for Canada, are for the most part dealt with under the Act. The remainder are from smaller places and are returned by the police magistrates who proceed under the Criminal Code and municipal regulations. But the purpose of this report is to analyze the cases of boys and girls under the age of 16 years who have been so unfortunate as to require the intervention of the law to adjust their public behaviour, irrespective of the method of procedure.

ANNUAL REPORT OF JUVENILE DELINQUENTS

In order that the tables for 1927 might be made comparable with those for at least one year back, the returns for 1926 have been recompiled and the cases adjourned *sine die* deducted. This affects the tables of classified offences, birthplaces, religions, occupations, age and school grades, since these details are furnished only in the cases of delinquents.

The following table of the number of juveniles brought before the courts, shows the number of dismissals and the number of convicted delinquents for the years 1926 and 1927—

It will be seen by the above that in the latest year the actual number of delinquents increased but very slightly (1.3 p.c.) in respect of major offences, which is the most important feature to be studied; these will be taken up in detail following the next table.

The number of juveniles convicted of major and minor offences are shown below by sex and provinces for 1926 and 1927.

There was thus in 1927 an increase of 4.01 p.c. in the grand total of boys and of 11.01 p.c. in the grand total of girls convicted. The increases among boys convicted for major and minor offences were 2.38 p.c. and 7.16 p.c. respectively. Girls convicted for major offences decreased by 17.13 p.c., but those convicted for minor offences increased by 39.16 p.c.

Of the total juvenile delinquents of 7,831 for 1926 and 8,185 for 1927, 6,524 and 6,533 respectively were returned from 32 of the principal cities (Table X), i.e., 83.20 p.c. and 79.81 p.c. respectively. The population of these cities (1921) was 2,406,515, the average of juvenile delinquents for the two years being 271 delinquents per 100,000 of the 1921 population. For the remaining and mostly rural part of Canada, the delinquency averaged only 23 per 100,000 population for the two years.

MAJOR OFFENCES

The number of juveniles that were proven guilty of major offences in Canada is shown below in a condensed grouping of offences for 1926 and 1927. (See Table IV for further details).

There was then a slight increase of 66 or 1.3 p.c. in the total number of offenders in 1927. In 1926 there was an increase of 1.01 p.c. over 1925, which shows that there was but little change in the numbers for the three latest years. In offences against the person (the first seven items shown above) there was a decrease in 1927 of 41 or 18.64 p.c. In "breaking, entering and theft" there was an increase of 117 or 17.92 p.c. In plain theft and receiving stolen goods there was a decrease of 173 or 5 p.c. Wilful damage to property increased 43.40 p.c. in 1927, but immoral conduct decreased 40.35 p.c. The youthful burglars, robbers and thieves constituted in 1927, 78.76 p.c. of the major delinquents. The proportion for 1926 was 80.98 p.c., in 1925 79.72 p.c. and in 1924, 76.24 p.c., indicating steadiness in the types of delinquency.

REPEATERS (FOR MAJOR OFFENCES ONLY)

The proportion of repeaters has also been a steady factor. For each of the three years prior to 1927 the numbers were 1,068, 1,174 and 1,138, or a percentage of between 22 p.c. and 23 p.c. of the whole for each year. For 1927 the number of repeaters, 1,327 or 25.7 p.c., is the highest since 1923, when the percentage was 26.4.

The number of delinquents brought before the court one or more times is shown below for 1926 and 1927.

DISPOSITION OF JUVENILE OFFENDERS

As stated in a previous report, only about 35 p.c. of the delinquents are given what may be termed punitive sentences, such as corporal punishment, a term in the reformatory or otherwise detained, fined or required to pay damages or to otherwise make restitution. The other 65 p.c. are disposed of by being warned, reprimanded or put under supervision, which are corrective rather than punitive methods. It would appear that it may be the character and condition of the accused rather than the class of offence that governs the disposition, for we find the latter distributed amongst all classes of offences.

The following table shows the dispositions of major offences for 1926 and 1927:—

There was an increase of 62·65 p.c. in the number not counted as delinquents, but the number of delinquents, as previously stated, increased by only 1·3 p.c. It is a rather notable fact that 828 (in 1927) children should be taken before the court charged with major offences, with not sufficient evidence to warrant their conviction. In the case of minor offences, the number so treated is still greater.

PLACE OF BIRTH

The birthplaces of delinquents convicted of major offences in 1926 and 1927 are shown below:—

It will be seen by the above that among the delinquents, Canadian-born of Canadian parents averaged less than 45 p.c. of the total for the two years, while 25 p.c. were Canadian-born of foreign-born parents, and less than 12 p.c. were Canadian-born of British-born parents. Those born in foreign countries averaged 4·39 p.c.

**BIRTHPLACES, RACES AND RELIGIONS OF DELINQUENTS, WITH RATIO TO
POPULATION**

By using the census figures of 1921 for birthplace, origin and religious affiliation of the people, certain comparisons can be made respecting the ratio of delinquency for different classes of people, as shown in the table following. It should, however, be stated that all such analyses and comparisons between the birthplaces, racial origins, religions, etc., of the juvenile delinquents and of the general population are very rough approximations, in particular because of the fact that convicted juvenile delinquents are mainly urban dwellers. Thus the people of a particular birthplace, or race or religion who are preponderatingly urban dwellers are likely to be shown as contributing more than their proportionate share to the juvenile delinquents. Similarly, the population of a particular birth place, race or religion who are predominantly rural dwellers, are likely to be shown as contributing less than their proportionate share to the juvenile delinquents.

The population figures of the age-groups of 10 to 20 years of age form the nearest group obtainable to the age-group of the juvenile delinquents. It will be seen (by the first section of the table) that the Canadian-born of foreign parents produce the greatest percentage of delinquents, *i.e.*, 95 per 10,000 population. Those of British-born parents (out of Canada) are next with 62. The Canadians of Canadian-born parents show 19·8 per 10,000. But it is notable that the British and foreign-born produce the smallest ratio of delinquents, *i.e.*, 8·8 and 13·1 per 10,000 respectively.

The second part of the table shows the ratio of the Canadian-born children of foreign parents by several of the largest racial groups. The figures of population in this section are available only by origin and not by birthplace, consequently the populations given are in excess of what would be the case if the birthplaces could be used. This fact obviously gives a more favourable ratio than would be otherwise shown. But even as given the figures appear significant when compared with the groups above.

ANNUAL REPORT OF JUVENILE DELINQUENTS

The principal religious denominations of the juveniles convicted of major offences in 1926 and 1927 are shown as follows, with the proportion per 100,000 population professing these religions:—

The occupations of the fathers of delinquents are given in the following table. Particularly notable, apart from the high proportion of cases in which the occupation of the father is not given, is the large number of cases in which the fathers are described as laborers, in which connection the question of the responsibility of heredity or environment comes up for consideration. It will also be noted that in upwards of 200 cases, the father is deceased.

The above figures show that the greatest number of delinquents is at age 14, with but a slight falling off at age 15. The comparatively steady increase from the youngest age up is what would be expected. The proportion of girls dropped from 5·6 p.c. in 1926 to 4·6 p.c. in 1927, or in numbers from 286 to 237.

The school grades of delinquents, as totalled up for the English-speaking provinces (the grading in Quebec not being comparable to that of the remainder of the Dominion) are shown by sex of delinquents below. Those whose educational standing was not given are not included in this table.

As in former years, grade V proved to be the grade of the greatest number of delinquent boys in 1926 and 1927, the percentage in each grade increasing to grade V, then declining, but not quite so rapidly, up to the secondary grades standard. The educational standard of the greatest number of girls is shown to be grade IV. This notwithstanding the fact that the girls are on the average older than the boys. Taking the average for the two years, it is seen that 82·5 p.c. of the boys as against 88 p.c. of the girls were over ten years of age. The average age of the boys was 12·4 years and that of the girls 13 years.

MINOR OFFENCES

The minor offences, for which complete tables are given on p.p. 32 to 36, were disposed of as shown below in 1926 and 1927.

The variations of minor offences are not notable and call for no particular comment, but some of the principal items are breaches of by-laws which for the two years averaged 28·26 p.c. of the total. Disorderly conduct accounted for 11·11 p.c., incorrigibility, 12·13 p.c., trespass, 16·03 p.c., truancy, 6·55 p.c. and vagrancy and wandering away from home, 12·32 p.c., for the two years.

JEUNES DÉLINQUANTS, EN 1927.

INTRODUCTION

Dans la compilation des données composant ce rapport, le Bureau Fédéral de la Statistique a pour habitude de traiter des personnes et non pas des cas, des accusés plutôt que des accusations. C'est pourquoi le nombre d'inculpés trouvés coupables nous occupe plutôt que le nombre d'inculpations, qui est nécessairement plus grand, parce que, dans certains cas, l'accusé a commis plus d'une offense dans une même occasion.

Le nombre de causes dans lesquelles les accusés étaient des enfants est naturellement plus grand que le nombre d'enfants condamnés. Les tableaux qui suivent ne traitent pas des causes qui ont été retirées ou ajournées *sine die*, etc., ou bien, là où l'accusation pour contravention simple a été renvoyée. Bien que la disposition d'une cause ajournée *sine die* soit plutôt indéfinie c'est, devant plusieurs tribunaux, le classement final de l'affaire. Dans les rapports antérieurs, les causes terminées de cette manière étaient comprises avec celles d'accusations fondées, parce que les tribunaux concernés avaient la preuve de la culpabilité et, dans le passé, la signification d'une cause ajournée *sine die* était l'équivalent de "sentence suspendue". Mais, récemment, on a fait des objections à cette méthode de classement, principalement à Toronto où environ 60 p.c. des causes sont ainsi classées. En conséquence, dans le rapport actuel, toutes les causes ajournées *sine die* sont classées avec celles renvoyées, mais entrées séparément, tandis que ne sont considérés comme délinquants que ceux dont le délit est établi d'une manière définitive. Tout de même ces causes sont un élément de confusion dans les statistiques, parce qu'elles se rencontrent non seulement dans les contraventions simples, mais même dans les offenses graves, comme le vol et le cambriolage. Une cause renvoyée veut dire "non coupable", mais il y a évidemment doute, là où la cause ajournée n'est jamais reprise.

Dans le cas des jeunes délinquants, le traitement des inculpés est naturellement plus varié que dans celui des adultes. Le séjour à l'Ecole de Réforme est la plus grande pénalité et, généralement, une telle condamnation n'est imposée que dans 7 à 8 p.c. des cas. D'autres sont détenus indéfiniment, c'est-à-dire, dans la plupart des cas, dans des établissements spéciaux de détention. Pour le plus grand nombre, les accusés sont laissés sous surveillance, condamnés à l'amende ou forcés de payer des dommages et faire restitution et, dans certains autres cas, un châtiment corporel ou une sentence suspendue sont les autres méthodes. A ce sujet, il est bon de noter que si la loi des jeunes délinquants (S.R. du Canada 1927, chap. 108) ne mentionne pas les deux derniers modes de punition, on les rencontre dans le rapport. La punition corporelle est inscrite soit comme fouet, verge, etc.; dans certains cas il est mentionné que la punition corporelle est appliquée avec le consentement des parents, mais il faut présumer que le consentement des parents est toujours obtenu.

La proportion de causes entendues en vertu de la loi des jeunes délinquants n'est pas montrée d'une manière définitive dans le rapport, mais cette loi a été adoptée dans presque toutes les villes. Les causes des 32 villes paraissant dans les tableaux, qui représentent plus de 80 p. 100 du total du Canada, ont été en plus grande partie jugées en vertu de cette loi. Les autres causes viennent d'endroits où les magistrats appliquent le code criminel et les règlements municipaux. Mais le but de ce rapport est d'analyser les cas de garçons et filles au-dessous de 16 ans qui ont eu l'infortune de forcer l'intervention de la loi pour réprimer leur inconduite, quelle que soit la méthode de procédure suivie.

Afin que les tableaux de 1927 soient comparables au moins avec ceux de l'année précédente, les rapports de 1926 ont été recomplis et les causes ajournées *sine die* déduites. Ceci affecte les tableaux des offenses classifiées: lieux de naissance, religions, occupations, âges et degrés scolaires, depuis que ces détails sont fournis, mais seulement sur ceux qui sont trouvés délinquants.

Le tableau ci-dessous du nombre d'enfants traduits devant les tribunaux donne le nombre de causes renvoyées, le nombre d'accusations fondées pour les années 1926 et 1927:

On voit qu'en 1927 il y a une augmentation très légère du nombre de délinquants, 1.3 p.c. en ce qui concerne les offenses criminelles; ce qui forme la partie la plus importante de cette étude et fera l'objet du tableau suivant.

On voit qu'en 1927 il y a une augmentation de 4.01 p.c. dans le grand total de garçons et 11.01 dans le grand total de filles trouvés coupables d'accusations quelconques. Les accusations de garçons trouvés coupables d'offenses graves ou de simples délits étaient de 2.38 p.c. et 7.16 p.c. respectivement. Le nombre de filles accusées d'offenses graves a diminué de 17.13 p.c. et celui de filles trouvées coupables de simples contraventions a augmenté de 39.16 p.c.

Sur le total de jeunes délinquants, 7,831 pour 1926 et 8,185 pour 1927, 6,524 et 6,533 respectivement venaient de 32 des principales villes (tableau X), c'est-à-dire 83.20 p.c. et 79.81 p.c. respectivement. La population de ces villes en 1921 était de 2,406,515, et la moyenne des jeunes délinquants, pour les deux années, était de 271 par 100,000 de population. Pour le reste du Canada, en plus grande partie les régions rurales, la criminalité juvénile ne donne en moyenne que 23 par 100,000 de population pour ces deux années.

OFFENSES GRAVES

Le nombre d'enfants trouvés coupables d'offenses graves au Canada et la classification condensée des chefs d'accusation en 1926 et 1927 sont donnés ci-dessous. (Pour plus de détails, voir le tableau IV.)

L'augmentation de jeunes condamnés en 1927 est de 66 ou 1·3 p.c. du total, En 1926 il y avait une augmentation de 1·01 p.c. sur 1925, ce qui démontre qu'il y a eu peu de changement dans les trois dernières années. Dans les offenses contre la personne, (les trois premiers item de la liste ci-dessus) il y a une diminution de 41 ou 18·54 p.c. en 1927. L'item de cambriolage montre une augmentation de 117 ou 17·92 p.c. Dans le vol simple et recel, il y a diminution de 173 ou 5 p.c. Dans celui de dommages intentionnels à la propriété, il y a une augmentation de 43·40 p.c., tandis que dans celui d'immoralité, la diminution est de 40·35 p.c. Le vol avec ou sans effraction ou violence forme, en 1927, 78·76 p.c. des délits graves chez les enfants. La proportion de 1926 était de 80·98 p.c.; de 1925, 79·72 p.c. et de 1924, 76·24 p.c., ce qui indique une certaine stabilité dans ces types de crime.

RÉCIDIVISTES (POUR OFFENSES GRAVES SEULEMENT)

La proportion des récidivistes est aussi un facteur permanent pour chacune des trois années précédant 1927; leurs chiffres sont respectivement 1,068, 1,174 et 1,138 ou un pourcentage variant de 22 p.c. à 23 p.c. pour chaque année. Pour 1927 le nombre des récidivistes est de 1,327 ou 25·7 p.c. le plus élevé depuis 1923, alors qu'il avait atteint 26·4.

On voit ci-dessous le nombre de délinquants paraissant en cour pour la première fois ou ayant déjà paru antérieurement.

SUITES DONNÉES AUX ACCUSATIONS

Tel que dit dans un rapport précédent, seulement 35 p.c. des jeunes délinquants reçoivent ce que l'on peut appeler une sentence punitive, telle que, le châtiment corporel, une condamnation à l'école de réforme ou autres maisons de détention, une amende, des dommages ou une restitution. Les autres 65 p.c. reçoivent soit un avertissement, une réprimande ou sont laissés sous surveillance, méthodes correctives plutôt que punitives. Il semble que c'est plutôt le caractère de l'accusé que celui de l'accusation qui détermine la sentence, parce que nous trouvons la dernière méthode répartie à peu près dans toutes les catégories d'accusation.

Voici comment les juges ont disposé des jeunes délinquants trouvés coupables de délits graves en 1926 et 1927.

Il y a une augmentation de 62.65 p.c. dans le nombre de ceux qui ne sont pas comptés comme délinquants, mais le nombre des délinquants, comme nous l'avons déjà dit, a seulement augmenté de 1.3 p.c. Il est plutôt remarquable que 828 enfants, en 1927, soient traduits devant les tribunaux sur des accusations graves sans preuves suffisantes pour justifier leur condamnation. Dans le cas de contravention simple, le nombre de causes aboutissant de la même manière est encore plus élevé.

On constate par ces chiffres qu'en ces deux années, les enfants nés au Canada de parents canadiens forment moins de 45 p.c. du total des jeunes délinquants, tandis que 25 p.c. sont nés au Canada de parents nés à l'étranger et moins de 12 p.c. sont nés au Canada de parents nés en d'autres parties de l'Empire Britannique. Ceux nés en pays étrangers forment 4.39 p.c. du total.

LIEUX DE NAISSANCE, RACES ET RELIGIONS DES JEUNES DÉLINQUANTS PROPOR-
TIONNELLEMENT À LA POPULATION

En se servant des chiffres du recensement de 1921 pour les lieux de naissance, les origines et les religions de la population, il est possible de faire certaines comparaisons proportionnelles de la criminalité dans différentes classes de la nation, comme dans le tableau qui suit. Cependant, il est bon de rappeler que dans toutes telles analyses et comparaisons entre les lieux de naissance, origines raciales, religions, etc., des jeunes délinquants et de la population en général, il n'y a que des approximations, en partie par ce que le plus grand nombre des jeunes condamnés habitent la ville. Ainsi, les gens nés en une certaine place ou ceux d'une race ou d'une religion qui ont plus que d'autres une tendance à habiter les villes, sont plus probablement ceux devant contribuer plus que leur proportion au nombre de jeunes délinquants. De même la population née dans une certaine place appartenant à une certaine race ou religion qui habite préférablement la campagne, aura aussi une tendance à contribuer moins que sa part proportionnelle au nombre de jeunes délinquants.

Les chiffres de la population donnant le groupe d'âges le plus rapproché pouvant absorber tous les jeunes délinquants sont ceux du groupe de 10 à 20 ans. On voit par la première section du tableau ci-dessus que les nés au Canada de parents étrangers fournissent la plus grande proportion de délinquants, c'est-à-dire 95 par 10,000 âmes; ceux nés de parents britanniques hors du Canada viennent ensuite avec 62; les nés au Canada de parents canadiens donnent 19·8 par 10,000. Mais, en même temps, on constate que les britanniques et les nés à l'étranger donnent la plus petite proportion de délinquants, c'est-à-dire 8·8 et 13·1 par 10,000 respectivement.

La seconde partie du tableau donne la proportion d'enfants nés au Canada de parents étrangers, par groupes de races principales. Les chiffres de population de cette section ne touchent que l'origine et non pas le lieu de naissance, conséquemment les populations données sont en excédent de ce qu'elles seraient si on se servait des lieux de naissances.

Ceci donne une proportion beaucoup plus favorable, mais même tels qu'ils sont, ces chiffres ont leur signification quand on les compare avec les groupes qui les précèdent.

Le tableau qui suit donne la répartition des enfants trouvés coupables d'offenses graves en 1926 et 1927, suivant leur religion, avec proportion par 10,000 âmes composant ces mêmes religions.

Le tableau suivant donne les occupations des pères des délinquants. On y remarque, outre la forte proportion de cas où l'occupation du père n'est pas donnée, un grand nombre de cas où l'occupation du père est décrite comme journalier, ce qui soulève la question de la responsabilité ou de l'influence que peuvent avoir l'hérédité ou le milieu. On remarque aussi que dans plus de 200 cas, le père est décédé.

Ces chiffres montrent que la majorité des jeunes délinquants ont 14 ans et que la criminalité ne tend à baisser que légèrement à 15 ans. Cette tendance d'augmentation de criminalité des jeunes délinquants avec l'âge est naturellement ce qu'il fallait attendre. La proportion de filles a baissé de 5.6 p.c. en 1926 à 4.6 p.c. en 1927, ou en chiffres absolus, de 286 à 237.

Le tableau ci-dessous donne le degré d'instruction des jeunes délinquants mais pour les provinces de langue anglaise seulement, attendu que la gradation scolaire de la province de Québec n'est pas sur la même échelle que dans le reste du Cominion. Ceux dont le degré d'instruction n'est pas donné ne paraissent pas dans ce tableau.

Comme dans les années passées, c'est le degré V qui fournit le plus grand nombre de garçons condamnés par les tribunaux en 1926 et 1927, le pourcentage de chaque degré augmentant jusqu'au V, après quoi il baisse, mais pas aussi rapidement jusqu'aux degrés secondaires. Pour les filles, c'est dans le degré IV que l'on rencontre le plus grand nombre de celles condamnées par les tribunaux et ce, en dépit du fait que les filles sont en moyenne plus vieilles que les garçons. La moyenne des deux années montre que 82·5 des garçons et 88 p.c. des filles ont plus de 10 ans. L'âge moyen des garçons est de 12·4 ans et celui des filles de 13 ans.
