Notes:

The reader is cautioned that there are problems in attempting to make comparisons between urban crime rates using the data in this table. The problem is that all municipal police forces do not have jurisdiction over comparable urban environments; for example, the Vancouver Police Department has responsibility for policing only the highly developed downtown part of the urban area while the surrounding suburban areas are policed by other municipal police forces. This is in contrast with the situation in Winnipeg in which the jurisdictional boundary of the police department coincides closely with the urbanized area. This means that the crime statistics from these two police departments cannot be directly compared because they police different environments. As a solution to this problem, the Law Enforcement Program staff are currently working to organize crime statistics according to Census Metropolitan Areas, thus making the data much more comparable.

Notes:

Le lecteur est prié de noter que l'établissement de comparaisons entre les taux de criminalité urbaine à partir des données présentées dans cette publication pose certaines difficultés. Le problème vient du fait que les services de police municipaux n'exercent pas tous leur compétence dans des milieux urbains comparables. Par exemple, le corps policier de Vancouver assure le maintien de l'ordre uniquement dans la partie la plus développée du centre-ville, tandis que les banlieues environnantes relèvent d'autres corps policiers municipaux. Par ailleurs, à Winnipeg, les limites des territoires desservis par le service de police correspondent étroitement à la région urbanisée. Ainsi, on ne peut faire une comparaison directe entre les statistiques de la criminalité de ces deux corps policiers car ils assurent des services de police dans des milieux différents. Pour résoudre ce problème, le personnel du Programme de l'application de la loi s'emploie actuellement à organiser les statistiques de la criminalité selon les régions métropolitaines de recensement, ce qui augmentera la comparabilité des données.

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
