# Production and disposition of tobacco products

December 2000

Production of cigarettes by Canadian manufacturers decreased in December. Sales also declined, but to a lesser extent, and inventories were reduced. For the whole year 2000, both production and sales figures were slightly below those of 1999, and year-end inventories were higher than opening inventories in January 2000.

In December, 3.4 billion cigarettes were produced, 13% fewer than in November and 9% fewer than in December 1999. Total production for the year 2000 reached 46 billion cigarettes but remained 2% below that of 1999.

Manufacturers shipped 3.4 billion cigarettes in December, down 11% from November and down 16% from December 1999. Shipments for all of 2000 were 45 billion cigarettes, which represents a slight drop of 4% from the 1999 level.

Holiday season sales were relatively weak in December, but reduced production lowered closing inventories to 3.9 billion cigarettes. Although this was a drop of 11% from the opening inventory level for the month, it was still 12% above the closing inventory at the end of 1999.

## **Railway carloadings**

Seven-day period ending December 14, 2000

Non-intermodal traffic loaded during the seven-day period ending December 14 was 4.7 million metric tonnes, down 6.4% from the same period of 1999. The number of cars loaded decreased 6.6%.

Intermodal traffic tonnage was 463 000 tonnes, up 16.2% from the same period of 1999. The

year-to-date figures were up 8.3% compared with the same period of 1999.

Total traffic decreased 4.8% during the period. This brought the year-to-date total to 215.0 million tonnes, a decrease of 12.5% from the same period of 1999.

All year-to-date figures have been revised.

## Pulpwood and wood residue statistics

November 2000

Pulpwood receipts totalled 3 038 178 cubic metres in November, down 4.6% from 3 185 174 cubic metres in November 1999. Wood residue receipts were 7 307 429 cubic metres, up 7.4% from 6 802 935 cubic metres in November 1999. Consumption of pulpwood residue totalled 9 565 218 cubic metres, up 6.0% from 9 026 507 cubic metres in November 1999.

The closing inventory of pulpwood and wood residue decreased 3.7% to 13 593 539 cubic metres, down from 14 116 389 cubic metres in November 1999. Year-to-date consumption of pulpwood and wood residue was 107 880 736 cubic metres, up 5.1% from 102 665 344 cubic metres in the same period of 1999.
