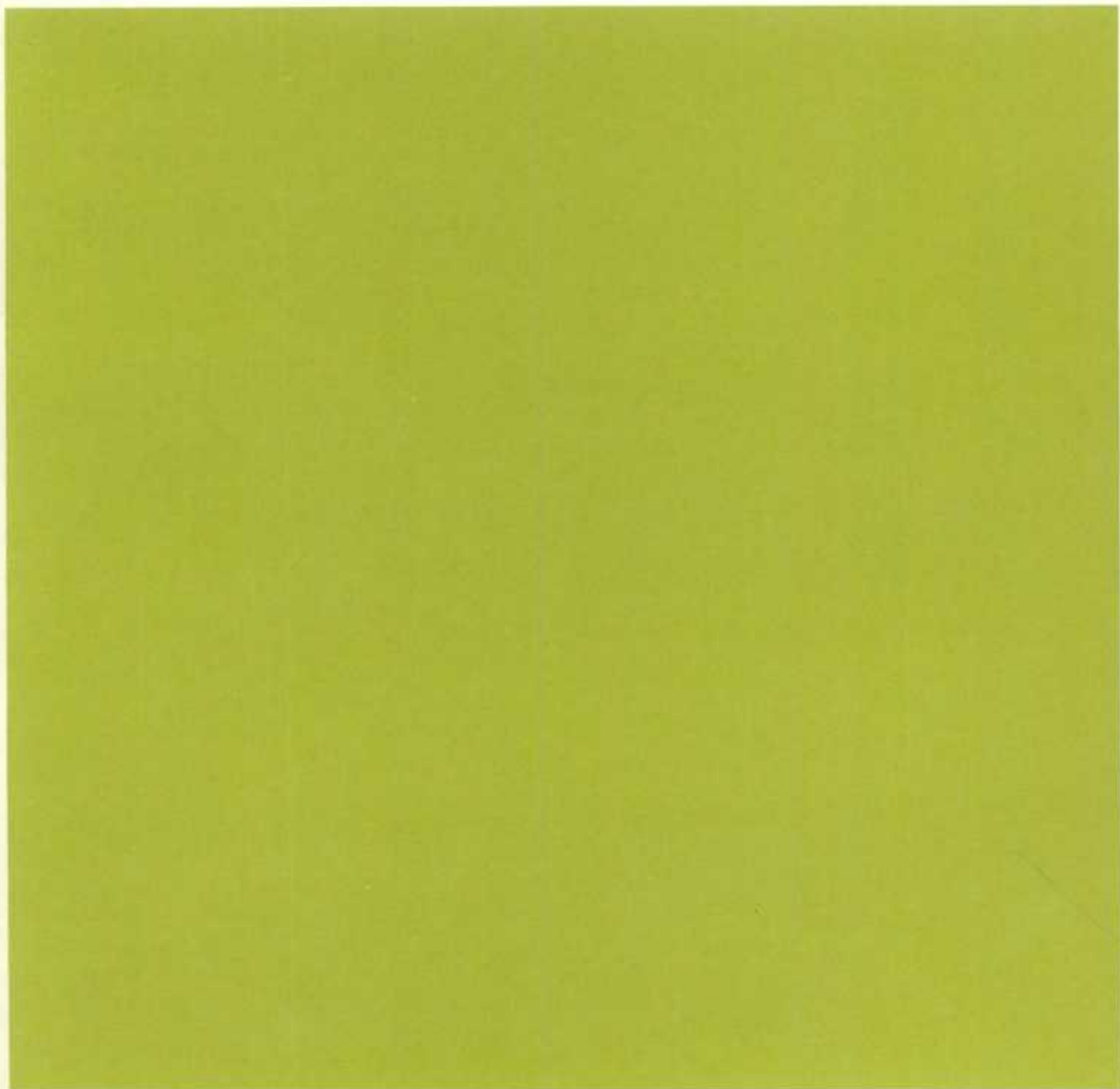

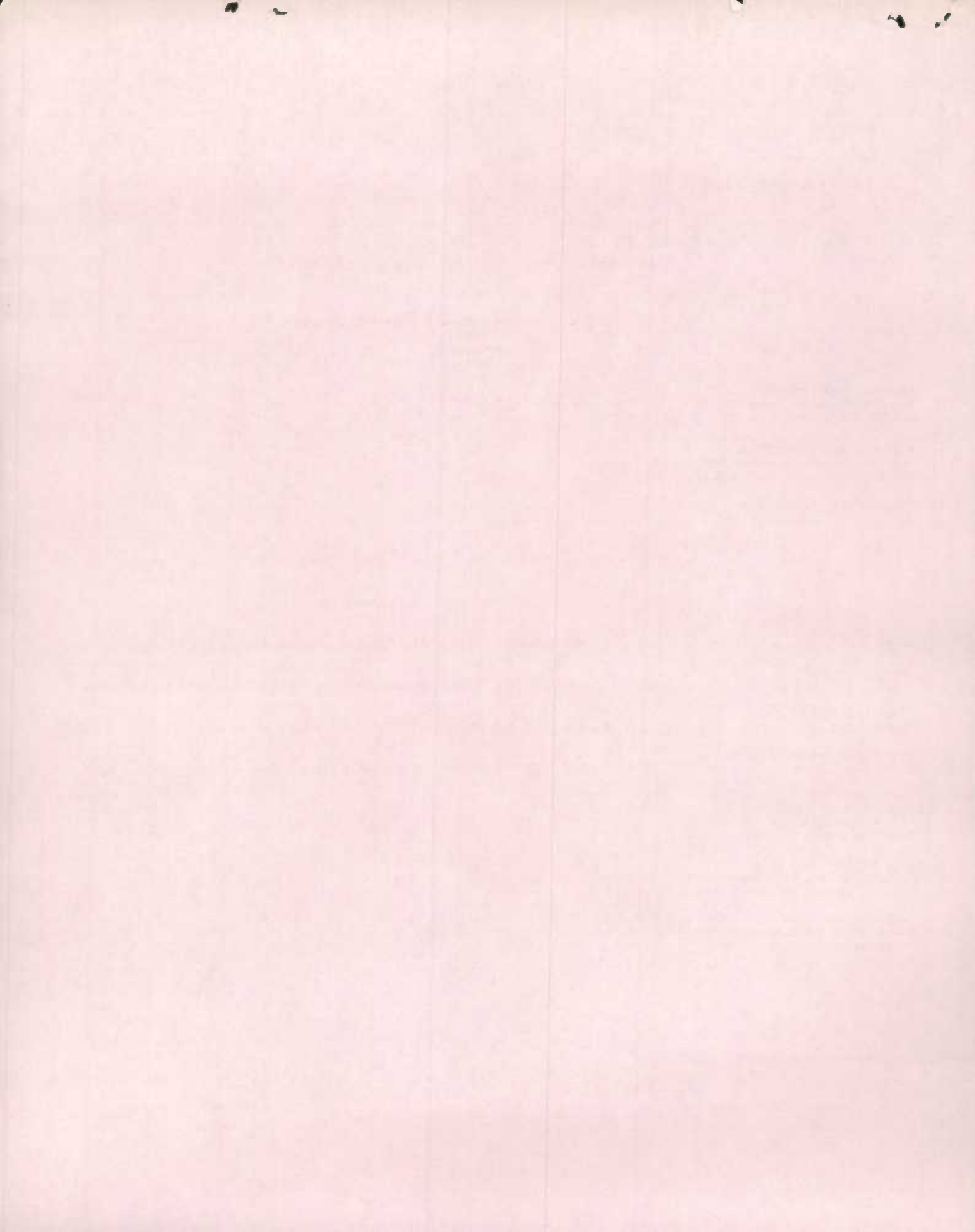

## THE SYSTEM OF NATIONAL ACCOUNTS

In Canada, the National Accounts have been developed since the close of the Second World War in a series of publications relating to their constituent parts. These have now reached a stage of evolution where they can be termed a "System of National Accounts". For purposes of identification, all publications (containing tables of statistics, descriptions of conceptual frameworks and descriptions of sources and methods) which make up this System will now carry the term "System of National Accounts" as a general title.

The System of National Accounts in Canada consists of several parts. The annual and quarterly Income and Expenditure Accounts (included with Catalogue Nos. carrying the prefix 13) were, historically speaking, the first set of statistics to be referred to with the title "National Accounts" (National Accounts, Income and Expenditure). The Balance of International Payments data (Catalogue Nos. with prefix 67), in their more summary form, are also part of the System of National Accounts and they, in fact, pre-date the Income and Expenditure Accounts.

Greatly expanded structural detail on industries and on goods and on services is portrayed in the Input-Output Tables of the System (Catalogue Nos. with prefix 15). The indexes of Real Domestic Product by Industry (included the Catalogue Nos. carrying the prefix 61) provide "constant dollar" measures of the contribution of each industry to Gross Domestic Product at factor cost. Inputs and outputs are related in Productivity Studies (Catalogue Nos. with prefix 14).

Both the Input-Output Tables and Indexes of Real Domestic Product by Industry use the establishment as the primary unit of industrial production. Measures of financial transactions are provided by the Financial Flow Accounts (Catalogue Nos. with prefix 13). Types of lenders and financial instruments are the primary detail in these statistics and the legal entity is the main unit of classification of transactors. Also, provision is made in the System for incorporation of balance sheet (wealth) estimates when such data are sufficiently developed.

The System of National Accounts provides an overall conceptually integrated framework in which the various parts can be considered as interrelated sub-systems. At present, direct comparisons amongst those parts which use the establishment as the basic unit and those which use the legal entity can be carried out only at highly aggregated levels of data. However, Statistics Canada is continuing research on enterprise-company-establishment relationships; it may eventually be feasible to reclassify the data which are on one basis (say the establishment basis) to correspond to the units employed on another (the company or the enterprise basis).

In its broad outline, the Canadian System of National Accounts bears a close relationship to the international standard as described in the United Nations publication, *A System of National Accounts* (Studies in Methods, Series F, No. 2 Rev. 3, Statistical Office, Department of Economic and Social Affairs, United Nations, New York, 1968).

## LE SYSTÈME DE COMPTABILITÉ NATIONALE

Au Canada, les comptes nationaux ont fait l'objet depuis la fin de la Seconde Guerre mondiale de toute une série de publications portant sur leurs éléments constitutifs. Ils ont connu une telle évolution qu'on peut maintenant les qualifier de "Système de comptabilité nationale". Aux fins d'identification, toutes les publications qui font partie du système (elles contiennent des tableaux statistiques, la description du cadre théorique et l'explication des sources et des méthodes) porteront désormais le titre général de "Système de comptabilité nationale".

Le système de comptabilité nationale du Canada se divise en plusieurs catégories de comptes. Les comptes annuels et trimestriels des revenus et des dépenses (paraissant dans les publications dont le numéro de catalogue commence par 13) ont constitué le premier ensemble de statistiques à être connu sous le titre de "Comptes nationaux" (Comptes nationaux, revenus et dépenses). Les données sur la balance canadienne des paiements internationaux (numéro de catalogue commençant par 67) font également partie, sous leur forme sommaire, du système de comptabilité nationale; elles ont même existé avant les comptes des revenus et des dépenses.

Une nomenclature beaucoup plus détaillée d'industries et de biens et services figure dans les tableaux d'entrées-sorties du système (numéro de catalogue commençant par 15). Les indices du produit intérieur réel par industrie (compris dans les publications dont les numéros de catalogue commencent par 61) mesurent, en dollars constants, l'apport de chaque branche d'activité au produit intérieur brut au coût des facteurs. Un rapport est établi entre les entrées et sorties dans les études de productivité (publications dont le numéro de catalogue commence par 14).

L'établissement est l'unité primaire de production industrielle tant dans les tableaux d'entrées-sorties que dans les indices du produit intérieur réel. Les comptes de flux financiers (publications dont les numéros de catalogue commencent par 13) mesurent les opérations financières. Les catégories de prêteurs et d'instruments financiers forment les éléments de base de ces statistiques et la personne morale est le point de départ du classement des agents économiques. En outre, le système a été conçu de façon à pouvoir incorporer les comptes de bilans (qui prennent pour objet le patrimoine) lorsque les données s'y rapportant seront suffisamment développées.

Le système de comptabilité nationale constitue un ensemble conceptuellement intégré dans lequel les diverses catégories de comptes peuvent être considérées comme des sous-systèmes étroitement liés entre eux. Au stade actuel de développement, on ne peut faire de comparaison directe entre les éléments basés sur l'établissement et ceux qui sont basés sur l'entité juridique que lorsque les données sont groupées dans des catégories très générales. Toutefois, Statistique Canada poursuit ses recherches sur les relations entre l'entreprise, la société et l'établissement. Il sera peut-être possible un jour de reclasser les données établies sur une certaine base (l'établissement par exemple) de manière à les faire correspondre aux données établies sur une autre base (société ou entreprise).

Dans ses grandes lignes, le système de comptabilité nationale du Canada suit de très près la norme internationale exposée dans la publication des Nations Unies intitulée *Système de comptabilité nationale* (Études méthodologiques, série F, n° 2, rév. 3, Bureau de statistique, Département des affaires économiques et sociales, Nations Unies, New York, 1970).

### SYMBOLS AND CODES

S.I.C. code: The Standard Industrial Classification code appearing in the tables should be interpreted as follows:

An S.I.C. Division is indicated by one of the integers 1 to 11.

An S.I.C. Major group within the Division is indicated by two digits following the Division code and separated from it by a colon.

A 3-digit industry class is indicated by three digits respectively.

Note: Due to rounding, sub-annual detail may not average to the annual level.

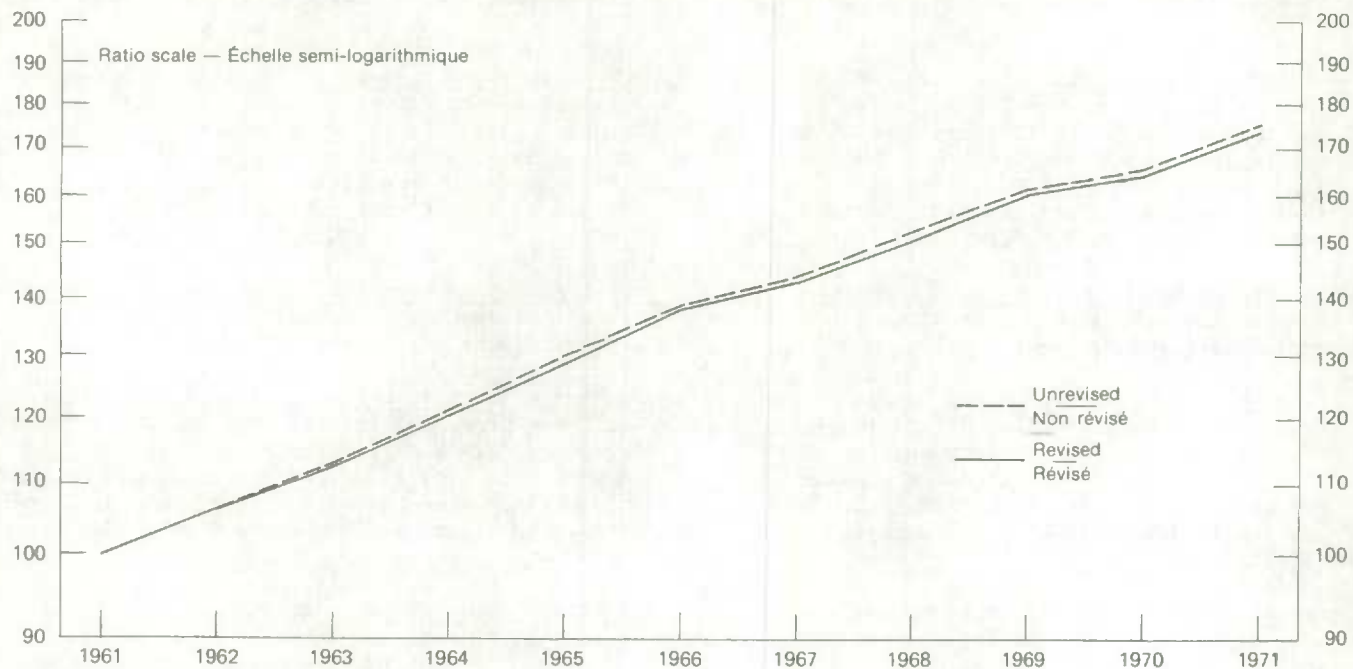

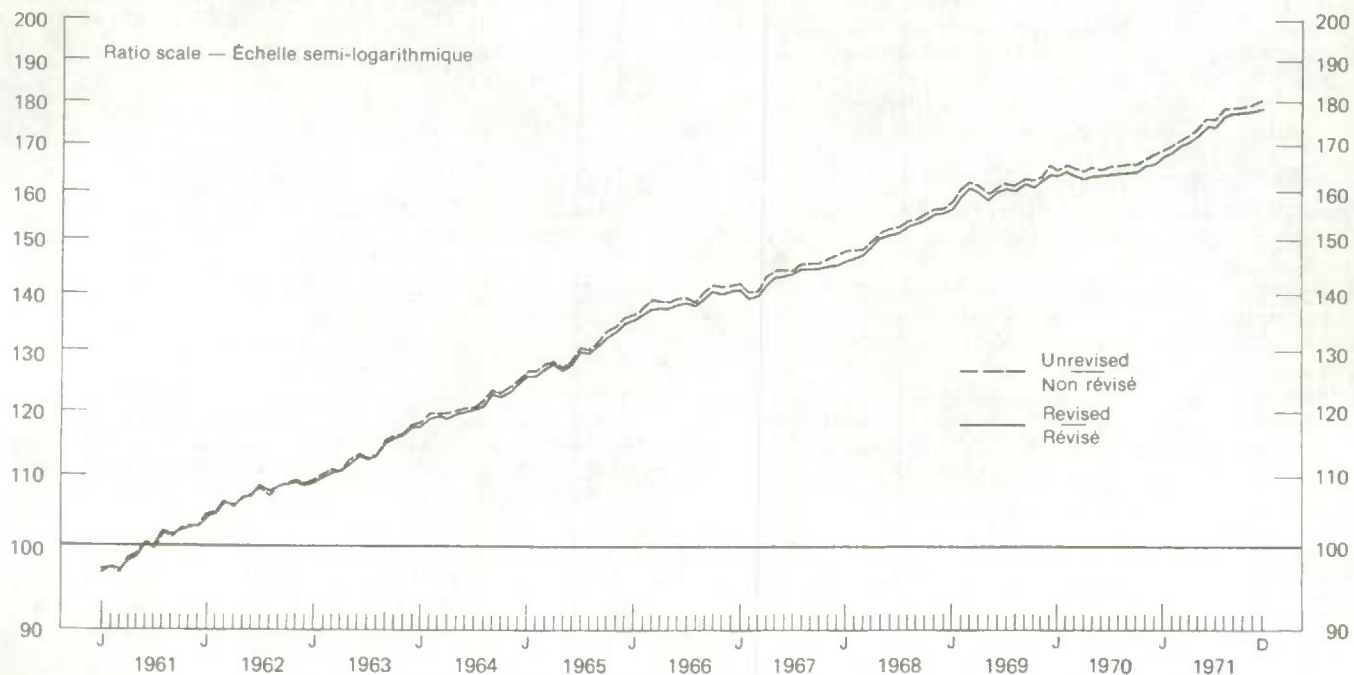

This report presents revised estimates of Real Domestic Product (RDP) by industry for the 1961-1971 period on an annual and sub-annual basis as well as showing some previously unpublished data for the service-producing industries.

Table 1 of the report presents, for the first time, annual estimates of RDP by industry expressed in constant dollar rather than index form. In addition, Appendix I provides, for selected manufacturing industries, annual estimates of gross outputs, intermediate inputs, and value added in current and constant (1961) prices and the corresponding implicit price indexes.

With the exception of the revisions mentioned below, the concepts and general methodology remain unchanged from those described in the previously published reference papers. (1) The 1960 Standard Industrial Classification (S.I.C.) system continues to be used for the 1961-1971 period.

Users should note that the revised estimates presented herein replace those previously published for this period in the 1974 supplement to the monthly publication Indexes of Real Domestic Product by Industry Catalogue 61-005 and in Catalogue 61-510.

The entire period is affected by statistical changes due to the incorporation of new annual levels. The magnitude of the revisions varies from year-to-year and from one industry to another, but in general, the total changes in RDP resulted in raising its level by less than 1% in any given year - the largest increase was 0.8% in 1971.

The changes in RDP resulted mainly from the incorporation of more up-to-date data from annual surveys for some industries, or the availability of new data, such as quinquennial census results, or from the adoption of new methodologies.

The most important methodological changes occurred in the area of finance, insurance and real estate. In this instance, output measures have been introduced for the finance industries, to replace the previously used labour input indicators. Paid and imputed residential rents are now projected on an index of the constant dollar value of the stock of owned and rented residential buildings. In the case of forestry, a major change resulted from the adoption of a gross output rather than a net output indicator. In the case of other storage and warehousing (S.I.C. 527) a productivity adjustment has been applied to the previously used labour input indicator.

Cette publication présente des estimations révisées du produit intérieur réel (P.I.R.) par industrie pour la période s'étendant de 1961-1971 sur une base annuelle et infra-annuelle et fournit aussi des données nouvelles pour les industries productrices de services.

Le tableau 1 du présent rapport montre, pour la première fois, des estimations annuelles du produit intérieur réel par industrie exprimées en dollars constants, plutôt que sous forme d'indices. De plus, on trouve à l'appendice I des données annuelles pour certaines industries manufacturières concernant la production brute, nette et la consommation intermédiaire aux prix courants et constants (de 1961) et les indices implicites de prix correspondants.

Sauf dans le cas des modifications mentionnées ci-dessous, les concepts et la méthodologie générale demeurent identiques à ceux qui sont formulés dans les ouvrages de référence antérieurs(1). La classification des activités économiques (C.A.É.) est celle de 1960 pour les années 1961-1971.

Les utilisateurs devraient noter que les estimations révisées remplacent celles qui ont déjà été publiées au sujet de la période. On retrouve ces dernières dans le supplément de 1974 du rapport mensuel intitulé Indices du produit intérieur réel par industrie, n° 61-005 au catalogue et dans le rapport hors série du même titre, n° 61-510 au catalogue.

La période entière est affectée par des changements statistiques attribués à l'incorporation de nouveaux niveaux annuels. Le degré de révision varie d'une industrie à l'autre, tout comme d'une année à l'autre. L'ensemble des modifications a, règle générale, haussé le P.I.R. de moins de 1% - la variation la plus grande est de 0.8% en 1971.

Les révisions apportées au P.I.R. ont été provoquées par la mise à jour des données provenant d'enquêtes annuelles pour certaines industries, par la disponibilité de nouvelles informations, comme les estimations des recensements quinquennaux, ou par l'adoption de nouvelles méthodologies.

Les changements méthodologiques les plus importants ont pris place dans le secteur des finances, des assurances et des affaires immobilières. Pour certaines institutions financières, on a introduit des mesures d'output alors qu'on utilisait auparavant des indicateurs d'emploi. En ce qui concerne les loyers imputés et payés des ménages, on emploie maintenant comme projecteur un indice de la valeur à prix constants des stocks d'habitations occupées par les propriétaires et les locataires. L'industrie des forêts a été surtout touchée par un retour à une mesure de la production brute, plutôt que nette. Pour l'industrie des autres entrepôts (C.A.É. 527), on a ajusté l'indicateur d'emploi utilisé auparavant à la croissance estimée de la productivité.

A large number of the service-producing industries were trend-adjusted to incorporate the results of the 1971 census of merchandising and services. Construction and mining were affected largely by data revisions.

The 1961 GDP distribution used for the industry weighting system was marginally revised following a reconciliation with the revised 1961 input-output tables and the Income and Expenditure accounts. Table I shows the relation between Gross National Product at market prices and Gross Domestic Product at factor cost.

As a result of the above mentioned revisions to the annual estimates, the monthly and quarterly indicators were adjusted to the new annual levels and new seasonal adjustment factors were developed for the period.

The annual estimates are shown in Table 2 in index form for most of the 3-digit S.I.C. industries and all aggregates. This constitutes a considerable expansion in the published industrial detail for most of the service-producing industries.

At the end of the report (Appendix I), there is a special section on selected manufacturing industries, showing annual estimates of gross output, intermediate inputs and value added in current and constant dollars as well as the resultant implicit price indexes. The industrial detail consists of total manufacturing, all major groups, and selected 3-digit S.I.C. industries.

The current price (i) gross output (ii) intermediate input and (iii) value added series have been derived as follows. (i) For each industry, the value of total production obtained from the census of manufactures is adjusted, where necessary, to include estimates of additional income items such as rentals. In calculating the value of production, the physical change in inventories has been valued in prices of the current period. (ii) Intermediate inputs are derived by adding an estimate of the cost of purchased service inputs and indirect taxes to the cost of material inputs, supplies, containers, fuel and electricity, etc., obtained from the census of manufactures. The service inputs were estimated as a fixed proportion of value added for both the current and constant dollar measures. (iii) Value added is derived residually, that is, it is the difference between gross outputs and intermediate inputs.

The implicit price indexes are derived by dividing each current price series by the corresponding constant price series. Since the deflation process is carried out at a detailed commodity level, thereby capturing the current period commodity structure, the resultant implicit price indexes should be considered as Paasche or currently weighted price indexes.

Les industries productrices de services ont bénéficié de la parution récente du recensement du commerce et des services de 1971. Les données inter-censitaires ont été ajustées à la tendance exprimée entre les deux années de recensement. Les bâtiments et les travaux publics et les mines ont surtout connu des changements d'ordre statistique.

La pondération des industries de 1961 a été légèrement modifiée de façon à la rendre cohérente avec les tableaux d'entrées-sorties et les comptes nationaux des revenus et des dépenses. On voit au tableau I le rapprochement effectué entre le produit national brut au prix du marché et le produit intérieur brut au coût des facteurs.

À la suite des changements entrepris dans les niveaux annuels, on a dû modifier les estimations mensuelles, trimestrielles et les facteurs saisonniers qui leur sont rattachés.

Les données annuelles sont présentées sous forme d'indices au tableau 2 pour la majorité des industries à 3 chiffres et pour tous les agrégats. Des informations beaucoup plus détaillées sont maintenant disponibles pour la majorité des industries productrices de services.

On trouve à la fin du rapport une section spéciale, l'appendice I, sur le groupe des industries manufacturières. Y sont présentées des estimations annuelles de la production brute de la consommation intermédiaire et de la valeur ajoutée, comme nous l'avons déjà mentionné. Ces données sont disponibles pour l'ensemble des entreprises manufacturières, pour tous les agrégats principaux et pour certaines industries à 3 chiffres (C.A.E.).

Les séries en prix courants (i) de la production brute, (ii) de la consommation intermédiaire et (iii) de la valeur ajoutée sont calculées comme suit. (i) Pour chaque industrie, l'estimation de la production totale, tirée du recensement manufacturier, est ajustée, si nécessaire, pour inclure certains revenus additionnels, par exemple, de location. Au moment du calcul, les variations matérielles des stocks ont été évaluées aux prix de la période courante. (ii) La consommation intermédiaire est obtenue en additionnant le coût des services achetés et les taxes indirectes aux coûts des matériaux, des fournitures, des contenants, du combustible et de l'électricité, etc., fournis par le recensement manufacturier. Le coût des services achetés a été estimé à l'aide d'un coefficient fixe de la valeur ajoutée, appliqué aux mesures en dollars courants et constants. (iii) La valeur ajoutée est dérivée de façon résiduelle, c'est-à-dire, qu'elle est la différence entre la production brute et la consommation intermédiaire.

Les indices implicites de prix proviennent de la division de chaque série en prix courants par la série correspondante en prix constants. Comme le dégonflement des données s'effectue pour une désagrégation poussée des produits, reflétant ainsi leur structure courante, les indices implicites qui en résultent devraient être considérés comme des indices de Paasche ou des indices de prix à pondération courante.

Long Term Trends

The decade of the 1960's represents one of the longest and most vigorous periods of economic expansion in Canadian history. A marked change in the industrial structure occurred during this period resulting from changes in the patterns of domestic and external demand as well as from technological advancement. The widespread amelioration in the standard of living and the emphasis in North America on social welfare issues provided the impetus to the implementation of income redistribution policies. This was accompanied by heavy investment in health, educational and recreational facilities at the community level.

Several sectors of the economy benefited from the introduction of new technology. For example, the spread of computer technology revolutionized not only the handling of information but also the production processes of a whole range of goods and services. The agriculture industry recorded productivity gains due to rapid increases in mechanization, the extensive use of chemical products and some rationalization of the size of farms. The principal factors affecting the growth in mining production were exploration expenditures, coupled with the already intensive capital investment in mining operations as well as the development of foreign markets and the appearance of new products, such as potash. The rapid spread of supermarkets and shopping centres and the introduction of self-service operations transformed the retailing scene. In the case of the manufacturing industries, the expansion of markets was a contributing factor both to boosting the volume of production and to broadening the range of manufactured goods being produced in Canada. The considerable growth in exports of motor vehicles and parts, following the Canada - United States automotive agreement, added a new dimension to traditional Canadian exports.

The pattern of growth at the national level disguised sharp regional disparities. The general trends in industrial growth that could be discerned across the country exhibited pronounced variations from province to province. In aggregate, the growth in Real Domestic Product (RDP) for Canada compared favourably with that of other developed countries. With an average annual rate of growth in RDP of 5.5% for the 1961 to 1971 period, Canada ranks third after Japan (10.8%) and France (5.9%) at the top of the list of developed countries with rapid rates of growth in production.

Tendances à long terme

La dernière décennie se présente à l'analyse comme l'une des plus longues et des plus fortes périodes d'expansion dans l'histoire canadienne. Des changements profonds de la structure industrielle l'ont agitée, liés aux modifications de la demande extérieure et nationale et à de rapides progrès technologiques. L'amélioration générale du niveau de vie de la population et l'intérêt récent en Amérique du Nord pour les politiques de bien-être ont provoqué l'établissement de programmes de redistribution du revenu et la mise en place d'équipements collectifs de loisir, de santé, d'éducation.

De nombreux segments de l'activité économique ont su bénéficier de l'apparition de nouvelles machines. Parmi celles-ci, l'avènement des ordinateurs a bouleversé tant le traitement de l'information que les méthodes de production des biens et des services. L'industrie de l'agriculture a joui d'une croissance sensible de sa productivité grâce à l'utilisation intensive d'équipement mécanique et des produits chimiques et de la rationalisation de la grandeur des fermes. En ce qui concerne les industries extractives, les investissements poussés dans la recherche de nouveaux sites, la déjà forte capitalisation des entreprises, le développement des marchés étrangers et l'essor de nouveaux produits (par exemple, la potasse) ont été les moteurs principaux de la croissance. L'implantation des supermarchés, des centres commerciaux, des systèmes de libre-service a complètement bouleversé l'image des établissements de commerce. Quant au secteur manufacturier, l'agrandissement des marchés a contribué à élargir la gamme de produits fabriqués et en à gonfler considérablement le volume. La hausse fantastique des exportations d'automobiles et de pièces, à la suite de l'accord canado-américain de l'automobile, a apporté une nouvelle dimension au groupe habituel des biens d'exportation.

Le développement national se ressent fortement des disparités régionales. Une tendance générale dans la croissance industrielle manifestée d'un bout à l'autre du pays démontrera parfois des variations extrêmes entre les provinces. En moyenne, cependant, la croissance de la production intérieure se compare avantageusement avec celle des autres pays développés. Avec un rythme annuel moyen d'augmentation de 5.5 % du produit intérieur réel (P.I.R.) de 1961 à 1971, le Canada rejoint le Japon (10.8 %) et la France (5.9 %) à la tête du peloton des pays à croissance rapide.



Analysts of the Canadian economic scene have distinguished two main phases in the expansion of the last decade. From 1961 to 1966 the rate of growth in RDP averaged around 6.9%, the highest growth rate sustained for a period of such duration. A tendency toward full utilization of productive capacity and price stability characterized Canadian economic conditions until the middle of 1965. The expansionary factors at work in the economy were pervasive enough to permeate most industrial activities during this period. During the second half of 1965 and 1966, however, some signs of overheating in the economy started to become evident.

During the second phase of the expansion, production grew at a less rapid pace, while the rate of price increases accelerated. The costs of production increased, as did unemployment. The changing and erratic economic conditions necessitated flexibility in policy approaches. International economic conditions worsened, and this emerging malaise was deepened by a monetary crisis, widespread inflation and weakness in the export markets for Canadian grain. Closer to home, the Canadian economy was affected by a softening in the United States balance of payments position.

Les observateurs de la scène nationale distinguent deux phases principales de l'expansion de la dernière décennie. De 1961 à 1966, le taux de croissance se maintient autour de 6.9 %, le plus haut taux de croissance enregistré au pays pour une période d'une telle durée. L'élan vers le plein emploi des ressources productives, la stabilité des prix et l'expansion généralisée à tous les secteurs de l'activité caractériseront la conjoncture jusqu'au milieu de 1965. À partir de la seconde moitié de 1965 et en 1966, les signes de la surchauffe deviennent plus évidents.

Pendant la seconde phase, le rythme de la croissance se réduit. La montée des prix s'accélère. Les coûts de production et le chômage s'élevèrent. Les conditions économiques capricieuses et changeantes exigent des politiques flexibles. La conjoncture internationale se dégrade, encouragée par la crise monétaire, l'inflation, la faiblesse de nos marchés extérieurs, des céréales et les difficultés de la balance des paiements américaine.

Conditions in the Canadian labour market exhibited tendencies similar to those discussed above for production. The labour force grew substantially and at a fairly even pace. The steady stream of the post World War II generation entrants to the labour force was channelled, to a considerable extent, into the service-producing industries, as were the large numbers of women joining the labour force as a result of the noticeable increases in the female participation rate. The participation of Canadian women in the labour force, which, in 1961, was well below that of Western Europe, the United States and Japan, had almost reached a comparable level by 1971.

Employment grew more rapidly than the labour force until about the middle of the decade. Beginning in 1967, however, jobs and hence employment, did not grow sufficiently to absorb the available labour supply. For the 11 year period under discussion, therefore, Canada enjoyed the unenviable reputation of maintaining the highest unemployment rate among the industrialized nations of the West. As shown in Table III, unemployment, after reaching a low in 1966, increased considerably during the late 1960's.

Le marché du travail se comporte semblablement. D'un côté, l'offre de main-d'oeuvre s'élargit considérablement et à un rythme presque régulier. L'entrée massive des jeunes nés après la seconde guerre mondiale et l'accroissement sensible de la participation des femmes seront canalisés, en grande partie, vers le secteur des services. L'activité des femmes sur le marché du travail, de peu importante en 1961 en comparaison avec l'Europe de l'Ouest, les États-Unis et le Japon, rejoindra presque leur niveau en 1971.

Quant à l'emploi, il s'est accru plus vite que la population active jusqu'au milieu de la période. Puis, à partir de 1967, il montre une accélération insuffisante pour absorber la nouvelle main-d'oeuvre. Sur l'ensemble de ces 11 ans, le Canada jouit de la réputation peu enviable parmi les nations occidentales d'avoir maintenu un des plus hauts taux de chômage. Celui-ci, après avoir touché un seuil minimum en 1966, deviendra de plus en plus important, comme on peut le constater au tableau III.

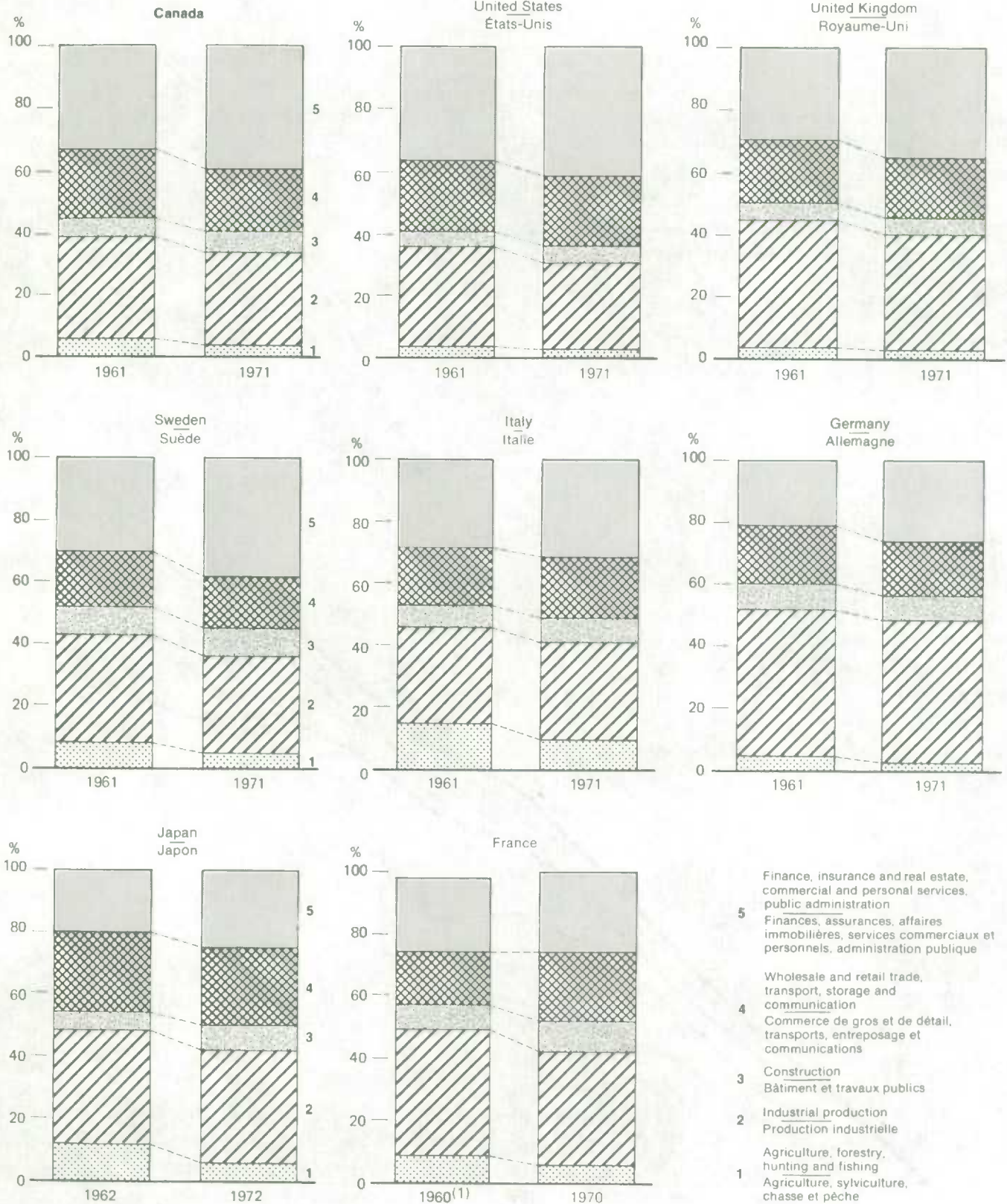

**Répartition du produit intérieur réel aux prix courants, par genre d'activité économique**



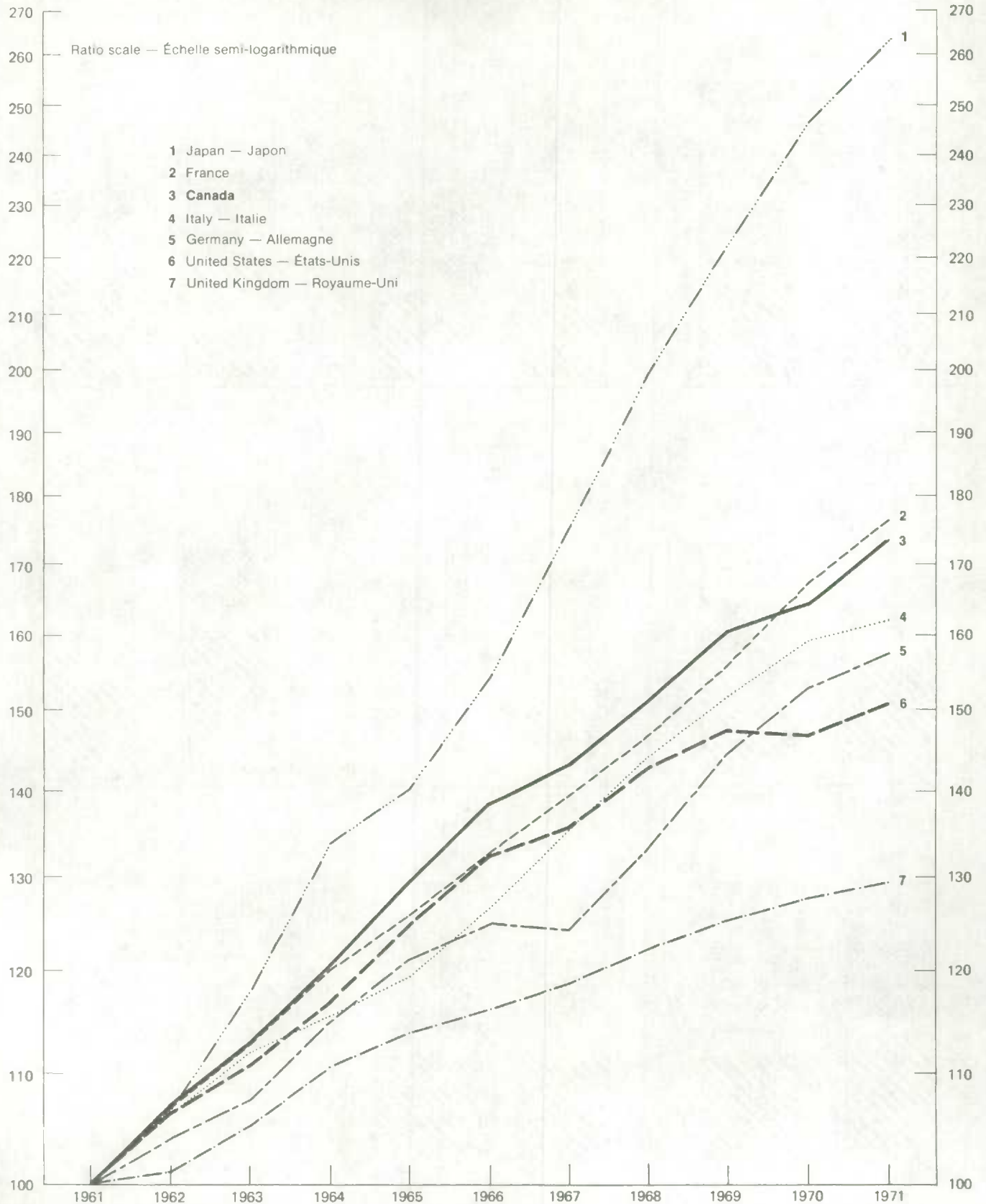

Comparaison des indices du produit intérieur réel aux prix de 1961



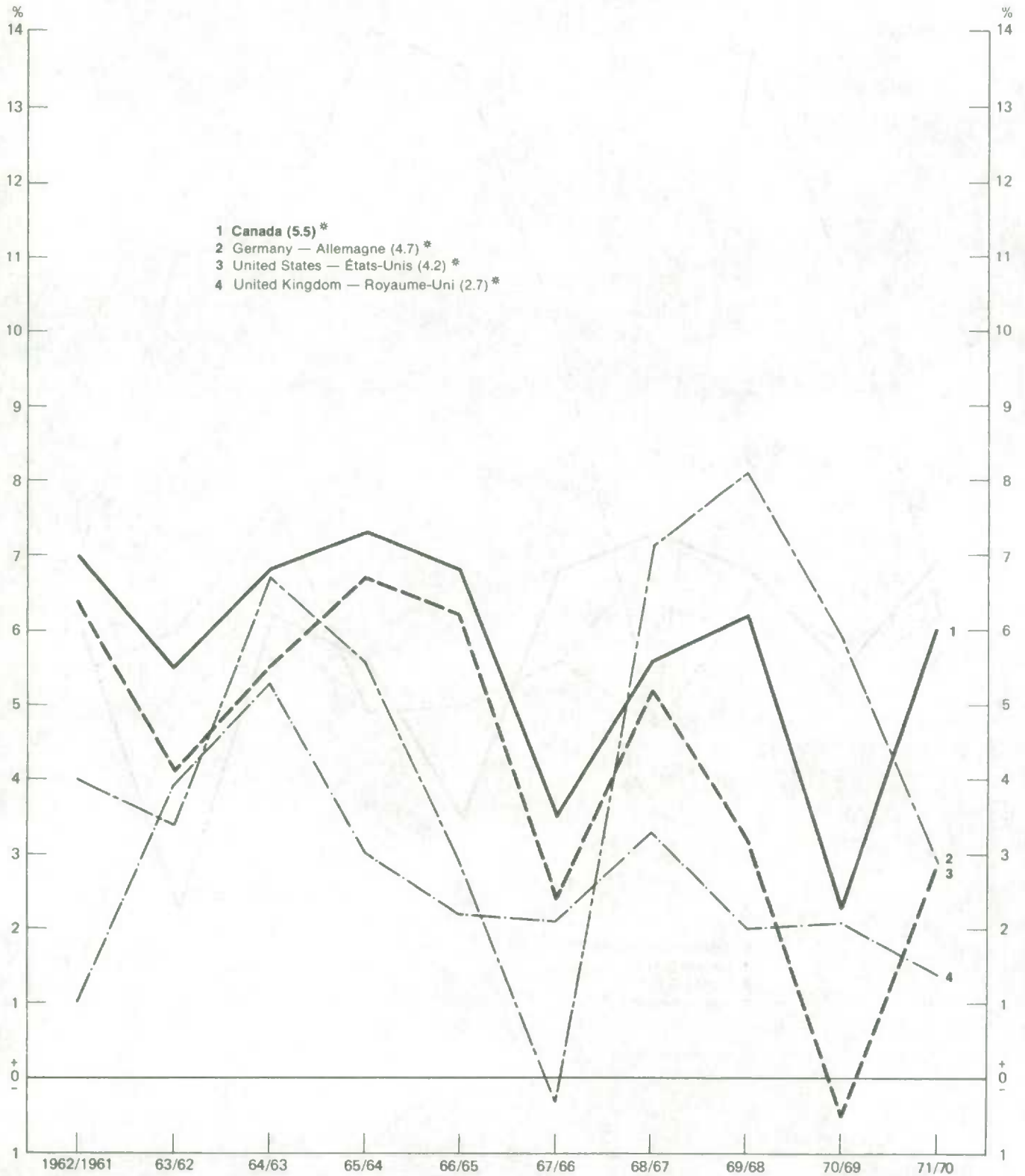

Comparaison des taux de croissance annuels du P.I.R., 1961-1971



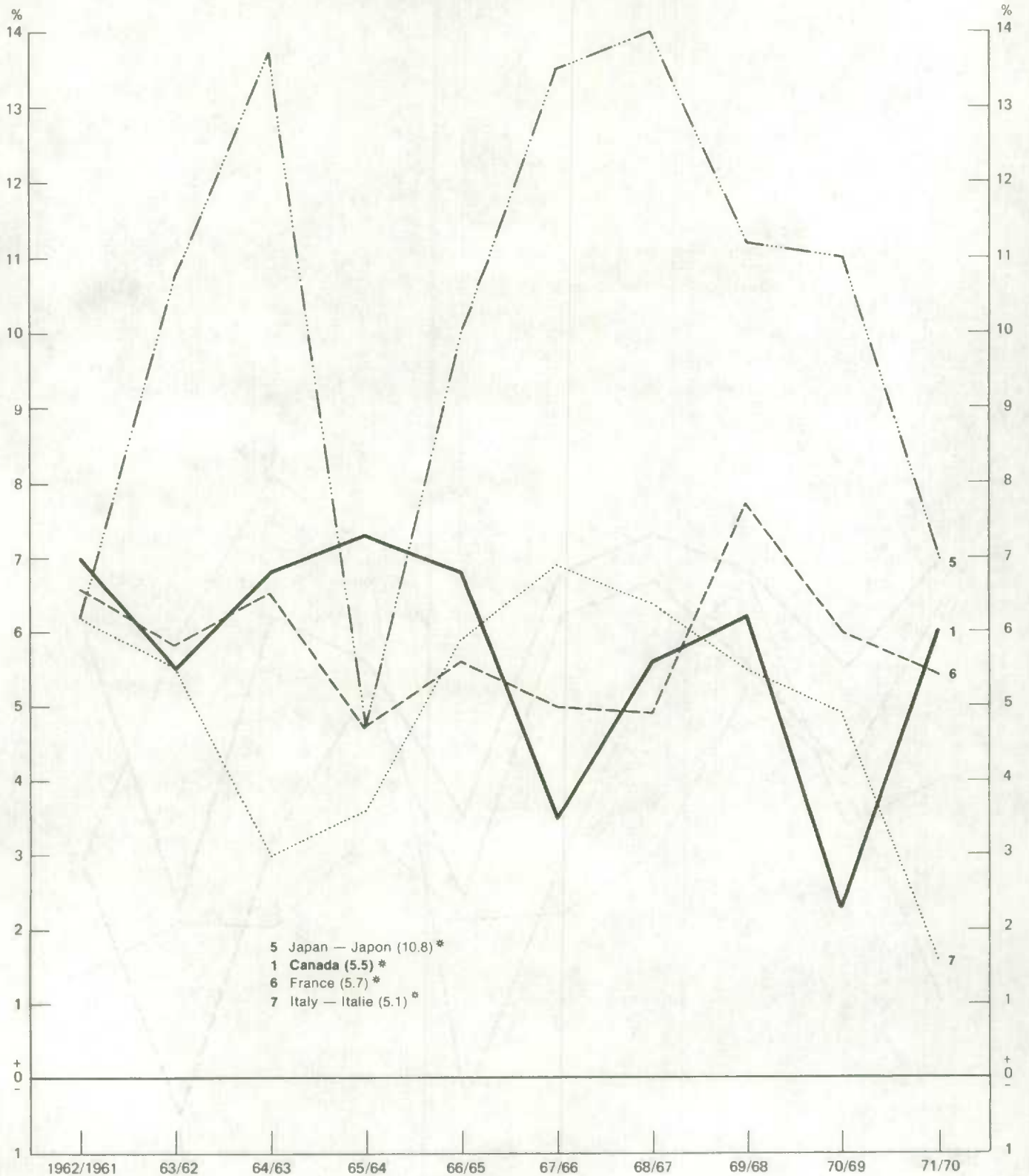

**Comparaison des taux de croissance annuels du P.I.R., 1961-1971**



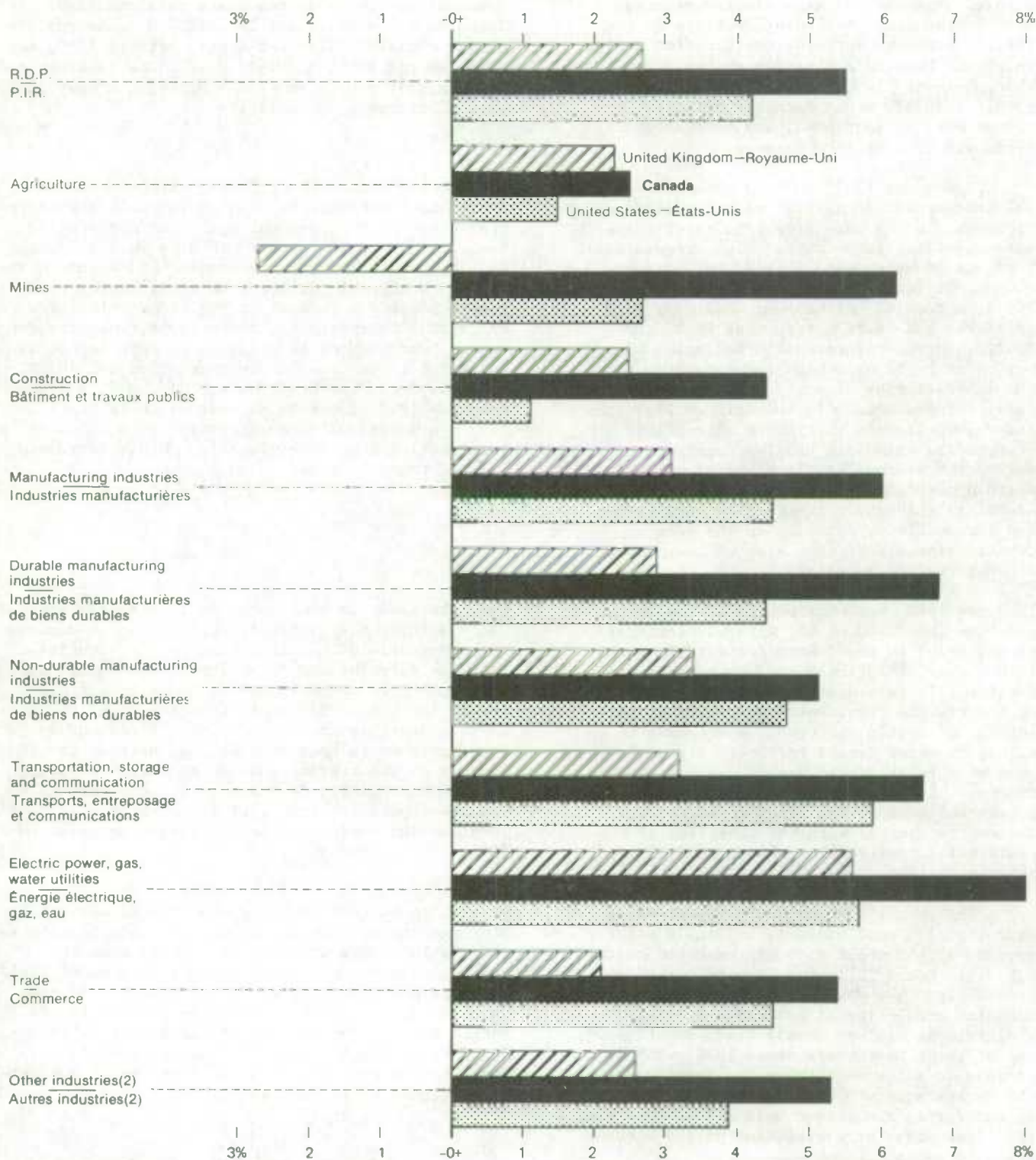

### Medium Term Trends

During the first quarter of 1961, the Canadian economy began to emerge from a brief recessionary period. The unemployment rate hovered around 7% and the price level remained stable. A number of expansionary measures were introduced. Following a crisis in the foreign exchange markets, the Canadian dollar, which had been on a floating exchange rate since October 1950, was pegged, in May of 1962, at \$0.925 U.S. Canada's official reserves were strengthened, and merchandise trade was brought into balance.

The years 1962 and 1963 benefited from the interaction of several rather exceptional factors. In the case of agriculture, there were unusually large wheat crops, considerable portions of which were shipped to Eastern Bloc countries and farm incomes rose appreciably as a result. After some hesitancy during the first and third quarters of 1962, the fourth quarter witnessed the beginning of a period of rapid expansion in production in the manufacturing of motor vehicles and in related industries. In the fall of 1963, the federal government instituted a programme designed to stimulate housing construction during the seasonally slack winter months, which succeeded in assuring some degree of stability throughout the year to production and income flows, not only in the area of construction itself, but also to the producers of construction materials.

In 1964, consumer demand for goods and services increased by 6%, with particularly strong gains in the demand for durable goods. In the case of agriculture, wheat production declined, in part due to drought conditions in the Prairie Provinces. By contrast, marketings of cattle increased in response to strong consumer demand for beef, although some of this increased demand was met through imports. Construction began, in 1964, to show a remarkable expansion which continued for another two years, with the exception of residential construction which, declined sharply in 1966.

The year 1965 once again witnessed an exceptionally good harvest, and again a large portion of the wheat crop was exported to the U.S.S.R. Domestic demand also increased substantially, thus strengthening the base for Canadian production of goods and services. Wholesale as well as retail trade experienced one of their best years since 1958, with increases in sales well above the average for the decade as a whole. According to the OECD, it was during the second half of the year that the first signs of overheating of the economy began to appear.

### Tendances à moyen terme

Au premier trimestre de 1961 l'économie canadienne se relève d'une courte récession. Le taux de chômage s'aventure autour de 7 % et le niveau des prix reste stable. Les autorités canadiennes prennent une série de mesures expansionnistes. À la suite d'une crise sur le marché des changes, le dollar canadien, flottant depuis octobre 1950, est fixé, en mai 1962, à \$0.925 É.-U. Les réserves de changes sont renforcées et les échanges commerciaux avec l'étranger, rééquilibrés.

Les années 1962 et 1963 cueilleront les fruits de l'interaction de nombreux facteurs exceptionnels. Dans le secteur agricole, des récoltes fantastiques de blé seront expédiés vers les pays de l'Est et les ménages concernés bénéficient d'une hausse appréciable de leurs revenus. Après une courte pause aux premier et troisième trimestres de 1962, l'industrie des véhicules automobiles est ramenée sur une courbe de développement rapide au quatrième trimestre. Le programme fédéral de stimulation de la construction d'hiver, créé à l'automne de 1963, assurera au secteur de la fabrication des matériaux de construction et à celui de la construction même un niveau plus stable de revenu pendant toute l'année.

En 1964, la croissance de la demande personnelle atteint 6 %, orientée surtout sur la dépense en biens durables. L'industrie de l'agriculture voit une décroissance de sa production de blé due en partie à la sécheresse dans l'Ouest; par ailleurs, les ventes de boeuf, importés et d'ici, augmentent sensiblement pour répondre à une hausse importante de la consommation. Le secteur des bâtiments et des travaux publics connaîtra à partir de 1964 et pour les deux années consécutives une remontée spectaculaire, sauf la composante de la construction résidentielle qui subira un recul en 1966.

L'année 1965 voit des récoltes abondantes que l'on exporte de nouveau en U.R.S.S. L'intensification de la consommation de la part de tous les agents économiques contribue au développement rapide de la production intérieure. Le commerce de gros comme de détail, profite d'une de ses meilleures années depuis 1958 et pour l'ensemble de la décennie. Selon l'O.C.D.E., c'est au cours de la seconde moitié de l'année que se font sentir les premiers signes de la surchauffe.



The annual rate of change in RDP remained fairly high (6.8%) for 1966, but growth was not evenly dispersed among industries. It is interesting to note a decline in the contribution to aggregate growth on the part of such cyclically-sensitive industries as manufacturing, trade and transport, and a compensating increase in the contribution of agriculture and construction. Strikes in railway transport, iron ore mining and textile manufacturing, dampened aggregate production in the second and third quarters. The unemployment rate declined to 3.6%, a rate which is generally considered to be full employment.

The 9.3% increase in government expenditures on goods and services from 1965 to 1966 and the 11% expansion in business gross fixed capital formation (both in constant dollars), began to exert considerable pressures on resource costs. The federal government responded to the resulting rise in costs and prices by abandoning certain government construction projects, and through measures of fiscal restraint and credit restrictions. Beginning in mid-1965 mortgage rates began to rise, following a period of stability. The expansion in residential construction experienced some slowdown in 1965 (9.3%, down from a gain of 14.4% in the previous year) and a decline of 10% in 1966. Various regions in Canada began to suffer from a serious housing shortage. The summer of 1966 witnessed the introduction of various measures designed to foster short-term expansion.

In contrast to previous expansionary periods, the 1961 to 1966 expansion did not result in a balance of payments deficit. Commodity exports were strengthened by two large wheat sales to the U.S.S.R., an export support policy, the lowering of the exchange rate at the end of 1961 and in 1962 and, finally, through the Canada - United States automobile agreement which was concluded in 1965. The proportion of current dollar exports of finished products accounted for by motor vehicles and parts, increased from 12.5% in 1961 to 46.9% in 1966 and jumped to 55.7% in 1967. RDP in the motor vehicle manufacturers industry increased by about three times between 1961 and 1967. The rate of growth in this industry was less spectacular after 1967. Table IV presents the percentage change between 1961, 1966 and 1971 by industry and the contribution of each industry to the change in RDP.

Le taux de variation annuel du P.I.R. demeure assez élevé (6.8 %) en 1966, mais n'est pas distribué également à travers les secteurs de l'économie. On note une baisse de la participation relative des industries réactives aux cycles (manufactures, commerce et transports) par rapport au gain national et une accentuation compensatoire de la contribution de l'agriculture et de la construction. Des grèves dans les chemins de fer, les textiles et le minéral de fer freinent l'activité au deuxième et au troisième trimestres. Le taux de chômage s'élève à 3.6 %, taux considéré comme reflétant le plein emploi de la main-d'oeuvre.

L'augmentation en dollars constants de la dépense gouvernementale en biens et services de 9.3 % entre 1965 et 1966, et de la formation brute de capital fixe des entreprises de 11 % imposent de fortes pressions sur les ressources productives. Au gonflement consécutif des coûts et des prix, le gouvernement fédéral répond par l'abandon de certains projets publics de construction, par la restriction fiscale et le resserrement du crédit. À partir du milieu de 1965, le taux d'intérêt hypothécaire augmente rapidement, après une période de stabilité. La construction résidentielle s'en trouve ainsi ralentie, sa croissance passant de 14.4 % à 9.3 % entre 1964 et 1965. Elle voit même, en 1966, une réduction de 10 % de son volume. Diverses régions du pays endurent alors une grave pénurie de logements. À l'été de 1966, des mesures expansionnistes de court terme sont annoncées.

Contrairement aux périodes d'expansion antérieures, celle de 1961 à 1966 n'a pas conduit à un déficit commercial de la balance des paiements. Les exportations ont été fortifiées par deux grandes ventes de blé à l'U.R.S.S., par la politique de financement des exportations et d'aide de guerre accordée aux États-Unis, par la baisse du taux de change à la fin de 1961 et en 1962, et, finalement, par l'accord de 1965 sur l'automobile. La valeur aux prix courants des automobiles et des pièces exportées, par rapport à la totalité des produits finis non comestibles destinés aux marchés extérieurs est passée de 12.5 % en 1961 à 46.9 % en 1966 et à 55.7 % en 1967. Le volume de la valeur ajoutée des fabricants de véhicules automobiles a été multiplié par trois fois entre 1961 et 1967. La croissance de cette industrie aura une contribution moins importante après 1967. Le tableau IV nous montre l'augmentation brute et la contribution relative à l'accroissement par industrie entre 1961, 1966 et 1971.

In addition, there were other factors that appeared to play a decisive role in the 1961-1966 expansion. For example, the Canadian economy was closely connected to that of the United States, not only through geographic proximity and the facility of movement of labour and capital, but also in the area of trade, with increasing flows of goods and services across the border. Moreover, the strength of the United States economy during this period resulting from particularly successful economic policy measures, coupled with the expansion in the money supply which helped to finance the war in Vietnam, contributed to the growth in the Canadian economy.

The pace of Canadian industrial production advanced rapidly, supported as it was by strong domestic demand from the business and government sectors. Business investment in particular revealed an exceptionally rapid rate of growth. Expenditures on business gross fixed capital formation increased by 57% between 1961 and 1966, as measured in 1961 prices, while from 1966 to 1971 the increase was only 14%. Capital expenditures on machinery and equipment, between 1963 and 1966, constituted by far the largest proportion of the total increase in investment. There were also considerable capital expenditures by the various levels of government in the areas of education, health, transport and in preparation for Expo'67 and the Centennial year events. During the 1961 to 1966 period personal disposable income in current prices rose by 48%, while consumer expenditures on goods and services rose by 42% during the same period. Thus personal saving showed some gains during this period, indicating that households tended to set aside some part of their rising incomes for the future.

The year 1967 as a whole was notable for a relatively poor performance of the Canadian economy, even though activity picked up during the second and third quarters. The output of agriculture as well as that of construction declined, the latter after the end of the Expo'67 building boom. The manufacturing industry group which had expanded at an average annual rate of about 8% slowed to an increase of about 3% for the year 1967. The unemployment rate increased by 0.5% to 4.1%, while prices and salary and wage rates continued to increase. The strikes in the United States automobile industry affecting the Ford plants had a spill-over effect on Canadian aggregate production, particularly through reduced exports of motor vehicle parts. This was compounded by reduced wheat exports and by labour disputes in various Canadian industries, notably construction,

Outre l'apport des exportations, d'autres facteurs apparaissent décisifs de l'expansion de 1961-1966. L'économie canadienne se trouve particulièrement intégrée à celle des États-Unis à la fois géographiquement, par la grande mobilité des facteurs de production, et commercialement, par celle des biens et des services. Or, la fermeté de la situation économique américaine, à la suite d'une politique économique particulièrement heureuse et de l'expansion de la masse monétaire utilisée pour financer la guerre du Vietnam, a été un élément clé de l'efficacité économique nationale.

De plus, la croissance canadienne a été soutenue par une demande intérieure particulièrement vigoureuse, surtout celle des entreprises et de l'État. La croissance de l'investissement des entreprises, en particulier, se montre très forte. La dépense des firmes au chapitre de la formation brute de capital fixe, aux prix de 1961, se gonfle de 57 % entre 1961 et 1966, alors que l'augmentation totale entre 1966 et 1971 ne sera que de 14 %. L'achat, entre 1963 et 1966, sur les marchés nationaux et étrangers, de machines et d'équipement de production en constitue la part dominante. L'État s'engage dans de nombreuses dépenses en immobilisations en réponse au développement des secteurs de l'éducation, de la santé, des transports et à la préparation d'Expo 67 et des fêtes du Centenaire. On observe chez les ménages une tendance à épargner une partie de leurs nouveaux avoirs. Alors que le revenu personnel disponible s'élève de 48 % entre 1961 et 1966, la dépense personnelle en biens et services, aux prix courants, s'accroît de 42 %.

L'année 1967 révèle une piètre performance même si l'activité s'intensifie au deuxième et au troisième trimestres. L'agriculture et la construction d'après Expo 67 ont une production plus petite que celle de l'année précédente. Les industries manufacturières qui montraient depuis 1962 un gonflement annuel de la valeur ajoutée de l'ordre de 8 % doivent se contenter d'un taux de 3 %. Le chômage augmente de 0.5 % pour atteindre 4.1 %, les prix et les taux de salaires continuent de grossir. La grève des usines Ford aux États-Unis réduit l'activité nationale, en diminuant l'expédition de pièces au pays. Dans le même sens, s'ajoutent la grève de la construction, des transports, des fabricants d'équipement électrique et la diminution des exportations de blé. La balance courante s'améliore momentanément sous l'impulsion de l'exposition universelle tenue à Montréal et des festivités du Centenaire. Uniquement en 1967, le relèvement de la productivité de l'ensemble des industries

transport and electrical equipment manufacturers. On the other hand, the situation was somewhat improved, if only for a short period, through expenditures on Man and his World held in Montreal and the various activities associated with the Canadian centenary. However, 1967 was the only year during the 1961-1971 period for which productivity gains were lower in Canada than in the United States for the commercial industry group. Unit labour costs increased more rapidly than in the United States for the third consecutive year.

RDP for the year 1968 recovered from the previous year's decline and productivity registered a significant increase. Exports of motor vehicles and parts to the United States remained one of the principal expansionary factors. The community, business and personal services group showed the second largest contribution to the change in total output. Man-days lost to strikes and lockouts increased by about one-third from the year before and clearly asserted a dampening influence on production. The effects of work stoppages were particularly severe in the case of transportation equipment manufacturers and in the communications industry. Following strong increases in demand for housing in metropolitan areas, the government instituted policies designed to foster expansion in available mortgage funds. However, the continued increases in building costs as well as all the other real estate charges continued to constitute an obstacle to bringing the demand and the supply of housing into balance.

Le P.I.R. de 1968 se remet de la descente de 1967. La productivité enregistre une hausse significative. Les exportations d'automobiles vers les États-Unis demeurent la principale force d'expansion. Remarquablement, les services socio-culturels, commerciaux et personnels apportent la seconde plus large contribution au changement total. Le grossissement de plus du tiers par rapport à l'année précédente des journées-hommes de travail perdues à cause de grèves et de lock-outs affaiblissent la remontée. Les arrêts de travail se manifestent surtout chez les fabricants de matériel de transport et le secteur des communications. À la suite d'une demande très forte de logements dans les zones métropolitaines, le gouvernement cherche à élargir le volume de fonds disponibles sur le marché hypothécaire. Mais la hausse constante des coûts de production et de toutes les charges afférentes à la mise en valeur des maisons neuves et anciennes constituent autant d'obstacles à l'équilibre du marché.

The following year showed a similar pattern: the rate of growth increased in relation to 1968 but the expansion was unevenly distributed among industries and the economy was subjected to longer and more severe labour disputes. The strikes were most severe in construction, in iron and steel production, smelting and refining and in air transport. The stevedoring strike in the United States channelled larger export flows from Canada to that country, partly as a result of re-exports. Export markets for Canadian wheat remained weak. The rate of increase in prices for 1969 was one of the highest during the entire decade. As a notable example, prices of imported goods rose by 3%, which is three times higher than the average annual price increase for the five preceding years. In spite of this, the rate of inflation in Canada still remained the lowest among the Western countries. This relatively favourable situation was the result of the reduction in tariffs negotiated during the 1969 Kennedy round, the temporary drop in food prices following the severe price competition among supermarket chains, and the priority that the federal government attached to the fight against inflation.

Since 1966, the level of consumer prices had continued to increase at an accelerated rate. Approximately one third of the increase between 1967 and 1969 was due to the housing component. This appears to have been the result of a shortage of housing, accompanied by rising costs of land, materials, labour and financial capital. Money incomes had not kept pace with the rapid changes in price levels, and were soon caught in a race to catch up. For the tax payers, tax increases were added to the price pressures on incomes. These included indirect taxes (as a result of increases in both the volume of sales and of tax rates), as well as direct taxes on income. Between 1965 and 1969, although personal income rose by 50%, government revenues from income taxes more than doubled. There followed a reduction in the savings propensity of households.

Total transfer payments to individuals increased by about 16% per annum during the 1965 to 1971 period. Government expenditures were largely devoted to financing the improvements in community services, and expanded social and welfare programmes, such as unemployment insurance and old age pensions, as well as the financing of post-secondary education and the administration of all these programmes. Hospital services, educational institutions, particularly vocational schools and universities and colleges were among the most rapidly growing industry areas in the economy during the 1961 to 1969 period, with the rate of growth peaking in 1967.

L'année suivante continue sur la même lancée: taux de croissance réaugmentée par rapport à l'année précédente, mais dont la distribution est inégale entre les industries, durcissement et allongement des conflits de travail. Les grèves éclatent cette fois dans la construction, le fer et l'acier, l'affinage des métaux et le transport aérien. La grève des débardeurs aux États-Unis permet de relever nos exportations (en partie les réexportations) vers ce pays, tandis que le marché mondial du blé reste faible. Le taux annuel d'augmentation des prix sera l'un des plus élevés par rapport à l'ensemble de la décennie. On souligne un relèvement des prix à l'importation de 3 %, i.e., trois fois plus que la hausse moyenne des cinq années précédentes. Même là, l'inflation canadienne se présente encore comme la moins vive en Occident. Cette situation relativement favorable tient à la réduction des tarifs issue du Kennedy round de 1969, à la baisse momentanée du coût des aliments provoquée par la guerre de prix entreprise dans les supermarchés et à la priorité consacrée à la lutte contre l'inflation par le gouvernement fédéral.

Depuis 1966, la hausse de l'indice des prix à la consommation s'accélère. De 1967 à 1969, environ le tiers de cette majoration s'explique par le renchérissement de l'habitation. Les logements sont rares, bâtis sur des terrains de plus en plus coûteux, à l'aide de ressources matérielles, financières et de main-d'oeuvre onéreuses. Les revenus monétaires négociés tentent de s'ajuster aux hausses antérieures des prix, convertissant leur escalade en un processus auto-entretenu. Pour le contribuable, s'ajoute à la pression des prix le relèvement des taxes payées, taxes indirectes (majoration des taux et du volume des ventes) et impôts sur le revenu. Entre 1965 et 1969, alors que le revenu personnel a grossi d'environ 50 %, les recettes des gouvernements au titre de l'impôt sur le revenu ont plus que doublé. Les ménages réduisent leur propension à épargner.

Les transferts totaux de tous les gouvernements vers les particuliers croissent d'environ 16 % par année entre 1965 et 1971. Les administrations publiques financent l'amélioration des services communautaires, le développement des programmes de paiements de transfert dont la caisse de sécurité de la vieillesse, l'assurance-chômage, les subventions à l'enseignement post-secondaire et l'agrandissement consécutif des fonctions publiques. Les hôpitaux, les écoles, surtout professionnelles, les collèges et universités bénéficieront d'une croissance exceptionnelle à partir du début de la période jusqu'en 1969, atteignant leur apogée en 1967.

In the context of the battle against inflation, the federal government decided to adopt, in 1969, a severely restrictive monetary policy. The Bank of Canada raised the interest rate. This in turn attracted sizable amounts of foreign capital, the influence of which resulted in the appreciation of the Canadian dollar. In 1970, the Bank of Canada decided it would no longer support the Canadian dollar at a fixed rate of exchange and, in May, allowed it to float. A new recession in economic activity had already become apparent at that time. The increase in RDP for 1970 was the smallest (2.3%) of any during the period from 1961 to 1971. The economic recession which affected the United States and the international monetary crisis continued to significantly affect the production of Canadian industries. The increase in the unemployment rate (to 5.9%), coupled with the decline in the rate of expansion of personal incomes, reduced the level of consumer demand for goods and services. In view of these developments, the federal government implemented further special programmes to stimulate investment both on a national scale and at the regional level, and to aid housing construction. Federal policies became expansionary in nature. However, it should be noted that external demand for raw materials and fuels such as minerals, petroleum, and natural gas, constituted the principal factor contributing to the expansionary forces. The crude petroleum and natural gas industry maintained a rate of growth of nearly 14%. Labour disputes were concentrated in the area of pulp and paper, in construction and in motor vehicle production.

The year 1971 witnessed a recovery which, although sporadic, was promising as the main source of strength appeared to come from domestic demand. This was reinforced by an easing of fiscal and monetary policies. Credit conditions were relaxed and resulted in a 25% increase in the number of dwelling starts. Contrary to the usual trends, the external sector asserted a dampening influence on the expansion at this time, following a decline in demand in Europe, the United States and Japan. Employment reacted slowly probably, since at an early stage of the expansionary phase of a cycle, there is a tendency for productivity to rise rather than for employment to increase. The unemployment rate settled in the vicinity of 6.4%. Output per man-hour for the commercial economy increased by 3.3%. The rate of inflation slowed down, aided by the relative stability in United States price levels. Labour disputes became less numerous. The recession seemed to have petered out and the Canadian economy began to adjust itself to the expansionary period which lasted until 1974.

Dans le contexte de la lutte contre l'inflation, le gouvernement fédéral décide d'appliquer, en 1969, une politique économique très restrictive. La Banque du Canada relèvera alors le taux d'intérêt. L'attraction massive de capitaux étrangers qui s'en suit mène rapidement à l'appréciation du dollar canadien. En 1970, la banque centrale ne peut plus soutenir le taux de change fixe du dollar canadien et, en mai, décide de le laisser fluctuer. Une nouvelle décélération économique était déjà manifeste. L'augmentation du P.I.R. en 1970 se résume à 2.3 %, la plus faible parmi les années considérées. La récession américaine et la crise monétaire internationale continuèrent d'affecter profondément l'industrie nationale. Le taux de chômage élevé (5.9 %), la réduction de la croissance du revenu personnel réel réduisent l'ampleur de la demande des consommateurs. Face à cette dégradation, le gouvernement fédéral s'empresse d'élaborer des programmes spéciaux de stimulation des investissements, tant au niveau national qu'à celui des régions, et d'aide à la construction résidentielle. Les dépenses publiques prennent un tournant nettement expansionniste. La demande extérieure de matières premières (minerais, pétrole brut et gaz naturel) constituera la principale force d'expansion. L'industrie du pétrole brut et du gaz naturel maintient un rythme de croissance de près de 14 %. Les grèves se concentrent surtout dans les industries des pâtes et papiers, de la construction et de la fabrication de véhicules automobiles.

L'année 1971 enregistre une reprise qui, quoiqu'irrégulière, sera encourageante car fondée sur la consommation intérieure. L'allégement des politiques fiscales et monétaires l'aura soutenue. Les conditions de crédit plus relâchées provoqueront une hausse de 25 % du nombre de mises en chantier. Étonnamment, le secteur extérieur ralentit l'expansion à la suite d'une baisse conjuguée de la demande en Europe, aux États-Unis et au Japon. L'emploi réagit très peu car, à un premier stade d'expansion cyclique, il existe une tendance chez l'entrepreneur à utiliser plus efficacement la main-d'oeuvre au détriment de l'embauche. Le taux de chômage se situe aux alentours de 6.4 %. La production par heure-homme du secteur commercial augmente de 3.3 %. L'inflation se résorbe, aidée par la stabilité relative des prix aux États-Unis. Les conflits de travail deviennent moins nombreux. La récession semble se calmer. La croissance se poursuivra jusqu'en 1974.

NOTES FOR CHARTS

For all the charts in this section, the data for GDP at factor cost for Canada have been taken from the tables contained in this publication (Statistics Canada, Catalogue 61-516, Real Domestic Product by Industry, 1961-1971) and from Catalogue 61-213, Real Domestic Product by Industry.

Chart 3 was based mostly on data contained in the National Accounts of OECD Countries, OECD. It presents GDP by industry at market prices for all the countries except Canada. The data for France used in this chart were obtained from the Yearbook of National Accounts Statistics, United Nations. Users should note that the industry GDP estimates for France for the year 1960 sum to 98%. The residual 2% which has not been allocated by industry consists of the item "indirect taxes less subsidies".

Charts 4, 5 and 6 present data obtained from National Accounts of OECD Countries, the United Nations Yearbook of National Accounts Statistics; the Survey of Current Business, published by the United States Department of Commerce, for United States Data; and from Economic Trends and the Monthly Digest of Statistics, HSMO for the United Kingdom. Only the estimates for the United Kingdom and Canada are valued at factor cost; the estimates for the other countries are at market prices.

Users should note that the comparisons between countries shown in the charts should be interpreted with some caution. Country practices used in compiling national accounts estimates by industry tend to vary, even though, in general, they follow international conventions. This as well as other factors affect the meaningfulness of the comparisons. Nevertheless, trends that can be observed in the above mentioned charts, appear to be valid at the level of aggregation shown.

NOTES AU SUJET DES GRAPHIQUES

Pour tous les graphiques, les estimations du P.I.B. au coût des facteurs du Canada proviennent de la présente publication (Statistique Canada, n° 61-516 au catalogue Produit Intérieur réel par industrie, 1961-1971) et du rapport annuel du même titre (n° 61-213 au catalogue).

Le graphique 3 a été composé à l'aide des Comptes nationaux des pays de l'O.C.D.E. de l'O.C.D.E. et présente le P.I.B. au prix du marché par industrie, pour tous les pays sauf le Canada. Toutefois, les données pour la France sont tirées de l'Annuaire Statistique des Nations Unies. Vous remarquerez que le P.I.B. français illustré pour 1960 égale 98 %. Le 2 % résiduel forme la partie non attribuée aux industries particulières de la rubrique des "taxes indirectes moins les subventions".

Les graphiques 4, 5 et 6 rassemblent des informations diverses provenant des Comptes nationaux de l'O.C.D.E., du Yearbook of National Accounts Statistics des Nations Unies, du Survey of Current Business du United States Department of Commerce pour les États-Unis, et de Economic Trends and Monthly Digest of Statistics, H.M.S.O., pour le Royaume-Uni. Seuls le Canada et le Royaume-Uni présentent une estimation au coût des facteurs.

L'interprétation des graphiques montrant des comparaisons entre les pays doit être faite avec prudence. Même si des conventions internationales régissent la compilation des comptes nationaux par industrie, plusieurs pratiques propres aux agences statistiques nationales, de même que de nombreux autres facteurs, affectent la valeur de tels rapprochements. Nous croyons toutefois qu'au niveau d'agrégation des 4 graphiques précédents, des tendances générales peuvent être dégagées.

- Users should note that the current dollar data (for years other than the base years) were subjected to critical appraisal and rigorous time-series analysis only to the extent necessary to achieve the primary objective of producing reliable estimates of Real Domestic Product.

Consequently, the current dollar data and therefore the implicit price indexes for the 1962-1971 period inclusive, should, on the whole, be considered to be less reliable than the constant price measures, or the 1971 GDP distribution used in the estimates for the 1971-weight base period.

- The constant price value added (RDP) measures for most of the selected 3-digit industries included in Appendix I have been derived using the double deflation technique, that is, gross outputs and intermediate inputs have been deflated separately and value added has been derived residually. For 55% of the 1961 manufacturing value added, constant price value added (calculated in the manner just described) has been used as the indicator of RDP. For industries in which either gross outputs, materials or labour inputs are used as the indicator of RDP, the assumption has been made that year-to-year changes in the unmeasured series are proportional to those in the series selected as the official indicator. Gross output indicators have been used for SIC's 251, 295 and 336. The gross output indicator has been modified for industries in which the revenue from the sales of goods purchased for resale (GPRS) is significant. In these instances, the gross output includes only the gross margin on the GPRS sales. A modified gross output indicator has been used for SIC's 174, 332, 335, 339, 374 and 375. As a result, the movement of the RDP measure will differ from that of the gross output measure which includes the value of the GPRS sales. Materials were used as the indicator for SIC 286.

The RDP measures for SIC's 243, 244, 254, 365 and 379 are based on a combination of net and gross output indicators used at the 4-digit SIC working levels; the RDP measure for SIC 381 is based on a combination of gross output and manhours indicators at the 4-digit SIC working levels.

La production brute a servi d'indicateur pour les catégories 251, 295 et 336 de la C.A.E. On a modifié l'indicateur de la production brute pour les industries où la valeur des ventes de marchandises achetées pour la revente est importante. Dans ces cas, la production brute ne comprend que la marge bénéficiaire brute. L'indicateur de la production brute modifiée a été utilisé pour les catégories 174, 332, 335, 339, 374 et 375. Ainsi, la mesure du P.I.R. évoluera autrement que celle de la production brute, qui comprend la valeur totale des produits achetés pour la revente et non la seule marge. La matière première a servi d'indicateur pour la catégorie 286 de la C.A.E.

La mesure de P.I.R. pour les catégories 243, 244, 254, 365 et 379 est fondée sur une combinaison d'indicateurs nets et bruts de la production pour les calculs effectués au niveau des catégories à 4 chiffres; la mesure du P.I.R. pour la catégorie 381 repose sur une combinaison d'indicateurs de la production brute et d'heures-hommes pour les calculs effectués au niveau des catégories à 4 chiffres.
