I - INTRODUCTION

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Directory is to provide the staff of the Research Branch with useful information on primary sources of demographic/socio-economic data on Registered Indians and Inuits in order to assist them in responding more efficiently and effectively to inquiries from clients and users. It will also assist the Branch staff in their research activities, particularly in the preparation of demographic, social and economic reports on Registered Indians and Inuits.

2. SCOPE

The scope of this Directory is confined to two populations: Registered Indians and Inuits. The latter is not as fully covered as the former due to the limited data on Inuits and the time frame of the project; however, the coverage of this Directory is quite extensive but not comprehensive.

Users are advised that some information has been intentionally omitted from the Directory.

This Directory covers data available from only significant data bases which are primary sources of statistics on Registered Indians and Inuits. Hence, secondary sources reporting on or using primary ones such as analytical reports, papers or articles for special "Ad Hoc" purposes are usually excluded. For instance, An Overview of Demographic, Social and Economic Conditions among Canada's Registered Indian Population, prepared by A.J. Siggner, Research Branch, INAC, 1979 and other reports and articles have been omitted.

Data from the 1981 Census are not listed because this information is covered in another Research Branch document on the "Development of a 1981 Census User Summary Tape - Native Peoples". 1981 Census data are expected to be available early in 1984.

A list of selected information omitted from the Directory is provided in Appendix A. This information has not been considered as it does not relate directly to the areas of demographic and socio-economic data of interest to the Research Branch.

No information on the North except that pertaining to the Inuits is included in the Directory.

Provincial governments and private groups were not contacted concerning similar sources of information.

3. METHODOLOGY

Considerable analysis and consultation with INAC and other departmental agencies and libraries was undertaken on demographic and socio-economic data on Registered Indians and Inuits. Within INAC those groups consulted were:

MAJOR INAC DATA BASES

The more significant data bases within the Department are:

- 1) The <u>Indian Membership</u> is the cornerstone data base on Registered Indians, as it provides longitudinal and cross-sectional demographic data. The information comes from Administrative Records and is tabulated annually (December 31) but maintained monthly.
- 2) The Nominal Roll System is the cornerstone data base on Registered Indians as it relates to Education. It provides an in-depth portrait of the elementary and secondary Indian Education System. This information comes from Administrative Records and is tabulated annually (October 15).
- 3) The Continuing Education Information System is also a major source of education data and gathers information on post-secondary Indian students similar to data found in the Nominal Roll.

II - HOW TO USE THE DIRECTORY

The format of the Directory has been designed to allow a quick and effective search for information. It is divided into two section, referring to the Registered Indian and Inuit populations; corresponding indexes can be found at the end of the Directory. These indexes refer to the subject matters, topics and sub-topics located in both sections.

The following is a brief explanation of each column heading found in the Registered Indian and Inuit sections.

- Subject Matter: refers to the substance of the sub-section. The user will find these subject matters in each section: Education, Employment, Health, Housing, Indian or Inuit Events, Justice, Population and Social Services.
- Topic: refers to the different fields of each subject matter.
- Sub-topic: refers to additional breakdown of "Topic".
- Cross-tabulations: refers to the title of the table available from source.
- Geographic Breakdown: Note: the term "region" refers to the nine administrative regions of Indian and Northern Affairs Canada which contains Districts, Bands and Reserves.
- Years Available: refers only to the information available in the specified cross-tabulations. In many instances, additional related information is available from the identical source on the same variables but in a different format.
- Source: refers to: 1. data base providing the information and 2. Regional Offices or other Governmental Agencies. This is usually a primary source of data.
- Update Frequency: refers to the time frame between updates.
- Reference Period: refers to the reference date on which the information is updated.
- Location: refers to the place from where information is disseminated or available.
- Expert Contact: provides the name, position and telephone number of an expert(s) who can be consulted for more in-depth information on the data referred to in the cross-tabulations.
