Post Graduate Students in Arts and Science, English-Language Universities in Canada, Session 1948-49

A questionnaire was addressed to the Heads of Departments in the Faculties of Arts and Science in all English-language Universities in Canada during March 1949, primarily to discover the extent and nature of financial assistance available to post graduate students. The absence of Departmental organization in the French-language universities made use of the same questionnaire inadvisable. Faculties other than Arts and Science in the English-language universities were not covered.

Returns for Humanities and Social Science Departments were practically complete. Three comparatively large Departments in the Pure Science group did not provide returns: Chemistry and Mathematics at McGill, Physics at Toronto, also two smaller Departments of Biology, viz., McMaster and New Brunswick.

Numbers in Canada, and Abroad.

The number of post graduate students reported in attendance at the universities included may be summarized as follows from the detailed tabulations by Departments on subsequent pages:

In other words, roughly one student is known to be attending a university outside Canada for each three attending here. The actual ratio is probably higher than one to three. About 80 p.c. are in the United States. The proportion of students reported to be outside Canada is considerably higher in Pure Science (30 p.c.) than in the Humanities and Social Sciences (about 20 p.c. each).

Scholarships Held in Canada and Abroad.

A high proportion of the students who have gone outside Canada for post graduate work have done so on scholarships or fellowships, as may be seen by comparing the following summary with the one immediately preceding.

The actual number of Canadian post graduate students holding scholarships or fellowships abroad is much larger than the number holding similar awards in Canadian universities, - 424 as compared with 266.

The great difference is almost entirely due to the situation in the Humanities and Social Sciences. There are four Canadian Humanities students abroad on scholarships or fellowships for every one in Canada, and almost three Social Science students abroad for each one at home.

The record does not indicate what proportions of the Humanities and Social Science students could have remained in Canada under the terms of their awards had they so chosen. The proportions may have been larger in part because relatively more of the awards were made by universities in the United States than in the case of the Pure Science students, and in part because relatively more of the Humanities and Social Science students considered that the Canadian universities were less well equipped to provide the instruction they sought. In either case some weakness appears to be indicated in the Canadian provision for Social Science and Humanities students, as compared with provision for those in Pure Science.

Value of Scholarships Held in Canada.

No record was obtained of the value of scholarships held abroad, but the record for those held in Canada is as follows:

The Humanities are completely lacking in awards worth as much as \$1000, while the Social Sciences have 10 and the Pure Sciences 16. They have only 9 worth as much as \$1500.

By comparing this summary with the first one given above, it will be seen that fewer than 5 p.c. of Humanities post graduate students in the Canadian universities hold scholarships, and only 6 p.c. of Social Science students, as compared with 30 p.c. of Fure Science students,

Part Time Employment.

Financial assistance is available to some students through part time employment in their Department as instructor, lecturer, teaching fellow, reader, class assistant, demonstrator or research assistant. The numbers thus aided were as follow:

Here again the Pure Science students are more frequently in remunerative circumstances. About 70 p.c. of them are paid. Although there is some duplication between these and the 30 p.c. holding scholarships, it is apparent that not more than 10 p.c. or 20 p.c. are without remuneration of some kind while studying.

About 25 p.c. of the Humanities and Social Science students derive some remuneration from employment in their Departments. These together with the 5 p.c. on fellowship or scholarship leave 70 p.c. with no remuneration provided.

Remuneration for Employment.

Some conception of the range of remuneration is provided by the following summary:

The median remuneration for the Social Science group is below \$500, for the Humanities group above \$500, and for the Fure Science group about \$600.

Time Taken by Employment.

Heads of Departments were asked to indicate what amount of the students' time was required by the duties for which they were paid. While returns were not entirely satisfactory, the following is a summary for the Humanities and Social Science groups.

When duties in addition to those required in the classroom were considered 32 of the Humanities students were shown to have more than six hours required of them as compared with 76 serving six hours or less and 33 unspecified. In the Social Science group 72 worked more than six hours, 77 six hours or less, and 33 were not reported.

Restriction on Residence Credit.

Fractically all of the Social Science students were reported to be allowed full residence credit in spite of employment. The Humanities Departments appear to be less liberal in this respect: Full residence credit for the year was allowed to 89, part of a year only to 43 (usually $\frac{1}{2}$ year), 9 unreported.
