## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The data used in this study were derived mostly from the Adult Criminal Courts Survey (ACCS) administered by the Canadian Centre for Justice Statistics (CCJS). The jurisdictions which provided data to the ACCS were Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia, Quebec, Saskatchewan, Yukon and the Northwest Territories. Two provinces, Alberta and Ontario, provided data to CCJS specifically for this study.

The data represented all the cases disposed of with a conviction and a sentence in provincial courts of criminal jurisdiction during 1993 and 1994. Data from superior courts of criminal jurisdiction, where many of the more serious cases are heard, are not currently available to the CCJS.

These data consisted of 551,682 cases with convictions for 820,606 charges which accumulated $1,331,183$ sanctions as sentences.

The distribution of cases by jurisdiction is presented in the following table. Almost half of the cases originated in Ontario. Thus, many of the overall sentencing trends would be a reflection of the practices in Ontario.

## Most cases were defined by a conviction for one charge

The majority of cases ( $79 \%$ ) receiving a conviction and a sentence in provincial courts during 1993 and 1994 involved only one charge. Half of these charges were instances of a property or a motor vehicle offence. Crimes against the person, such as assault or robbery, accounted for a minority ( $16 \%$ ) of all the one charge cases.

The remaining $21 \%$ of the cases involved two or more charges, with an average of 3.4 convictions per case.

## Most offenders, convicted of only one crime, received a non-custodial sentence

Due to the relatively minor nature of most of the offences, the majority of the persons convicted of one charge received either a fine or a term of probation as the principal sentence. A fine was the penalty imposed in $45 \%$ of cases with a conviction for one offence, and a term of probation was imposed in an additional $25 \%$ of these cases. Other kinds of sanctions, such as driving prohibitions, were imposed in an additional $4 \%$ of the cases. The remaining $26 \%$ of the cases received a prison sentence. Thus, $74 \%$ of the persons convicted of one charge received a noncustodial sentence.

For single charge cases, the average fine was $\$ 430$, the average prison sentence was just under three months and the average length of probation was 14 months.

## In many cases, a single conviction resulted in more than one penalty

Judges can impose more than one penalty per case. On average, for single charge cases, the judges imposed 1.6 sanctions per case. In some instances a multiple penalty is mandatory. For example, a term of probation must be accompanied by a prison sentence, a fine or a suspended sentence. A third of the prison sentences imposed in one charge cases were followed by a term of probation. These probation terms were longer than the probation terms which were imposed as the most serious sanctions in cases with one charge. Similarly, in the cases where there was an additional fine, the fine amounts were greater than those imposed as the most serious sanction.

## The nature and magnitude of the sentence increased with the seriousness of the offence

In one charge cases, more serious offences resulted in the imposition of more severe penalties. For example, the most serious form of assault (aggravated assault) resulted in incarceration in $79 \%$ of cases; convictions of the least serious form of assault (simple assault) received a prison sentence in only $20 \%$ of the cases. The length of the prison sentences also varied with the severity of the offence. The average prison sentence for aggravated assault was 440 days (about 15 months) but the average sentence for simple assault was 51 days (less than two months).


## The use of probation in cases with one conviction decreased as the severity of the offence increased

Twenty-five percent of the cases with one charge received a term of probation as the most serious sanction. The average probation order was for about 13 months with a median probation term of one year. For $31 \%$ of the cases there was an additional fine imposed and in $13 \%$ of the cases there was the addition of a restitution order.

The use of probation as the most serious sanction decreased for convictions in more serious offences. Almost $60 \%$ of the cases of 'simple assault' received a probation term as the most serious sanction. Only $18 \%$ of the cases of 'aggravated assault' got probation as the most serious sanction. However, the length of the probation order increased with the severity of the offence. The average probation term for aggravated assault was about 610 days ( 20 months) whereas the average term for simple assault was only 408 days ( 14 months).


## 'Other Federal Statute' and 'Motor Vehicle' offences most often received a fine

A fine was the most serious sanction for $45 \%$ of all the single charge cases. The average fine amount was $\$ 430$ with a median of $\$ 300$.

The highest average fines were imposed for 'Other Federal Statute' offences. This category included, among others, offences under Parking Regulations, the Unemployment Insurance Act, the Income Tax Act, the Fisheries Act and the Indian Act. Most of these cases (89\%) received a fine as the most serious penalty. Due to the variety of acts and regulations covered by the 'Other Federal Statutes' category, there was a large variance in the average fines imposed for different acts. The average fine varied from $\$ 118$ for Parking Regulations to $\$ 5,222$ for Income Tax Act violations. Thus, for the entire category, there was a wide disparity between the median fine ( $\$ 100$ ) and the average fine ( $\$ 640$ ).

The next largest utilization of fines was for 'Motor Vehicle' offences. A 'Motor Vehicle' conviction resulted in a fine in $70 \%$ of the cases with an average fine of $\$ 544$.

## The number of charges in the case had a strong impact on the sentence

The number of charges in a case was associated with both the nature of the sentence imposed and with the sentence amount. The incarceration rate was more than double for cases with five or more charges ( $69 \%$ ) compared to cases with only one charge ( $26 \%$ ). On the other hand, the use of fines decreased with the number of charges. Forty-four percent of the cases with one charge received a fine as the most serious sanction. The use of fines dropped to $25 \%$ for two charge cases and to $10 \%$ for cases with five or more charges. The use of probation as the most serious sanction did not vary significantly with the number of charges.


The average prison sentence for cases with one charge was 85 days and increased to 199 days for charges in cases with two or more charges. Cases with only one charge had an average probation term
of 405 days. Cases with two or more charges had average probation terms of 519 days per charge. However, the fine amounts did not vary with the number of charges in the case.

## Almost half of all the charges resulting in a conviction were in multiple charge cases

There were 113,833 cases with convictions for two or more charges. These multiple charge cases made up $21 \%$ of the total number of cases but contained almost half of all the charges. The offences which defined the multiple charge cases were more serious than the charges in the cases with one charge. Most of the prison sentences ( $65 \%$ ) and most of prison sentence time to be served ( $81 \%$ ) were imposed in these multiple charge cases.

The most frequent sanction imposed was a term of imprisonment (53\%). Twenty-six percent of the cases received a term of probation and $21 \%$ received a fine.

The median probation term was one year with an average about 17 months. The average probation disposition for multiple charge cases was about $25 \%$ longer than those imposed on cases with only one charge.

Overall, the average fine for the most serious charge in the case was $\$ 463$ with a median of $\$ 300$. Fine amounts imposed as the most serious sanction did not seem to vary significantly with the number of charges in the case. (The median for single charge cases was $\$ 300$ with an average of $\$ 430$.) However, each case multiple charge received several fines, and the total of these fines averaged $\$ 1,089$.

## Most of the prison sentences were imposed in cases with two or more charges

Prison was the most frequently used sanction in the multiple charge cases. There were 59,980 cases with two or more charges which received a prison sentence as the most serious sanction. In fact, these cases consisted of 211,722 offences which received a prison sentence. The average prison sentence imposed in these cases was 199 days with median sentence of 90 days. The average prison sentence for these multiple charge cases was twice the average of cases with one charge, and the median was three times the median for cases with only one charge.

## Most offenders were males

The majority ( $86 \%$ ) of the convicted persons were males. The average age was 32 years for all offenders with no significant difference between the average age of males and females. For both males and females, the largest proportion of offenders were in the 20-24 year age-group. Males were more likely to be convicted of offences 'Against the Person' and 'Motor Vehicle' offences. One the other hand, females were more likely to be convicted of 'Property' and 'Morals' offences. Within any one offence category, males were more likely to receive a prison sentence and females were more likely to be put on probation. The sole exception were 'Morals' offences where women were more likely to be incarcerated.

## Jurisdictions which had higher incarceration rates tended to have lower average prison sentences

The overall incarceration rates varied from $11 \%$ in Nova Scotia to $43 \%$ in Prince Edward Island. Québec and the Northwest Territories had the highest rate of the use of probation. Alberta and Nova Scotia had the highest utilization of fines as the most serious sanction. There were notable variations in the incarceration rates for the jurisdictions. Generally, Ontario and Prince Edward Island ${ }^{1}$ had incarcerations rates that were above the average. In Québec the incarceration rates tended to be below the average for the nine jurisdictions.

With respect to the average prison sentences, a slightly different picture emerges. The average prison sentences in Ontario were at or below the study average. In Québec, the average sentences were above the average. It should be noted that the large number of cases in Ontario ( $50 \%$ of the total) would tend to influence the overall average sentence.

## Offence-Specific Jurisdictional Comparisons

The examination of sentencing for individual offences revealed considerable variations in both incarceration rates and average sentences imposed. However, here were no systematic patterns within the jurisdictions that were consistent across all offences. Except for Newfoundland, each jurisdiction had the highest incarceration rate or the longest average prison sentence for at least one of the offences used in the comparisons.

As can be seen in the accompanying graph, there was a tendency for jurisdictions which had higher incarceration rates to have lower average sentences. For example, Nova Scotia which had the lowest incarceration rate (9\%) had the highest average prison sentence ( 101 days). On the other hand, Prince Edward Island which had the highest incarceration rate (50\%) had the lowest average prison sentence (33 days).

## 1. INTRODUCTION

### 1.1 Background

The sentencing process has frequently attracted widespread public criticism. The results of nation-wide opinion surveys reveal that most Canadians believe sentences should be more severe. However, neither the public nor criminal justice professionals are aware of sentencing patterns in Canada. This lack of awareness is, in part, caused by the lack of information available on sentencing practices in Canadian courts. The 1987 report of the Canadian Sentencing Commission' decried the absence of aggregate sentencing statistics for Canada.

To help remedy this problem, the Canadian Centre for Justice Statistics (CCJS), in 1993, published its first analysis of sentencing practices. Sentencing in Adult Criminal Provincial Courts ${ }^{2}$ reported information on sentencing in adult provincial courts in six jurisdictions over a 15 -month period. This second study expands on what was done in 1993. It provides a statistical description of sentencing in nine jurisdictions over a twoyear span.

### 1.2 Study Objectives

The objective of this study is to provide a portrait of recent sentencing practices in Canada. Issues to be explored include:

- The number and type of charges and cases.
- The types of sanctions being imposed and the amount of these sanctions for different offence categories.
- Differences in sentencing for single vs. multiple charge cases.
- The age and gender of offenders.
- Sentencing for hybrid offences.
- Comparisons of sentencing among the provinces/territories and among cities.


### 1.3 Trial Process

All criminal trials begin in provincial criminal courts, but where they ultimately end up depends on the type of offence and the elections made by the accused and the Crown. More serious offences are sometimes transferred to superior court.

Offences are classified as summary, indictable or hybrid offences. Summary offences are the least serious type - they can only be tried in provincial court (or in municipal courts in Québec). Indictable offences are the most serious and can be tried in either provincial or superior court ${ }^{3}$, a decision that is made by the accused. Hybrid offences are intermediate in terms of seriousness. They can be treated as either summary or indictable offences, a decision that is made by the Crown. Maximum penalties for indictable offences are higher than those for summary offences. Thus the procedure chosen for hybrid offences has implications with respect to the severity of the sentence that can be imposed.

### 1.4 Sentencing Process

Sentencing is a complex process. The judge must consider several sentencing purposes such as deterrence, incapacitation, reparation and rehabilitation. As well, the judge must consider many aggravating and mitigating circumstances, including the degree of harm inflicted, the number and nature of any previous convictions, and the circumstances surrounding the commission of the offence. Judges have a considerable degree of discretion when imposing sentences. There are no formal sentencing guidelines and the maximum penalties allowed by law are quite severe.

After considering all factors, the judge imposes an aggregate sentence on the accused. Components of the sentence may be ascribed to different offences, but they will ultimately add up to the total sentence that the judge wishes to impose upon the offender. It is only in situations where there is one count of one offence that it is possible to clearly relate the sentence and the charge. In cases with multiple charges, the aggregate sentence may be clear, but the contribution of each charge to the aggregate is often unclear.

As with trial procedure, sentencing depends on the type of offence. Most offences have maximum sentences and some have minimum sentences. The maximum punishment for a summary offence is generally a term of imprisonment of six months and/or a fine of $\$ 2,000$. The punishments for indictable offences are more severe. Maximum terms of imprisonment range from 2 years to life and there is no stated maximum fine.

### 1.5 Sentencing Reform

After many years of study and consultation, the federal government passed sentencing reform legislation in September 1996. Chapter 22 of the Statutes of Canada (formerly Bill C-41-Sentencing Reform) contains a number of provisions designed to improve the nature of the sentencing process in Canada. One of these reforms is a statement of the purposes and principles of sentencing. The aim is to provide guidance to judges and promote more uniform sentencing patterns. As well, the legislation introduces a number of changes to the sentencing process, including a new disposition called a "conditional sentence".

As a result of this legislation, some of the practices described in this report are no longer in use. Further, some Criminal Code sections have been amended. The Criminal Code sections used in this report are those in use prior to the new legislation.

## 2. METHODOLOGY

### 2.1 Scope/Coverage

This study examines Criminal Code and other federal statute offences resulting in a conviction and sentence in adult provincial courts in nine provinces and territories. They include: Newfoundland and Labrador, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia, Quebec, Ontario, Saskatchewan, Alberta, Yukon, and the Northwest Territories. These nine jurisdictions account for approximately 80 percent of the adult population in Canada. Data for New Brunswick, Manitoba, and British Columbia are not currently available.

Not all provincial court locations are included. Data for Newfoundland are reported for two court locations St. John's and Clarenville. This represents about 45 percent of Newfoundland's federal statute caseload. Data for Halifax Municipal Court, where approximately 15 percent of Nova Scotia's federal statute charges are heard, were not available. Additionally, data from Quebec's 140 municipal courts were not available. Sixty-seven of these municipal courts, including those in Montreal, Quebec City, and Laval, hear federal
statute summary and hybrid summary offences. The extent of under coverage is not certain, but is estimated to be at least 20 percent.

The data for all jurisdictions except Ontario and Alberta were obtained from the CCJS's Adult Criminal Court Survey (ACCS). Ontario and Alberta provided data specifically for the study. Those data were converted to conform to ACCS specifications.

The data include charges with a sentencing date during the calendar years 1993 and 1994. The one exception is Ontario, where the data cover the fiscal years 1993/94 and 1994/95.

### 2.2 Exclusions from the Analysis

For a number of reasons, some data were excluded from the analysis. These exclusions are described below.

## One day prison sentences

One day prison sentences are imposed for a number of reasons. They represent a disposition of "time served" by an accused during the trial process; they satisfy the requirements of Section 718(2) of the Criminal Code, whereby for certain indictable offences, a judge must impose a prison term in order to permit the use of other sanctions; or they signify the court's displeasure with an accused who has "failed to appear" or "failed to comply". Whatever the reason, the inclusion of these sentence lengths in the analysis would tend to skew the distribution of prison terms toward the lower range. For this reason, a total of 18,660 charges ( 13,952 cases) were excluded from the analysis.

## Companies as accused

Case characteristics involving companies as the accused tend to be quite different from those involving individuals. Typically companies are charged with different types of offences, they receive different types of sanctions, and the amounts of those sanctions are different. Because of these differences, a total of 3,909 charges ( 1,982 cases) involving companies were excluded from the analysis.

## Long term prison sentences

The Adult Criminal Court Survey does not capture a value for prison sentences exceeding 14 years, including life imprisonment. Because these sentences cannot be given an exact value, they have been eliminated from the analysis. A total of 129 charges ( 58 cases) were excluded.

### 2.3 Sanctions Defined

There are a number of sanctions that can be imposed in Canada. The ones examined in this report are:

## Prison

Prison refers to the physical confinement of an offender in a penal institution. Sentences of two years or longer are served in a federal penitentiary, while terms of less than two years are served in provincial correctional facilities. Sentences of 90 days or less can be served intermittently, usually on weekends. The maximum term of imprisonment for summary offences is 6 months, while the maximum for indictable offences varies from 2 years to life. In the case of multiple prison sentences, the judge determines whether the time is to be served concurrently or consecutively.

## Probation

Probation, not to be confused with parole ${ }^{4}$, refers to conditions that are imposed on an offender over a specified period of time. Every probation order requires that the accused keep the peace, be of good behaviour, and appear before the court as required. Other conditions that may be imposed include: reporting

[^2]to a probation officer, abstaining from alcohol, refraining from carrying a weapon, making restitution to a victim, or performing community service. A period of probation cannot be imposed as a separate sanction. It must be imposed in conjunction with a suspended sentence, a fine, or a term of imprisonment not exceeding two years. The maximum period of probation is three years. In the case of multiple probation terms, all terms are served concurrently.

## Fine

A fine refers to the amount of money that the offender is directed to pay to the provincial or federal government. A fine can be imposed alone or in conjunction with other sanctions, with two exceptions. If the offence carries a minimum term of imprisonment or carries a maximum penalty of more than five years, then the offender cannot receive a fine alone. All fines must be paid, regardless of the number imposed.

## Compensation/Restitution

Compensation and restitution both refer to a judge's order to the offender to pay the victim of the offence for any losses incurred. The court may order the accused to compensate the victim for loss or damage to property suffered as a result of the offence. In addition, if any property obtained through the commission of an offence is sold to an innocent purchaser, the offender may be ordered to compensate that purchaser. Restitution may be imposed as a condition of probation. In this report, the term "restitution" is used to denote all payments by the offender to a victim.

## Other

A number of other sanctions can be imposed by a judge, including conditional and absolute discharges, community service orders, confiscation orders and prohibition orders (e.g. driving and firearm prohibition). All of these sanctions have been grouped under "other".

### 2.4 Units of Count Defined

The study uses several units of count and sorting criteria as follows:

## Charge

A charge is a formal accusation against an accused involving a federal statute offence. This study examines all those charges that resulted in a conviction and a sentence. (Approximately 55 percent of charges disposed in provincial court result in a finding of guilt.)

## Case

A case is defined in this study as all charges resulting in conviction for one offender on the same sentencing date. The one exception to this definition is Ontario, where it was necessary to define a case as all charges on a single information. Because it is possible to resolve more than one information on a single sentencing date, the number of cases in Ontario is inflated by an estimated 10 percent.

## Most Serious Sanction (MSS)

Rather than displaying all the sanctions imposed for a particular offence, the data can be displayed by selecting a "most serious sanction". The sanctions were ranked according to the following order of severity:

- prison
- probation
- fine
- restitution
- other

[^3]Thus, for example, if a conviction for "impaired driving" results in the imposition of probation and a fine, the most serious sanction for that offence is probation.

## Most Serious Offence (MSO)

When analyzing case data it is often necessary to identify a "most serious offence" to represent the case. Offences were ranked according to the same "most serious sanction" rule described above. Thus if a case consists of two charges, a "break and enter" that resulted in prison and "theft under $\$ 1000$ " that resulted in a fine, then the "break and enter" charge would be used to represent the case. If several offences in a case should receive the same "most serious sanction", then the amount of the sanction, for example length of prison, is used to select the offence which is most serious.

## Offence Categories

For the analysis, the data were organized into 65 offence categories. ${ }^{6}$ Most categories are single offences, for example "robbery". The remaining categories are residuals, for example, "other property offences". Apart from "other federal statutes", the residual categories are not included in the discussions.

A secondary offence classification was created that groups the 65 offences according to the type of offence. In all, there are eight offence-type categories, including "offences against the person", "property offences", and "motor vehicle offences". (A complete description of the offence categories is contained in Appendix B.)

### 2.5 Previous Sentencing Study

The CCJS's 1993 Sentencing Study included data from six of the nine jurisdictions included in this study. Not included were Newfoundland, Saskatchewan, and the Northwest Territories. The data covered a 15 -month, rather than a 24 -month period. As well, the 1993 Study was able to examine more sanctions, including conditional discharges, absolute discharges, community service orders, and forfeiture/prohibition/confiscation orders.

The most significant difference in trying to compare the two studies is a difference in the definition for "most serious sanction" (MSS). These two indices are shown below:

Now consider a case with one charge - an impaired driving offence receiving a fine and a driving prohibition. According to the 1993 Study, the MSS is the driving prohibition, but the current study views the fine as the MSS. The situation is more complicated for cases involving multiple charges, where the MSS is used to select the charge that represents the case. Unfortunately it was not possible, with the available data, to use the 1993 MSS index for the current study.

As a result of these differences, only a limited number of comparisons could be made between the two studies.

### 2.6 Data Limitations

There are a number of data limitations. These are described below.

## Incomplete Coverage of Provincial Courts

Data from New Brunswick, Manitoba, and British Columbia were not available. Additionally, data from three provinces - Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, and Quebec - were incomplete. Furthermore, because the missing data from Quebec only involve summary offences, it is likely that Quebec's data represent proportionately more serious cases.

## Lack of Superior Court Data

Superior courts are trial and appeal courts, having federally appointed judges. Data from these courts, which tend to hear more serious cases and impose more severe sanctions, were not available. Fortunately, these courts hear a much smaller volume of cases as compared to provincial courts.

## Lack of Aggregate Sentencing Data

Data on aggregate sentences were not available. In particular, there was no information on whether multiple prison terms were to be served consecutively or concurrently. This made it impossible to get a complete picture of sentencing for cases involving more than one charge.

## Lack of Case-Specific Data

Complete details on offender and case characteristics were not available. Factors such as previous criminal record and relationship of the offender to the victim, may have a mitigating or aggravating effect on the sentence. Such data are necessary in order to understand and to explain case specific sentencing variations.

### 2.7 Structure of the Report

The report is divided into several sections. It begins with an overview of the database - the total number of charges, the types of offences, the types of sanctions, and the distribution of charges by jurisdiction. Next is an examination of the relationship between sentencing and the number of charges per case. Because this factor appears to have a major impact on sentencing practices, the next two sections of the report take an in-depth look at sentencing in single charge and then multiple charge cases. Finally, there is a discussion of some additional sentencing issues - demographic characteristics of offenders, sentencing for hybrid offences, and sentencing variation among provinces/territories and among cities.

## 3. OVERVIEW OF THE DATABASE

### 3.1 Charges, Cases, and Sanctions

The sentencing database contains provincial court data from nine jurisdictions covering a two-year span. The data consist of 551,682 cases involving 820,606 charges for which there was a conviction. These charges resulted in the imposition of $1,331,183$ sanctions. (See Figure 1.) There was an average of 1.5 charges per case, 1.6 sanctions imposed per charge and 2.4 sanctions per case. (These data are discussed in more detail in the next three sections.)

### 3.2 Types of Offences

The kinds of sentences that are imposed will depend on the types of offences for which there was a conviction. Figure 2 presents the percentage distribution of charges for the eight offence-type categories used throughout the report. This figure reveals that the data are dominated by convictions for property offences, administration of justice offences (such as failure to appear in court) and motor vehicle offences, in that order. These three categories accounted for almost $70 \%$ of total charges. Charges for offences against the person made up only $14 \%$ of the total.

Figure 3 examines the distribution of charges by individual offence type. It is evident that a small number of offences made up the majority of convictions. Of the 65 offences identified for the analysis, 16 accounted for $75 \%$ of all the charges. The six most common offences were: impaired driving, fail to appear, "other federal statutes", simple assault (level 1), fail to comply and theft under $\$ 1000$. Combined, these six offences accounted for $50 \%$ of all charges on the database. That a small number of relatively less serious offences
accounted for such a large number of the charges was not unexpected. However, it is important to note that these offences had a large impact on the sentencing data.

### 3.3 Types of Sanctions

Figure 4 shows the distribution of all sanctions imposed for all charges. Because more than one sanction can be imposed for a charge, percentages total more than $100 \%$. Of the five types of sanctions examined, four were imposed in roughly the same frequency. Prison, probation, and fines, were each imposed in about $40 \%$ of charges. As well, "other" sanctions, a catchall category that includes conditional and absolute discharges, community service orders, and prohibition orders, were imposed $40 \%$ of the time. By contrast, restitution was seldom imposed separately from a condition of probation.

The use of different sanctions varied with the type of offence. Administration of justice offences, which include "fail to appear", "unlawfully at large" and "escape custody", had the highest incarceration rate. It is not surprising that offenders who demonstrated a lack of compliance with the justice system were incarcerated for these offences. Offences against the person had the highest probation rate. This was due, in part, to the high probation rate for simple assault (level 1). (Simple assault, the largest component by far of offences against the person ( $51 \%$ of charges), had a probation rate of $69 \%$ ). "Other federal statutes" had the highest rate of fines - the usual sanction for these offences. Restitution, though seldom imposed, was utilized most often in convictions for property offences. As expected, offenders convicted of theft and other such property offences, were told to make restitution to their victims. "Other" sanctions were most often imposed for motor vehicle offences. Driving prohibition orders, which were counted under "other" sanctions, are often imposed for motor vehicle offences.

Motor vehicle offences also received the most sanctions per charge. This is a reflection of the fact that many offenders received a fine and an "other" sanction. Federal statute offences received the fewest sanctions per charge. Offenders convicted of these offences tended to receive a fine only.

### 3.4 Most Serious Sanctions

Another way of looking at the data is to examine only the most serious sanction imposed per charge. This ranking procedure, by choosing only the one sanction per charge, enables comparisons to be made on the relative severity of sentencing among offences. The order of seriousness used was: prison, probation, fine, restitution and "other". Figure 5 indicates that in $40 \%$ of charges, prison was the most serious sanction. Fines were the next most frequent serious sanction, followed by probation, "other" sanctions, and restitution. Except for prison, the figures in Figure 5 are lower than those in Figure 4. This is a function of the ranking system used for most serious sanction and the fact that probation, fines, restitution, and "other" sanctions were sometimes imposed in combination with a more serious sanction.

As was true for total sanctions, the frequency of most serious sanctions varied by offence category. In fact, the results were almost identical to those described in Section 3.3. Administration of justice offences had the highest incarceration rate, offences against the person the highest probation rate, "other federal statutes" the highest rate of fines, and property offences the highest proportion of restitution. The one difference was the rate for "other" sanctions which was highest for morals offences rather than motor vehicle offences. (Morals offences include charges for "soliciting" and "indecent acts/exposure".) This indicates that motor vehicle offences tended to receive higher order sanctions (such as fines) in addition to "other" sanctions. The usual type of "other" sanction for morals offences was an absolute or conditional discharge.

### 3.5 Distribution of Charges by Jurisdiction

The geographic distribution of charges is illustrated in Figure 6. As expected, Ontario accounted for the largest percentage of charges, followed by Quebec and Alberta. These three jurisdictions had a significant influence on the summary statistics for the database as they accounted for $87 \%$ of charges.

## 4. SENTENCING AND THE NUMBER OF CHARGES PER CASE

The previous section described charge-based data. This is useful in that it provides a complete picture of all offences and sanctions. However, sentences are imposed on offenders, not on charges. Components of the sentence may be ascribed to different charges, but ultimately the sanctions add up to the total sentence that the judge wishes to impose. For this reason it is important to examine case-based data. This section examines the relationship between sentencing and the number of charges per case.

### 4.1 Charges per Case

One measure of case complexity is the number of charges in a case. Presumably, the larger the number of charges in a case, the more effort is required to resolve it. Figure 7 shows that a substantial majority of cases ( $79 \%$ ) were of the "simple" variety - having a conviction for only one charge. Thirteen percent of the cases had two charges and nine percent had three or more charges. Similar results were obtained in the 1993 Study, where $77 \%$ of cases were single charge cases. Although making up almost $80 \%$ of all cases, single charge cases accounted for just
over $50 \%$ of all the charges. By contrast, cases with five or more charges, while making up only $3 \%$ of cases, accounted for $18 \%$ of all charges.

### 4.2 Type of Most Serious Sanction

The number of charges per case had a significant influence on the type of sanction imposed. Cases with multiple charges received more severe sentences. This is illustrated in Figure 8. The incarceration rate varied directly with the number of charges per case, increasing from $26 \%$ for single charge cases to $69 \%$ for cases with 5 or more charges. The average rate of incarceration for all multiple charge cases (53\%) was double the rate for single charge cases. The use of fines as a most serious sanction exhibited the reverse trend. Fines were the most serious sanction in $45 \%$ of single charge cases, but the rate fell continuously to $10 \%$ for cases with 5 or more charges. On average, fines were the most serious sanction in $21 \%$ of multiple charge cases. The number of charges per case had no impact on the frequency of probation as a most serious sanction - the rate was about $25 \%$, regardless of the number of charges per case.

### 4.3 Amount of Most Serious Sanction

The number of charges per case also had a significant influence on the amount of the most serious sanction. Figure 9 illustrates how the average amount of the most serious sanction varied with the number of charges per case. As can be seen, cases with multiple charges received more severe sentence amounts. The average prison sentence for cases with one charge was 85 days. This figure increased continuously to 300 days for cases with 5 or more charges. The average prison term for all multiple charge cases was 199 days.

Section 4.2 illustrated that the use of probation as a most serious sanction did not vary with the number of charges per case. However, the length of probation did. The average probation term increased steadily from 405 days ( 14 months) for single charge cases to 666 days ( 22 months) for cases with 5 or more charges. The average probation term for all multiple charge cases was 588 days ( 20 months).

When a fine was the most serious sanction, the amount of the fine increased from $\$ 430$ for single charge cases to a peak of $\$ 494$ for cases with four charges. The average fine for cases with five or more charges was $\$ 333$. The fines for "other federal statutes" were the primary cause for this decline. The average fine for these offences fell from $\$ 1,146$ for cases with 4 charges to $\$ 358$ for cases with 5 or more charges.

The 1993 Sentencing Study examined incarceration in single and multiple charge cases for 10 selected offences. The findings were similar to the current study - incarceration rates and median prison terms were higher for multiple charge cases.

## 5. SENTENCING FOR SINGLE CHARGE CASES

As was noted in Section 4, the number of charges per case had a strong impact on the nature of the sentence. Unfortunately, the influence of the various charges on the sentence in multiple charge cases cannot be determined. Take, for example, an offender convicted of break and enter and possession of stolen goods, who receives a nine month prison term for the break and enter and one month for the possession of stolen goods. It is not clear how the sentence for the break and enter was affected by the possession of stolen goods. Further, it
is not possible, with the available data, to determine whether the aggregate sentence was nine or ten months. For this reason, single charge cases give the clearest insight into sentencing practices. The ultimate disposition is not affected by the number of charges, nor by the particular mix of offences in the case.

There were 437,849 cases with a conviction for one charge and a total of 719,716 sanctions associated with those cases. That is an average of 1.6 sanctions per case.

### 5.1 Most Serious Sanction

Figure 10 provides an overview of sentencing for single charge cases and will be the basis for much of the discussion in Section 5. A fine was the most frequent serious sanction imposed, with $45 \%$ of the cases receiving a fine. The prevalence of fines was a reflection of the large number of motor vehicle and "other federal statute" offences. (These two categories made up $33 \%$ of the cases.). After fines, prison was the most frequently used serious sanction, at $26 \%$. This rate was low because of the large number of convictions for relatively minor offences. The rate of probation as a most serious sanction was similar to that of incarceration (25\%).

### 5.2 Prison as the Most Serious Sanction

## Frequency of Prison

There were 113,200 single charge cases in which a prison sentence was the most serious sanction. Offences against the administration of justice had the highest incarceration rate ( $47 \%$ ). Offenders who committed these types of offences ("escape from custody", "fail to appear", etc.), exhibited a lack of compliance with the justice system and were therefore sent to prison. The next highest incarceration rates were for offences against the person, property offences, and drug offences, which all had about the same rate (26-28\%). (See Figure 10)

For individual offences, the incarceration rate varied from $1 \%$ for gaming and betting offences to $89 \%$ for sexual assault (levels $2 \& 3$ ). Figure 11 illustrates that 18 of the 65 offence categories had prison as the most serious sanction in at least $50 \%$ of cases. Most of these offences would appear to be of a more serious nature.

## Length of Prison Terms

The percentage distribution of prison terms is illustrated in Figure. Overall, prison sentence lengths varied from 2 days to 14 years. ${ }^{7}$ However, only $4 \%$ of cases had a sentence over 1 year. Furthermore, $82 \%$ of cases had a prison term of 3 months or less. The average prison term was 85 days and the median ${ }^{8}$ term was 30 days. As with rates of incarceration, these results were influenced by the large number of convictions for relatively minor offences. Offences against the person commanded the highest average prison sentence, while offences against the administration of justice had the lowest. Prison terms tended to be clustered at particular values. Sentences of 1 month, 2 months and 3 months were used frequently.

## Offence Severity

Offence severity had a direct effect on the frequency and length of incarceration. This can be demonstrated by examining offences in the Criminal Code that have a tiered structure of seriousness(Figure 13). For example, there are three levels of assault. The most serious is aggravated assault (assault level 3), followed by assault with a weapon (assault level 2) and simple assault (assault level 1). It is evident that the more serious the assault, the higher the incarceration rate and the longer the average prison term. The same relationship is true for break and enter/theft offences. ${ }^{9}$ Thus offences against the person (assault) and property offences (theft) both showed this tendency.

## Maximum Penalties Allowed by Law

The Criminal Code sets maximum penalties for most offences. However, these maximum penalties were not reflected in the actual sentences that were imposed. Of the 65 offences used in the study, 25 had a maximum sentence of 10 years or more. Figure 14 shows the sentencing patterns for these offences. The average incarceration rate for these offences, although higher than that of the other 40 offences, was less than $50 \%$. The median prison sentence was 90 days and the average was 205 days. Again, these amounts are high in comparison to the other offences, but they are very low in comparison to the maximum penalties allowed by law.

An examination of certain individual offences confirms these findings. The offence of break and enter carries a maximum penalty of life imprisonment. Yet almost $40 \%$ of offenders did not receive a prison sentence. For those who were imprisoned, the median term of custody was 4 months and $95 \%$ of all prison terms were under 2 years. In some instances, offences with lower maximum penalties, such as sexual assault, were punished more severely.

## Additional Sanctions

To this point, Section 5 has focused on an examination of prison sentences for single charge cases. However, Figure 15 demonstrates that some of these cases do receive sanctions in addition to prison. In fact, prison was the only sanction in $54 \%$ of cases, meaning that almost half of the cases received additional sanctions. For those cases having additional sanctions, probation was the most frequently used other sanction. Thirty-two percent of cases had both prison and probation as sanctions. Neither fines, nor restitution were imposed very often in combination with prison. Motor vehicle offences and offences against the person were most likely to receive sanctions in addition to prison. Offences against the person tended to get probation as an additional sanction, while motor vehicle offences received an "other" sanction.

The amounts of sanctions were more severe for cases having a prison term. The average probation term for single charge cases with a prison term was 483 days ( 16 months). In comparison, cases with no prison had an average probation term of 405 days ( 14 months). Fines associated with prison terms averaged $\$ 1,304$, while fines not associated with prison terms averaged $\$ 434$. Thus, whatever factor prompted the case to be judged severe enough to merit a prison term, also influenced the magnitude of the additional sanctions that were imposed.

### 5.3 Probation as the Most Serious Sanction

## Frequency of Probation

As indicated in Figure 10, 25\% of single charge cases (111,033 cases) had probation as the most serious sanction. The highest rate of probation occurred for offences against the person ( $53 \%$ ), followed by property offences (40\%): Together, these two categories of offences accounted for over $70 \%$ of the cases with a probation term as the most serious sanction. The high rate of probation for offences against the person was due, in part, to the high probation rate for assault (level 1). This offence made up over 60\% of the cases in offences against the person.

Regarding individual offences, the probation rate varied from $3 \%$ (driving while disqualified, unlawfully at large, and "other federal statutes") to $74 \%$ (harassing/indecent phone calls). Figure 16 illustrates that 8 of the 65 offences had probation as a most serious sanction in at least $50 \%$ of cases.

## Length of Probation Terms

For single charge cases with probation as the most serious sanction, probation terms ranged from 1 day to 3 years, the maximum term allowed by law. Figure 17 shows that the average term was 405 days ( 14 months). The median probation term was slightly lower - 12 months. As with prison terms, offences against the person commanded the highest average probation term. Motor vehicle offences had the lowest average term. Figure 17 also presents the percentage distribution of probation terms. The distribution was remarkably consistent for all offence categories, with only a slight departure for offences against the person and motor vehicle offences. Similar to prison, probation terms tended to be clustered at particular values. A probation term of 1 year was imposed most often ( $44 \%$ of cases), but terms of 6 months and 2 years were also frequently imposed.

## Offence Severity

As with incarceration, the length of the probation term was directly related to the seriousness of the offence. However, the frequency of probation (as a most serious sentence) was inversely related to the seriousness of the offence. This can best be illustrated by examining its application in assault offences Figure 18). Simple assault (assault level 1) had the highest rate of probation, but the shortest average probation term. Aggravated assault (assault level 3) had the lowest rate of probation, but the highest average probation term.

## Additional Sanctions

A period of probation cannot be imposed as a separate sanction. It must be imposed with a suspended sentence, a fine, or a term of imprisonment not exceeding two years. Figure 19 provides details on sanctions that were imposed in conjunction with probation. It shows that when probation was the most serious sanction, $82 \%$ of probation orders were accompanied by an "other" sanction. Often this "other" sanction was a suspended sentence. Fines were imposed in addition to the probation order in $31 \%$ of cases. Seven of the eight offence categories had figures close to this average. The one exception was motor vehicle offences, with $92 \%$ of cases having a fine in combination with a probation order. Restitution was imposed with probation in $13 \%$ of cases - the majority of these involved property offences.

### 5.4 Fines as the Most Serious Sanction

## Frequency of Fines

Figure 10 indicates that there were 196,174 single charge cases with a fine as the most serious sanction. This represented $45 \%$ of cases, the highest rate among the five sanctions examined. The figures for "other federal statutes" ( $90 \%$ ) and motor vehicle offences ( $70 \%$ ) were quite high. In fact, these two offence categories accounted for over half of the cases having a fine as the most serious sanction. Offences against the person had a fine as the most serious sanction in only $16 \%$ of cases. Instead, these offences usually received prison or probation terms.

There were 9 offences that had at least $50 \%$ of cases with a fine as the most serious sanction (Figure 20). The use of fines as a most serious sanction was fairly low for the remaining offence types. Indeed, 41 of the 65 offences, had a fine as the most serious sanction in less than $25 \%$ of the cases.

## Amount of Fines

The distribution of fine amounts is shown in Figure 21. For single charge cases with a fine as the most serious sanction, the average fine was $\$ 430$ and the median was $\$ 300$. "Other federal statute" offences had the highest average fine, despite the fact that $59 \%$ of cases had fines of $\$ 100$ or less. The reason for this was a small number of very large fines. For example, one of the "other federal statues", the Income Tax Act, had fines that averaged $\$ 5,222$. Motor vehicle offences also had high average fines ( $\$ 544$ ), but unlike "other federal statutes", there were no fines of $\$ 100$ or less. Administration of justice offences had the lowest average fine at $\$ 195$.

## Additional Sanctions

For $58 \%$ of single charge cases with a fine as the most serious sanction, the fine was the only sanction (Figure 22). Cases which had other sanctions usually involved motor vehicle offences. For these types of cases the fine was accompanied by an "other" sanction, likely a driving prohibition.

## 6. SENTENCING FOR MULTIPLE CHARGE CASES

Offenders convicted of multiple charges were given more severe sanctions than those convicted of single charges. It is not possible to present a complete picture of sentencing in multiple charge cases - the database does not contain information on aggregate prison sentences. Nevertheless, it is possible to draw some conclusions regarding sentencing practices in these cases. ${ }^{10}$

There were 113,833 cases with two or more charges. They involved a total of 382,757 charges and 611,467 sanctions. These cases represented only $21 \%$ of total cases, but close to $50 \%$ of total charges and sanctions. There was an average of 1.6 sanctions per charge, the same as single charge cases. Offences against the person had the fewest charges per case (2.0), while administration of justice offences had the most (6.9). The figure for administration of justice offences is not unexpected. The nature of these offences ("failure to appear", "escape custody", "unlawfully at large") is such that, they are committed as a result of an other offence.

### 6.1 Most Serious Sanction

Figure 23 provides an overview of sentencing for multiple charge cases and will be the basis for much of the discussion in Section 6. This figure illustrates that, unlike single charge cases, incarceration was the most frequent serious sanction for multiple charge cases. The rate, at $53 \%$, was about twice that of single charge cases. The use of probation as a most serious sanction was about the same. However, the imposition of fines as a most serious sanction dropped from $45 \%$ for single charge cases to $21 \%$ for multiple charge cases. Again, restitution and "other" sanctions were seldom a most serious sanction. Instead, they were used in combination with prison, probation, or fines.

### 6.2 Prison as the Most Serious Sanction

## Frequency of Prison

A total of 59,980 multiple charge cases had prison as the most serious sanction. (See Figure 23.) Offences against the person had the highest incarceration rate ( $57 \%$ ), but drug, administration of justice, property, and motor vehicle offences all had similar rates. Relative to cases with one charge, the incarceration rate for all eight offence categories was significantly higher.

The incarceration rate for individual offences ranged from $2 \%$ (gaming and betting) to $98 \%$ (use firearm for offence). There were 33 offences which had prison as the most serious sanction in at least $50 \%$ of cases (Figure 24). In comparison, single charge cases had only 18 such offences. (Those same 18 offences are found in the 33.) There were only 7 offences that had prison as the most serious sanction in less than $25 \%$ of cases.

Multiple charge cases that received a prison term often received more than one. The 59,980 cases with prison as a sanction actually involved a total of 211,722 prison terms, i.e. an average of 3.5 per case. In fact, multiple charge cases accounted for $65 \%$ of all prison sentences. Unfortunately, it was not possible to determine the aggregate prison terms.

## Length of Prison Terms

Like single charge cases, prison terms for multiple charge cases varied from 2 days to 14 years. However, there were more cases ( $10 \%$ vs. $4 \%$ ) that had terms in excess of one year and there were fewer cases ( $61 \% \mathrm{vs}$. $82 \%$ ) that had terms of three months or less. The average prison term was about twice that of single charge cases. The median term was 90 days compared to 30 days. Once again, offences against the person commanded the highest average prison sentence, while offences against the administration of justice had the lowest. (See Figure 25 .) Prison terms tended to be clustered at particular values. Sentences of 1 month, 3 months, and 6 months were frequently imposed.

## Additional Sanctions

Fewer multiple charge cases had prison as the only sanction ( $45 \%$ vs. $54 \%$ for single charge cases). Probation or "other" sanctions were usually the additional sanctions associated with a prison term. Like single charge cases, offences against the person tended to get probation as an additional sanction, while motor vehicle offences received an "other" sanction. (See Figure 26.)

### 6.3 Probation as the Most Serious Sanction

## Probation Rate

There were 29,677 multiple charge cases in which probation was the most serious sanction. (See Figure 23) This rate ( $26 \%$ ) was equivalent to that for single charge cases. The highest rate was about $34 \%$ and occurred in four offence categories: offences against the person, property offences, morals offences, and "other criminal code" offences.

There were 6 individual offences that had probation rates of at least $50 \%$, compared to 8 offences for single charge cases. Of the 6 types, 4 were common to both single and multiple charge cases. Those offences were: harassing/indecent phone calls, mischief under $\$ 1,000$, fraud (amount unknown), and mischief over $\$ 1,000$.

## Length of Probation Terms

Like single charge cases, probation rates for multiple charge cases varied from one day to three years. The average term of probation was about 17 months and the median was 12 months. Comparable figures for single charge cases were 14 months and 12 months, respectively. Thus the average probation term was higher for multiple charge cases. Once again, probation terms tended to be clustered at values of 6 months, 1 year, and 2 years.

### 6.4 Fines as the Most Serious Sanction

## Frequency of Fines

Fines were less likely to be a most serious sanction in multiple charge cases. Twenty-one percent of cases ( 23,397 cases) had a fine as the most serious sanction ( Figure 23). As with single charge cases, the highest rate occurred for "other federal statute" offences. Only 3 of the 65 offences had at least $50 \%$ of cases with a fine as the most serious sanction. Those offences were: "other federal statutes", keeping a bawdy house, and Narcotic Control Act (NCA) possession.

## Amount of Fines

The average fine for multiple charge cases was $\$ 463$, slightly higher than that for single charge cases ( $\$ 430$ ). Other results were about the same for both types of cases. The median fine was $\$ 300$, the largest average fines were imposed for "other federal statute" offences, and the smallest were imposed for administration of justice offences. One factor to keep in mind is that all fines must be paid, regardless of the number imposed. As a result, the total fine paid was much greater for multiple charge cases. The 23,397 multiple charge cases that had a fine as the most serious sanction, were associated with an additional 59,641 fines. The total average fine for these cases was $\$ 1,089$.

## 7. OTHER ISSUES

### 7.1 Demographic Characteristics of Offenders

The sentencing database can be analyzed to examine the age and gender of persons who are convicted of different crimes and who receive different sentences.

## Gender

Figure 27 presents the percentage distribution of each gender by offence category and the percentage distribution of both genders by offence category. It is clear from the data that males constituted a large majority ( $86 \%$ ) of convicted persons. ${ }^{11}$ However, this figure varied by offence category. Offences against the person had the highest percentage of males convicted (91\%), but five other categories of offence had percentages above the average. The highest proportions of females to males were found in property and morals offences, a reflection of the number of females convicted of "theft under $\$ 1,000$ " and "soliciting". These findings were similar to those in the 1993 Sentencing Study.

[^9]From an examination of the percentage distributions for each of the genders across offence categories, it is apparent that the first three categories - offences against the person, property offences, and motor vehicle offences - dominated the percentages, accounting for $68 \%$ of females convicted and $67 \%$ of males convicted. However, females had a preponderance in the area of property offences, while males had a preponderance in both property and motor vehicle offences.

Figure 28, Figure 29, and Figure 30 were created in order to explore the hypothesis that males and females were treated differently by the courts upon conviction for the same offence. Figure 28 shows, for each gender, the percentage distribution of most serious sanction by offence category. The totals at the bottom indicate that similar proportions of males and females receive a fine as the most serious sanction, but that the percentages for prison and probation are quite different. Males were more likely to have prison as a most serious sanction. This was true of all offence categories except morals offences. In fact, males exhibited dramatically higher percentages of incarceration for the three dominant offence categories - offences against the person, property offences, and motor vehicle offences. Females, on the other hand, were more likely to have probation as a most serious sanction.

As a result, the totals may not add to $100 \%$.
Figure 29 examines gender differences with regard to the quantity of the most serious sanction. The totals at the bottom indicate that the average amounts of the most serious sanction were higher for males than for females. The differences were most dramatic for prison terms and fines, where in all eight offence categories, males had higher average sanctions. The differences were less pronounced for probation terms, where males had higher averages in four of the offence categories and females had higher averages in the other four.

One factor which could have distorted the sentencing data for the two genders is the possibility that males faced more charges that did females. (It is already been demonstrated that sentencing for multiple charge cases is more severe than for single charge cases.) However, it appears that there was no great difference between the genders with regard to the number of charges per case. Among males, $79 \%$ were convicted of one charge, $13 \%$ of two charges, and $8 \%$ of three or more charges. Of the females, $83 \%$ were convicted of one charge, $11 \%$ of two charges, and $6 \%$ of three or more.

To carry the analysis one step further, Figure 30 compares incarceration statistics for males and females for 12 specific offences. The comparisons were made using single charge cases in order to eliminate any differential influence of multiple charge cases. The offences were chosen because they tended to be high frequency ones. The data reveal that for 10 of the 12 offences, the incarceration rates for males were significantly higher than for females. The two exceptions were Narcotic Control Act (NCA) possession and soliciting. For NCA possession the incarceration rates were about the same - $15 \%$ for males and $17 \%$ for females. For soliciting offences, females had a much higher incarceration rate $-32 \%$ versus $2 \%$ for males. With regard to prison terms, males had longer average terms for all 12 offences, although the difference for some offences was not large. It is interesting to note that, even though females had a higher incarceration rate for soliciting, males had a longer average prison term - 28 days compared to 26 days for women.

Thus the data presented in Figure 28, Figure 29, and Figure 30 suggest that the courts were apt to deal more harshly with males than with females. There are other factors, for example, criminal record, that may have contributed to the differences in sentencing between the genders. However, it was not possible to control for such factors.

## Age

The average age for all offenders was 32 years. ${ }^{12}$ That figure was the same for both males and females. Figure 31 indicates that the number of offenders per 10,000 population for both genders peaked in the 20-24 year age group. From there, the rate decreased continually with age. (The rate for the 18-19 year age group was lower

[^10]than would be expected due to the method used to calculate age. ${ }^{13}$ ) The data in Figure 31 also reveal that the rate of conviction for males for all age groups was about six times higher than the rates for females.

Figure 32 provides the number of offenders per 10,000 population for males for offences against the person and property offences. Figure 33 provides the same data for females. There are some evident differences between the two genders. Younger males tend to be convicted of more property offences - the rate per 10,000 population exceeds that for offences against the person, up until the 35-39 year age group. After that the rates for the two offence types remain about the same. Females also tend to be convicted of more property offences than offences against the person, but unlike males, this trend is true for all age groups. For both property offences and offences against the person, the two genders exhibit the general trend of a decreasing rate with age. As well, the rates for males exceed those for females.

### 7.2 Hybrid Offences

The majority of Criminal Code offences are hybrid offences, meaning they can be prosecuted either summarily or by indictment. The Crown decides by which method to proceed. Presumably one of the factors influencing the Crown's choice is the severity of the offence. It is commonly assumed that sentences for hybrid offences
that proceed by way of indictment are more severe because indictable offences carry stiffer maximum penalties. ${ }^{14}$

Hybrid offence data for six of the jurisdictions are shown in Figure 34. ${ }^{15}$ (These jurisdictions only represent about $15 \%$ of the charges on the database.) The most common offence category was motor vehicle offences, with 16,854 cases or $39 \%$ of the total. Of the 42,827 hybrid offence cases, the majority ( $88 \%$ ) were concluded under summary procedure rules. About $75 \%$ of hybrid-summary cases were single charge compared to $53 \%$ for hybrid-indictable cases. Thus, the number of charges in the case may have been a factor in determining the Crown election.

As expected, hybrid-indictable cases were treated more severely than hybrid-summary cases. The most frequent serious sanction for hybrid-indictable cases was prison. The incarceration rate was $47 \%$ compared to $22 \%$ for cases concluded under summary conviction rules. All offence categories had higher incarceration rates for hybrid-indictable offences. The most frequent serious sanction for hybrid-summary cases was a fine ( $52 \%$ of cases). Again all offence categories had higher frequencies of fines for hybrid-summary cases. Overall, the use of probation was higher for hybrid-indictable offences, however these results varied by offence category.

In addition to receiving more severe types of sanctions, hybrid-indictable cases received harsher sanction amounts. Figure 35 provides the average amount of the most serious sanction for hybrid offences. It shows that the average prison term for hybrid-indictable cases was higher than that for hybrid summary cases across six offence categories. The overall average, at 172 days, was 3 times higher than that for hybrid-summary cases. The same trend was true of probation - the average terms were higher across six offence categories and the overall average probation term was 1.5 times higher for hybrid-indictable cases. Average fines were universally higher for all types of hybrid-indictable offences, but the overall averages differed by only $7 \%$.

### 7.3 Jurisdictional Comparisons

The sentencing database contains provincial court data from nine jurisdictions. Coverage for three of those jurisdictions - Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, and Quebec - is incomplete. As well, Quebec's data probably represent more serious cases, due to the lack of municipal court data. It's not possible to assess how these differences in coverage affected sentencing patterns across the jurisdictions.

Jurisdictional comparisons were made using single charge cases in order to eliminate any differential influence of multiple charge cases. The distribution of single charge cases in each jurisdiction is presented in Figure 36. The data highlight the different mix of caseload in each jurisdiction. For example, the proportion of cases against the person varied from $9 \%$ in Quebec to $36 \%$ in the Northwest Territories. Property offences varied from $17 \%$ in Yukon to $31 \%$ in Newfoundland. Variations of such magnitude no doubt contributed to the variations in sentencing discussed below.

There was considerable variation in the most serious sanction imposed in the jurisdictions. (See Figure 37.) The overall incarceration rates varied from $10 \%$ in Nova Scotia to $42 \%$ in Prince Edward Island. Similar variances can be observed for the other sanctions. Quebec and the Northwest Territories had the highest use of probation, while Alberta and Nova Scotia had the highest utilization of fines as the most serious sanction. One cause for the high incarceration rate in Prince Edward Island was that province's decision to incarcerate
all impaired drivers ${ }^{16}$. This demonstrates that different jurisdictional policies can be responsible for variations in sentencing.

To facilitate inter-jurisdictional comparisons 11 high frequency offences were chosen. These offences accounted for at least $55 \%$ of all the single charge cases in each jurisdiction. The incarceration rates and average prison lengths for the selected offences are shown in Figure 38. As was the case with the total caseload, there was considerable variation in sentencing patterns among the jurisdictions. Except for Newfoundland, each jurisdiction had the highest incarceration rate or the longest average prison sentence for at least one offence. The range in incarceration rates and average prison sentences was greater for some offences than for others. In general, provinces with high incarceration rates had low average sentences and provinces with low incarceration rates had high average sentences.

### 7.4 Comparisons among Cities

It has been suggested that there are different patterns of crime in urban and rural areas. The nine jurisdictions included in this report represent different rural/urban mixes of population. By examining only major urban courts, it is possible to enhance comparability. There were four jurisdictions with urban areas that could be used in inter-city comparisons: Alberta, Saskatchewan, Ontario, and Quebec. However, Quebec was excluded due to the lack of municipal court data. In the end, seven municipalities were chosen. Data for Toronto's five provincial court locations were combined. All the other cities had only one provincial court location. ${ }^{17}$ To further facilitate comparisons, only those 11 offences identified in the jurisdictional comparisons were used in the analysis.

Figure 39 compares incarceration statistics for the seven cities. As with inter-jurisdictional comparisons, there was considerable variation among cities. The overall incarceration rate for the selected offences varied from $14 \%$ in Calgary to $39 \%$ in Ottawa. In fact, Ottawa had the highest incarceration rate for all but 3 of the 11 offences. The average prison term varied from 53 to 155 days. Once again there appeared to be an inverse

[^14]relationship between incarceration rate and length of prison terms. Cities with higher rates of incarceration had lower average prison terms.

## Data Limitations

Several limitations on the data base should be borne in mind. First, the study lacks data from Superior Courts. The data for this study were compiled from the Adult Criminal Court Survey (ACCS) conducted by the Canadian Centre for Justice Statistics (CCJS). The ACCS currently compiles data only from provincial or lower courts. The cases heard in Superior Courts of criminal jurisdiction represent a relatively small proportion of the total number of criminal cases, but tend to be the more serious cases. The consequence of this limited coverage is that some of the more serious cases (which would result in the more severe sanctions) are not included in the present study.

## Coverage

The data base was edited to exclude the following cases: 3,909 cases where the accused was a company; 58 cases where the prison sentence length was either 'life' or a term exceeding 14 years. (In these cases the sentence length was given a fixed code which did not reflect the sentence length); 18,660 prison sentences which had a length of one day. These sentences reflected a sentence of "time served" or an addition of time for fail to appear or fail to comply.

The ACCS currently collects data from courts in seven provinces and territories. They are:
A. Newfoundland and Labrador - 2 courts in St. John's and Clarenville (with an estimated coverage of $45 \%$ of federal statute cases);
B. Prince Edward Island - all 5 courts;
C. Nova Scotia - 13 courts (excludes Halifax City Court with an estimated $15 \%$ of federal statute cases);
D. Québec - all 41 provincial courts (excludes 140 Municipal Courts, 67 of these Municipal Courts, including Montreal, Québec city and Laval, have jurisdiction over Criminal Code summary and hybrid-summary offences);
E. Saskatchewan - all 16 courts centres;
F. Yukon - all 16 courts; and
G. The Northwest Territories - all 43 courts.

In addition, Alberta provided data from all 99 courts and Ontario provided data from all 67 courts to CCJS specifically for this study. These data were converted by CCJS to conform to ACCS data specifications and file structures.
