

DIVERSITY/PLURALISM, HEALTH/PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT. PHYSICAL EDUCATION

This documentary uncovers a unique streetball tournament played by Chinese-Americans in parking lots and back alleys across the U.S. and Canada. The chaotic nine-man tournament grew in popularity during the 1930s, when anti-Chinese laws forced restaurant workers and laundrymen to socialize among themselves. Today it represents an enduring connection to Chinatown for a dynamic community of men who live in a more integrated world, yet still fight to maintain autonomy and tradition. 2014 (89 min)



ABSENCES

This film was inspired by the director's own personal story of the inevitable estrangement of her mother, whose memory is slowly being consumed by Alzheimer's disease. This "anticipated separation" becomes a bridge to the film's other characters, who are also struggling with absence in various forms. Carole Laganière (East End Kids) deftly weaves their stories together to explore the deepest regions of the psyche, where our sense of loss and resiliency co-exist. An experiment in human connectivity and interactive storytelling, *Bread* offers a peek into the lives of six older women from very different backgrounds, all of whom share a passion for bread making.

BUBBLE DANCERS (IN THE DISH PIT)

CIVICS/CITIZENSHIP, DIVERSITY/PLURALISM. **HEALTH/PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT**

Bringing the dish pit to the desktop, Bubble Dancers takes us into the restaurant industry through the back doors and alleyways of St. John's, introducing us to men and women whose voices are usually drowned out by the clatter of pots and pans. The pit attracts an eclectic mix. from young musicians and recent immigrants to seasoned pros, retired cooks, and students and drifters still figuring it out.

THE DEVIL'S **TOY REDUX**

ARTS EDUCATION, GEOGRAPHY, MEDIA EDUCATION

In 1966, a plank of wood and four wheels was hell on earth. Fifty years later, skateboarding is a multi-billiondollar sport. But at its core, it remains a vehicle for rebellion and for youth to express themselves. Claude Jutra's classic *The Devil's Tov* is reimagined by 14 directors from around the world in an interactive doc that allows users to witness the evolution of skateboarding culture by easily navigating from one film to the next.



CIVICS/CITIZENSHIP. MEDIA EDUCATION, TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION

This seven-part series provides an eye-opening look at how online behaviour is being tracked, analyzed and sold-an issue that affects billions of web users around the world. What place does the short form have in the digital landscape? And is it possible to create an interactive experience that touches viewers' emotions and tells a story in just 60 seconds? These interactive haikt followed ten creative rules, which included a 60-second time limit and the goal of being accessible to an international audience while providing an experience that prompts viewers to see the world in a different light.



HIGHRISE: UNIVERSE WITHIN

This interactive online documentary reveals the hidden digital lives of highrise residents around the world. Incorporating photography, film, data art and webGL, Universe Within confronts viewers with provocative questions about ethics, emotions and empathy in our digital, vertical environments.





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
