Dairy statistics

September 2001 (preliminary)

Butter production during the 2000/01 dairy year reached 81,000 metric tonnes, up 2.7% from the 1999/2000 dairy year. (A dairy year runs from August to July).

Cereals and oilseeds review

August 2001

During September, Winnipeg oilseed futures showed considerable independence from slumping soybean and soyoil prices at the Chicago Board of Trade (CBOT). For most of September, canola prices held up due to tight supplies, quality concerns and a weaker dollar. Flaxseed prices gained \$25 a metric tonne as a result of low farm deliveries and a lower harvest. However, a combination of much higher farm deliveries and bearish outside markets lowered prices by about \$15 a tonne in the last two trading days.

The Canadian Wheat Board forecast that durum wheat prices would remain steady while non-durum wheat values would fall from \$6 to \$13 a tonne. Despite lower domestic production and good harvest conditions that led to higher grades and protein in this year's wheat crop, there were many overriding factors. The negative factors included: uncertainty generated from the terrorist attack of September 11, importers covering only local needs, a good quality U.S. spring wheat crop, and favourable planting conditions for the U.S. winter wheat crop.

Data from the August 2001 issue of the *Cereals* and oilseeds review are now available. The information

includes data on production, stocks, cash and futures prices, domestic processing, exports, farmers' deliveries and supply-disposition analyses.

Longitudinal Administrative Databank 1982 to 1999

Data for 1999 have been added to the Longitudinal Administrative Databank (LAD). This databank now spans 18 years, from 1982 to 1999, and contains information about individuals and census families.

The LAD consists of a 20% longitudinal sample of Canadian taxfilers, and provides researchers and analysts with a tool for studying the changes in income that Canadians and their families experience. The LAD contains a wide variety of income and demographic variables such as employment income, self-employment income, Registered Retirement Savings Plan contributions, alimony, age, and census family composition. The large sample (4.5 million persons in 1999) ensures reliable estimates for Canada, the provinces, census metropolitan areas, and several subprovincial regions, based on aggregations of postal codes.


