

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PREFACE

Police statistics have been published by the Bureau since 1920 and in the past have included police administration, crime and traffic enforcement statistics.

The 1960 and future editions will be published in three separate bulletins: *Police Administration Statistics*, *Crime Statistics*, *Traffic Enforcement Statistics*.

Crime and Traffic Enforcement Statistics for 1960 will be published later this year.

Another change in the format of these reports is the grouping of urban areas by population size.

The data compiled herein were obtained from municipal police departments in urban centres of 750 population or more and from Federal, Provincial and railway police.

The Bureau gratefully acknowledges the invaluable assistance of all those individuals, agencies and police forces whose co-operation has made this report possible.

This report was prepared in the Judicial Section of the Bureau.

PRÉFACE

Le Bureau publie la statistique de la police depuis 1920, laquelle, dans le passé, contenait la statistique de l'administration, la statistique de la criminalité et la statistique de l'application des règlements de la circulation.

L'édition de 1960 est publiée en trois tranches intitulées: *Statistique de l'administration policière*, *Statistique de la criminalité* et *Statistique de l'application des règlements de la circulation*. Il en sera de même des éditions futures.

Les deux dernières tranches mentionnées, en ce qui touche l'année 1960, paraîtront plus tard cette année.

Le regroupement des régions urbaines selon la taille de leur population constitue une innovation dans la présentation de ces rapports.

Les chiffres du présent rapport proviennent des services de police municipaux des centres de 750 habitants ou plus, ainsi que des services de police fédéraux, provinciaux et des chemins de fer.

Le Bureau remercie toutes les personnes et tous les organismes et services de police de leur collaboration qui a rendu possible la publication du présent rapport.

Le rapport a été rédigé à la Section de la statistique judiciaire du Bureau.

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INTRODUCTION

The report of police administration statistics for the calendar year, 1960 surveys the administrative aspects of municipal police forces in urban communities, of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, the Ontario Provincial Police, the Quebec Provincial Police and the Railway Police.

Commencing with this report the QPP have reported some of their administration statistics covering the number of policemen and civilians employed, and the number of police officers killed on duty.

Urban communities included in Tables 1 and 2 are:

- (a) Communities with a population size of 750 and over, including urban areas policed under contract by the RCMP and the OPP.
- (b) Communities with a population size of less than 750, policed under contract by the RCMP.
- (c) Townships, districts, district and rural municipalities, etc., policed under contract by the RCMP or the OPP.

A number of urban municipalities are excluded from this report because:

- (a) Community size was less than 750 although they have a police force.
- (b) Communities were without a police force although their population was more than 750.
- (c) Communities, while more than 750 population, were policed by the QPP as part of their regular duties.

There were 952 communities with a population of 750 and over exclusive of the QPP, the OPP and the RCMP when acting in their capacity as provincial and federal police forces.

Complete monthly reports were received from 767 departments representing 80.6% of potential contributors. There were 108 departments or 11.3% who submitted less than 12 monthly reports and 77 departments or 8.1% who did not report.

Tables cannot be compared with previous years because of increased coverage.

Le rapport statistique sur l'administration de la police pour l'année civile 1960 étudie l'aspect administratif des services de police municipaux dans les centres urbains, de la Gendarmerie royale du Canada, de la Police provinciale de l'Ontario, de la Sûreté provinciale du Québec et de la police des chemins de fer.

A compter du présent rapport, la Sûreté provinciale du Québec a soumis une partie de sa statistique administrative qui porte sur le nombre d'agents de police et le nombre de civils à son emploi, ainsi que sur le nombre d'agents de police tués dans l'exercice de leurs fonctions.

Les centres urbains compris dans les tableaux 1 et 2 sont:

- (a) Les centres de 750 habitants et plus, y compris les régions urbaines dont le service contractuel de police est assuré par la Gendarmerie royale et la Police provinciale de l'Ontario;
- (b) Les centres de moins de 750 habitants, dont le service contractuel de police est assuré par la Gendarmerie royale;
- (c) Les townships, cantons, districts, municipalités de district et rurales, etc., dont le service contractuel de police est assuré par la Gendarmerie royale ou la Police provinciale de l'Ontario.

Un certain nombre de municipalités urbaines sont exclues du présent rapport parce que:

- (a) Le centre compte moins de 750 habitants, bien qu'il ait un service de police;
- (b) Le centre n'a pas de service de police, bien qu'il compte plus de 750 habitants;
- (c) Le centre, tout en comptant plus de 750 habitants, est protégé par la Sûreté provinciale du Québec dont c'est une des fonctions régulières.

Il y avait 952 centres de 750 habitants et plus, sans compter les centres qui sont sous la surveillance de la Sûreté provinciale du Québec, de la Police provinciale de l'Ontario et de la Gendarmerie royale.

Des rapports mensuels complets ont été reçus de 767 (80.6 p. 100) des services de Police. Cent huit (11.3 p. 100) ont soumis moins de 12 rapports mensuels et 77 (8.1 p. 100) n'ont fait aucun rapport.

Les tableaux ne peuvent être comparés à ceux des années antérieures parce que le relevé est plus complet.

Summary Tables

Summary tables cover all reporting departments policing urban areas including the RCMP and the OPP under contract to police urban areas. As already stated the QPP are not, at present, reporting statistics for urban areas policed by them.

Comme il a été dit, la Sûreté provinciale du Québec ne fait pas rapport actuellement de son activité dans les régions urbaines où elle assure un service de police.

Table A shows the ratio of police per 1,000 population for Canada for each province and for each size group of communities. It should be noted that the population figures are based on the 1956 census while the number of police are as reported for 1960.

Le tableau A indique la proportion d'agents de police pour 1,000 habitants au Canada entier, dans chaque province et pour chaque groupe de collectivités selon la taille. A noter que les chiffres de la population se fondent sur le recensement de 1956, tandis que ceux des agents de police concernent l'année 1960.

Caution should be used in interpreting the police ratio per 1,000 population as Canada's population has increased since 1956. This increase in population would have the effect of reducing the ratio as shown in Table A.

The second part of Table A shows the ratio per 1,000 population by group size. Again, caution should be used in interpreting the data. While urban communities of over 100,000 population have the highest ratio of policemen at 1.9 per 1,000 population, this reduces as communities become smaller, excepting those under 1,500 population where the ratio rises to 1.4.

It should not be concluded from the ratio in Table A that larger communities have more policemen per population for, generally speaking, the larger communities grow faster.

On n'interprétera qu'avec prudence la proportion d'agents de police pour 1,000 habitants parce que la population du Canada a augmenté depuis 1956, ce qui a pour effet d'abaisser la proportion indiquée au tableau A.

La seconde partie du tableau A indique la proportion pour 1,000 habitants par tranche de taille. Ici encore ne faut-il interpréter les données qu'avec une certaine prudence. Alors que les centres de plus de 100,000 habitants accusent la plus forte proportion d'agents de police (1.9 pour 1,000 habitants), cette proportion diminue à mesure que les centres deviennent moins populeux, à l'exception de ceux de moins de 1,500 habitants, où elle monte à 1.4.

Il ne faut pas conclure, d'après les proportions du tableau A, que les grandes villes possèdent plus d'agents de police par habitant que les autres villes car, en général, les grandes villes croissent plus rapidement que celles-ci.


