



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


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
Revenue and Expenditure

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INTRODUCTION

This publication is the latest in a series of comprehensive reports containing comparative financial statistics of the federal, provincial and municipal governments in Canada. It brings together, in a convenient form, various sets of statistics prepared annually for the regular publications of the Public Finance Section of the Public Finance and

Transportation Division, Dominion Bureau of Statistics.

As explained in the Bureau of Statistics' regular annual reports on public finance, various adjustments to government financial statements are required in order to produce comparable statistics.

PART I. REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE

The statistics of the Government of Canada are based on the Public Accounts' data for the years 1956-57 to 1958-59, on preliminary data for the 1959-60 fiscal year appearing in the Budget Papers tabled in March 1960, and on the Estimates for the 1960-61 fiscal year contained in the Budget Speech presented March 31, 1960 and in the detailed Estimates tabled in February 1960.

The statistics of provincial governments are based on the Public Accounts' data for the fiscal years 1956-57 to 1958-59. Revenue and expenditure tables for 1959-60 and 1960-61 are based on analyses of the Provincial Estimates and Budget Speeches of the last two years.

In the case of municipal governments these data are based primarily on official published reports of the provinces supplemented by information from individual municipal reports and from preliminary returns filed with the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by selected municipalities in each province. As not all of the 1958 statistics are available at this time, some data for that year have had to be estimated. Similarly the 1959 and 1960 data for municipal governments are estimates based on preliminary returns and on projections of the latest final figures in relation to general trends reflected in the preliminary reports which have been filed for that year.

The ordinary revenues and expenditures of municipal utilities and enterprises, hospitals, libraries and certain special areas are not included nor is capital expenditure on municipal utilities and enterprises; only surpluses, deficits and levies thereof actually taken into the municipal accounts are reflected. Education expenditure is included at the amount of local taxation plus capital expenditure, less debt service (which appears under debt charges, except for minor amounts which cannot be identified).

Property taxes include all municipal and school taxes levied on real and personal property, its use and occupancy, as well as business taxes. There is no taxation of property for education levied by municipalities in Newfoundland. Grants in lieu of property taxes paid by the federal or provincial governments in respect of general government owned properties are shown separately on tables dealing with municipal revenues. Grants in lieu of property taxes from federal and provincial enter-

prises have been included under taxation, as many municipalities report them there as a result of statutory or regulatory direction and the amount separately reported would not be indicative of the actual situation.

Supplementing the revenue and expenditure statements are special statements showing transfer payments between the federal and provincial, and provincial and municipal governments. These data are analyzed according to the nature or purpose of the expenditure by each government concerned. Such transfer payments are comprised principally of two types of expenditure, namely, those in the nature of general grants or subsidies including the federal-provincial tax rental payments, which are not related to or predicated on expenditures for any particular service or function, and secondly, specific grants or subsidies which are directly related to the cost of or expenditure on particular services rendered by the receiving government.

In this presentation only the general grants, subsidies and tax rental payments are reflected in the revenue of the receiving government. All other transfer payments are deducted from the expenditures of the receiving government to which they are related. Similarly, institutional revenues and interest earnings have been deducted from related expenditures. Thus the expenditure tables reflect the "net" cost of the various services to each level of government.

Expenditures on capital account for the construction or acquisition of property, public works and other projects are combined with current or ordinary expenditures. Receipts in respect of such capital account transactions such as grants, contributions or other recoveries of amounts expended are also deducted from related expenditures.

Provision for debt retirement, including both principal instalments and sinking fund provisions, has been omitted from expenditure totals and the amounts omitted are reflected at the foot of each table affected.

Reference to the tables reconciling total revenues and expenditures appearing in the Public Accounts of the federal and provincial governments with the statistics appearing herein will reveal these and other adjustments.

It should be noted also that the statistics for all governments combined include only revenues derived from the public and expenditures on services to the public. Intergovernmental transfer payments, as above described, are excluded in all instances, including grants or subsidies for general

purposes and those for specific purposes. This is necessary to avoid duplication and to permit review of the relevant position of each level of government in light of its respective taxing and revenue producing power and authority.

PART II. DIRECT AND INDIRECT DEBT

These debt statistics are drawn from Dominion Bureau of Statistics compilations based on the public accounts of the federal and provincial governments and on departmental reports of the provinces and financial statements of municipalities, and for the latest year, on the federal budget papers and on surveys of the provinces and municipalities. In some instances it has been necessary to estimate municipal data so as to complete the presentation.

The direct funded debt of municipalities includes all debenture debt issued at the local government level whether for general purposes, for education, or for utilities; that is, all debentures issued by municipalities, by school boards, by utilities and by special districts and special areas such as those set up in metropolitan areas. Municipal sinking funds to the amount of the actuarial reserve have been shown as a deduction from funded debt. Municipal Improvement Assistance Act

loans and similar loans made by provincial governments which are secured by debentures deposited with the lender are shown as direct debenture debt. As all utility and special district and special area debt has been classified as direct debt, the amount of indirect debt shown represents debt issued by other than municipal corporations, or special local government bodies, and guaranteed by municipalities.

Only sinking or special debt retirement funds are shown as deductions from funded debt. Otherwise the statistics reflect the gross debt of each level of government.

In arriving at combined debt figures, intergovernmental balances, such as specifically identifiable treasury bills, loans and advances or other liabilities owing to other governments, are deducted. Securities such as bonds or debentures issued by one government and held as investments by another government are not deducted.
