

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THE INJURY STANDARDS

General Rules for Use

There are four injury standards: Nature of Injury, Part of Body, Source of Injury, and Type of Accident. These standards are directly related to each other. For example, the nature of the injury logically limits the parts of the body that can be affected. Similarly, the type of accident is partly determined by the source of the injury. For this reason, when coding a work injury case, the four standards should be used in the order in which they are shown in this manual. That is, the first code selected should be that for the Nature of Injury; the second, that for the Part of Body affected; etc.

Using the standards in this sequence should minimize the selection of invalid combinations of codes. These are defined as combinations of valid codes which between them contain contradictory information. An example of an invalid code combination would be Nature of Injury: concussion (code 140) with Part of Body: knee (code 513).

To further safeguard against invalid code combinations, once the code for Nature of Injury has been chosen, subsequent selections of codes for Part of Body, Source of Injury, and Type of Accident, should be checked against the appropriate table of invalid code combinations. If an invalid combination occurs, the original description of the injury should be reassessed, and the coding of the injury should be modified.


General Rules for "UNS" and "NEC" Codes

"UNSPECIFIED" (UNS) codes should be selected when the information available is insufficient to assign an existing detailed code.

"NOT ELSEWHERE CLASSIFIED" (NEC) codes should be selected when the information is sufficient for coding purposes, but none of the existing detailed codes applies.

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NATURE OF INJURY



NATURE OF INJURY

Definition

The nature of injury code identifies the injury or illness in terms of its principal physical characteristics.

General Rule

To avoid erroneous coding, first code Nature of Injury, followed by Part of Body, then Source of Injury, and then Type of Accident. Code for the primary or original injury or illness sustained, not for the consequence or sequelae of the primary injury. An exception to this rule applies to cases of amputations performed as a consequence of an injury. In these cases, select the code for the amputation and not the code for the original injury.

Rules for Selection

First choosing between the following broad groups may simplify the selection of the most appropriate detailed code:

- 1) Impact injuries (140, 160, 172, 178)
- 2) Body surface wounds (100, 170, 185)
- 3) Exertion injuries (182, 188)
- 4) Effects of extreme temperature, chemicals, and radiation (120, 175, 203, 220, 240, 290, 291, 293, 294, 295)
- 5) Inflammations (215, 260)
- 6) Respiratory injuries and illnesses (110, 273, 274, 281, 283, 286)
- 7) Other injuries and illnesses

Rules for Selection in Cases of Multiple Injuries


When one injury is obviously more severe than any of the others, select that injury. Severity is to be interpreted in terms of impairment of work performance.

When there are several injuries of different natures, such as cuts and sprains, none of which is indicated as being more serious than the others, code as "multiple injuries".

Rules for "UNS" and "NEC" Codes

"UNSPECIFIED" (UNS) codes should be selected when the information available is insufficient to assign an existing detailed code.

"NOT ELSEWHERE CLASSIFIED" (NEC) codes should be selected when the information available is sufficient for coding purposes, but none of the existing detailed codes applies.



NATURE OF INJURY - continued

Code Occupational Injuries

000 Occupational injury, UNS

- Amputation or enucleation
 Applies to cases where a limb, appendage, or any part thereof is entirely removed from the body. Enucleation applies to cases where the eyeball is removed following severement of the eye muscles and the optic nerve.
- Asphyxia, strangulation, drowning
 Applies to cases where the injury caused a
 cessation of breathing, or reduction in the capacity
 or ability to breathe. Asphyxia applies to a
 deficiency in the oxygen content of the respired
 air. Strangulation applies to choking or a
 throttling arrest of respiration, due to occlusion of
 the air passages by an external force or object.
 Drowning applies to respiratory arrest following
 filling of the lungs with water, or another liquid.
- 120 Burn or scald (hot or cold)
 Applies to the effects of contact with hot or cold substances. Does not include electric burns (175), chemical burns (203), sunburn (291), friction burns (185) or systemic disability such as heat stroke (240).
- 140 Concussion Brain, cerebral Applies to a loss of consciousness resulting from a blow to the head. <u>Does not</u> include skull fractures (178).
- 160 Contusion, crushing, bruise
 Applies to injuries producing no rupture of the skin surface. Bruise applies to any superficial injury produced by impact, without rupture of the skin.
- 170 Cut, laceration, puncture
 Applies to injuries producing rupture or tearing of
 the skin. Usually applies to cases of open wounds.
- 172 Dislocation
 Applies to injuries producing displacement of tones from their normal anatomical position, usually occurring in a joint cavity. Also called luxation.
- 175 Electric shock, electrocution
 Applies to injuries resulting from the passage of
 an electric current through the body. Includes
 electric burns.
- 178 Fracture

 Applies to injuries producing the breaking, or rupture of bones. Includes damage to teeth.

Code Ocupational Injuries

182 Hernia, rupture

Applies to injuries resulting from the protusion of a loop or knuckle of an organ or tissue through an abnormal opening. Includes cases of inguinal, femoral, and esophageal hernias, displaced lumbar discs or ruptured intervertebral discs (slipped discs).

- 185 Scratches, abrasions (superficial wounds)
 Applies to producing the wearing away or removal of a skin surface or mucous membrane. The injuries are superficial, and do not involve deeper body structures. Includes friction burns, and superficial wounds resulting from foreign bodies in the eye, ear, nose, etc.
- 188 Sprains, strains
 Applies to joint injuries where some, but not all, of the fibers in a supporting ligament are ruptured, but the continuity of the ligament is preserved. Commonly associated with overuse or overexertion of body muscles.
- 195 Multiple injuries
 Applies to cases involving several injuries of different natures, none of which is indicated as being more serious than the others.
- 199 Occupational injury, NEC

Code Occupational Illnesses

- 200 Occupational illness, UNS
- 203 Chemical burn
 Applies to tissue damage resulting from the corrosive action of chemicals, chemical derivatives, acids, alkalies, fumes, etc.
- 205 Contagious or infectious illness (disease), bodily infection

 Applies to injuries resulting from the multiplication of organisms in body tissues, which can be transmitted from person to person. Usually these illnesses are due to the action of virulent bacterial, viral, fungal or parasitic agents originating from conditions, plants, animals, persons, etc. in the working environment. Includes cases of amebiasis, anthrax, brucellosis, coccidioidomycosis, histoplasmosis, bacterial and viral food poisoning, conjunctivitis and ophthalmia, infectious hepatitis (exclude toxic hepatitis) (999), septicemia, tetanus, tuberculosis, etc. Bodily infections include cases of boils, furuncles, and carbuncles.

215 Dermatitis

Applies to injuries producing the inflammation of the skin and generally results from direct contact of the affected tissue(s) with irritants or sensitizing chemicals such as drugs, dusts, pollens, oils, biological compounds, plants, woods, metals or other agents in any form (solid, paste, gel, liquid, gas, etc.) which can be contacted in the pure state, in compounds or in combination with other materials. Includes cases of rashes, does not include cases of skin or tissue damage resulting from the corrosive action of chemicals (203), burns from contact with hot or cold substances (120), effects of exposure to low temperatures (220), or inflammation or irritation resulting from friction or impact (260).

- 216 Allergic condition, allergic reaction
 Applies to injuries following exposure to a
 sensitizing agent resulting in an immediate
 allergic-type reaction (for example, a bee
 sting). Includes cases of anaphylactic reaction, and
 anaphylactic shock.
- 220 Freezing, frostbite, and other effects of exposure to low environmental temperature.

 Does not include cold burns (120).

Code Occupational Illnesses

- 230 Hearing loss, or impairment (when the primary injury, and not the consequences of another injury).
 Applies to injuries producing reduction in the ability to discriminate normally audible sounds.
- 240 Heat stroke, sunstroke, heat cramps, heat exhaustion, and other effects of environmental heat.
 Does not include sunburn (291) or other effects of radiation (290).
- 260 Inflammation or irritation of joints, tendons or muscles
 Applies to injuries producing inflammation of a joint cavity, or any of its surrounding and supporting structures, including tendons, ligaments, bursae and muscles acting upon the joint cavity. These injuries usually result from repeated activity over a period of time. Includes inflammation or irritation resulting from friction or impact, cases of bursitis, synovitis, tenosynovitis, etc. Does not include cases of sprains, strains (188) or dislocation (172), or their after-effects.

270 Poisoning, systemic

Applies to systemic morbid conditions resulting from the inhalation, ingestion or skin absorption of a toxic substance affecting the normal function of the metabolic system, the nervous system, the circulatory system, the digestive system, the respiratory system, the genito-urinary system, the musculo-skeletal system, etc. Includes cases of chemical or drug poisoning, metal poisoning, organic diseases, and venomous animal bites.

Does not include effects of radiations (290 and 294), pneumoconiosis (280), corrosive action of chemicals (203), anaphylactic shock (216), allergic reaction (216), skin surface irritations (215), septicemia (205) or infected wounds (205).

- 273 Upper respiratory conditions
 Includes rhinitis, pharyngitis, sinusitis and hay fever.
- 274 Lower respiratory conditions
 Includes injuries usually limited to the lungs such as asthma, bronchitis, emphysema, influenza, and pneumonia.

NATURE OF INJURY - concluded

Code Occupational Illnesses

280 Pneumoconiosis, NEC
A condition characterized by an inflammatory reaction to the permanent deposition of unspecified particulate matter in the lungs and respiratory system. This usually results from exposure to particles in the working environment over a long time period. Includes byssinosis, siderosis, and pneumoconiosis with tuberculosis.

281 Aluminosis

A condition characterized by an inflammatory reaction due to the permanent deposition of aluminium and alumina-based dusts in the lungs and respiratory system. This usually results from exposure to particles in the working environment over a long time period.

283 Asbestosis

A condition characterized by an inflammatory reaction due to the permanent deposition of fibers of asbestos in the lungs and respiratory system. This usually results from exposure to particles in the working environment over a long time period.


286 Silicosis

A condition characterized by an inflammatory reaction due to the permanent deposition of stone dust, sand or silica-containing flints in the lungs and respiratory system. This usually results from exposure to particles in the working environment over a long time period.

- 290 Radiation effects, UNS Includes injuries due to exposure to either ionizing or non-ionizing radiations, of unspecified origin.
- 291 Effects of non-ionizing radiations Includes microwaves injuries and superficial and systemic effects of sunburns and ultraviolet burns. <u>Does not</u> include welder's flash (295), heat stroke (240), exhaustion, etc.
- 293 Effects of ionizing radiations X-rays Includes superficial and systemic effects of exposure to X-rays.
- 294 Effects of ionizing radiations Isotopes Includes superficial and systemic effects of exposure to ionizing radiations of isotopes such as uranium, cobali, plutonium.

Code Occupational Illnesses

- 295 Welder's flash
- 399 Occupational illness, NEC Includes cases of Raynaud's phenomenon and white finger vibration disease.
- 405 Non personal damage only Includes damage to eyeglasses, hearing aids, artificial teeth, prostheses, pacemakers, etc.
- 500 Effects of changes in atmospheric pressure Includes aero-otitis media, barotrauma, and caisson's disease.
- 550 Neoplasm, tumour, UNS Toxic and nontoxic.
- 551 Neoplasm, tumour, malignant Includes cancer and leukemia.
- 552 Neoplasm, tumour, benign
- 560 Disease of the nervous system Includes Bell's palsy, carpal tunnel syndrome, cerebral paralysis, and migraines.
- 570 AIDS (Acquired immunodeficiency syndrome)
- 600 Psychological disorders (includes burn out, functional disorders, mental disorders, etc.)
- 605 Stress
- 991 Heart condition
 Includes cases of typical and atypical angina as well as heart attacks, of non-toxic origin.
- 999 Occupational injury or illness, NEC (includes toxic hepatitis)



PART OF BODY

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PART OF BODY

Definition

The part of body code identifies the part of the injured person's body directly affected by the injury or illness previously identified.

General Rule

It is essential that a direct relationship between this classification and the Nature of Injury classification be maintained in order to permit significant analytical cross-tabulations of Part of Body by Nature of Injury.

Rules for Selection

When the previously named nature of injury is localized in one part of the body, select that part.

First choosing between the following broad groups may simplify the selection of the most appropriate detailed code:

- 1) Head injuries(100-199)
- 2) Neck injuries(200)
- 3) Upper extremity injuries(300-399)
- 4) Trunk injuries(400-499)
- 5) Lower extremity injuries(500-599)
- 6) Multiple parts injuries(700)
- 7) Body system injuries(800-899)

When the previously named nature of injury or injuries extends to several sections of a major body part, select that major body part. For example, in the case of a burn affecting the fingers, the hand, the wrist, and the forearm, select "upper extremities, multiple" as the body part affected.

When the previously named nature of injury applies to the same subpart on two similar major members, select the subpart. For example, in the case of cuts on the fingers of both hands, select "fingers" as the part of body affected.

When the previously named nature of injury applies to different subparts of two similar major members, select the major members. For example, in the case of cuts on one foot and on the thigh of the other leg, select "lower extremities, multiple" as the part of body affected.

When the previously named nature of injury applies to different and dissimilar major body parts, select "multiple parts" as the body part affected. For example, in the case of bruises on an arm and also on a leg, select "multiple parts".

In the event of an amputation, select the location of the point of amputation. For example, in the case of an amputation between the elbow and shoulder, select "upper arm" rather than "upper extremities, multiple".

Select "body system" only when the injury or illness applies directly to the selected system and it is not a corollary of an external injury to an external part of the body. For example, drowning or asphyxia would be considered injuries to the respiratory system. Similarly, the ingestion, inhalation, or absorption of poisons affecting the nerve centers would be considered injuries to the nervous system. But an external injury to the head involving brain damage with resulting paralysis would be considered a head injury. Muscular strains or sprains should be considered external injuries.

Rules for "UNS" and "NEC" Codes

"UNSPECIFIED" (UNS) codes should be selected when the information available is insufficient to assign an existing detailed code.

"NOT ELSEWHERE CLASSIFIED" (NEC) codes should be selected when the information available is sufficient for coding purposes, but none of the existing detailed codes applies.

Rules for Invalid Code Combinations

After completing the coding, check for invalid combinations of codes for Part of Body with codes for Nature of Injury using the invalid code combinations tables. In the event of an invalid code combination (for example, if the nature of injury has been coded as a "concussion", the Part of Body affected cannot be the "knee"), reassess the original description of the injury or illness and modify the coding.


Code Code

- 800 Body system, UNS
 - 801 Circulatory system (includes heart, blood, arteries, veins, etc.)
 - 810 Digestive system (includes digestion and defecation)
 - 820 Genito-urinary system (includes reproductive function and urine production <u>but not</u> defecation)
 - 830 Musculo-skeletal system (bones, joints, tendons, muscles, etc.)
 - 840 Nervous system (includes hearing, vision, smell, taste, and touch)
 - 850 Respiratory system (includes trachea, bronchi, and lungs, etc.)
 - 899 Body system, NEC (includes endocrine, immune system, etc.)

Applies when the functioning of an entire body system has been affected without specific injury to any other part, as in the case of systemic poisoning or infections, corrosive action affecting internal organs, damage to nerve centers, etc. <u>Does not apply when the systemic damage results from an external injury affecting an external part such as the back or the eye which includes damage to the nerves of the spinal cord or the optic nerve.</u>

- 990 Non-personal damage only (including damage to prostheses, e.g. eyeglasses, hearing aids, and artificial teeth and limbs.)
- 999 Part of Body, NEC

SOURCE OF INJURY



SOURCE OF INJURY

Definition

The source of injury code identifies the object, substance, exposure, or bodily motion which directly produced, transmited or inflicted the injury or illness previously identified.

General Rule

It is essential that a direct relationship between this classification and the Nature of Injury and Part of Body classification be maintained in order to permit significant analytical cross-tabulations, for example, Source of Injury by Nature of Injury.

Rules for Selection

Select as the source of injury the object, substance, exposure or bodily motion which directly produced the injury or illness previously identified in the nature of injury classification.

The code selected should provide a maximum of information to individuals interested in the injury or illness. For example, it is useful to know that a "knife" and not a "hand tool" was the source of the injury.

When an injury results from forcible contact with two or more objects, either simultaneously or in rapid sequence, and it is impossible to determine which object directly produced the injury, select the source of injury as follows:

- (1) When the choice is between a moving object and a stationary object, select the moving object. E.g. if a person is struck by a moving vehicle and thrown against a post, select the vehicle as the source of injury.
- (2) When the choice is between two moving objects or between two stationary objects, select the object which was contacted last. For example, if a person falls from an elevation, striking one or more objects in the course of the fall, but finally striking the floor or other working surface, select the working surface as the source of injury.

Select "bodily motion" as the source of injury only when the injury resulted solely from the stress or strain induced by a free movement of the body or its parts (voluntary or involuntary), or from the assumption of a strained or unnatural body position.

This should include cases of strains, sprains, etc., resulting from stretching, reaching, turning, twisting, bending, walking, climbing, running, or from efforts to recover from a loss of equilibrium, provided that the loss of equilibrium does not culminate in a fall or in

forcible contact with an object above the supporting surface.

<u>Do not</u> select "bodily motion" as the source of injury if the injury occurred in the course of a fall; resulted from bumping into or striking an external object; or arose from lifting, pushing, pulling, wielding, or throwing an external object. (In the case of a fall, select the surface or object on which the person's body came to rest. In cases of lifting, pushing, pulling, wielding, or throwing, select the object to which the physical effort was being applied.)

If, as a result of an accident to a vehicle, a person who was in or on the vehicle is injured, select the vehicle as the source of injury.

When an injury is caused by fragments of a larger item, or parts which cannot be identified as separate components, select a source of injury code describing the larger item, not the fragments or parts. For example, for an injury caused by flying metal items from an exploding boiler, select a source of injury code to describe the "boiler" (0501), not the "metal items". However, if the injury was caused by distinct parts or components of a larger item and if there exits a distinct code for these parts or components, select a source of injury code describing the component. For example, if the injury was caused by a car's tire rim, select a source of injury code which describes the "automobile part" (4110), not the car. This coding rule also applies to cases where an illness is caused by bacteria, viruses, etc. In this case, select the transmitting agent (e.g. persons, animals, water, or dust if identified on the source document) and not the bacteria or viruses.


Rules for "UNS" and "NEC" Codes

"UNSPECIFIED" (UNS) codes should be selected when the information available is insufficient to assign an existing detailed code.

"NOT ELSEWHERE CLASSIFIED" (NEC) codes should be selected when the information available is sufficient for coding purposes, but none of the existing detailed codes applies.

Rules for Invalid Code Combinations

After completing the coding, check for invalid combinations of codes for Source of Injury with codes for Nature of Injury and Part of Body. In the event of an invalid code combination (for example, if "dislocation" has been selected as the Nature of Injury, the Source of Injury cannot be "heat, atmospheric, environmental"), reassess the original description of the injury or illness and modify the coding.



TYPE OF ACCIDENT

Definition

The accident type code identifies the event or exposure which directly caused the injury or illness.

General Rule

It is essential that a direct relationship between this classification and the Nature of Injury, Part of Body and Source of Injury classifications be maintained in order to permit significant analytical cross-tabulations, for example, Type of Accident by Source of Injury. The coding of vehicle accidents is to take precedence over all other types of accidents.

Rules for Selection

When the injury or illness occurred as a result of contact with an object or substance previously named as the source of injury, select the type of accident code which best describes the manner in which that contact occurred.

First choosing between the following broad groups may simplify selecting the most appropriate detailed code:

- 1) Impact injuries (010-059, 500, 900)
- 2) Non-impact injuries (060-189, 400-450, 750, 751)
- 3) Vehicle injuries (200-399, 600-700)

When an accident results from a series of associated events, select the injury-producing event, and select the code which best describes how the previously selected source of injury caused the injury. For example, if a worker slips from a scaffold, falls, and slides down stairs to hit the floor and sustains a concussion - the type of accident code should be "fall from elevation", not "bodily reaction".


Rules for "UNS" and "NEC" Codes

"UNSPECIFIED" (UNS) codes should be selected when the information available is insufficient to assign an existing detailed code.

"NOT ELSEWHERE CLASSIFIED" (NEC) codes should be selected when the information available is sufficient for coding purposes, but none of the existing detailed codes applies.

Rules for Invalid Code Combinations

After completing the coding, check for invalid combinations of codes for Accident Type with codes for Nature of Injury, Part of Body and Source of Injury. In the event of an invalid code combination (for example, if "noise" has been identified as the Source of Injury, the Type of Accident cannot be "contact with noxious substances by inhalation"), reassess the original description of the injury or illness and modify the coding.

(2) The point of contact with the source of injury was lower than the surface supporting the person at the start of the fall.

Includes jumping from elevations.

Generally applies to the occurrence of strains, sprains, ruptures, or other internal injuries (including white finger or vibration disease) resulting from the assumption of an unnatural position or from involuntary motions induced by sudden noise, fright, vibrating tools, or efforts to recover from slips or loss of balance. Includes cases involving nervous shock and cases of muscular or internal injury resulting from the execution of personal movements such as walking, climbing, running, reaching, turning, bending, etc. when such movement in itself was the source of injury.

<u>Does not</u> apply to overexertion cases involving the lifting, pulling, or pushing of objects, or to cases in which a bodily movement, voluntary or involuntary, results in forcible contact with an external object.

However, if the passenger is thrown to the floor or against a part of the vehicle as a result of a sudden stopping, starting, or lurching of the vehicle, the case falls in this classification.

- (1) Falls on or from a vehicle which do not result from an accident to the vehicle or from the motion of the vehicle.
- (2) Striking against or being struck by parts of a vehicle or its cargo while in or on the vehicle, unless the event resulted from an accident to the vehicle or from the motion of the vehicle.

Applies to cases in which the injury resulted from exposure to noise over either a brief or a long time period. <u>Does not</u> include cases where the noise resulted from an explosion (500).

500 Explosions

An explosion is defined as a rapid expansion, bursting, or upheaval of gases and/or liquids and/or solid matter. Includes explosions of large objects (e.g. buildings, tank cars) and small objects (e.g. bottles, aerosol cans). The explosion may be of intentional or accidental origin. Includes cases of injury resulting from contact with hot objects or substances produced by explosions, and cases of hearing loss, and other effects of noise from explosions. Does not include electrical short circuits ("blown fuses"); however, exploding automobile batteries would be included.

Nonhighway-type motor vehicles are vehicles which usually perform certain functions at work sites or are used for off-road transport. Included are industrial, agricultural, construction, mining, excavation, and other light and heavy equipment

(e.g. fork lifts, backhoes, graders, and motorized all-terrain vehicles).

Although nonhighway-type vehicles make use of, or are used on roads, streets, and highways (e.g. to move from one work site to another, or to perform such functions as snow clearing), accidents involving nonhighway-type motor vehicles are to be classified in the "600" series regardless of where the accident occurred.

Does not apply to the following types of case:

- Falls on or from a vehicle which do not result from an accident to the vehicle or from the motion of the vehicle.
- (2) Striking against or being struck by parts of a vehicle or its cargo while in or on the vehicle, unless the event resulted from an accident to the vehicle or from the motion of the vehicle.
- (3) Accidents occurring in the course of servicing, repairing, loading, or unloading a vehicle, unless the event resulted from an accident to the vehicle or from the motion of the vehicle.
- (4) Accidents in which the injured was not in or on the vehicle as operator or passenger at the time of the accident.
