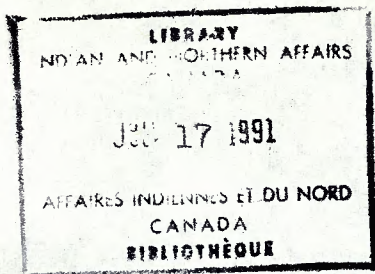

INTRODUCTION

THIS STATISTICAL SURVEY PROVIDES A FACTUAL STUDY OF THE PROGRESS OF PUPILS IN INDIAN SCHOOLS. IT CONTAINS A SUMMARY OF NON-PROMOTIONS WHICH HAVE BEEN CLASSIFIED ACCORDING TO THE REASON FOR FAILURE.

TABLES HAVE BEEN ARRANGED FOR EACH REGION SHOWING INDIAN DAY AND RESIDENTIAL PUPILS SEPARATELY. TOTALS OF THE REGIONS SHOW THE RESULTS FOR CANADA.

IN TABLE 19, OPERATION, ENROLMENT AND CLASSROOM LOAD HAVE BEEN SHOWN BY REGION.

THIS STATISTICAL SURVEY IS A QUANTITATIVE STUDY DEALING WITH THE NUMBER OF INDIAN PUPILS IN EACH GRADE AND THE NUMBER OF GRADES TAUGHT IN THE SCHOOLS.

THE DATA FOR THIS SURVEY WERE GATHERED FROM INDIAN SCHOOLS ACROSS CANADA FROM A DOMINION BUREAU OF STATISTICS FORM ENTITLED, "PRINCIPAL'S ANNUAL AGE-GRADE REPORT" ON WHICH EACH PRINCIPAL ENTERED THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN IN THE SCHOOL BY AGE, GRADE AND SEX.

THESE FORMS HAVE BEEN CONSTRUCTED TO INDICATE BETWEEN THE DARK HEAVY LINES, THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS PROGRESSING ACCORDING TO THE NORMAL AGE GROUP. NUMBERS ABOVE THE HIGHER DARK LINE INDICATE THE NUMBER OF UNDER AGE STUDENTS, WHILE THE NUMBERS BELOW THE LOWER DARK LINE INDICATE THE NUMBER OF OVER AGE STUDENTS.

CIRCULAR CHARTS HAVE BEEN INCLUDED SHOWING THE RATIO OF UNDER AGE, NORMAL AGE AND OVER AGE INDIAN STUDENTS ATTENDING INDIAN SCHOOLS OF CANADA.

THE STRUCTURE OF THE STUDY

THE POPULATION IN INDIAN SCHOOLS IS ARRANGED IN FOUR GROUPS (1) THE CHILDREN ATTENDING INDIAN DAY SCHOOLS (2) THOSE WHO FOR VARIOUS REASONS REQUIRE INSTITUTIONAL CARE OF THE RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL (3) THOSE WHO LIVE WITHIN A SHORT DISTANCE OF A RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL AND MAY ATTEND IT AS DAY STUDENTS AND (4) THOSE NON-INDIAN CHILDREN, INCLUDING CHILDREN OF GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES, METIS AND OTHERS WHO LIVE IN AREAS WHERE PROVINCIAL SCHOOLS ARE NOT AVAILABLE. IT WAS EXPECTED THAT CERTAIN WELL DEFINED DIFFERENCES IN PUPIL DISTRIBUTION MIGHT BE DISCOVERED BETWEEN THE FOUR GROUPS AND FOR THIS REASON THEY WERE SEPARATED FOR COMPARATIVE STUDY.

THE SCHOOL POPULATION WAS NEXT DIVIDED INTO ADMINISTRATIVE REGIONS, MARITIMES, QUEBEC, SOUTHERN ONTARIO, NORTHERN ONTARIO, MANITOBA, SASKATCHEWAN, ALBERTA AND BRITISH COLUMBIA AND YUKON.

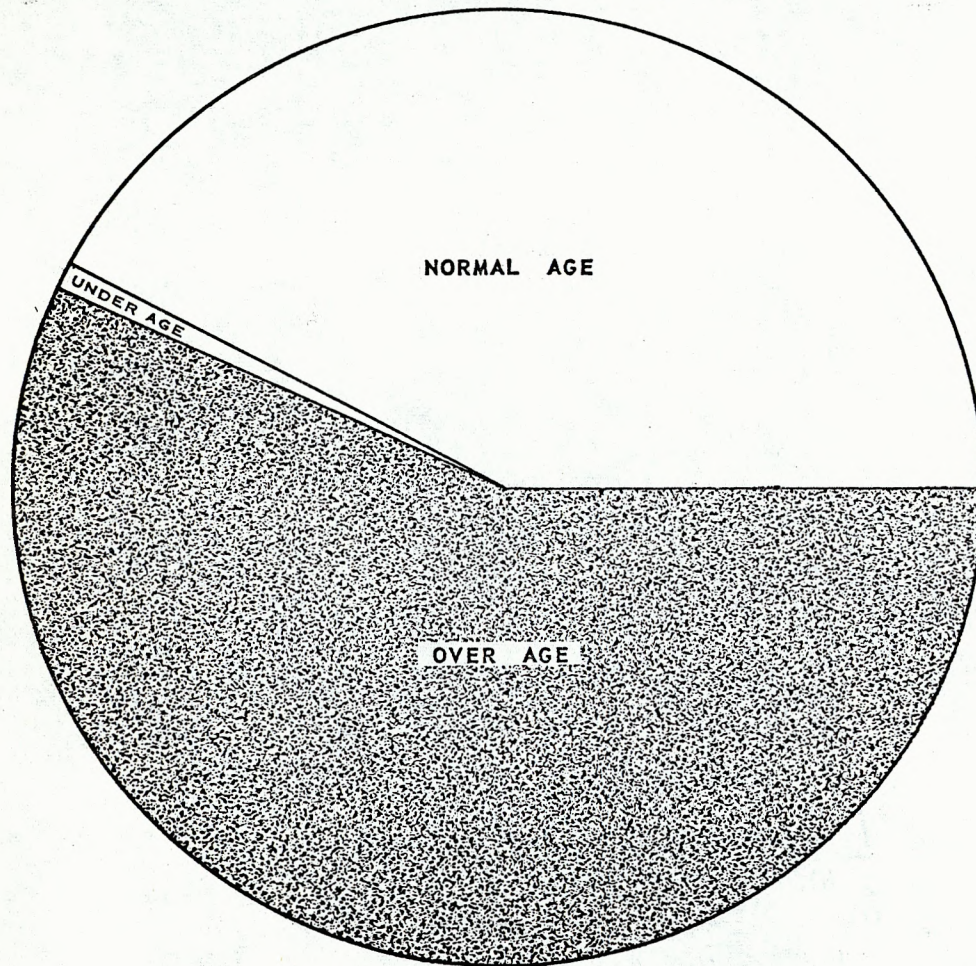

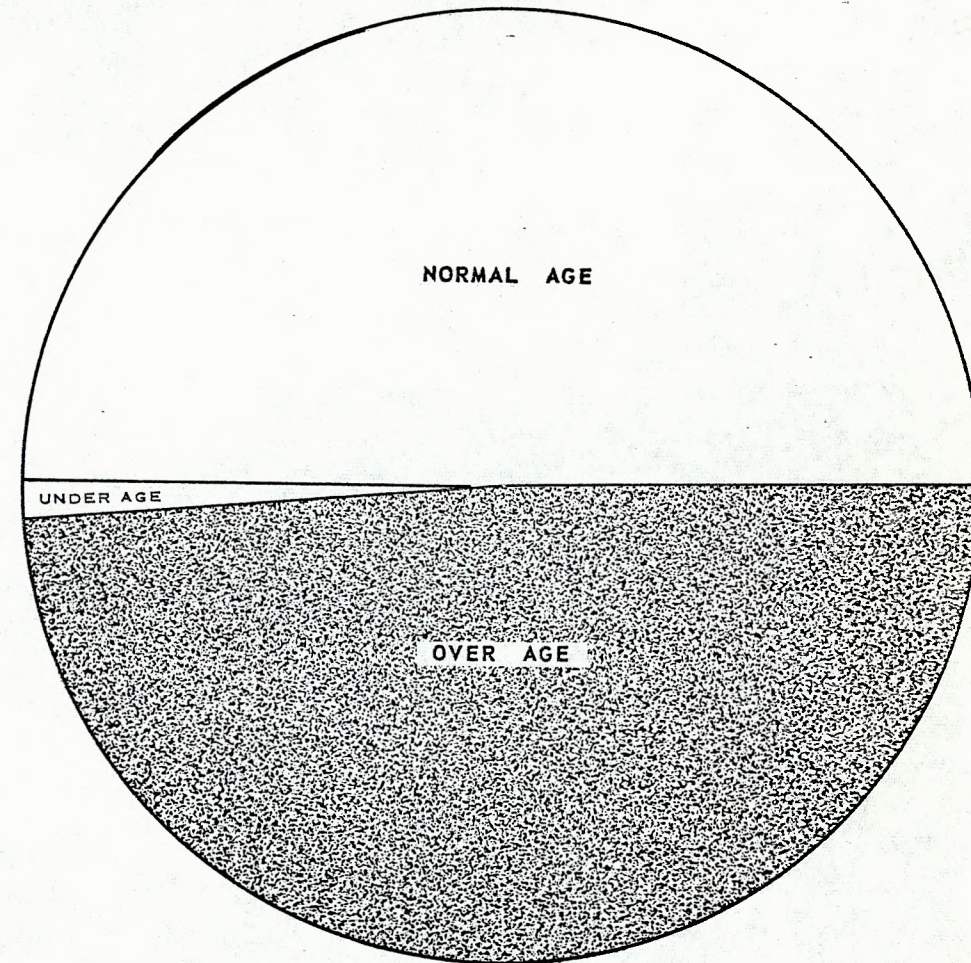
AGE CHARTS OF PUPILS ATTENDING INDIAN SCHOOLS OF CANADA

THE DATA FOR THIS STATISTICAL REPORT ON THE PUPILS LEAVING INDIAN SCHOOLS IN JUNE 1962 WERE GATHERED FROM THE SCHOOLS ON THE FORM PREPARED BY THE DOMINION BUREAU OF STATISTICS ENTITLED, "PRINCIPAL'S REPORT ON DESTINATIONS OF PUPILS WITHDRAWING FROM SCHOOL", AND PROCESSED BY THE BUREAU OF STATISTICS.

THE REPORT IS ARRANGED BY REGIONS WITH A SEPARATION OF DAY AND RESIDENTIAL SCHOOLS.

THIS SECTION OF THE REPORT DEALS ONLY WITH PUPILS ATTENDING INDIAN SCHOOLS AND, THEREFORE, EXCLUDES 30 PER CENT OF THE INDIAN SCHOOL POPULATION ATTENDING PROVINCIAL SCHOOLS.

IN THIS REPORT THE WITHDRAWING PUPILS ARE DIVIDED INTO THREE CATEGORIES:

1. PUPILS WITHDRAWING FROM THE INDIAN SCHOOL TO CONTINUE THEIR EDUCATION AT ANOTHER SCHOOL.
2. PUPILS LEAVING TO TAKE EMPLOYMENT.
3. PUPILS LEAVING SCHOOL FOR OTHER PURPOSES, SUCH AS, TO HELP IN THE HOME, MARRIAGE, DEATH, ETC.

THE DATA ON THESE THREE CATEGORIES ARE PRESENTED IN TWO SERIES OF TABLES, ONE SHOWING THE GRADE, SEX AND DESTINATIONS OF ALL WITHDRAWING PUPILS AND THE OTHER GIVING THE AGE, GRADE AND SEX OF CATEGORIES 2 AND 3 ONLY.
