

The camera of Alanis Obomsawin does not simply see. It speaks and listens. What it hears are North America's First Peoples, the Aboriginal voices so often cast aside and overlooked within official history. The 1990 Oka Crisis re-ignited historic First Nations grievances and galvanized collective resolve like few other events in recent history. Obomsawin was present to record the experience, crafting this compelling 4-part tribute to cultural resistance and pride. My Name is Kahentiiosta

Here is the portrayal of a courageous, committed woman. Through her eyes, we witness the arrest and detention of those who withdrew to the Treatment Centre after the Canadian army advanced during the 1990 conflict. Kahentiiosta herself is detained four days longer than the other women. Her crime? The prosecutor representing the Quebec government will not accept her Aboriginal name. (1995)

Spudwrench – Kahnawake Man

Meet Randy Horne, high-steel worker from the Mohawk community of Kanehsatake, near Montreal. As a defender of his people's culture and traditions, he was known as "Spudwrench" during the 1990 Oka Crisis. (1997)

Rocks at Whiskey Trench

On August 28, 1990, a convoy of 75 cars left the Mohawk community of Kahnawake and filed across Montreal's Mercier Bridge—straight into a horrifying mob that pelted the vehicles with rocks. The targets of this violence were Mohawk women, children and elders leaving Kahnawake in fear of an advance by the Canadian army. (2000)

Following the American Civil War, Sitting Bull led a Sioux resistance to western expansion and accomplished what seemed impossible: a treaty in which the U.S. gave the Sioux control of their territory for all time. However, the discovery of gold soon proved more important to the nation than honouring the treaty. This 2-part episode chronicles the life and legacy of a remarkable Native leader.

The Trial of Poundmaker

For two days in 1885, Poundmaker sat shackled in a Saskatchewan courtroom, accused of participating in a rebellion against the Queen's Canadian government. Administrators in the Indian Department saw the Native leader as an agitator in collusion with the Louis Riel rebellion. The role of Poundmaker is played by one of his direct descendants, Tyrone Tootoosis.

The Black Hawk War

While a statue of Black Hawk today overlooks the Mississippi River, near the homeland of the Sauk and Fox nations, his descendants were forced to move to Oklahoma. The violent conflict that finally erupted around Black Hawk in the spring of 1832 spelled the end of Sauk resistance to removal and nearly wiped out their people. Sauk descendants from Oklahoma revisit their traditional homeland in northern Illinois and Wisconsin.

The Worlds of Joseph Brant

Joseph Brant was born in 1742. His traditional Mohawk name, Thayendanegea, meant "two sticks bound together in strength." This name would be symbolic of Brant's twin ambitions: to be a power broker between Indian and English societies, and to satisfy his thirst for power and eminence. His name still stirs up controversy among his descendants, the people of the Six Nations.

Pontiac's Rebellion

Pontiac was chief of the Ottawa tribe and part of the Algonquin confederacy. He enjoyed a peaceful and respectful relationship with the French, a situation that changed when the British defeated the French on the Plains of Abraham in 1759. Pontiac's successful rebellion against the British brought about the Royal Proclamation of 1763, which created a vast Indian sovereign territory.

The Niagara frontier and the St. Lawrence Valley are protected. French Canadian troops repel an American attack at Lacolle. The two sides are locked in a stalemate on Lake Ontario. Wilkinson descends the St. Lawrence River. Hampton moves his troops north from Plattsburgh. The American advance is repulsed at the battles of Châteauguay and Crysler's Farm. By the end of 1813, much of Canada has been laid waste by war but continues to resist the invaders. (46 min)

Episode 4 – "The Rocket's Red Glare"

The American army rebuilds as the end of the Napoleonic Wars frees up troops in Europe. There are bloody battles on the Niagara frontier. The British sail up Chesapeake Bay and burn public buildings in Washington. The British squadron on Lake Champlain is defeated. Peace negotiations result in the signing of the Treaty of Ghent in 1814. (46 min)
