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#### 4. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Management Improvement Project Task 6.2 is a survey of 592 Indian bands and Inuit communities which identifies the management of each discrete service provided by the Department, the Departmental accountability for each service, and sources of technical and advisory support. The Task also examines the relationship of bands to the Department at different levels, and the roles of tribal and district councils, provinces and other agencies such as schoolboards. In so doing, it addresses planning and control problems identified by the Auditor General relating to transfers of programs to Indian bands by documenting in a comprehensive manner the degree to which services of the Indian and Inuit Program have already been transferred to Indian Administration.

A total of 155 services of a total possible 177 services to bands in the current Chart of Accounts were included in the questionnaire. Questionnaires were completed in the regions, at both regional and district offices. The survey was undertaken during the last two weeks of July 1981 and presents the situation as of July 1, 1981.

IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT THIS REPORT CONSIDERS ONLY THE NUMBER OF SERVICES DELIVERED AND RECEIVED AT THE SUB-ACTIVITY LEVEL. IT DOES NOT GIVE WEIGHT TO ANY GIVEN SERVICE RELATIVE TO ANOTHER. NOR DOES IT CONSIDER FINANCIAL AND BUDGETARY IMPLEMENTATIONS OF ANY INDIVIDUAL SERVICE OR GROUPS OF SERVICES.

#### STATISTICAL SUMMARY

#### MANAGEMENT

The "snapshot" or balance sheet presentation of MIP Task 6.2 is composed of 592 band and community questionnaires which identify the organizations and agencies which deliver each of the 155 services to the 592 bands and communities. A total of 31,005 discrete units of service were identified. Of these services:

45% are delivered by the Department

51% are delivered by Indian Administration

44% by bands

4% by Tribal/District Councils

3% by Other Indian Administration (Association)

4% are delivered by Other Non-Indian Administration (pratricelar territorial governments)

For comparative purposes, it is interesting to note that, as a percentage of total Indian and Inuit Program <u>BUDGET</u> (i.e. dollars), MIP Task 6.1 identified the following shared responsibility:

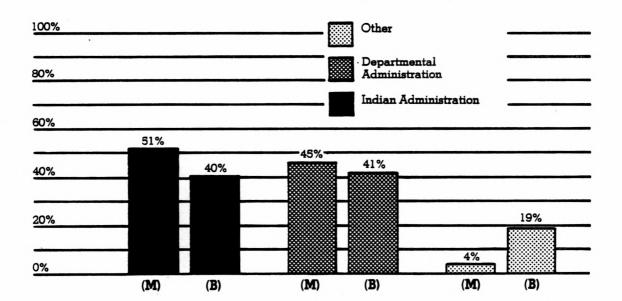

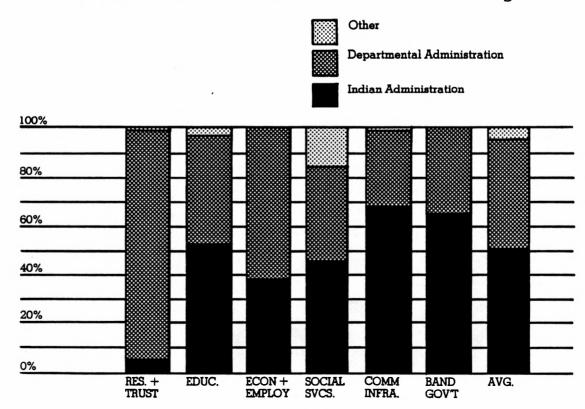
#### Management by Activity

The Department's role as a deliverer of services varied considerably from Activity to Activity. For example, the Department managed the delivery of 94% of all "services" in Reserves and Trusts, but only 31% in Community Infrastructure. Most services delivered are managed either by the Department or by Indian Administration. The only significant contribution from other organizations is in the area of Social Services, where 16% of the services are provided by provincial agencies. Other variations can be noted in the following chart and in Figure 2.

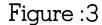


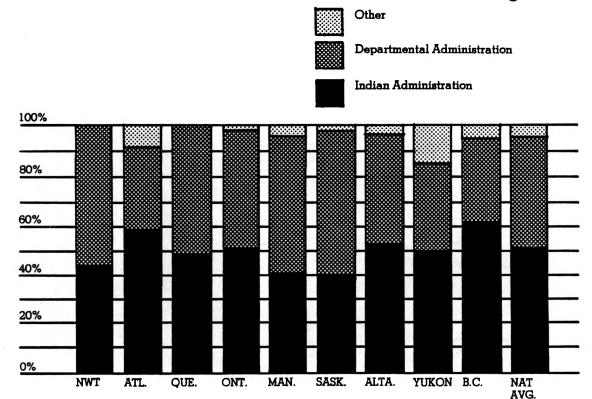
#### Management by Region

The ratio of Department/Indian management varied considerably from region to region. Indian management ranged from a high of 62% in British Columbia to a low of 40% in Saskatchewan. The role of other agencies (usually provincial social service agencies and school boards) as deliverers of services also varied markedly among regions. This information is displayed in the following chart and graphically in Figure 3.

#### ACCOUNTABILITY

For each of the 31,005 discrete units of service delivered, a departmental Responsibility Centre Manager is accountable. Accountability lies:

- at the District level in 66%, of the cases; at the Regional level in 34% of the cases, and at Headquarters level in \* of the cases.
- \* less than 1%.

#### TECHNICAL/ADVISORY SUPPORT

Technical Advisory Support was supplied in 30,362 of the 31,005 cases. The Department furnished the majority of the support at the District and Regional levels. Figure 4 shows the sources of technical support.

#### REPORT UTILIZATION

It is hoped that officers throughout the Indian and Inuit Program at headquarters and in regional and district offices will find this Report a useful management tool. It may be regarded as a management information system to assist in planning future transfers. It will also be useful in preparation of the Operational Plan, as a basis for comparison among districts and regions, and in support of the Band Profile Systems currently being developed.

In addition to the Report's immediate short-term benefit, it will assist in identifying managerial accountability and responsibility networks.

#### UPDATE

MIP Task 6.2 is complete in its present form and can be updated via a computer turnaround document. The revised Chart of Accounts, reflecting new service definitions developed in MIP Task 1.1 will be in place April 1, 1982. As a continuing source of information, therefore, this Report will require considerable amendment. Amendments will also permit the inclusion of services omitted in the initial survey.

The design of a system to provide a timely update of the information gathered will be undertaken in co-operation with the Management Systems Directorate. This will ensure that the goals of the Task are achieved while the Department's standards are maintained.

Since a number of activity codes will be affected by integration of this Report with the MIP Task 1.1 Directory of Services, a new questionnaire will be transmitted to the field in Fiscal Year 1982/83. Completion of the questionnaire during the months of July and August will allow managers to use the information in Operational Planning, and in planning future transfers to Indian Administration. It is recommended that the maintenance of the information contained in this Report be the ongoing responsibility of the Program Planning and Policy Co-ordination Directorate of the Indian and Inuit Program.

The budget of MIP Task 6.2 was \$341,000. The exact costs of developing an ongoing system will be determined in consultation with Management Systems and will be a function, in part, of the demands imposed by the systems development process. Maintenance costs of annual updates should be minimal.

#### 5. INTRODUCTION

#### BACKGROUND

Management Improvement Project Task 6.2 reflects the Department's concern with the issue of the transfer to Indian administration of responsibility for the delivery of its programs. The Department has long recognized that self-delivery of services assists in the attainment of self-determination among Indian people. Other studies, such as MIP Task 6.1, suggest a greater utilization of services as local residents acquire a sense of proprietorship.

Transfer policy then, may be regarded as a strategy to assist in the development of self-reliance among Indian people in general. It is also a means to encourage the development of a cadre of professionals as greater numbers of Indians acquire skills as administrators.

The transfer of program delivery responsibility has been practised since 1965 and became national policy in 1974. However, the lack of an explicit policy framework and guidelines at the national and regional levels has led to confusion in implementing transfers as well as a perception of loss of financial accountability.

In the absence of explicit guidelines, policy implementation has, to a large extent, been at the discretion of individual managers. The ensuing problems have been documented in the Auditor General's most recent report to the House of Commons. The Auditor General made specific reference to the following:

"In our opinion, the Department had not adequately planned the implementation of this (transfer) policy. Without an implementation plan, no clear objectives or schedules can be set out against which managers can judge progress. We also concluded that the Department was not adequately managing the implementation of the policy."

Concern was also expressed by the Auditor General and officials of central agencies regarding accountability for Departmental contributions to bands.

In putting together an operational profile of the Department at the band level, MIP Task 6.2 addresses these concerns by identifying which transfers of services have taken place, and the inter-relationship between the bands and departmental responsibility centres. Other aspects of the transfer policy will be dealt with by other MIP projects, as well as those to be carried out during subsequent phases of the Management Improvement Project.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

The objectives of this project as assigned by the MIP Steering Committee are as follows:

- 1. To identify and document the organizational profile of districts to regions and bands to districts,
- 2. To identify any cases (e.g., B.C. Manitoba) where the organizational relationship is direct between the regional office and bands.
- 3. To identify and document those bands that:
  - a) manage a complete range of services
  - b) manage a partial range
  - c) have services wholly delivered by the Department.
- 4. To identify and document bands to whom services are delivered by tribal councils, and whether wholly or partially.
- 5. To develop and implement procedures to keep the above data updated as changes occur.

#### 6. METHODOLOGY

Management Improvement Project Task 6.2 is a survey of 592 Indian bands and Inuit communities across the country which identifies the management of each discrete service provided by the Department, the Departmental accountability for each service, and sources of technical and advisory support. The Task also examines the relationship of bands to the Department at different levels, and the roles of tribal and district councils, provinces and other agencies such as schoolboards.

The information presented in this Report was obtained through a direct survey of Departmental Responsibility Centre Managers at National Headquarters and in all regions. The survey was conducted during the month of July 1981 and records the situation as of July 1.

The Work Plan for MIP Task 6.2 was approved by the MIP Steering Committee on April 7, 1981. It is attached to this Report as Appendix "A".

The approach taken was to construct a network profile of the linkages among "organizational cells", (i.e., all relevant deliverers and recipients of services), mapping patterns on selected dimensions. Senior Management agreed that the most appropriate functions to be examined are:

- 1. Management of Service Delivery, i.e.; who delivers the service to the band,
- 2. Accountability; i.e., where in the Department does accountability lie, when the service is delivered by the band or other Indian administration. For the purposes of this Report, accountability is defined as Section 27 of the Financial Administration Act, and
- 3. Technical/Advisory Support; i.e., to whom does the band turn for advice of a technical nature when it delivers the service itself.

Having determined the functions to be addressed, a conceptual model matrix was constructed as follows:

Discrete Units of Service

All organizational cells (Bands, Tribal Councils, District offices, etc.)

It was then necessary to select the appropriate organizational cells on one hand, and the discrete units of service on the other.

#### ORGANIZATIONAL CELLS

It was decided that, as recipients of services, bands would be the primary focus of the survey. All other organizational cells, (e.g., Departmental Responsibility Centres, Tribal Councils), were considered only as deliverers of service to the bands.

A total of 592 bands and communities were identified. As of July 1, 1981, 575 Indian bands and 17 Inuit communities in northern Quebec were listed. For the purposes of this report, these Inuit communities are treated as if they are bands. Throughout this Report the term "band" is used to mean band and/or community.

The survey population was identified as Departmental Responsibility Centre Managers (RCM's). The maximum RCM population at Headquarters, and in regional and district offices was determined to be 576.

#### DISCRETE UNITS OF SERVICE

The definition of what would constitute "services" necessitated prolonged discussion with activity managers and members of other MIP project teams.

Service 20 Res

Initially, the Activity Structure was examined to choose the most appropriate services. All seven Main Activities were considered but the Administration Activity was rejected as a possible "service" to bands. In consultation with headquarters activity managers, as well as selected field managers, 146 discrete units of service of a total maximum of 177 were selected as follows:

The survey, therefore was conducted using 155 services at the levels of sub-activities 1, 2, and 3. (see Appendix 'B').

#### CONSIDERATION OF MIP TASK 1.1

Concern was expressed by some MIP Project Team members that Task 6.2 should not proceed until the completion of Task 1.1. It was suggested that following the completion of Task 1.1, the Activity Structure and the Chart of Accounts would be considerably altered and expanded. It was argued, therefore, that a survey conducted with existing service codes would not lend itself to comparisons with future surveys using new codes.

A delay of approximately five weeks ensued and the survey was postponed accordingly. However, Senior Management decided that Task 6.2 would be of sufficient immediate and medium-term benefit to proceed without further delay, and the project team was instructed to continue.

#### CONSULTATION AND FIELD SURVEY

The information contained in this Report was obtained on the basis of survey questionnaires administered by project team members within each region to the level of RCM, usually district manager or designate.

Regional officials were contacted and briefed on several occasions including meetings of the Executive Planning Committee.

A questionnaire and instructions were produced. Questionnaire forms were printed with the name and code number of each band or community and batched by region and district.

MIP Task 6.2 project members visited each region to administer the survey which was undertaken during the last two weeks of July, 1981.

The manner in which the questionnaire was completed was determined in consultation with Regional Directors of Operations. While each Region handled survey completion to suit particular circumstances, the general practice was to have district officials complete the questionnaires after a workshop had been conducted by a Project Team Coordinator. Without exception, all regions were very cooperative and greeted the project team members enthusiastically. Questionnaires from all regions were completed, reviewed at regional headquarters and transmitted to national headquarters by the first week of August.

#### PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT AND DATA ANALYSIS

In excess of 40 possible tables were devised to display the project data. These tables were presented for management review and the set of seven shown in the enclosed <u>List of Tables</u> was selected. A computerized process was developed to compile statistics for the task data according to the work plan objectives.

When the questionnaires were returned to Headquarters, they were subjected to a rigorous quality review after which the data were entered on computer files by key entry. Qualifications or anomalies pertaining to the data were considered in an attempt to balance any conclusions drawn. The resulting observations are recorded in the Analysis Section of the report.

#### INFORMATION DISPLAY

Three basic groupings of raw data were developed. "Group A" lists each discrete unit of service that cleared editing. This information is sequenced organizationally, i.e. region/district/band.

"Group B" displays the same information but it is sequenced by activity, i.e., Main Activity/Sub-Activity.

"Group C" is a statistical account of the frequency of service within each region.

These three groupings of data, not included in this Report, form the foundation upon which the seven tables presented herein have been constructed.

#### 7. ANALYSIS

This section provides an analysis of data nationally and by region. Analysis, for the most part, was prepared by the Project Team Co-ordinator who conducted the survey in each region.

General qualifications and report findings pertaining to regional analysis are presented in this section, 5(a). Detailed Region analyses including specific qualifications and findings are in the regional analyses sections which follow.

#### (a) NATIONAL

The main qualification to the MIP Task 6.2 report is field interpretation of the questionnaire and instructions. Most frequently, Reserves and Trusts activity managers found that the number of services listed under this activity was insufficient to properly set out their provision to bands. Additionally, these managers felt that the trust nature of their services was such that they provided a service to all bands regardless of whether they were utilized.

Many regions had more than one manager of a given discrete service. A combination of a band, a tribal council, the Department or another entity could be involved in providing a portion of a service to a band. Since only one service manager could be entered on the questionnaire, the actual management could not be shown with precision.

Most regions indicated a preference for the inclusion of all services on the questionnaire. Alberta, for example, added nine services to Reserves and Trusts. Quebec was concerned with accurately displaying its range of fire protection services.

Differences of interpretation by some regions have resulted in distortion of data within certain activities. More detailed qualifications are appended to this section.

Notable variations were observed among regional approaches to service management and accountability. Among the factors contributing to this are differences in organizational structure and differences in the application of financial control systems.

In Alberta, for example, accountability for services is relatively high at the Regional level (65.7%), compared to Ontario (9.7%). This may be a function of the BCS structure where financial accountability in Alberta flows from Regional Program Directors (RCM's) to District Program Superintendents (CCM's), whereas in Ontario funds flow from the Regional Director General (RCM) to District Managers (RCM's), to Program Superintendents (CCM's or RCM's). It may also be a function of the relative importance placed on line and functional management at the Activity level between Regions and Districts. In Alberta functional accountability is very clear, whereas in Ontario line accountability is clear.

#### MANAGEMENT OF SERVICES

The chart on the following page and Figure 5 show management of services by the three main management groupings (Department, Indian, Other), and the nine sub-groups. Regional and national percentages are shown.

This information shows that, excepting NWT and Yukon Regions, Departmental Management of services is greatest in Saskatchewan at 58% and lowest in B.C. and the Atlantic at 33%. Nationally, the average of Departmental Service Management is 45%. Indian management of service is greatest in B.C. at 62% and lowest in Saskatchewan at 40%. Nationally the average is 51%.

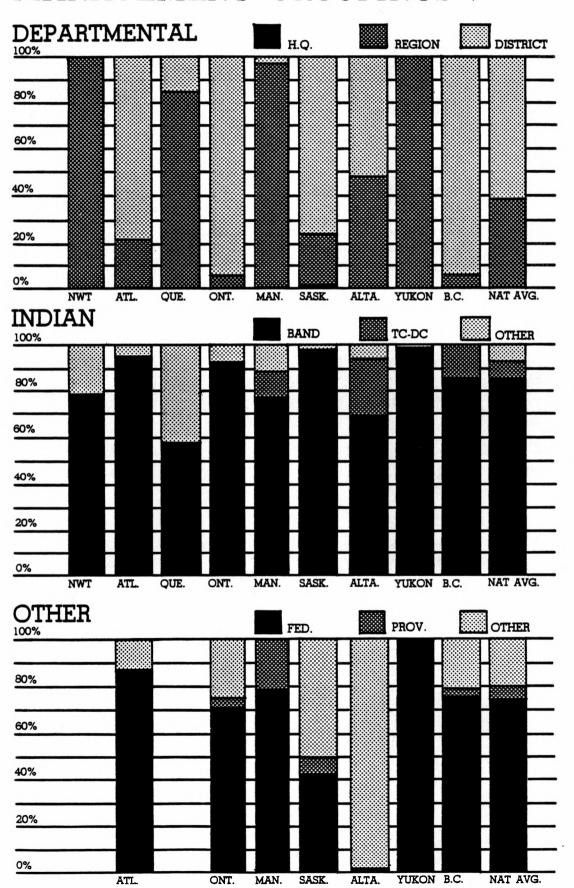
Within the Indian Administration, Tribal and District Councils are prominent in Manitoba, Alberta and B.C. where they manage 12%, 25% and 14% respectively of all Indian administered services.

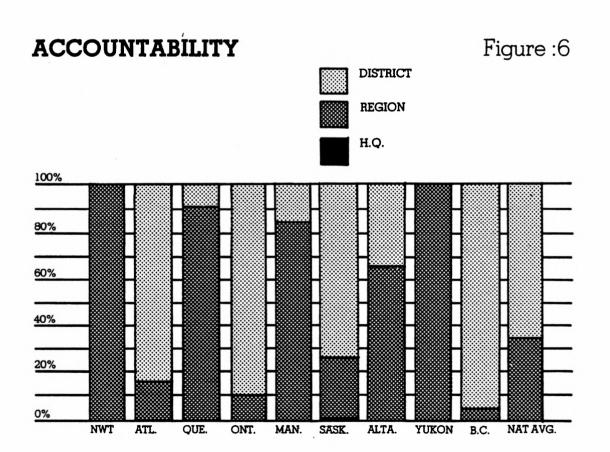

It is interesting to note that Headquarters accountability of services is relatively insignificant with only one Region, Saskatchewan, reporting 1% of its services accounted for at that level.

Regional organization, in great part, dictates where accountability lies. Manitoba, Quebec and Alberta have a high level of service accountability at the regional level with 84%, 91% and 66% respectively. The reverse is the case in Ontario and B.C. where 90% and 96% respectively of the services are accounted for at the District level.

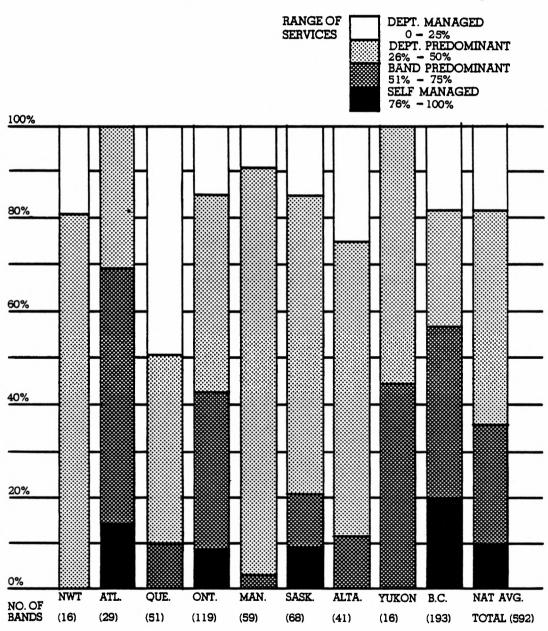
On the basis of this Report there is not a clear correlation between regional centralization and Indian administration of services. For example, Ontario and B.C. are highly decentralized and have respectively 51% and 62% Indian administration of services. Manitoba and Quebec on the other hand are highly centralized yet Indian administration of services is 49% and 41% respectively.

#### BAND MANAGED SERVICES

The following chart and Figure 7 compare by region the range of services received by Bands and managed by Indian Administration. For example, in Quebec, 25 Bands representing 49% of the region's 51 bands manage less than 25% of services received.

#### REGIONAL COMMENTS

In addition to general concerns regarding time constraints, delays and difficulties of an organizational nature, regional officials expressed the following observations:

- The questionnaire format on pages 1 and 2, (i.e. Name, Title, Ident. Code) should have been included on all pages. The format precluded the identification of program managers who, in most cases, completed the questionnaires.
- Reserves and Trusts had too few sub-activities. Additions varied by District and Region.
- Education was inconsistent since it is sometimes at level 2 and sometimes at level 3. Variation in rollup or breakout resulted in interpretation difficulties. Saskatchewan had difficulties in separating schools and residences, i.e. Code 6050 - Maintenance.
- Economic Development tended to include programs funded by other departments.
- Social Services was broken out as a data base. Funding had to be grouped, e.g. Adult Care 5006 included 5019, 5020, 5008; Child Care 5009 included 5010, 5011, 5021. Rehabilitation and Alcohol and Drug Abuse were often confused. The latter is funded on a national basis.
- Where many departmental units were involved in the same service delivery (quite common) it was often necessary to record at a higher RCM or arbitrarily select a RCM.
- Variation in activity definitions due to individual interpretations occurred.
- The delegation of BCS/EAS authority varies among activities and from region to region.

Services that are available on request but that had not been utilized were often recorded as delivered. Most noticeable was Reserves and Trusts.

#### **INTERPRETATION**

By Main Activity, the following qualifications to the interpretation of the questionnaire should be noted.

#### Reserves and Trusts:

There was some variation in the interpretation of who manages and the source of technical/advisory support. Part of the problem stems from the lack of an RCM in the field. Since the instructions required the use of RCM or CCM number some distortion in profile resulted.

#### Education:

There is considerable variation among districts of services rendered. This results, in part, from variations in interpretations of instructions. As pointed out previously, there was also concern expressed regarding duplication caused by level 2 and level 3 breakouts.

#### Economic and Employment:

Perception had a major influence. Some districts were extremely generous in their interpretation of services delivered even though no funds existed. There is some question as to the ability of RCM's to substantiate some delivery claims.

#### Social Services:

There was considerable variation in the detail of completion. Concern was expressed about level 2 and level 3 duplication. Data tended to be available in a Data Base format which did not duplicate the questionnaire layout.

#### Community Infrastructure:

One of the major problems was to determine if the service was in fact provided. Some districts rationalized inclusion on the basis that the service was available (See Reserves and Trusts) and had been provided in the past: some on the basis that it would be provided in the future. Multiple management of services were very common in this area with several major inputs being common but not recorded because of format.

#### Band Government:

Few comments were received in this area.

#### 7. ANALYSIS

#### (b) NORTHWEST TERRITORIES

In the Northwest Territories, Cecil Thompson acted as Project Team Coordinator. He worked with Larry Hagan, A/Regional Director and the Directors of Economic Development and Finance. Since NWT is a relatively small Region, the questionnaires were completed, in the main, by the aforementioned individuals.

Management Control, in a financial sense, is vested in the management positions listed in the previous paragraph and the Director of Community Affairs. A relatively limited service range reduces the requirement for several RCM's or CCM's.

Northwest Territories Region is unique in its operations compared to other regions as the Territorial government provides most of the non-discretionary services to bands through a comprehensive agreement with the Government of Canada. Because only a total of 73 services are recorded as being delivered in the NWT, the percentage breakouts of 56% Departmentally administered services and 44% Indian administered services are distorted. The total services refer primarily to basic programs such as Core Funding, Committees and Recreation Grants.

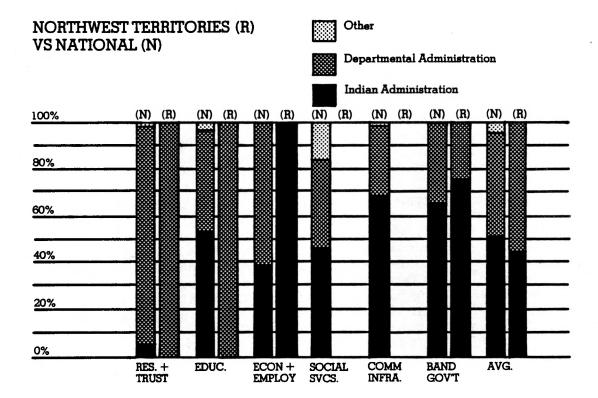
As these are no districts in the NWT, all programs are handled through the regional offices in Yellowknife. This is illustrated in the following chart and in Figure 8.

Only the Economic Development and Band Government programs are handled directly by the Department through the Regional office. Within these two Activities, 44% of the services delivered are managed by Indians.

In spite of the fact that only a small proportion of services delivered to Indian people in the Northwest Territories are managed by the department, the following chart shows that the regional office is involved in providing technical and advisory support in the majority of cases. The major exception is Social Services where the Territorial Government is the major delivering agent.

#### (c) ATLANTIC

In the Atlantic Region, Rod Brown acted as Project Team Coordinator and Dolores Gottenburg as Regional coordinator. They organized Regional workshops for the package which was distributed to District and Activity Managers for completion.

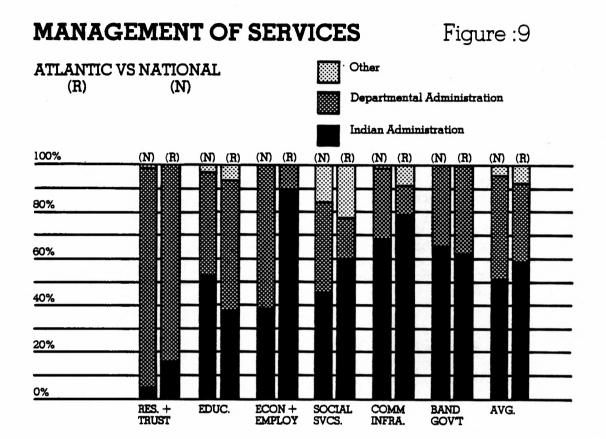
Management Control in Atlantic Region, as evidenced by the Budgetary Control System, is geared towards service both at the District level and by the Regional Office. All Program Directors and the Director of Operations are RCM's. The same holds true for the two District Managers (Nova Scotia and New Brunswick) and the Director of Operations. Program Superintendents also are RCM's. As in Ontario, the District Managers effectively have control over their program budgets. This has implications for Regional Program Directors and the District Program Superintendents who functionally report to them.

While overall figures confirm the degree of band administration, analysis by program shows that Economic Development with 90% management by bands is well above the national average. A trend toward band management of Reserves and Trusts is also evident. Management of Social Services indicates a significant provincial involvement.



#### ACCOUNTABILITY

With the exception of Reserves and Trusts where accountability is almost equally divided between district and region, the majority of the programs are accounted for at district level as shown in this chart.

While Indians provide considerable technical advisory support only in Band Government, other agencies are prominent in several activities including Economic Development, Social Services and Community Infrastructure.

#### 7. ANALYSIS

#### (d) QUEBEC REGION

Quebec Region has undergone a process of centralization over the past few years. This development is reflected in the Budgetary Control System where financial control is within the Regional Office, exclusive of Pointe-Bleue and Sept-Isles Districts. Like Manitoba Region, Quebec Region has designated Program Directors as RCM's and, under these positions, various program manager specialists provide services to bands across the Region as Cost Centre Managers.

The Quebec survey was co-ordinated by Rosemary Kralik of the Project Team and J.F. Nault from Regional office. Antonio Blouin completed the forms in the Regional office and coordinated the review. Activity managers reviewed the forms for any errors or omissions. Final review was made by Regional Director General, R.M. Connelly and Director of Operations, V. Caissie.

The approach was parallel to that of Task 1.1 in acknowledging that although all the services were offered, only those that had been delivered in the 1980-81 fiscal year were noted.

At the end of the exercise it was agreed that a representative profile had been given. The system however neglected areas in which more than one activity manager might be involved in a project. This occurred in Economic Development, and Community Infrastructure.

Social Services in Quebec region are delivered by the provincial government and the funds are identified by code 5016. However this could not be adequately reflected in the computer printout. Code 6058 designates local contracts for forest fire protection services for 24 bands. There are two instances of funding for off reserve housing. For 12 Inuit communities, Reserves and Trusts, Social Services, Community Infrastructure, Band Government and Education all fall under provincial jurisdiction. Education is administered under the conditions of the James Bay Agreement for 20 Bands, and Placement and Relocation (3030) is the concern of Employment and Immigration Canada.

The area that was the most difficult to complete was Band Government because the system did not provide for involvement of more than one responsibility manager. In reality, as many as three different agencies can be involved in planning and managing activities. This also applies to (4019) Economic Development Projects.

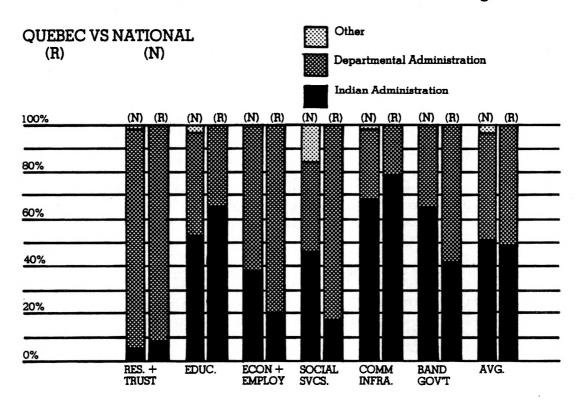

Quebec employs a higher percentage of outside expertise than the national average. The particularly high count in Education is caused by involvement with various local school boards as a result of the James Bay Agreement.

No bands manage a full range of services; only 5 bands manage a majority of the services; 21 manage up to half the services and 25 bands manage the delivery of 1/4 of the services or fewer.

## 7. ANALYSIS

#### (e) ONTARIO REGION

In Ontario Region, Rod Brown acted as Project Team Coordinator. He conducted a Regional workshop for the task which was attended by District representatives. MIP questionnaires and instructions were taken back to Districts for completion. When questionnaires were returned to Region by Districts, Mr. Brown and Dan Patterson, Regional MIP coordinator, reviewed them for accuracy and uniformity of completion.

Generally, there are few qualifications to the data presented in Ontario Region questionnaires. It should be noted, however, that under the Federal-Provincial Agreement (1965) the Province delivers Social Services to most bands. In these cases Departmental accountability lies in the Regional office with the Director of Economic Development. Districts provide 20% of the bands' Social Services budget and the balance (80%) is provided by the Province. Technical advice to bands comes from the Province.

In instances where a band is in a state of co-management with the Department or the Department delivers all Social Services, accountability and technical advisory support lie with the district office, most often in the position of the Superintendent of Local Government. Another anomaly in Ontario is the policing program whereby funds are provided to the Province to hire band constables under the auspices of the Ontario Provincial Police. Departmental accountability for funds transferred is in the Regional Office.

The organizational and financial structure of Ontario Region is geared towards decentralization to the district level. This fact is borne out by Departmental accountability for services which indicates that districts are accountable for 89% of services provided in the Region. The Budgetary Control System further supports the concept of decentralization to districts. Funds flow from the Regional Director General to the District Manager then, through the District Manager, to Program Superintendents. Regional Program Directors do not exert direct control over the budgets of District Superintendents.

In Ontario Region, 119 bands were surveyed. Generally, the Ontario Region's profile is very close to National averages. Compared to the National Services Summary (Table 2.4) the following comparisons are of value.

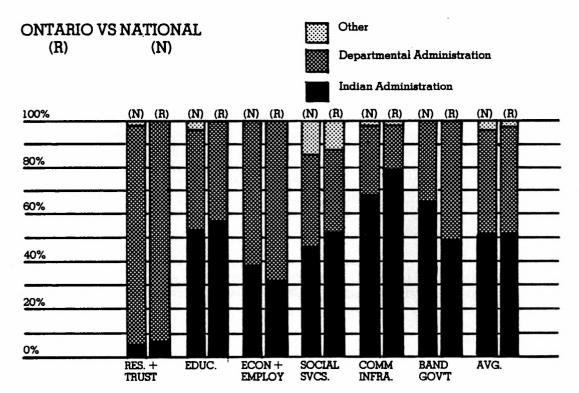

In terms of transfer of services to Indian Administration, Ontario equals the national average with 51% of the services delivered to bands managed by Indian Administration. The following chart and Figure 11 provide a breakdown of service management by activity both nationally and in Ontario:

Tribal Councils and District Councils represent .3% of service management in Ontario whereas the national average is 3.7%. In part this variation may be a function of the fact that average band population in Ontario is higher than other regions such as B.C. The role of the province in delivering certain Social Services in Ontario (Federal-Provincial Agreement 1965) is reflected in the fact that technical advisory support is provided in 61% of the cases by the Province compared to the National average of 25%.

#### ACCOUNTABILITY

In Ontario, Departmental accountability for services lies, for the most part at the district level (85%). Exceptions include Social Services because there is a province-wide agreement which places 49.1% of the Activity accountability at the Regional level. The reverse is Education where the absence of a master tuition agreement has 100% accountability at the district level. This decentralization permits Ontario, unlike other regions, to have greater district and band flexibility in negotiating tuition agreements.

Other information concerning accountability within Ontario Region is shown in the following chart:

It should be noted, too, that Ontario Region's Budgetary Control System structure permits much greater control at the district level and, in particular, district manager control over services.

Geographical location is not a prime determining factor for band and other Indian management of service if Sudbury and James Bay are compared.

From this chart it can be determined that 9 bands in Ontario manage a complete range of services, 42 bands manage the majority of services offered while 50 manage a partial range and 18 relatively few.

#### 7. ANALYSIS

#### (f) MANITOBA

As Manitoba Region is a highly centralized organization, the MIP Task 6.2 survey was completed entirely in the Regional office in Winnipeg. Dennis Wallace acted as Project Team Co-ordinator for the survey and Russ Tawes as Regional MIP Coordinator. Regional activity managers completed the survey questionnaires.

Qualifications to the Manitoba survey are relatively few but they do have some impact. Reserves and Trusts managers, for example, felt that, since their activity is of a trust nature and can only be a Departmental responsibility, the Department is the service manager in all cases. They also felt that Reserves and Trusts was an activity available to all bands, regardless of usage, therefore all bands are shown as receiving Reserves and Trusts services.

In the area of Economic and Employment Development, Manitoba Region has negotiated an arrangement with Employment and Immigration Canada which provides Placement and Relocation services (3030) to bands. Environment Canada provides bands with necessary environmental studies (7016). In several instances (4014 for example), it was noted that a given service might be delivered to a band by the Department, a tribal council and the band itself. The main reason for this was the uneven skill level of managers in different organizations while it was acknowledged that the Department had particular skills (forestry, fisheries, tourism) not available elsewhere.

The Budgetary Control System in Manitoba reflects centralization of the Region. Only the Island Lake Service Centre and Thompson District are shown as RCM's outside of the Regional Office. Regional Program Directors are RCM,s and have delegated subordinate RCM authority to particular program specialities (education support, elementary and secondary education, for example) to carry out program sub-activities.

Manitoba has 59 bands ranging from developed areas of Southwestern Manitoba to isolated sections of the province near Hudson's Bay. These locational factors have an impact on management of service and sources of technical advisory assistance.

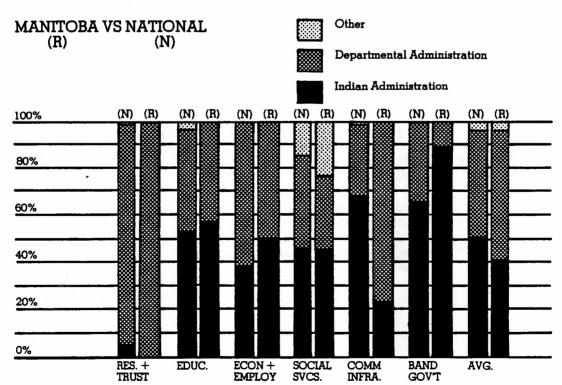
In Manitoba, the Department manages 55% of the services delivered to bands compared with the National average of 45%.

Reserves and Trusts is shown as being managed 100% by the Department. However, this statistic must be put in the perspective of the introductory qualifications. While Education shows Indian administration being equal to the National average at 46%, this figure should move significantly towards greater Indian administration over the next 12 months.

Interestingly, the bands manage a greater proportion of Band Covernment services with 89% compared to the National average of 65%. The role of the provincial government in Manitoba Region is slightly higher in the area of Social Services at 24% than the National average of 16%. Community Infrastructure has a high Departmental management of services at 77% compared to the National average of 23%.

Tribal/District Councils in Manitoba provide 4.5% of total Regional band service management compared to the National average of 3.7%.

Headquarters plays a very limited role in Reserves and Trusts (2%), Education (\*) and Social Services (\*). Overall the Region is accountable, on average, for 97% of services provided to bands. The national average for Regions is 39% with Ontario and B.C. at the opposite extreme with 6%.

It is interesting to note that in Manitoba, Canadian Executive Services Overseas (CESO) provides nearly 23% of technical/advisory support to Bands in the Economic and Employment Development Activity.

According to the statistical summary no bands in the Region manage a full range of services, 2 manage 51-75%, 52 manage 26-50% and 5 manage 25% or less.

#### 7. ANALYSIS

#### (g) SASKATCHEWAN

In Saskatchewan, Alex Jenkins acted as Project Team Co-ordinator and Emile Korchinski, Director of Operations, as Regional MIP Co-ordinator.

Messrs. Jenkins and Korchinski conducted a workshop for MIP field contacts who visited each District Office. Forms were completed at the District level and then vetted in the Region before they were transmitted to Headquarters.

The financial accountability (BCS) system of Saskatchewan is organized so that program directors, District Managers and District Program Superintendents each are RCM's. The only program exception is Economic Development where the Superviser is a CCM under the District Manager. District managers have relative flexibility in the utilization of District budgets when one considers their RCM status. Like Ontario, the BCS structure raises the issue of line management control versus program functional control.

#### MANAGEMENT OF SERVICES

The percentage of band managed services in Saskatchewan Region is similar to that of Manitoba, but lower than the national average. The percentage of programs delivered by other agencies also tends to be lower than the national average as the Province of Saskatchewan delivers very few of these services.

While levels of management within Indian Affairs show considerable variation, Saskatchewan was the only region to show services managed from Headquarters to any extent.

The following chart and Figure 13 indicate that Saskatchewan Region has a lower incidence of Band managed programs than the national average with the central programs, Education, Social Services and Band Management being considerably below the national average.

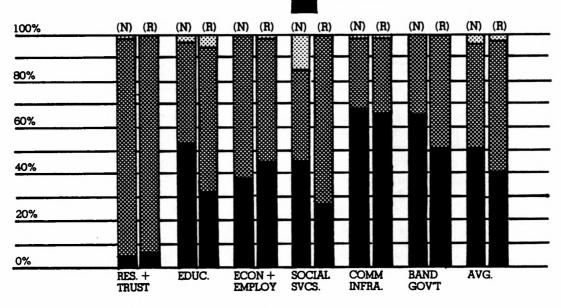

Analysis by program shows that Reserves and Trusts is an almost totally Departmentally managed program, probably because of the statutory responsibilities. Community Infrastructure, on the other hand, is two thirds managed by Bands. It should be noted that the two largest programs, Education and Social Services, are both less than a third managed by Bands.

With 23% of services administered by region as opposed to districts, Saskatchewan differs considerably from Manitoba with 97% regional delivery and British Columbia at the other end of the scale with only 6% delivery. Obviously the degree of decentralization is not standard.

### ACCOUNTABILITY

While the degree of decentralization of accountability from region to districts in Saskatchewan exceeds the national average, it falls far short of some regions. With about three quarters of the programs accounted for at district level, a noticable decentralization is evident as indicated in this chart.

Since Indian leaders refuse to administer any programs in the Shellbrook Indian Agency area, departmental management is 100%. In Saskatoon District, which borders Shellbrook, the Department manages only 22% of the programs — the lowest in the Region. While there is a wide variation in the percentage of programs managed by the Department there is no north-south or rural-urban trend.

#### 7. ANALYSIS

#### (h) ALBERTA REGION

The survey was conducted in Alberta Region by Cecil Thompson of the Project Team, with the assistance and co-operation of MIP Regional Co-ordinators Harvey Allen and Wally Easton.

Financial accountability structures in Alberta are organized differently than in other regions. In this Region, Program Directors are RCM's and under them District Program Superintendents are listed as CCM's. District Managers are not RCM's, thus financial accountability for services is directly between a Regional Program Director and a District Program Superintendent. The number of RCM's and CCM's in Alberta also is limited compared to Saskatchewan where the total number of RCM's and CCM's is 50 and 207 respectively.

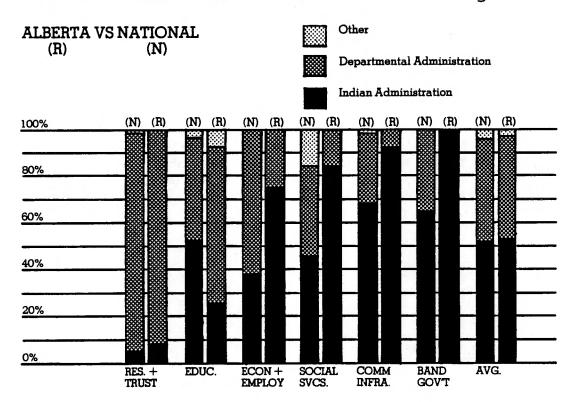
#### MANAGEMENT OF SERVICES

The survey indicates a committment on behalf of the region toward the transfer of program to bands. Of a total of 1412 services delivered, 743 (53%) are managed by Indian administration. The Department administers 628 (44%) and 41 (5%) are managed by other organizations. This information is displayed in the following chart and in Figure 14.

Tribal and District Councils in Alberta play an important role in the delivery of services to the Indian population. There are 1412 services being delivered to Indian Bands in Alberta and Tribal and District Councils manage 183 (12.9%) of them. The major emphasis is on the Education program with Tribal and District Councils managing 50 (9.6%) of the 483 services being delivered. Management by Councils for all activities is as follows:

Technical and Advisory support is provided for 1411 services. The Department is responsible in 1036 (93%) of these cases; Indian Administration, 333 (24%), and 42 (3%) are provided by other non-Indian organizations.

The range of Band and other Indian management of service varies from 40% in Fort McMurray Districts to 80% in Lesser Slave Lake. The role of tribal councils is very apparent for example, in Lesser Slave Lake District where they manage 77% of the services under Indian administration.

This shows that only 5 bands manage a majority of the services, while 26 manage a partial range, and 10 manage very few.

#### 7. ANALYSIS

### (i) YUKON REGION

The MIP Task 6.2 survey was conducted in the Yukon by Project Team Co-ordinator, Dennis Wallace. Vic Carson, A/Director of Operations, acted as Regional MIP coordinator. Since Yukon Region's offices are located in Whitehorse the questionnaires were completed there by respective activity managers.

Qualifications to Yukon's survey are not so much as to the data quality as they are for circumstances unique to the Region. Champagne/Aishihik Bands have amalgamated and use Aishihik's band number 00490. The Yukon Territorial Government provides the majority of Education services to bands via a master tuition agreement with Headquarters. Yukon Hall, a residential school, is charged to (3011), maintenance of students, by the Region. EAS code (3008) is used for In-school programs, (3014), counselling and referral, is used for cross cultural coordinators and (3032), Development, is used to code curriculum development by the Council for Yukon Indians. Social Services Code (5004), Basic Needs, includes Welfare Wood Program.

The Budgetary Control System in Yukon Region reflects the relatively small size of the Regional office. There are 10 RCM's in the Region including the Directors of Economic Development, Finance, Education, Social Development, Local Government, Engineering and Architecture, Planning, and Information services. The structure is not unlike a large District Office in Ontario.

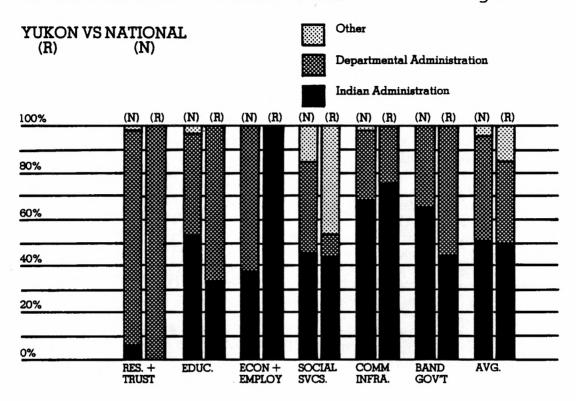

Despite isolated band locations it is of note that bands manage about the same percentage of services (50%) as the national average (57%).

The relatively low level of band management of services in Education is partly attributable the master tuition agreement with the Yukon Territorial Government (YTG) administered from Headquarters. Social Services is primarily managed by the YTG (46%), to a lesser degree by bands (44%) and least by the Department (6%). Bands in the Yukon manage a large proportion (76%) of Community Infrastructure projects.

#### 7. ANALYSIS

#### (i) BRITISH COLUMBIA REGION

Alex Jenkins acted as Project Team Co-ordinator and Gabor Szalay, Director of Finance, as Regional MIP Co-ordinator. Orientation meetings were conducted at Regional headquarters in Vancouver and questionnaires were completed at the District level. Despite the occupation of Regional Offices, completed questionnaires were returned to Headquarters in a timely fashion.

Financial Control in B.C. Region is decentralized to the District level for program services. At the Regional level the Director General, Director of Operations and Program Directors are RCM's. Funds flow from the Region to District Managers, who are RCM's, and then to Program Superintendents who are CCM's. The BCS system structure in B.C. Region is not unlike that used in Ontario Region. At the District level, the District Manager has control over Program funds.

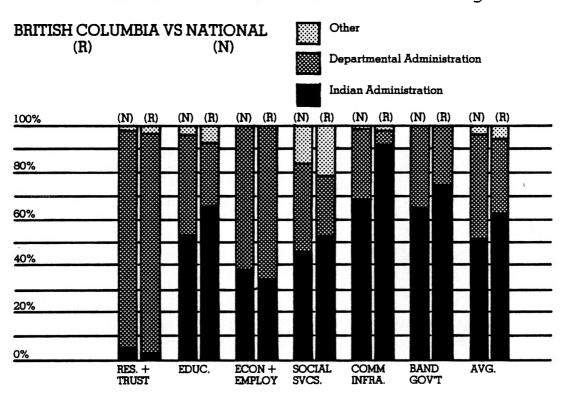
#### MANAGEMENT OF SERVICES

The following chart and Figure 16 indicate that British Columbia Region far exceeds the national average in Indian Administration of programs. Among individual activities, both Education and Community Infrastructure are particularly noteworthy as Indian administered programs well exceeding the national average. As usual, Reserves and Trusts is almost totally managed by the Department. A significant portion of Social Services (21%) is managed by non-Indian agencies, reflecting the provincial involvement in this area.

With only 6% of services managed at the regional level compared to 94% managed at the district level, British Columbia Region approximates Ontario Region in the degree of program decentralization. The Accountability Table further supports the observation that this is a highly decentralized region. This profile contrasts decidedly with Manitoba Region where 97% of departmental programs are administered by regional office.

#### ACCOUNTABILITY

Further supporting the trend to decentralization of authority to districts in British Columbia, the following chart shows that 96% of program services are accountable at the District level. This is considerably higher than the national average of 66%.

In spite of the tendency toward Indian managed programs, the above chart shows a considerable range within the region. Central District, centered in Vancouer, has the highest proportion of programs managed by Indians followed closely by several other districts. The lowest proportion of Indian managed programs is in Prince George District. Nanaimo, on the other hand, has the highest percentage of programs managed by other agencies.

The large number of bands managing a full range of services is noted. Only in British Columbia Region and in Atlantic Region do a majority of bands manage 50% or more of the services received.

#### 8. REPORT UTILIZATION

It is hoped that officers throughout the Indian and Inuit Program at headquarters and in regional and district offices will find the Report of Management Improvement Project Task 6.2 to be a useful management tool.

This Report may be regarded as an information system which will prove to be of assistance to managers. In combination with existing and planned systems it may become an important component of the Departmental planning process.

In addition to enumerating the services provided by the Department and received by each band at a given time (July 1, 1981), the Report identifies the role played by other federal and provincial agencies as well as that of Indian Government. Managers will find this information to be important in planning future transfers to bands and Tribal Councils. It will also be useful in preparation of the nt, Secretary by Operational Plan and as a basis of comparison among districts and regions.

Within the Department, managers will know precisely who is accountable for each service delivered to every band. This knowledge will prove valuable in identifying managerial responsibility and accountability networks within the Department, from Headquarters to Regions to Districts.

MIP Task 6.2 Report lends itself to being integrated with existing and planned information systems to provide managers with a more complete planning tool. Integration of Task 6.2 with Task 1.1 is the first step. Consideration may also be given to integrating the Report with the BCS/EAS system to add the additional dimension of dollars to services delivered to bands.

The Report will be of assistance to other information systems currently being developed within the Department such as the Band Profile Systems. Managers will find this Report to be a useful data base upon which to plan with bands the best use of resources available from the Department. At the same time, bands will have access to a data base regarding their own communities which should be useful for community planning purposes.

#### 9. PROCEDURES FOR UPDATING

Management Improvement Project Task 6.2 was completed according to the work plan objectives approved by the MIP Steering Committee. It presents a "snapshot" or balance sheet presentation of Departmental services received by each band in the country and identifies management of services, Departmental accountability for each service and sources of technical/advisory support. At the same time, relationships between the various levels of the Department and bands as well as relationships with tribal councils and other federal and provincial agencies are traced.

The process of accumulating and analyzing the above data is complete within the MIP Task 6.2 project. Subsequent surveys therefore, have an established base against which changes may be measured.

#### SURVEY FREQUENCY AND TIME

Because of the volume of information and the nature of the data collected, it is recommended that subsequent surveys be conducted once annually. Optimum utility can be obtained from data gathered if the survey is conducted in the period July-October of each year. During this period, proposed transfers to Bands will have taken place.

In addition, if the survey is conducted in July it should not conflict with major events in the planning cycle such as the Operational Plan. Indeed, the results of the survey may be used for planning purposes.

#### SURVEY CONTENT

The current MIP Task 6.2 survey was completed using 155 of a total possible 177 services in six Main Activities of the existing Activity Structure. Field comments indicated that it would be preferable to include all services in future surveys to present a more complete picture of the Indian Program. Given that the current Activity Structure will be revised effective April 1, 1982 to include service definitions developed in the MIP Task 1.1 project, it will be necessary to amend the present MIP Task 6.2 questionnaire.

The number of discrete services on the questionnaire will increase from 155 to as many as 400 services in the next fiscal year. Since preliminary review indicates that only 25% of the current survey can accurately be mapped to the new Activity Structure, it will be necessary to administer a new questionnaire.

Updates in years to follow can be accomplished via a turnaround document, that is, a computer printout of the previous year will be mailed to each region for its amendment by exception. This will significantly reduce field time necessary to maintain the information.

It should be noted that detailed comparison of the current survey to future surveys must be made with caution. Since the Activity Structure will change, close comparison would be akin, using an accounting analogy, to comparing a firm's balance sheets when there has been a change in the accounting methods used.

#### SYSTEMS DEVELOPMENT

The design of a system to provide a timely update of the information contained in this Report will be undertaken in co-operation with the Management Systems Directorate. This will ensure that the goals of the task are achieved while the Department's standards are maintained. It may be necessary to subject the design to the Directorate's systems development process. However, this process should be simpler, and the time required should be reduced as a result of the field tests and analysis methods already developed in carrying out the Task.

#### SYSTEMS RESPONSIBILITY

The responsibility for MIP Task 6.2 should be transferred to an ongoing section of the Department. Survey results will be of value both for the purposes of accountability and responsibility in systems planning and in planning future transfers to Indian administration. It is recommended therefore, that the maintenance of the information contained in this Report be the ongoing responsibility of the Program Planning and Policy Coordination Directorate of the Indian and Inuit Program.

#### SYSTEMS COST

The budget of MIP Task 6.2 was \$341,000. This amount included MIP staff salaries, consultants contract fees, travel and operational expenses. The exact costs of developing an ongoing system will be determined in consultation with Management Systems and will be a function, in part, of the demands imposed by the systems development process. Total costs will consider the determination of user requirements, the development of computer programs and systems, and the preparation of software packages.

It should be recognised that MIP Task 6.2 involves a massive amount of data which can only be analyzed efficiently by computer. Field staff time to complete the next questionnaire has not been calculated. However, ongoing maintenance costs to transmit turnaround updating documents and to carry out annual analyses will be relatively minor.

### SYSTEMS INTEGRATION

When MIP Project teams begin to review systems integration, this Report's complementary effects on a number of other existing and planned systems should be considered. For example, if dollar figures are added to the survey, either via questionnaire or computer search of EAS files (R145), much additional information would become available to managers.

This Report should assist in the preparation of the Band Profile Systems currently being developed. Additionally, accountability and responsibility networks, under review by the MIP Task 1 series, could be supported by the Task 6.2 Report.

#### 2. INTRODUCTION

Table 1.1 provides a profile of the services delivered to each of the 592 Bands (and communities) in Canada. For each service delivered, three functions are examined: first, who delivers the service to the band (MANAGES SERVICE); second, who is accountable within the Department for the delivery of that service (ACCOUNTABILITY); and third, who provides technical and advisory support for that service (TECH/ADVISORY/SERVICE).

For each function, where applicable, a catagory name and a valid code from the Expenditure Coding Manual is given. For example, page 1 profiles service delivery for Fort Norman Band in Northwest Territories Region. Among the services delivered to this Band as part of the Education Activity is "Development Cultural 3032:" This service is managed by the Department at the Regional level by "REG DIR 01100", (Director, Community Affairs).

The band also receives the service "CORE FUNDING, 7002" in the Band Government Activity. In this case, however, the band manages the service itself (Band 00750), is accountable to "REG DIR 01100" and receives technical support from the same position.

# 2. INTRODUCTION

Table 2.1 provides a statistical summary of services delivered to each band (or community). For each band, a statistical analysis, by Main Activity, is given for the three functions of the matrix; management, accountability and the provision of technical advisory support.

Table 2.1 differs from Table 1.1 in that the former (2.1) gives a statistical breakdown of services received, whereas the latter (1.1) gives the name and code of the responsible parties.

Page 13 of Table 2.1 profiles the Resolution Band, in the Northwest Territories Region. Under the heading "MANAGEMENT OF SERVICES", the Reserves and Trusts Activity is analysed. Of a possible total of 13 services, Resolution Band receives 3 or 23%. Of these 3 services, all 3 (100%) are administered by the Department.

Under the heading "ACCOUNTABILITY" it is noted that for all the Reserves and Trusts services, accountability lies at the Regional level.

Under the heading, "TECH/ADVIS SRV", it is noted that for all activities, and in all instances where the technical support was sought, it was provided in 88% of the cases by the Department and 13% by other bodies. Please note that technical support is not always provided and therefore the total in this function does not always equal that of the services delivered.

## INTRODUCTION

Table 2.2 provides a statistical summary of services delivered at the District level. For each of the approximately 40 Districts a statistical analysis, by Main Activity, is given for the three functions of the matrix; management, accountability and the provision of technical/advisory support. In several cases where a direct region/band relationship exists, the regional office is treated as if it were a district office.

Page 1 of Table 2.2 profiles the Northwest Territories Region which is not divided into districts. Under the heading "MANAGEMENT OF SERVICES" it is noted that a total of 131 services are delivered to the 16 bands in the Region. Of these 131 services, 73 (56%) are administered by the Department; 46 (44%) by Indian Administration; and none by other bodies.

Under the heading, "ACCOUNTABILITY" it is noted that for all 131 services, accountability lies at the Regional level in all instances.

Under the heading, "TECH/ADVIS SRV", it is noted that for all activities, and in all instances where technical support was sought, it was provided in 94% of the cases by the Department, 2% by Indian Administration and 5% by other bodies. Please note that technical support is not always provided and therefore the total in this function does not always equal that of the services delivered.

### INTRODUCTION

Table 2.3 provides a statistical summary of services delivered at the Regional level. For each of the nine regions, a statistical analysis, by Main Activity, is given for the three functions of the matrix; management, accountability and the provision of technical/advisory

services are delivered to the 16 bands in the Region. Of these 131 services, 73 (56%) are administered by the Department; 58 (44%) by Indian Administration; and none by other bodies. Page 1 of Table 2.3 profiles the Northwest Territories Region. Unde the heading "MANAGEMENT OF SERVICES" it is noted that a total of 131 Under

### INTRODUCTION

Table 2.4 provides a statistical summary of services delivered nationally. A composite statistical analysis of the services provided to Indian Bands by Main Activity, is given for the three functions of the matrix; management, accountability and the provision of technical advisory support.

This table shows that a total of 31,005 discrete units of service are received by the 592 bands (and communities) across the country.

Under the heading "MANAGEMENT OF SERVICES", it is noted that 45% of all services are managed by the Department, 51% by Indian Administration, and 4% by other bodies.

Under the heading, "ACCOUNTABILITY" it is noted that of the 31,005 total services, accountability lies at the District level in approximately 20,300 instances, at the Regional level in approximately 10,600 instances, and at Headquarters level in only 81 instances.

Under the heading, "TECH/ADVIS SRV", it is noted that for all activities, and in all instances where technical support was sought, it was provided in 81% of the cases by the Department, 11% by Indian Administration and 8% by other bodies. Please note that technical support is not always provided and therefore the total in this function does not always equal that of the services delivered.

### INTRODUCTION

Table 3.1 analyses the management of services by Main Activity for each region and nationally. For each Main Activity, statistics are displayed by the three management groupings: Departmental administration; Indian administration; Other administration, (i.e., non-Department; non-Indian).

This table invites comparisons within and among regions and against national averages. For example, the degree to which the Education Activity is either Departmentally administered or Indian administered can be seen in examining management in selected regions. The following summary, taken from this table is shown as an example:

Caution must be exercised in making inter-regional comparisons. To point out, for example that 43% of all Education Activity services in Manitoba are Departmentally administered versus 57% Indian administrated does not indicate that 43% of the Education BUDGET is delivered by the Department. This table, and indeed this entire Report, considers only the number of services delivered and received at the sub-activity level. It does not give weight to any given service relative to another. Nor does it consider financial and budgetary implications of any individual service or group of services.

This table provides additional regional information. For example, in Quebec Region, of all services delivered, 6% were in the Reserves and Trusts Activity, 34% were in Education, and 22% were in Economic and Employment. This contrasts with Ontario Region where the respective percentages were 7%, 24% and 23%. The utility of this information however, is questionable.

### INTRODUCTION

Table 4.1 highlights the roles played by each of the "deliverers" of services, which are categorized into the following three main groupings and nine sub-groupings.

Information is displayed for each region and nationally. There is no subdivision by Main Activity; all services delivered are tabulated, and are considered collectively.

For example, in British Columbia Region, 2804 discrete units of service are delivered by the Department. Of these, the overwhelming majority, 2645 or 94% are managed at the district level, while only 159 (6%) are managed at the regional level. This contrasts with Manitoba Region where the district/regional roles are reversed (37% vs 97%). The national average is: district-61%; region-39%.

Within the Indian Administration category, the role of Tribal Councils can be examined. This table shows that in most regions, tribal and district councils do not deliver any services to bands. However in Ontario, 11 services are delivered; in Manitoba 231 (or 12% of all Indian-administered services); in Alberta 183 (25%); and in British Columbia, 726 (14%).

Subsequent editions of this report, might indicate any trends towards an increasingly important role played by tribal councils in the delivery of the Department's program.

- 2. A system for the updating of this data base.

This product will provide a comprehensive picture of existing operational linkages and answer these questions:

- a) which Bands manage a complete range of services;
- b) which Bands manage a partial range of services; and
- which Bands have services wholly delivered by the Department.

The task will produce a "snapshot" from the Department's point of view, and in doing so will deal with three existing structural linkages (i.e. delivery of service, accountability, and technical/advisory services).

The information produced by this task will be quickly dated as additional transfers of program delivery responsibility take place. Importance is therefore attached to designing a system which may be updated at regular and timely intervals.

The project will be undertaken during a six-month period beginning April 1 and terminating September 30, 1981. It is estimated that 46 person months (4 PY) of effort and an additional \$125 K of operating expenses will be required.

### II PROBLEM DEFINITION

### A. BACKGROUND

The transfer of program delivery responsibilities to Indian Bands is regarded as a significant means to enable Indian people to make the major decisions affecting their political, social economic and cultural well-being.

The transfer of program delivery responsibility has been practised since 1965 and became national policy in 1974. However, the lack of an explicit policy framework and guidelines at the national and regional levels has led to confusion in implementing transfers as well as a perception of loss of financial accountability.

In the absence of explicit guidelines, policy implementation has, to a large extent, been at the discretion of individual managers. The ensuing problems have been documented in the Auditor General's most recent report to the House of Commons. The Report identified "a number of major planning and control inadequacies."

In addition to the Auditor General's criticisms, the manner in which transfers have taken place has been the subject of concern to central agencies.

Task 6.2 addresses these concerns first of all, by identifying the degree to which transfers of services have already taken place, and the inter-relationship between the bands on one hand and the departmental responsibility centres on the other.

Other tasks which are being conducted concurrently will identify future transfers, describe existing guidelines and list existing criteria. Phase II projects will attempt to develop and implement new policies and criteria.

It is hoped that in addition to the ultimate utility of this information, a short-term result will be to satisfy central agency requirements needed to release resources which have been frozen.

### B. TASK OBJECTIVES

As specified in the MIP task description, the objectives of Task 6.2 are:

- To identify and document the organizational profile of districts to regions and bands to districts.
- To identify any cases (e.g. BC, Man.) where the organizational relationship is direct between the regional office and bands.
- 3. To identify and document those bands that
  - a) manage a complete range of services
  - b) manage a partial range
  - c) have services wholly delivered by the Department.
- To identify and document bands to whom services are delivered by Tribal Councils, and whether wholly or partially.
- To develop and implement procedures to keep the above data updated as changes occur.

### III PROJECT METHODOLOGY

The approach of this project is to construct a network profile of the linkages between all relevant "organizational cells" involved in the provision or receipt of services. The profile will map present linkage patterns on selected dimensions.

The task will be undertaken in five stages as listed below. Results of each stage will be reported formally for approval of the ADM (I&I) and the Senior  $A \cdot D \cdot M$ .

Stage 1. Design

Stage 2. Data Collection

Stage 3. Data Organization

Stage 4. Data Analysis and Presentation

Stage 5. Data Base Update System

Activities to be carried out during each stage are as follows:

### Stage 1. Design

- a) During this stage a conceptual model will be constructed within which decisions can be taken pertaining to the shape and scale of the network profile. The responsible A.D.M.'s will be asked to select which additional specific dimensions are to be mapped. (e.g. organizational linkages, authorities, service delivery relationships, technical/advisory support provided, administrative services provided, flows of money and information).
- b) A data collection process will be developed and survey instruments designed and tested. The purpose is to produce questionnaires that can be administered to the level of District activity manager. This will be carried out by officers of the Department who are to be identified by each Regional Director General and provided with appropriate training and orientation. Planning for the collection of data will be synchronized with Tasks 1.1 and 6.3 in order that, where feasible, personnel, work instruments and other resources may be shared.
- c) Relevant organizational cells will be identified (HQ, Regional, District, Services Centres, Tribal Councils, Indian institutions, Bands, Other).

### Stage 2. Data Collection

- a) Data will be collected, where possible, in conjunction with Tasks 1.1 and 6.3.
- b) The survey population will be appropriate Departmental Responsibility Centre Managers (max. population: 576).
- c) Indian Bands and organizations will not be interviewed.

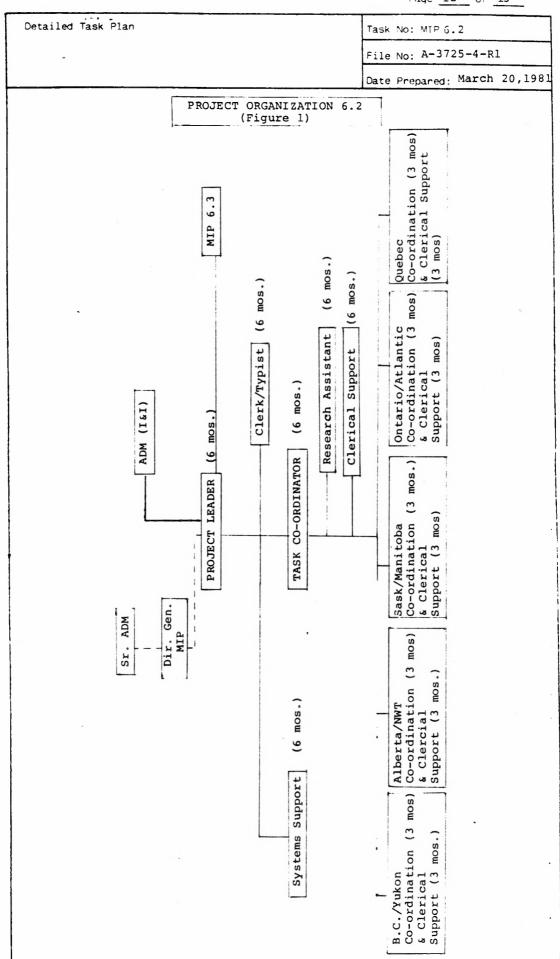
