## CONSUMPTION OF CARBON BLACK IN CANADA, 1929.

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa reports the results of a special survey on the consumption of carbon black in Canada as follows:-

pounds appraised at \$1,014,140, practically all from United States. As ordinary gas black is not made in Canada the imports should nearly represent the domestic consumption; the difference between the import figure and the actual consumption total given above is due to quantities consumed in industries not covered by the Bureau's survey or to quantities held in stock by the users.

Acetylene black is made in Canada by one concern. Data regarding acetylene black have not been included in this bulletin.

The consumption of bone black in Canadian sugar refineries in 1929 amounted to 2,440,670 pounds worth \$130,967.
