### Criminal Statistics for the year ended

September 30th, 1927.

The total number of convictions recorded in the returns of Criminal Statistics for the year ended September 30th, 1927 was 212,075 compared with 187,361 for 1926. Showing an increase of 24,714 or 13.19 p.c. The increase in 1926 over the previous year was 10.83 p.c. The number of indictable offences returned for the year was 23,526 charges and 18,835 convictions. The summary convictions for non indictable offences amounted to 193,240. There was an increase in convictions for indictable offences of 1,387 (7.95 p.c.) during the year. The proportions of convictions to charges in 1927 was 79.94 p.c. There was an increase in summary conviction of 23,327 (13.73 p.c.) which is the greatest increase rate recorded since 1913.

Of the total 212,075 convictions in 1927, 91.12 p.c. were for non-indictable offences, and 8.88 p.c. for indictable offences. Of the indictable offences 4.61 p.c. were tried by Jury, 12.72 p.c. by Speedy Trials Act and 82.67 p.c. by Summary Trials



The principal increase was, in breaches of traffic regulations convictions which rose from 78,027 to 96,340 (23.47 p.c.) during the year. Drunkenness increased from 28,317 to 31,171, but breaches of liquor laws decreased from 13,512 to 12,477. during the year 1927.
