INTRODUCTION

This statistical survey, undertaken at the request of the Deputy Minister, provides a factual study of Indian education and attempts to answer for all who are concerned with Indian education the question: "How well are Indian children doing in school?" The analysis, by no means complete, is broad and general in scope and points to tendencies, abnormalities, special problems and signs of significant progress by region rather than by individual school. It is a quantitative study in that it deals with the numbers of pupils in each grade and the number of grades taught in the schools.

The data for this survey was gathered from Indian and provincial schools across Canada from a Dominion Bureau of Statistics form entitled, "Teacher's Annual Age-Grade Report" on which each teacher entered the number of children in her class by age, grade and sex in each classroom.

These forms were returned to Education Division, Indian Affairs Branch, where they were sorted and sent to the Education Division of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for processing.

In order to interpret the mass of raw data provided by the forms it was necessary to determine the facts required for this study. The framework of the study was therefore set up by the Education Division, Indian Affairs Branch, and the Dominion Bureau of Statistics produced the tables from the raw data to fit into this framework.

THE STRUCTURE OF THE STUDY

The Indian school population falls into three groups, (1) the children attending Indian day schools, (2) those who for various reasons require institutional care of the residential schools and (3) those who have been integrated into the Canadian educational system and attend provincial schools. Although fundamentally the schools attended by these three groups have similar aims nevertheless each type of school has a special function and attracts children of parents of divergent socio-economic backgrounds and cultural and educational development. It was expected that certain well defined differences in pupil distribution might be discovered between the three groups and for this reason they were separated for comparative study.

The school population was next divided into administrative regions, Maritimes, Quebec, Southern Ontario, Northern Ontario, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia and the Yukon. If this analysis is to assist field officials in the diagnosis of special problems in their respective regions, this division was essential.

The division of Canada into regions chops the country mainly north to south or perpendicularly into convenient administrative regions with boundaries generally co-terminus with those of the provinces, but inasmuch as Indian settlement and economic stability has tended to develop earlier in the south and has still to reach into some of the northerly areas it was considered necessary for this study to introduce horizontal divisions from east to west and so five zones cutting across the regional divisions were set up as follows:

- 1. United States border to the 50th parallel.
- 2. 50th to the 52nd parallel.
- 3. 52nd to the 55th parallel.
- 4. 55th to the 56th parallel.
- 5. 56th to the northern provincial boundary. Zones 4 and 5 correspond with the two northerly zones in which a Northern Allowance is paid to field staff.

DISTRIBUTION OF PUPILS ATTENDING INDIAN DAY SCHOOLS

Table I shows the distribution of 15,457 Indian children by age, grade and sex. In this group have been included all day pupils whether they attend a regular day school or whether they are day pupils taking their instruction at a residential school. Since data from all schools was not available this study will deal with 15,457 pupils out of a total of 18,461 registered as of January, 1957.

The grand totals at the bottom of the table give the enrolment by grades, and shows a range of 802 in kindergarten to 6 in Grade X. The grade totals at the right of the table show the number of pupils in each age group from five years to 19 years and over.

To compare the enrolment by grade - the totals at the bottom of Table I - with the enrolments in provincial schools the provinces of Prince Edward Island and Alberta were chosen. Table Ia shows graphically this comparison for pupils aged 6 to 16 years, the period of compulsory education. The contours of the graphs are almost identical, showing that the holding power of the Indian day school is very close to that of the two selected groups of provincial schools. Some of the drop-outs from Indian day schools can be accounted for by their transfer to provincial schools, a factor which must be taken into account in assessing the real significance of this comparison.

Table Ib shows the grade offerings in Indian day schools. In the column on the left the number of grades taught in the school is shown and to the right the number of schools teaching those grades only. Approximately one-half of the day schools give instruction in Grades I to VI only. This would include the majority of the one-room schools and the schools from which the pupils are transferred to provincial schools after Grade VI. The rest, with the exception of ten schools which have Grade IX and X pupils, extend their programs to Grade VIII which is generally regarded as the end of elementary school education.


The following conclusions may be drawn from these statistics:

- 1. The distribution of pupils in Indian day schools for the age group 6 to 16 years is comparable to that of two selected provinces.
- 2. The holding power in Indian day schools is similar to that of the schools in the selected provinces.
- 3. Segregated education in Indian day schools is largely confined to Grades I to VIII and about one-half of the schools do not go beyond Grade VI.

CLASSIFICATION OF DAY PUPILS BY AGE

Boys The figures in Tables 2, 3, 4 and 5 giving a breakdown of the pupils according to age and rank in school reflect both the progress and the problems in Indian education. In all school systems that attempt to cater to the needs of the individual there is both acceleration and deceleration in pupil progress. The socio-economic and language barriers and the perplexities of acculturation are forces of deceleration peculiar to Indian education so that deceleration in terms of the provincial educational program is a normal condition and any indications of acceleration and normality are signs of solid progress which reflect in turn the breaking down of the socio-economic and language barriers.

The program of studies and grading of pupils in Indian day schools are those of the province in which each school is situated which means that comparisons between grade achievement in provincial schools and Indian day schools are valid.

The underage group in Table 2 numbering 1278 boys are those who have been accelerated by one or more years. For these boys there are no barriers. Of special significance is the large number, 435, who are accelerated by one year in Grade I. The reasons for this favorable situation may be sought in the following circumstances:

- 1. A better understanding amongst Indian parents of the nature and importance of education.
- 2. The provisions of the amended Section 115 of the Indian Act which requires rather than permits a child of six years to enter school.
- 3. Improved methods of instruction in the Beginners' grade in Indian schools.
- 4. Improved school facilities.

The largest group of pupils, numbering 2163, are at the normal age for their grade. Many of these will undoubtedly have entered school at six years and will have benefitted by a year of readiness instruction. The need of a further analysis of this group is clearly indicated to discover the conditions under which normal progress through the grades is made.

If to the normal group is added the one year retarded group 52.3 per cent, see Table 3, of the school population is accounted for. The pupils who are one year retarded may be regarded as having made normal progress taking into consideration the retarding forces at work. Thus these two groups may reasonably be considered as the normal school enrolment.

The overage enrolment which includes the slow learners and late starters is therefore 31.3 per cent. These pupils are fairly evenly distributed over the first six grades of school and as is to be expected do not appear to get beyond Grade VI. However, the holding power of the school on these decelerated pupils is partly revealed by these figures and is an indication of the successful effort of the Indian school to provide for these deviates.

Girls The general remarks about the classification of boys apply equally to the classification of the girls to be found in Tables 4 and 5, but a special interest attaches itself to a comparison of the distribution of boys with that of the girls because the latter appear to take more kindly to schooling.

The total enrolment of boys is 7,772 compared with 7,685 girls.

The percentage of accelerated girls is 20.6, Table 5, compared with 16.4, Table 3, accelerated boys.

The normal group has 27.8 per cent boys while that of the girls has 28.9 per cent.

The combined normal and one year retarded groups of boys amount to 52.3 per cent while the same groups of girls are 52.9 per cent.

A comparison of the retarded groups shows 31.3 per cent of the boys and 26.5 per cent of the girls in these two groups.

Although the differences are not great but in each instance the girls make a better showing than the boys.

The conclusions deserving attention are:

- 1. The Indian Day School is developing a solid core of pupils who are making normal progress through the grades.
- 2. The fast learners are being accelerated according to ability and the number of accelerated pupils is encouraging.
- 3. Indian day schools are catering to the needs of the slow learner and the pupils who have been retarded for other reasons. The holding power of the school on these deviates appears to be strengthening.
- 4. The large number of normal pupils would seem to indicate that the retarding forces in Indian education are being overcome.
- 5. There are indications that the in-service training for Indian school teachers has produced improved readiness programs in the Beginners' grade which have tended to accelerate the progress of the Indian child through school.
- 6. Entrance at six years of age should be encouraged wherever classroom accommodation, equipment and the grade-pupil load teacher will allow it. The department should where necessary make provision for the acceptance of children of six years in the classroom.

#### ANALYSIS OF DAY PUPIL DISTRIBUTION BY ZONES

For the purpose of this analysis five parallel areas were set up:

- 1. Between the United States Border and the 50th parallel.
- 2. Between the 50th and the 52nd parallels.
- 3. Between the 52nd and the 55th parallels.
- 4. Between the 55th and the 56th parallels.
- 5. From the 56th to the northern boundary of the province.

The day school population contained in this study falls into these parallels as follows:

<u>Area</u>	School Population
U.S. Border to 50th Parallel	7,661
50th to 52nd Parallel	2,806
52nd to 55th Parallel	4,269
55th to 56th Parallel	680
56th to Northern Boundary	267

Zone 1 Tables 6 to 15 show the classification of pupils by age and grade in the five parallel areas mentioned above. Comparing the pupil population in each zone it is to be noted that approximately one-half of the pupils involved in this analysis live in the most settled and highly populated area between the United States border and the 50th parallel. The Indians in this area have abandoned hunting, fishing and trapping and now find more settled employment either on the reserve or in seasonal or permanent occupations open to them.

The figures in Tables 6 and 7 show that Indian education is relatively advanced in the southerly zone and is superior in every respect to the total situation and to the situation in any other of the zones.

The accelerated group is up to 25.5 per cent. The normal group has reached 32.2 per cent and with the one year retarded group is 55.1 per cent. The retarded group is down to 19.4 per cent.

It is to be noted that in Grade I there are 475 pupils, Table 6, accelerated by one year compared with 320 at normal age.

Zone 2 Apart from a few schools in northern Ontario the day schools in the zone between the 50th and the 52nd parallels lie in the prairie provinces and British Columbia.

The general distribution as shown in Tables 8 and 9 is slightly less favorable than the total distribution showing fewer accelerated pupils and more decelerated pupils, but the core of normal pupils stands at 54.3 per cent.

Zone 3 Of the 4,269 day pupils attending schools in the zone between the 52nd and 55th parallels shown in Tables 10 and 11 all but the 309 in northern Ontario schools attend schools in the prairie provinces and British Columbia.

In this zone the accelerated pupils have dropped to 1.9 per cent and the decelerated group has grown to 40.5 per cent. The normal group stands at 47.8 per cent.

Zone 4 The number of pupils in the zone between the 55th and 56th parallels is considerably smaller than that in the southerly zones. There are fewer Indians living in this area and the establishment of day schools becomes more difficult by reason of the nomadic habits of the Indians, poor communications and the general lack of development. Getting the children into school in this area is not always an easy matter. Education does not appear to be very important to Indian parents living by hunting and trapping, and a settled mode of living does not hold promise of a livelihood for many of these Indians yet.

However, the distribution of pupils in these day schools presents an encouraging picture. Table 13 shows 13.4 per cent in the accelerated group, 32.0 per cent in the decelerated group and a normal group of 54.2 per cent.

Zone 5 In the zone north of the 56th parallel the day school population tapers off to 267 pupils. Most of the schools are in Alberta where agricultural development extends into the northern reaches and communications have followed the widespread exploration of oil. Remarkable progress has been made in the schools with these children whose background is that of the most primitive of Canadian Indians and the impact of the school on the community has produced hopeful results. A few years ago most of the children were in Grades I and II. There was no accelerated group and the majority were decelerated. Tables 14 and 15 show that the work in these schools now extends to Grade VI. There is an accelerated group of 2.6 per cent, a normal group of 31.7 per cent and the over age group has been reduced to 65.4 per cent.

The following conclusions may be drawn from this analysis:

- 1. The distribution of the school population in the most southerly zone indicates that the majority of the children are ready academically for integration into the provincial schools.
- 2. Integration will in the next few years be less hampered by over age pupils than it is today.
- 3. Approximately one-half of the Indian day pupils live in the settled, industrialized area of Canada where employment opportunities are normally good.
- 4. The schools in the southern zone should provide motivation in the form of a guidance program and pre-vocational courses to prepare pupils for integrated education and vocational training for careers either on or off the reserve.
- 5. The distribution of pupils in the northerly zones indicates that the day school is making steady progress in its program of elementary education.

#### DISTRIBUTION OF PUPILS ATTENDING RESIDENTIAL SCHOOLS

Residential school pupils differ from day school pupils in that they are a select group. They have been admitted to the residential school either because they require institutional care, or because they cannot conveniently attend a day school or they are receiving higher education not offered in the local day school. This selection conditions the distribution of the pupils and the grade offerings at the residential school. Whereas the day schools are with a very few exceptions confined either to elementary or elementary and junior high school grades, the residential school has a representative group of senior high school pupils. The distribution will be affected by the high school enrolment and by the children of migrant parents inasmuch as their numbers will include more overage pupils than are to be found in the day schools.

The total distribution of the 10,754 residential school pupils made up of 5,202 boys and 5,552 girls is shown in Table 16. The graphical presentation of the distribution in Table Ia has a contour similar to those of the other schools in most respects. By comparison with the Indian day schools the drop off after age 14 years is less sharp, but the enrolment at ages 5 and 6 years is smaller. The reason for the very small enrolment of children of 5 years is to be found in departmental policy which restricts the admission of children of this young age to residential schools and encourages the use of foster homes for children under six requiring institutional care. To a lesser degree the same policy is applied to six year olds which accounts for the relatively small enrolment of 372.

No inferences with respect to holding power can be made from these figures because the residential school population is selected, restricted and shifting.

The changing role of the residential school is shown in the distribution by grade in Table 16 which reveals a total of 1,648 pupils in Grades VII to XII or 15 per cent of the total attendance. If this tendency persists there will be less room for junior pupils. To what extent this situation will pose a problem for the department cannot be forecast, but it is anticipated that better educational opportunities for all Indian children should eventually increase the capability of Indian parents to look after their children and so reduce the number of institutional cases. The conclusions that may be drawn from the distribution in Table 16 are:

- 1. Admission to the residential schools begins with a small number of exceptions at 7 years. This is dictated by departmental policy and the restricted accommodation at the schools. Although it is anticipated that the educational policy of the department will reduce the need of institutional care for Indian children it will be necessary to watch the development of the residential school enrolment to ensure that neglected and orphan children have prior claim on the available accommodation of the residential school.
- 2. The increasing number of pupils entering junior and senior high school grades and the limited space available for Indian children in the provincial schools are compelling the residential schools to extend their school program to the high school grades. Although segregated high school instruction is not considered as effective as integrated instruction in provincial schools there is no alternative at present. The eventual solution may be found in joint schools for all high school pupils but for many reasons this is not feasible immediately. The provision of adequate hostel or dormitory accommodation for senior pupils taking high school instruction at the residential school or at a nearby provincial school should be planned immediately if the higher education program is to keep pace with the demand.

#### CLASSIFICATION OF RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL PUPILS

Boys
Table 18 shows the distribution of boys by age and grade, accelerated 6.0 per cent, normal 52.2 per cent and retarded 41.5 per cent.

It is interesting to note that the largest number of accelerated pupils is in Grade I where there are 80, and that retardation tapers off in the senior grades. This latter is to be expected because a high degree of selection has taken place amongst the senior pupils. The retarded group of 41.5 per cent compared with 31.3 per cent in the day schools is an indication of the enrolment of over age pupils and does not reveal the retardation that has taken place in school. It is not unusual for residential schools to admit beginners at age 10 years which is a retardation of 3 years at the outset of the child's school career.

Girls In Table 20 the distribution of girls shows 9.3 per cent accelerated, 54.4 per cent normal and 36.0 per cent retarded. Here again there is a large group of accelerated Grade I pupils and a tapering off of retardation in the senior grades.

There is an appreciable difference between the numbers of senior high school boys and girls, Tables 17 and 19 show 127 boys and 172 girls in Grades X to XII.

Table Ic shows graphically the comparative classification of boys and girls with the latter favorably placed in each group.

Conclusions to be drawn from this analysis:

- 1. Although the retardation may in most instances be beyond the control of the school a careful study of all retarded cases should be made by field officials to prevent all needless deceleration and to promote the acceleration of over age, mature pupils, in the interests of efficiency and economy.
- 2. In the residential school as in the day school the girls are more favorably distributed than the boys.
- 3. Retardation amongst the senior high school pupils is relatively small.

#### ANALYSIS OF RESIDENTIAL PUPIL DISTRIBUTION BY ZONE

The residential school population contained in this study attend schools situated in the following parallel zones. Although all of the children may not normally reside in the zone in which their school is located, but may be transported to these schools from distant points, the overlapping is not considered sufficiently extensive to affect seriously the validity of this data.

Tables 21 to 30 show the classification of pupils by age and grade in these five parallel zones. Comparing the pupil population in each zone it is noted that there is a tapering off in the northerly zones with about 90 per cent of the children in the three southerly zones.

Indicative of the development from south to north are the concentration of high school pupils in the two southerly areas and the absence of high school pupils in the three northerly areas. This should not be interpreted to mean that no pupils in the northern schools reach high school but that the number is small enough to be absorbed by provincial schools. The more favorable distribution of pupils in the accelerated and decelerated groups is in the southerly schools.

A high percentage of retardation in the early grades is characteristic of all residential schools. The explanation for this lies in the fact that amongst the institutional cases that are received into the residential schools there is a high percentage of over age pupils. For a variety of reasons they have been kept out of school by parents or guardians and make a late start in school.

#### The following conclusion may be drawn:

1. The extension of the school program to the high school grades has become necessary in the southerly residential schools. This development should be kept under observation in order to assess the value of segregated high school education and to determine the possibility of consolidating it in one or two schools in each region, since small high schools cannot provide a sufficiently diversified program to meet the needs of Indian pupils preparing themselves for vocations in which they are most likely to succeed.

#### DISTRIBUTION IN THE SCHOOLS IN THE MARITIMES REGION

<u>Schools</u> The work in the Indian day schools with the exception of two pupils is confined to Grades I to VIII. Possibly by reason of their relatively small numbers all high school pupils are integrated into the provincial school system.

Tables 31 and 32 show the distribution by age and grade. There is a marked drop from 150 In Grade III to 110 in Grade IV and a sharp tapering off down to 40 in Grade VIII. At the Grade III level there are 48 pupils retarded by two or more years and 48 are also retarded by two or more years at the Grade IV level. This unfavorable situation should be investigated by the regional school inspector and a remedial program set up to assist these retarded pupils. Unless this is done the number of pupils leaving school at the sixth grade at 16 years of age will remain high.

Of the 19 day schools operating in the Maritimes 10 offer Grades I to VIII and the rest a less extensive program. See Table Id for this grade load analysis. If the program of integration now developing can be expanded not only to meet the demands of a gradually increasing high school group but also to include larger numbers of pupils reaching Grades VI and VII the additional classroom facilities required can be provided at joint schools rather than at enlarged Indian day school.

#### Residential

Schools One residential school serves the Maritimes Indian population.

Approximately one tenth of the school population only require institutional care. This school does not offer instruction beyond Grade VIII. Its high school graduates presumably move to provincial schools in accordance with the policy of integration.

The distribution of the pupils shown in Tables 33 and 34 displays a favorable learning situation with 5.6 per cent of the pupils accelerated, 64.7 per cent normal and 29.5 per cent retarded.

There is a concentration of overage pupils at the Grade IV level and a steep drop from 25 in Grade IV to 14 in Grade V which suggests that Grade IV is the terminal grade for some pupils. This condition should be investigated by the regional inspector.

The following conclusions may be drawn from this analysis:

- 1. Education in Indian schools in the Maritimes is confined to the elementary grades. This is in conformity with departmental policy in that provision is made for higher education in association with non-Indian children. In this respect the Maritimes has made commendable progress.
- 2. The marked drop in school population figures at the Grade III level in the day schools and at the Grade IV level in the residential school and an increase in the number of retarded pupils at these levels calls for a field study to determine causes and to introduce remedies.
- 3. The Indian schools in the Maritimes appear to be reaching a state of balance where the number entering Indian schools equals the number leaving for provincial schools. This should mean that the building program will tend to become centred more on joint schools than on the building of Indian schools.

#### DISTRIBUTION IN THE SCHOOLS OF THE QUEBEC REGION

Schools In the Quebec region instruction is conducted in French for some schools and for others in the English language, but in this analysis the schools are studied as a group.

The distribution shown in Tables 35 and 36 presents an encouraging picture. In the accelerated group there is 30.5 per cent of the children, 50.5 in the normal group and 19.0 per cent retarded.

There is a precipitous drop from 207 to 178 from Grade III to Grade IV and another from 178 to 132 from Grade IV to Grade V. These should be given study in the field. At the Grades III, IV and V levels there are high percentages of retardation which should also be studied.

The unusually high number of accelerated pupils in Grade I probably reflects the work of the Kindergarten classes and the admission to school at six years of age. If this assumption is correct the advantages of the early start can be demonstrated. Subsequent yearly studies will show the annual progress of this accelerated group.

The sharp fall off after Grade VII is explained in Table Ie which shows that only two schools offer instruction beyond Grade VII. The elementary grades end at Grade VII in Quebec and high school begins at Grade VIII. Integration is encouraged for the high school pupils.

### Residential

Schools The distribution in the residential schools of Quebec presents a strong contrast with that of the day schools. The school population drawn to these schools from the northern hinterland includes a large number of over age children who with the recent opening of the residential schools had an opportunity for the first time to attend school. The high percentage of retarded children reflects the role of the schools, which are offering a special program for over age beginners who must acquire a moderate degree of literacy in two or three years. It is understood that the program of instruction is designed to allow over age pupils to proceed at an accelerated pace suited to the ability of the individual to compensate for the late start.

Tables 39 to 42 give a break down of the distribution for the two parallel zones in Quebec in which residential schools are situated.

The school in the most southerly zone has enrolled a large group of over age pupils in Grades I to III, shown in Tables 39 and 40. This is an extreme situation created to meet the special needs and circumstances of the children in that area. The over age group should gradually be replaced by children who enter school at the age of six or seven years and who will proceed through the elementary grades at a regular pace.

The distribution shown in Tables 41 and 42 for children attending residential schools located in the area between the 50th and the 52nd parallels displays a more normal situation. There is a 5.2 per cent accelerated group, a 44.7 per cent normal group and a 50.1 per cent retarded group. The concentration of over age pupils at the Grades II, III and IV levels should be studied by the regional school inspector to determine the reasons for this high degree of retardation and to find means of remedying the situation.

The following conclusions may be drawn:

1. Education in the day schools is making satisfactory progress.

- 2. The program of instruction in Indian schools in Quebec is confined to the elementary grades and those seeking higher education are integrated into the provincial system.
- 3. The steep drop in the day school population figures between Grades III and V should be studied carefully for causes.
- 4. The high percentage of retardation at the Grade III, IV and V levels in the day schools should be investigated and a remedial program set up in an effort to reduce retardation.
- 5. The residential schools besides catering to the needs of children requiring institutional care should receive those children who can benefit most by this form of education. The high incidence of retardation can be reduced by ensuring that all children reaching school age in September are admitted to school, even to the exclusion of some over age pupils who are not likely to complete the first six grades.

DISTRIBUTION IN THE SCHOOLS IN THE SOUTHERN ONTARIO REGION

Day

Schools All of the schools in Southern Ontario are located in the most southerly zone between the United States border and the 50th parallel.

The distribution of the school population shows a high degree of progress. Comparing the figures for Southern Ontario day schools in Tables 43 and 44 with the totals for the zone, Tables 6 and 7 the distribution for Southern Ontario is superior in every respect.

From Table If which gives an analysis of the grade load in the schools in Southern Ontario it can be seen that only one school offers Grade IX instruction, this accounts for the low attendance figure for that grade. The distribution is also affected by the grades taught in Indian schools and by the terminal grade for segregated education. Of the 52 Indian day schools 32 offer instruction up to Grade VI, and only 15 schools have Grade VIII pupils. Integration for some children attending Indian day schools begins at the end of Grade II. This factor will, of course, have some bearing on the drop-out from grade to grade in the Indian day schools.

The retarded group is relatively small and the concentration occurs at the Grade V, VI and VII levels.

#### Residential

Schools One residential school only is located in this region. The children enrolled in this school are mostly either homeless or from broken or inadequate homes. In spite of the unfortunate home background of these children they are apparently making good progress in school. In fact, the percentage of pupils making normal progress is at the relatively high figure of 64.8.

The following conclusions may be drawn:

- 1. The distribution figures indicate that Indian children in this region have largely overcome the retarding forces and that the majority are making normal progress through the elementary grades.
- 2. The integration program is advancing steadily, beginning for some children at school entrance and for others at various grade levels up to Grade VIII when, with the exception of one school, all Indian education takes place in provincial schools.
- 3. There is evidence of good school supervision by the field staff in the general progress of the pupils attending Indian schools and in the development of the integration program.
- 4. Indian education in this region has reached the point where expenditures for joint schools will equal or exceed expenditures for the building of Indian schools.
- 5. The residential school is evidently providing good educational opportunities for neglected children and is getting commendable results in the classroom.

#### DISTRIBUTION OF PUPILS IN THE NORTHERN ONTARIO REGION

Schools The day schools in this region with one exception offer instruction in the elementary grades, Grades I to VIII. Table Ig shows that 31 of the day schools provide instruction in Grades I to VIII or VIII, one school has Grades I to X and the rest have fewer grades either because the children in the area have not yet reached beyond the early grades or because they are leaving the Indian school to attend a provincial school for work in the higher grades.

From Table 47 it may be seen that there are 109 pupils in Grade I who are accelerated by one year. The same table shows 506 pupils, the largest group, advancing normally for their age. It should be noted that there is an abnormally large group of Grade I repeaters. There are no fewer than 369 or 18 per cent of the total enrolment of whom 186 are retarded by two years or more. The breakdown by zones given in Tables 49 to 54 show that the retardation in this grade is much greater in the northern schools than in the southern schools. Retardation of two or more years as shown in Tables 52 and 54 exceeds 60 per cent in each of these two zones. The cause of most of this retardation is irregularity of attendance and loss of instruction by absence with parents on the trapline or the hunt.

Although few children get beyond Grade IV at present in the northerly day schools to have Grade IV with some of these children is an accomplishment and a sign of progress.

#### Residential

Schools The distribution in the residential schools closely parallels that of the day schools. Throughout the elementary school grades there is a high incidence of retardation.

The schools in the northerly zones do not go beyond Grade VI. The southerly schools on the other hand have about 12 per cent of the enrolment in senior high school. The causes of the retardation in the residential schools will possibly be discovered in another part of this study. From these it may be possible for the field staff to get some assistance in bringing about an improvement in pupil achievement in the residential schools.

Observations to be drawn from this analysis are:

- 1. There is a high incidence of retardation both in the day and the residential schools.
- 2. This retardation is more understandable in the day schools than in the residential schools. A careful study of the residential school situation should be made in an effort to improve pupil progress.
- 3. Retardation in Grade I deserves special study.
- 4. Good progress is being made in the southerly residential schools.

#### DISTRIBUTION OF PUPILS IN THE MANITOBA REGION

Schools In Manitoba there are 72 Indian day schools of which 30 offer instruction beyond Grade VI. This is shown on Table Ih.

The day schools in Manitoba are distributed throughout the five parallel zones but the majority are between the 50th and the 55th parallels.

The distribution of the 2550 day pupils is shown in Table 63. In every respect it is less favorable than the totals for Canada shown in Tables 2 to 5. There are 362 repeaters in Grade I, 14 per cent of the total enrolment. This situation deserves study. The steep drop between Grade IV and Grade V from 334 to 248 and a similar drop between Grade V and Grade VI from 248 to 174 indicates a substantial number of dropouts at these levels.

The number of pupils continuing beyond Grade VI amounts to about 10 per cent of the enrolment, a significant and promising figure. These all attend day schools south of the 55th parallel, as shown in Tables 65 to 74.

#### Residential

Schools The distribution of 1608 children in the residential schools of Manitoba closely parallels that of the day schools. There is the sharp drop as shown in Table 75 between Grades V and VI from 161 to 109, a promising enrolment of 203 in the junior high school grades and a tapering off in the senior high school grades.

Comparing the statistics for the schools in the three southerly parallel zones it is to be noted that greater progress is being made in the middle zone.

Observations of special note are:

- 1. Manitoba has 72 day schools, a relatively large number for its day school pupilage, 30 of which offer instruction beyond Grade VI.
- 2. There is an abnormally high number of Grade I repeaters.
- 3. Progress in high school education is concentrated in the residential schools between the 50th and the 52nd parallels.

#### DISTRIBUTION OF PUPILS IN THE SASKATCHEWAN REGION

Table Ie shows a total of 65 day schools for this region, the majority of which are one-room schools. Instruction up to Grade VIII is offered in 41, Grade IX in 2 and the rest do not go beyond Grade VI.

Tables 83 and 84 indicate that progress in this region does not reach the level for Canada.

It is to be noted that with the larger number of day schools offering instruction in Grades VII and VIII larger numbers of pupils in these grades are retained in school. The figures in Table 83 show that the holding power of the schools in this region is relatively good. The first steep drop is between Grade V and VI where there is a decline from 255 to 189. The retention of 192 pupils or nearly 10 per cent of the enrolment in Grades VII and VIII is a most encouraging sign.

Tables 85 to 92 giving the breakdown by parallel zones show the largest group in the central zone and only a few in the extreme southern and northern zones.

### Residential

Schools The distribution of pupils in this region as shown in Tables 93 and 94 compare favorably with the distribution for all residential schools.

It is interesting to note that the distribution for the day and the residential schools is almost identical.

The heavy build-up of retarded pupils amounting to 81.4 in Grade IV deserves study. It will be seen in Tables 93 and 94 that this concentration of over age pupils persists in Grades IV, V and VI.

High school instruction in this region in one school has been built up by the transfer of pupils from adjacent regions to this school so that it now has over 20 per cent of the total number of Indian pupils receiving high school instruction at residential schools.

Like the day schools the residential schools are concentrated in the central zones of the region. This is shown in Tables 95 to 98.

#### Observations of note are:

- 1. The majority of the day schools in Saskatchewan offer instruction in Grades VII and VIII.
- 2. A relatively large number of pupils in Grades VII and VIII are retained in the day schools.
- 3. The distribution of accelerated and retarded pupils is similar for day and residential schools.
- 4. Segregated high school instruction has become an important aspect of Indian education in this region.

#### DISTRIBUTION OF PUPILS IN THE ALBERTA REGION

There are still comparatively few day schools in Alberta and day schools are something new for the present generation of Indian children. In 1949 there were only 3 day schools in Alberta. Today there are 36 of which 14 offer instruction beyond Grade VI. It has been the policy of the regional office to restrict the grade load at the one-room schools to the first six grades wherever possible, sending the junior high school pupils either to Indian residential schools or to provincial schools as day or residential pupils.

Possibly because of the newness of the day school situation the distribution of pupils compares unfavorably with that of the totals for Canada.

Similar to the situation in the schools in Saskatchewan there is a heavy build-up of overage pupils in Grade IV, shown in Table 102 as 86.8 per cent. There is also a steep drop from 151 to 104 between Grade IV and Grade V which might indicate that a number of the retarded pupils dropped out of school at Grade IV.

Because the day schools have not been encouraged to offer junior high school instruction the number of pupils in Grades VII to IX is small. In Table 101 the total number of junior high school pupils is shown as 62.

The day schools in Alberta are distributed throughout the province from north to south with the greatest concentration in the central zone. It has been possible to develop day schools over a wide area by reason of the system of roads leading to every part of the province with the exception of the north east corner.

The figures in Tables 103 to 112 showing the distribution by parallel zone indicate the various stages of development of the day school in this region.

Schools Alberta is unique in its large number of residential schools.

About two-thirds of the Indian pupils attending Indian schools are enrolled either as residential or day pupils at these schools.

Tables 113 and 114 show the distribution by age and grade, which is superior in most respects to the total distribution for Canada.

The small number of Grade IX and X pupils shown on Table 113 as 23 and 2 respectively reflect the policy of desegregated high school instruction pursued by the regional office. Pupils continuing with senior high school work have been placed in provincial schools.

The relatively low number of Grade I repeaters shown in Table 113 as '93 can be attributed to the improved readiness programs in these schools and regular attendance.

Like the day schools the residential schools are scattered throughout the province. The development in pupil progress is similar to that of the day schools.

Observations of note are:

- 1. Indian education in Alberta is concentrated in the residential schools.
- 2. There are relatively few day schools most of which have been established during the past eight years.
- 3. The build-up of retarded pupils in Grade IV in the day schools deserves careful study.
- 4. The schools in the zone between the 50th and 52nd parallels are well advanced and are on a par with the best Indian day schools in Canada.
- 5. A policy of desegregated high school education has been followed in Alberta.

## DISTRIBUTION OF PUPILS IN THE BRITISH COLUMBIA REGION

Day

Schools The British Columbia and Yukon region is the largest and has the greatest Indian population.

Table Ik shows that 73 day schools operate in this region, 46 of which offer instruction up to Grade VIII and two of these up to Grade IX.

The schools are scattered throughout the length and breadth of the province with the greatest concentration in the zone between the 52nd and the 55th parallels.

The distribution shown in Tables 125 and 126 is superior to the total distribution for Canada in day schools.

Of special significance is the fact that over 25 per cent of the children are accelerated, and of particular note are the 217 Grade I children who are accelerated by one year.

The development in school achievement by zones as measured by pupil distribution is revealed in Tables 127 to 136.

Table 125 shows 254 pupils in Grades VII and VIII and no enrolment beyond Grade VIII following a policy of desegregated high school instruction. Integrated education in this region is now highly developed and embraces one quarter of the Indian school enrolment of whom one third are enrolled in the junior and senior high school grades.

Pupil distribution in the day schools presents a picture of solid progress and if the low percentage of over age pupils shown in Table 126 for Grade I is any indication of future achievement it is reasonable to expect that retardation in the schools in this region will be reduced to 10 per cent within the next seven or eight years.

#### Residential

Schools The returns on which this analysis is based give a higher enrolment in the residential schools than in the day schools for this region. In this respect due to the incompleteness of the returns the figures are misleading. There are in fact fewer pupils in residential schools than in day schools in British Columbia.

The distribution of pupils in residential schools is better than the totals for Canada and inferior to the day school distribution for this region.

The steep decline from 456 in Grade IV to 344 in Grade V, shown in Table 137 would seem to indicate an unusually heavy withdrawal from school at this point, and since the drop occurs amongst the normal age group the only feasible explanation is that the pupils are being transferred to provincial schools. This should be given study in the field.

Table 137 indicates the development of high school instruction taking place in the residential schools in British Columbia. Eighteen per cent of the residential school pupils are in the junior and senior high school grades.

The distribution by parallel zones given in Tables 139 to 146 shows a heavy concentration of residential schools in the two southern zones and it is in these two zones that all of the high school instruction is given.

The following conclusions may be drawn from this analysis:

- 1. Retardation in the day schools in this region is now below 20 per cent and there are indications that it will drop to 10 per cent during the next few years.
- 2. Over 25 per cent of the children are accelerated due to the large enrolment of six year olds.
- 3. Day schools in the two southerly zones have distributions that present a picture of commendable progress.
- 4. Good supervision over the years is probably the most important contributing factor to educational progress in this region.
- 5. In the residential schools there is a sharp drop in enrolment between Grade IV and V which requires study, although the causes may be revealed in the report on withdrawals to be dealt with in another part of this survey.
- 6. The role of the residential school as a high school is taking shape in this region. A comparative study of the training and employment history of Indian graduates from provincial and segregated schools should be undertaken to determine the advantages and disadvantages of integrated and segregated education.
- 7. The successes that have been achieved in this region should be fully exploited for the immediate benefit of the present generation of Indian youth, as an example to Indians elsewhere in Canada.

#### DISTRIBUTION IN PROVINCIAL SCHOOLS

Since returns were received only from about one third of the provincial schools attended by Indian pupils the study of this group of Indian pupils can only be a sampling of the distribution in these schools, indicating tendencies rather than statements of fact. In 1957 there were 6272 Indian pupils attending provincial schools and statistics on 2297 of these were received.

Integration for Indian children is now taking place at all grade levels. The figures in Tables 147 to 150 indicate that there is a preponderance of Indian children enrolled in the elementary grades of provincial schools.

Integrated education in a democracy depends upon the willingness of both sides to accept integration. Where there is lack of agreement either on the part of the non-Indian community or on that of the Indian community there can be no integration. In some instances partial integration is acceptable and Indian children at certain grade levels are admitted to provincial schools. In some cases complete integration is agreed upon. Local attitude of mind towards integration determines the integration program and government policy promotes it and endeavors to build up a favorable climate for integration.

Integration may begin at various grade levels according to local policy but beyond that there is very little selection imposed on the children attending provincial schools in the elementary and junior high school grades. At this level groups or whole communities rather than individuals are integrated into the provincial schools. The majority of the Indian students to be found in provincial schools are essentially a cross—section of the Indian school population rather than a selected group. Integration has taken place in areas where Indian education is most highly developed and it can therefore be assumed that the favorable changes that can be observed in the pupil distribution amongst children attending provincial schools may be attributed to some extent to the influence of the Indian school on these children.

The following comparison of the distribution by age of the pupils attending Indian day schools and provincial schools shows that Indian pupils are in general making better progress in the provincial schools than in Indian day schools.

#### CONCLUSION

This statistical report on the distribution of Indian school children by age, grade and sex has presented in detail incomplete but representative data on the Indian school population. The analysis is necessarily brief, focussing attention on certain features of the report which seem to deserve emphasis.

The chief purpose of the survey is to present as complete a picture as possible of the distribution of Indian school children for the year 1957 and thereby to establish a set of figures which may be used for comparison in future surveys.

The analysis points with some satisfaction to signs of progress and it also singles out the more obvious weaknesses and imperfections in Indian education as revealed by the survey. Further study and remedial action within the region has been recommended. Common to schools in all regions is the accumulation of overage pupils in Grade IV and a heavy dropout at the end of the school year for Grade IV pupils. To take a closer look at the achievement of pupils in this grade for the purpose of remedial action it is considered advisable to test all Grade IV pupils, towards the end of the school year, 1957-58, using a battery of standardized tests. These tests will be distributed to the schools through the regional offices and returned to Ottawa for processing and analysis.

The data for this survey came from schools scattered over the length and breadth of Canada. The difficulties and delays in communications with many remote schools have not only deferred the publication of this report but also have rendered it incomplete. The cooperation of teachers, school principals, agency superintendents and regional school inspectors in providing and gathering together the data is appreciated and full acknowledgement is gratefully extended to all who have participated in this project. Special reference is made to the Education Division of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics who assumed the largest share of the work in producing the majority of the Tables in the survey.
