COSEWIC LISTS

The first COSEWIC "Endangered Species List" was issued in 1978. Around 1990 a decision was made that all species considered by COSEWIC should be listed even if the species were "not at risk" or "indeterminate". Therefore, this document is divided into three separate lists under the title "Canadian Species at Risk":

- List 1: Species Designated in the Five "Risk" Categories With Current Geographical Occurrence. (This is COSEWIC's "official" list of species at risk.)
- List 2: Species Examined and Designated in the Not at Risk Category, With Geographical Occurrence and Date Examined.
- List 3: Species Examined and Designated in the Indeterminate Category Because of Insufficient Scientific Information, With Geographical Occurrence and Date Examined.

Five summary tables provide the numbers of species by taxonomic category for the three lists (species at risk, species not at risk, and indeterminate species) as well as species that have been delisted and species which have had their status reexamined at least once.

A Record of Status Reexaminations can be found at the back of the document.

COSEWIC Mandate

COSEWIC determines the national status of wild species, subspecies, varieties and nationally significant populations that are considered to be at risk in Canada. Designations are made on all native species for the following groups: fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds, mammals, molluscs, lepidoptera, vascular plants, mosses and lichens.

Three primary lists are maintained: 1) species designated at risk; 2) species examined and designated not at risk; 3) species examined for which status is indeterminate because of insufficient scientific information. A record of status re-examinations is also maintained. Species examined more than once are identified, and those added in the current year are shown in boxes

COSEWIC Membership

COSEWIC is comprised of representatives from each provincial and territorial government wildlife agency, four federal agencies (Canadian Wildlife Service, Parks Canada, Fisheries and Oceans, Canadian Museum of Nature), three national conservation organizations (Canadian Nature Federation, Canadian Wildlife Federation, and World Wildlife Fund Canada) and the chairs of the scientific subcommittees. The Committee meets annually in April to consider status reports on candidate species.

AMERICAN WHITE PELICAN: designated threatened in 1978 and delisted in 1987.

ANATUM PEREGRINE FALCON: designated endangered in 1978 and downlisted to threatened in 1999.

ATHABASCA THRIFT: designated threatened in 1981 and downlisted to vulnerable in 1999.

BAIRD'S SPARROW: designated threatened in 1989 and delisted in 1996.

BARN OWL: considered one population in 1984 and designated (rare) vulnerable. Split into two populations in 1999 and the eastern population (ON) was uplisted to endangered. The western population (BC) was reconfirmed as vulnerable.

BENTHIC PAXTON LAKE STICKLEBACK³³: provisionally designated threatened in 1998; BC provided new information and a revised report was prepared - revisited and reconfirmed as threatened in 1999.

BLACK-TAILED PRAIRIE DOG: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1978 and reconfirmed as (rare) vulnerable in 1988; revisited again in 1999 and reconfirmed as vulnerable.

BLACK TERN: (not in any category) not at risk in 1988 and reconfirmed as not at risk in 1996.

BLUEHEARTS: designated threatened in 1985 and uplisted to endangered in 1998.

BOWHEAD WHALE: Eastern and Western Arctic populations designated endangered in 1980; Western Arctic population revisited in 1986 and reconfirmed as endangered.

BURROWING OWL: designated threatened in 1979 and reconfirmed as threatened in 1991; re-examined in 1995 and uplisted to endangered.

CASPIAN TERN: designated as (rare) vulnerable in 1978 and delisted in 1999.

CENTRAL STONEROLLER: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1985 and delisted in 1998.

COOPER'S HAWK: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1983 and delisted in 1996.

COUGAR (EASTERN POPULATION): designated endangered in 1978; re-examined by COSEWIC in 1998 and placed on indeterminate list because there was insufficient scientific data to evaluate taxonomy or assign a status.

CUCUMBER TREE: designated endangered in 1984 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1999.

EASTERN BLUEBIRD: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1984 and delisted in 1996.

EASTERN MOLE: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1980 and reconfirmed as vulnerable in 1998.

EASTERN MOUNTAIN AVENS: designated endangered in 1986 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1999

EASTERN PRICKLY PEAR CACTUS: designated endangered in 1985 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1998.

FERRUGINOUS HAWK: designated threatened in 1980 and downlisted to vulnerable in 1995.

FLAMMULATED OWL: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1988 and reconfirmed as vulnerable in 1999.

FOWLER'S TOAD: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1986 and uplisted to threatened in 1999.

FURBISH'S LOUSEWORT: designated endangered in 1980 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1998.

GATTINGER'S AGALINIS: designated endangered in 1988 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1999.

GIANT HELLEBORINE: designated threatened in 1984 and downlisted to vulnerable in 1998.

GOLDEN CREST: designated threatened in 1987 and reconfirmed as threatened in 1999.

GOLDEN EAGLE: (no designation required) not at risk in 1987 and reconfirmed as not at risk in 1996.

GRAVEL CHUB: designated endangered in 1985 and uplisted to extirpated in 1987.

GREAT GRAY OWL: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1979 and delisted in 1996.

GREATER PRAIRIE CHICKEN: designated endangered in 1978 and uplisted to extirpated in 1990.

GRIZZLY BEAR: (not in any category) not at risk in 1979 and uplisted to vulnerable in 1991. (The uplisting recognized the sensitivity of the grizzly bear to environmental changes and overharvest, though its population was not in decline.)

GYRFALCON: (not in any category) not at risk in 1978 and reconfirmed as not at risk in 1987.

HARBOUR PORPOISE: Northeast Atlantic population designated threatened in 1990 and reconfirmed as threatened in 1991. Northeast Pacific population designated "ISIBD"³⁴ (indeterminate) in 1991.

HEART-LEAVED PLANTAIN: designated endangered in 1985 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1998.

HENSLOW'S SPARROW: designated threatened in 1984 and uplisted to endangered in 1993.

HOARY MOUNTAIN MINT: designated endangered in 1986 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1998.

HUMPBACK WHALE: both Atlantic and Pacific populations were designated threatened in 1982. Status reconfirmed as threatened for the North Pacific population in 1985. The Western North Atlantic population downlisted to (rare) vulnerable in 1985.

INDIAN PLANTAIN: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1988 and reconfirmed as vulnerable in 1999.

IVORY GULL: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1981 and reconfirmed as vulnerable in 1996.

KING RAIL: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1985 and uplisted to endangered in 1994.

KIRTLAND'S WARBLER: designated endangered in 1979 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1999.

LAKE LAMPREY: designated rare (vulnerable) in 1986 and reconfirmed as vulnerable in 1998.

LARGE WHORLED POGONIA: designated endangered in 1986 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1998.

LEAST BITTERN: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1988 and reconfirmed as vulnerable in 1999.

LIMNETIC PAXTON LAKE STICKLEBACK³⁵: provisionally designated threatened in 1998; BC provided new information and a revised report was prepared - revisited and reconfirmed as threatened in 1999

LOGGERHEAD SHRIKE: considered as one population in 1986 and designated threatened; eastern population was revisited and uplisted to endangered in 1991.

LOUISIANA WATERTHRUSH: designated vulnerable in 1991 and reconfirmed as vulnerable in 1996.

MOSOUITO FERN: designated threatened in 1984 and reconfirmed as threatened in 1998.

MOUNTAIN BEAVER: (not in any category) not at risk in 1984 and uplisted to vulnerable in 1999.

NARWHAL: (not in any category) not at risk in 1986 and reconfirmed as (not in any category) not at risk in 1987.

NODDING POGONIA: designated threatened in 1988 and uplisted to endangered in 1999.

NORTHERN MADTOM: considered indeterminate in 1993; re-examined in 1998 and designated vulnerable.

NORTHERN SPOTTED OWL³⁶: designated endangered in 1986 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1999.

NUTTALL'S COTTONTAIL: prairie population (not in any category) not at risk in 1991 and reconfirmed asnot at risk in 1994.

PEALE'S PEREGRINE FALCON: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1978 and reconfirmed as vulnerable in 1999.

PEARY CARIBOU: considered as one population and designated threatened in 1979. Considered as three populations in 1991 and redesignated as follows; Banks Island population, endangered; High Arctic population, endangered; and Low Arctic population, threatened.

PINK COREOPSIS: designated endangered in 1984 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1999.

PINK MILKWORT: designated endangered in 1984 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1998.

PIPING PLOVER: designated threatened in 1978 and uplisted to endangered in 1985.

PITCHER'S THISTLE: designated threatened in 1988 and uplisted to endangered in 1999.

PLAINS POCKET GOPHER: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1979 and delisted in 1998.

PLYMOUTH GENTIAN: designated threatened in 1984 and reconfirmed as threatened in 1999.

POLAR BEAR: (not in any category) not at risk in 1986; uplisted to vulnerable in 1991. (The uplisting recognized the sensitivity of the polar bear to environmental changes and overharvest, though its population was not in decline.) Revisited in 1999 and reconfirmed as vulnerable.

PRAIRIE FALCON: (no designation required) not at risk in 1978 and reconfirmed as (no designation required) not at risk in 1982. Reassessed in 1996 and reconfirmed as not at risk.

PRAIRIE LONG-TAILED WEASEL: designated threatened in 1982 and delisted in 1993.

PRAIRIE WARBLER: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1985 and delisted in 1999.

PROTHONOTARY WARBLER: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1984 and uplisted to endangered in 1996.

PURPLE TWAYBLADE: designated threatened in 1989 and uplisted to endangered in 1999.

RED MULBERRY: designated threatened in 1987 and uplisted to endangered in 1999.

RED-SHOULDERED HAWK: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1983 and reconfirmed as vulnerable in 1996.

RIGHT WHALE: designated endangered in 1980; reconfirmed as endangered in 1985 and reconfirmed again as endangered in 1990.

RIVER REDHORSE: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1983 and reconfirmed as (rare) vulnerable in 1987.

ROSEATE TERN: designated threatened in 1986 and uplisted to endangered in 1999.

ROSS' GULL: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1981 and reconfirmed as vulnerable in 1996.

SAGE GROUSE: conditionally designated threatened in 1997. The report was revised and reexamined in 1998 and the Prairie population (AB and SK) was designated endangered.

SEA OTTER: designated endangered in 1978 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1986. Reassessed in 1996 and downlisted to threatened.

SHARP-SHINNED HAWK: (no designation required) not at risk in 1986 and reconfirmed as not at risk in 1997.

SHUMARD OAK: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1984 and reconfirmed as vulnerable in 1999.

SILVER SHINER: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1983 and reconfirmed as (rare) vulnerable in 1987.

SKINNER'S AGALINIS: designated endangered in 1988 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1999.

SLENDER BUSH CLOVER: designated endangered in 1986 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1999.

SMALL WHITE LADY'S-SLIPPER: designated endangered in 1981 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1999.

SMALL WHORLED POGONIA: designated endangered in 1982 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1998.

SOUTHERN MAIDENHAIR FERN: designated endangered in 1984 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1998.

SPOTTED GAR: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1983 and reconfirmed as vulnerable in 1994.

SPOTTED SUCKER: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1983 and reconfirmed as vulnerable in 1994.

SPOTTED WINTERGREEN: designated endangered in 1987 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1998.

SWEET PEPPERBUSH: designated threatened in 1986 and reconfirmed as threatened in 1998.

SWIFT FOX: designated extirpated in 1978 and downlisted to endangered in 1998.

TRUMPETER SWAN: designated (rare) vulnerable in 1978 and delisted in 1996.

TUNDRA PEREGRINE FALCON: designated threatened in 1978 and downlisted to vulnerable in 1992.

TYRRELL'S WILLOW: designated threatened in 1981 and delisted in 1999.

VANCOUVER ISLAND MARMOT: designated endangered in 1978 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1997.

WATER -PENNYWORT: designated endangered in 1985 and downlisted to threatened in 1999.

WHITE WHALE (BELUGA)) [ST LAWRENCE RIVER POPULATION]: designated endangered in 1983 and reconfirmed as endangered in 1997.

WOLVERINE: considered as one population in 1982 and designated (rare) vulnerable. Split into two populations in 1989; Western population, vulnerable, and Eastern (Quebec and Labrador) population, endangered.

WOOD BISON: designated endangered in 1978 and downlisted to threatened in 1988.

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The Committee on the Status of Endangered Wildlife in Canada (COSEWIC) was created in 1977 as a result of a recommendation at the Federal-Provincial Wildlife Conference held in 1976. It arose from the need for a single, official, scientifically sound, national listing of wildlife species at risk. In 1978, COSEWIC designated its first species and produced its first list of Canadian species at risk. COSEWIC meets annually in April each year. Species designated at this meeting are added to the list.



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
