# Criminal Statistics for the year ended September 30th, 1928

The total number of prosecutions for criminal offences (indictable) recorded for the year ended September 30th, 1928, was 26,693 against 23,563 for 1927. This is an increase of 3,130 or 13.3 p.c. The convictions for the two years were 21,720 and 18,836 respectively, which shows an increase of 2,884 or 15.3 p.c., which is the largest increase since the years 1913 and 1914 when the increases in convictions stood: 17.69 p.c. and 17.02 respectively.

By classes, the convictions for indictable offences increased as follows: Class I, offences against the person, 14.65 p.c. Class II, offences against property with violence, 14.54 p.c. Class III, offences against property without violence, 10.94 p.c. Class IV, malicious injury to property, 13.31 p.c. Class V, forgery and offences against the Currency, 16.14 p.c. Class VI, other offences, 31.03 p.c.

The total number of summary convictions (non-indictable) for 1928 was 245,763 against 193,240 for 1927, being an increase of 52,523 or 27.18 p.c., which is the greatest increase in summary convictions since these statistics were recorded - over fifty years. The principal increase was in breaches of traffic regulations which rose from 96,340 in 1927 to 141,493 in 1928 or 46.87 p.c. Other increases are shown in breaches of liquor laws, 22.33 p.c., profanation of the Lord's Day, 35.31 p.c., Fishery and game laws,28.43 p.c., Revenue laws, 32.96 p.c. and non-support of family, 24.66 p.c. The principal decreases were contributing to delinquency of children, 64.80 p.c., and frequenting bawdy houses, 10.67 p.c.
