
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

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SECTION I: INTRODUCTION

The Canadian Centre for Justice Statistics was established in June 1981 as a federal-provincial/territorial initiative dedicated to the production of national statistics and information on the justice system in Canada. The Corrections Program of CCJS collects and disseminates information describing the operation and delivery of correctional services to both adults and young offenders in Canada.

In Canada, adult offenders include all persons 18 years of age and older who breach the provisions of provincial/federal criminal legislation such as the *Criminal Code of Canada*. Young offenders include persons aged 12-17 years, at time of offence, who are subject to the provisions of the *Young Offenders Act* and are processed through a separate youth justice system. Children below the age of 12 years are not held criminally responsible in Canada and are therefore not included in this report.

The Canadian criminal justice system is administered within four inter-related areas: policing services, prosecution, the courts and correctional services. Responsibility for correctional services in Canada is divided between the provinces/territories and the federally administered Correctional Service Canada.

The provincial/territorial adult and youth correctional services are responsible for persons who have been charged with an offence and who have been remanded (ordered by the court) to custody while awaiting a further court appearance. The provinces/territories are also responsible for adult offenders who have been sentenced to an aggregate term of imprisonment which is less than two years (in some cases where a youth is charged with a serious offence, ordinarily the sentence length could be a combination totalling a maximum of 3 years. In exceptional cases, the sentence could be between seven to 10 years) as well as offenders placed on a term of probation.

Correctional Service Canada is responsible for offenders sentenced to an aggregate term of custody of two years or more. These offenders are imprisoned in federally operated penitentiaries.

Uses of the Data

Key indicator data, while quite general in nature, are an important and well established management tool. The use of such indicators is particularly important for monitoring trends in correctional populations. These data assist policy makers and corrections managers in formulating decisions based upon historical comparisons. Key indicator data also give some indication of current trends and demands.

The primary objective of the Key Indicator Report is to compile, analyze and release timely information on both the adult and youth corrections systems in Canada. Clearly, a major constraint affecting the usefulness of data collected on an annual basis is the timeliness with which this information can be made available to the user community. The production of some very basic key indicator data provides information which facilitates more effective and expedient decision-making and program planning.

Measures of Correctional Activity

The primary focus of the *Corrections Key Indicator Report for Adults and Young Offenders* is on one aspect of correctional caseload data, namely, average counts. Counts are a major operational indicator and are used to describe the number of inmates imprisoned or serving a sentence in the community at a given point in time. Typically, inmates are counted many times during the day, minimally at every shift change, although the midnight count is used as the indicator of the bed utilization space within the institution. Counts of offenders under community supervision are taken on a monthly basis.

In order to avoid confusion, it is important to note the distinction between average counts and another type of correctional measure called admissions. Admission data record the total number of annual inmate admissions to correctional facilities or to community supervision programs. Average counts, on the other hand, indicate the average number of individuals in correctional facilities or under community supervision programs at a given point in time.

While admission data describe and measure the changing caseload of correctional agencies over time, these data do not indicate the number of individuals using correctional services. A person can be included several times in annual admission totals. For instance, a person held in custody before their trial (remand) could then be sentenced to nine months in prison and later be released on parole to complete their sentence in the community. Sentences to provincial institutions could be followed by a term of probation. In this situation, the offender is counted three times in the admissions totals. While it is important to monitor the workload associated with each individual (remand, sentenced to prison, parole), it is also important to be able to count the total number of offenders producing the admissions workload.

As an illustration of the difference between the two measures, a person sentenced to 25 years in custody for committing a murder in 1990 would appear in the custodial count data for 1996-97, since they would still be in custody on the day or month the count took place. They would not, however, appear as part of the admission data for 1996-97, since they were actually admitted to prison several years earlier.

Adult and Youth Corrections

The report is divided into two population groups: adults and youths. The adult corrections component of this report includes two data elements: (1) monthly average daily counts and (2) month-end probation counts. The average count of "in-house" inmates, is taken on a daily basis for all provincial, territorial and federal adult correctional facilities across Canada. Data on average daily counts for provinces/territories are broken down by two inmate statuses: "sentenced/other" and "remand" (see Appendix A). Sentenced counts refer to all persons ordered by the court to serve a term of custody as well as those offenders incarcerated for a breach of probationary or parole conditions. Remand counts, on the other hand, refer to those persons who have not been sentenced but who are in custody awaiting a further court appearance. A person may be remanded to custody for a variety of reasons (i.e. risk that they will fail to appear for their court date, danger to others, risk to re-offend, interfere with evidence). This breakdown is not relevant to inmates in federal institutions, and, accordingly, data provided by Correctional Service Canada are limited to "actual-in counts" (all offenders who are in the institution at the time of the count).

The second adult data element is the "month-end probation count". Probation is a sentence which is served by the offender in the community under specified conditions. Typical conditions include abstaining from the consumption of alcohol, completing community service work, or fulfilling a restitution order. Probation orders are usually supervised by a probation officer to whom the offender is required to report. This count is only reported by the provincial/territorial jurisdictions since probation is not available to federal offenders.

The youth corrections component of this report includes three data elements: (1) monthly average daily institutional count; (2) month-end probation count; and, (3) month-end admission count. It is important to note that "month-end admission" data are limited to only five jurisdictions.

Similar to adults, the "monthly average daily institutional count" data for youth corrections also pertain to "actual-in" counts of young offenders in each province/territory. These data are presented by custody status (secure, open or remand/temporary detention).

The "month-end probation count" data refer only to those offenders under supervised probation. The "month-end admissions" are presented by custodial status (secure, open, remand/temporary detention or supervised probation) as well as by gender and age.

Recent Legislative Changes

Recent trends show that inmate counts to federal and provincial institutions have been gradually rising over the

past decade, particularly between 1988-89 and 1992-93. The corrections community faces a serious dilemma. On the one hand, the public is demanding a tough response to crime, with more restrictive early-release policies and longer sentences for repeat and violent offenders. On the other hand, prisons are already over-crowded, a situation that would only be worsened by increased demands on limited, expensive prison space and related services.

In order to address these issues, *Bill C-41* (Chapter 42) was proclaimed into law in September 1996 and is intended to reform the sentencing system in Canada. The reforms are designed to protect the public, assist victims, instill greater sense of responsibility in offenders, and support the principles of rehabilitation, restitution and deterrence. A further objective of these legislative changes is to promote the use of alternatives to imprisonment where appropriate.

Part of the sentencing reform included a new type of sentence available to judges called a "conditional sentence". Conditional sentences permit certain offenders to serve custodial terms in the community under supervision. The objective is to provide less serious offenders with effective, less costly community-based alternatives while using scarcely needed resources for the incarceration and treatment of more serious offenders. It may be several years before the impact of conditional sentences on the custodial and community populations is known.

The Key Indicator Report

Section I has provided a brief introduction to the Key Indicator Report. The remainder of this report presents average count data for the five-year period April 1992 to March 1997 (with the exception of young offender admissions data as well as counts data on age and gender which are reported only for the period April 1996 to March 1997).

Sections II and III provide an annual summary of monthly average daily custody counts and month-end probation counts for both adults and youths by jurisdiction. The data for these counts are presented in both graphical and tabular formats.

Section IV presents a time-series analysis for the 6 months reported - April 1992 through March 1997 for all provincial/territorial and federal jurisdictions. The detailed data tables show adult custodial and probation counts. This section also presents young offender monthly custodial and probation data for each jurisdiction. For Ontario, the data are presented separately for young offenders aged 12-15 and young offenders aged 16-17, to correspond to the defined age jurisdiction of the two responsible ministries within the province.

The data tables in Section V provide additional information on age and gender of young offenders in custody and on probation.

The appendices provide supporting information on the methodology used in the data collection, and a list of definitions used throughout this report. Population data tables used for rate calculations are also included in this section.

- Due to the population size in the smaller jurisdictions, the reader should use caution when interpreting and comparing the data in this report.

SECTION II: INSTITUTIONAL COUNTS

The summary data in this section represent the institutional counts for adults and young offenders in all reporting jurisdictions. These data represent average monthly counts of all offenders in custody in an institution at the time the count is taken (daily counts).

A. Adult Custody Counts

- Although Canada's adult incarceration rate decreased in each of the last two years to 15 adult inmates per 10,000 adults in 1996-97, the trend over the five years has remained virtually the same. Many factors can influence the custodial population, including changes in the age composition of the population, legislative changes, police enforcement, the crime rate and sentencing practices.

In 1996-97, the provincial rate of incarceration was approximately 9 adults per 10,000 adult population.

In 1996-97, the federal rate of incarceration was approximately 6 adults per 10,000 adult population.

- Overall, during 1996-97, close to 34,000 adult offenders were held in correctional institutions across Canada on any given day. More than half (58%) were in provincial/territorial facilities, while the remainder (42%) were in federal penitentiaries. Although recent annual increases have been small, the total adult inmate population is 6% higher than it was five years ago; an increase in line with the growth in the Canadian population.

- The increase in the offender population can be attributed to an influx in federally sentenced inmates. Over the five-year period 1992-93 to 1996-97, the average federal inmate population experienced a 15% increase (nearly 1,800 inmates) while the average provincial/territorial offender population remained fairly constant.

- Six provincial/territorial jurisdictions reported decreases in their average "actual-in" count since 1992-93. Overall, the total average count decreased by less than one percent over the five-year period.

Quebec experienced the largest decline in average inmate counts. There was an average of a little more than 530 fewer inmates (-13%) in Quebec institutions compared to five years ago.

British Columbia experienced the most significant increase of over 650 inmates (+34%) followed by Ontario reporting an increase of almost 350 inmates (+5%).

- Most offenders in provincial/territorial custody are serving a sentence. During 1996-97, provincial inmates whose legal status was "sentenced/other" represented approximately 74% of the total "actual-in" count. The number of sentenced/other inmates has declined by 4% since 1992-93.

Eight of the twelve jurisdictions followed this national downward trend. Since 1992-93, Quebec experienced the largest decrease with slightly more than 500 fewer "sentenced/other" offenders (-19%) in 1996-97. Alberta reported an average of 380 fewer offenders (-18%).

- The remaining 26% of provincial/territorial inmates were on remand status (held in custody awaiting trial). Nationally, the number of inmates on remand in provincial/territorial facilities increased by 14% since 1992-93.

Over the five year period, all but two jurisdictions showed increases in remand populations. The largest increases occurred in British Columbia with over 240 additional offenders (+64%), and Ontario reporting an increase of over 220 offenders (+13%).

B. Young Offender Custody Counts

Note: Average count data for Quebec was not available for 1996-97 and average count data for Ontario was not available for 1995-96 and 1996-97.

- As data for Quebec and Ontario were not available for recent years, it is not possible to establish a national trend in the young offender custodial population. However, of the ten jurisdictions who did report average counts, most recorded slight to moderate increases in the use of custody over the past five years.
- Excluding Quebec and Ontario in 1996-97, there was an average of 2,264 young offenders in custody on any given day. Of these, 777 were in secure custody, 1,020

were in open custody and 468 were on remand or temporary detention. In comparison, there was a total of 2,016 young offenders in custody in 1992-93 (excluding figures from Quebec and Ontario) representing a 12% increase over the five-year period.

- Young offender average "actual-in" counts to custody increased in seven of the ten reporting jurisdictions over the past year, though in most provinces the increases were small. The only decreases were reported in New Brunswick, Alberta and British Columbia.
- Seven of ten jurisdictions also reported increases in their "actual-in" average counts over the five-year period. While most increases were small, Manitoba was reporting the most significant provincial increase (+37).
- Between 1992-93 and 1996-97, young offender average counts in open custody increased in all but one of the reporting jurisdictions (Newfoundland's count remained the same). British Columbia (+22%) experienced the largest increase of close to 50 more young offenders in open custody. Saskatchewan (+23%) followed with an increase of nearly 30 youths in open custody
- From 1992-93 to 1996-97, five of the ten reporting jurisdictions showed decreases in their average secure custody counts. In general, decreases in secure custody occurred in eastern Canada and increases in western Canada. In the East, Prince Edward Island had 50% fewer young offenders in secure custody. In the Western provinces, Saskatchewan (+20%) reported increase of about 30 youths.
- The youth incarceration rate declined in three jurisdictions over the previous year: Alberta (-8%), British Columbia (-3%) and New Brunswick (-1%). Prince Edward Island reported the greatest increase (+15%). Similarly, most jurisdictions reported increases in their youth incarceration rate over the past five years.

(1) New Brunswick: The category of "other" includes police holdings, persons held for immigration reasons and those on mixed status, i.e., remand/sentence.

(2) Ontario: "Remand status only" counts are not available. Ontario reports 'remand' counts which include inmates on remand status only and those on remand/sentenced dual status. Historically, remand inmates represent about 75% of these reported counts. This percentage is used to estimate "remand status only" counts. The remaining 25% have been included in the "sentenced/other" counts.

(3) Manitoba: Some lock-up inmates may be included in the remand counts.

(4) Correctional Service Canada: Actual-in counts also include persons designated as having temporary detention status. Counts exclude federal inmates held in provincial institutions under the Exchange of Services Agreement. Counts also exclude inmates held in Her Majesty's Penitentiary as Newfoundland, by statute, retains jurisdiction over all offenders sentenced in the province.

Average Actual-in Counts








FIGURE 1B: ADULTS

Average Actual-in Counts









FIGURE 1B: YOUNG OFFENDERS**Average Annual Rate of Incarceration

SECTION III: PROBATION COUNTS

The counts reported in this section represent the summary of all adults and young offenders on supervised probation in the community. A number of key points are highlighted in the following paragraphs.

A. Adult Probation Counts

- In any given month during the 1996-97 reporting period, there were an average of 106,884 adults on probation in Canada. This represents a 4% increase over the previous year and an 8% increase since 1992-93.
- Three jurisdictions reported decreases in their 1996-97 probation counts: Newfoundland (-7%), Nova Scotia (-4%) and the Northwest Territories (-4%). The largest increase was in Quebec (+29%).
- All but three jurisdictions reported increases in their probation counts over the last five years. The largest increases were in British Columbia where month-end counts rose by an average of over 3,800 offenders (+34%) followed by Quebec where the month-end counts increased by an average of 2,660 offenders (+25%).
- Ontario has consistently reported the largest month-end count of probationers, with an average count three times greater than the next closest jurisdiction (British Columbia).
- In 1996-97, an average of 47 persons per 10,000 adult Canadians received a probation sentence. This rate has remained fairly constant during the last five years.

B. Young Offender Probation Counts

Note: Two jurisdictions (Quebec, and Ontario) could not provide month-end young offender probation counts for this report. As such, the following data comparisons exclude these two jurisdictions.

- The use of probation for young offenders appears to be increasing in Canada. Excluding counts for Ontario and Quebec, an average of 16,290 young offenders were on probation during any given month in 1996-97, an increase of 13% from five years ago.
- Most jurisdictions reported increases in probation counts in 1996-97, notably Yukon (+17%), Saskatchewan (+6%) and Manitoba (+3%). Of the four provinces reporting a decline in probation counts, Prince Edward Island showed the largest reduction (-14%).

- Seven of the ten jurisdictions reported increases in the average probation counts since 1992-93. Reporting the most significant changes over the past five years were the Northwest Territories whose average young offender month-end probation count rose by nearly 200 offenders (+160%), followed by Manitoba with an average increase of 580 youths (+40%). Of the three provinces reporting a decline in probation counts since 1992-93, Prince Edward Island with 160 fewer young offenders (-33%) reported the largest decrease .

- The youth probation rate decreased by 2% in 1996-97, following three straight increases. Despite the decline, the 1996-97 rate of 171 youth probationers per 10,000 youths was still 7% higher than five years ago.

Average Annual Month-end Probation Counts











FIGURE 2B: ADULTS

Average Annual Month-end Probation Counts









FIGURE 2B: YOUNG OFFENDERSAverage Annual Rate of Probation




FIGURE 3: ADULTS




FIGURE 3: YOUNG OFFENDERS




FIGURE 4: ADULTS




FIGURE 4: YOUNG OFFENDERS




FIGURE 5: ADULTS




FIGURE 5: YOUNG OFFENDERS




FIGURE 6: ADULTS




FIGURE 6: YOUNG OFFENDERS




FIGURE 7: ADULTS



FIGURE 7: YOUNG OFFENDERS






FIGURE 8: ADULTS



FIGURE 8A: YOUNG OFFENDERS


Ontario (12-15 years)



FIGURE 8B: YOUNG OFFENDERS





FIGURE 8C: YOUNG OFFENDERS






FIGURE 9: ADULTS




FIGURE 9: YOUNG OFFENDERS




FIGURE 10: ADULTS




FIGURE 10: YOUNG OFFENDERS




FIGURE 11: ADULTS




FIGURE 11: YOUNG OFFENDERS




FIGURE 12: ADULTS




FIGURE 12: YOUNG OFFENDERS




FIGURE 13: ADULTS



FIGURE 13: YOUNG OFFENDERS






FIGURE 14: ADULTS




FIGURE 14: YOUNG OFFENDERS











APPENDIX A

Methodology - Adult Data

Data Collection

In each province or territory, a pre-determined procedure is used to transform average daily count data into a monthly format. Most jurisdictions have computerized information systems with a built-in capacity to produce this 'roll-up'. The automated systems in Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba, Alberta, Saskatchewan and British Columbia can readily produce these data. Prince Edward Island, the Yukon and the Northwest Territories produce monthly average count data using 'computer assisted' procedures - a combination of automated and manual calculations.

Definitions

Facilities - Government operated institutions (including community correctional/residential centres) and privately operated community residential (or treatment) centres are included in the above counts.

Total days stay - Refers to the estimated number of prisoner days served, usually based on overnight stays. It is calculated by adding together the daily midnight counts.

Actual-in counts - Includes all remand inmates, sentenced offenders and other persons who are legally required to be at a facility and are present at the time the count is taken.

Sentenced/other counts - Includes all persons in custody under a Warrant of Committal. Also includes persons who have completed a custodial sentence and have been returned to custody following a breach of probation or parole conditions, and those held for immigration reasons and those on mixed statuses, i.e. remand and sentenced. Inmates serving a sentence represent about 95% of total counts in this category.

Remand counts - Includes those persons in custody who are awaiting a further court appearance only, and are not presently serving a sentence or being held on another 'hold' status.

Supervised probation - Includes all adults who must, as a condition of a probation order, report to and be under the supervision of a probation officer or other person designated by the court.

Calculation of rates of incarceration - Rates of incarceration for actual-in counts are calculated by using adult population figures in Appendix C. The average count for the month is divided by the Canadian adult population, then the result is multiplied by 10,000 to obtain the rate per 10,000 adults.

Monthly average daily count calculations - The data for monthly average daily counts are calculated by dividing the total days stay (or total "bed days") for all correctional institutions within the jurisdiction by the number of days in the month.

APPENDIX B

Methodology - Young Offenders Data

Data Collection

All contributing jurisdictions, with the exception of Nova Scotia until 1995-96, submit monthly count data in aggregate format. For Nova Scotia, daily young offender population count sheets were supplied to the Canadian Centre for Justice Statistics and processed to produce monthly average counts.

Definitions

Facilities - Government operated facilities (including community correctional/residential centres) and privately operated group or treatment homes (centres).

Secure facilities - A facility is considered "secure" where youths are detained by security devices, including those which operate with full perimeter security features and/or whose youths are under constant observation. The *Young Offenders Act* (YOA) defines secure custody as any facility so designated by the Lieutenant Governor in Council of the province for the secure containment or restraint of young persons.

Open facilities - A facility is considered "open" when there is minimal use of security devices or perimeter security. The *Young Offenders Act* defines open custody as "custody in (a) a community residential centre, group home, child care institution, or forest or wilderness camp or (b) any like place or facility".

Actual-in counts - Includes all youths on remand and temporary detention, sentenced offenders and other young offenders who are legally required to be at a facility and are present at the time the count is taken.

Sentenced counts - Includes all youths in custody under a Warrant of Committal serving a provincial or federal sentence, as well as those persons who have been sentenced on one charge but who are awaiting the completion of court hearings on another charge. Also includes youths who have completed a custodial sentence and have been returned to custody following a breach of conditions.

Remand/temporary detention counts - Includes only those youths detained in custody under a Remand Warrant who are awaiting a further court appearance, and are not presently serving any type of sentence.

Supervised probation - Includes all youths who must, as a condition of a probation order "report to and be under the supervision of a probation officer or other person designated by the court".

Monthly average daily count calculation - The data for monthly average daily counts are calculated by dividing the total days stay (or total "bed" days) for all correctional institutions within the jurisdiction by the number of days in the month.

Calculation of rates of incarceration - Rates of incarceration for "actual-in" counts for youth are calculated for each jurisdiction using the population at risk figures. That is, the provincial/territorial population aged 12 to 17 years. For those jurisdictions with split responsibilities, rates of incarceration reflect the respective population at risk. It should be noted that some jurisdictions may hold persons up to 20 years of age, if the offender was charged/sentenced while less than 18 years old, but has since reached the age of a legal adult. The average count for the month is divided by the Canadian youth population (see Appendix C), then the result is multiplied by 10,000 to obtain the rate per 10,000 youths.

Admission to sentenced secure custody, and admission to sentenced open custody - An admission to sentenced secure custody and sentenced open custody is based on the issuance and processing of a Warrant of Committal. The following events do not constitute a new admission:

- the youth is transferred from one secure facility to another secure facility;
- the youth is transferred from one open facility to another open facility;
- the youth is transferred from a place of open custody to a place of secure custody for a period not exceeding 15 days (Sec. 24.2(9) YOA);
- the youth is returned to a place of open custody after an administrative transfer to secure custody for a period not exceeding 15 days (Sec. 24.2(9) YOA);

- the youth returns to custody on expiry of a temporary absence from custody (Sec. 35(1)(a) YOA);
- the youth returns to custody after a temporary day release (Sec. 35(1)(b) YOA); and,
- the length of the disposition is changed as a result of outstanding charges, additional charges, an appeal or a review that does not break a continuous period of time in secure or open custody.

Admission to remand/temporary detention - An admission to temporary detention is based on the issuance and processing of a Remand Warrant.

The following events do not constitute a new admission to temporary detention for a particular youth:

- the youth is presently serving a term of secure custody or open custody and has been issued a Remand Warrant due to outstanding charges or the commission of another offence; or,
- the youth in temporary detention is transferred from one facility to another.

Age - The age refers to the age of the youth when the count is taken by the institution or the probation officer.

Admission to a term of supervised probation - An admission to a term of supervised probation is based on the issuance and processing of a probation order.

Average month-end admission count - Data are an indication of the average month-end admission count to a facility or probation. Averages are calculated by adding all month-end admission counts and dividing the total by the number of months for the corresponding period.

Month-end probation count - Data are an indication of the current monthly caseload of young offenders on supervised probation.
