


D.B.S. MEMORANDUM

Ottawa, Canada

The estimated population of Canada at June 1, 1950 was 13,845,000. This figure results from a population accounting which starts with the 1941 Census, adds births and immigration and deducts deaths and emigration for the subsequent nine years.

The 1950 estimate is broken down by provinces as follows:

For each province an attempt is made to follow the same method as for Canada, but the figures on migration used are less complete. During the five years subsequent to the 1941 Census the only available material on inter-provincial migration was the counts of successive ration books; since 1947 the Labour Force Survey has estimated inter-provincial movement, subject to small but cumulative sampling error.

It is to be noted that population estimates such as here given, while taking account of all material on hand, are subject to an error, which increases with each year that elapses since the Census on which they are based.

La population estimative du Canada au 1er juin 1950 est de 13,845,000 habitants. Pour obtenir ce chiffre, on a ajouté à la population de recensement de 1941 les naissances et les immigrants des neuf années subséquentes et on en a soustrait les décès et les émigrants.

L'estimation de 1950 est décomposée par province de la façon suivante:

La méthode employée pour le Canada est appliquée autant que possible à chaque province, mais les chiffres sur la migration sont moins complets. Au cours des cinq années postérieures au recensement de 1941, les seules données disponibles sur la migration inter-provinciale étaient basées sur un compteable des carnets successifs de rationnement; depuis 1947, le Relevé de la main-d'œuvre donne une estimation du mouvement interprovincial, sujette à une erreur, faible mais cumulative, d'échantillonage.

Il importe de noter que les estimations de la population telles qu'elles sont données ici, bien que tenant compte de tous les renseignements disponibles, sont sujettes à une erreur qui grandit d'année en année depuis le recensement sur lequel elles sont fondées.

ACADEMIC STANDING AND GRADING POLICY
