## Travel between Canada and other countries

Year 2000 and December 2000

Foreign travel to Canada grew for the eighth consecutive year in 2000, largely the result of more trips taken from overseas nations, particularly Asia and the United Kingdom.

Almost 19.6 million people travelled to Canada for at least one night during 2000, up 0.7% from 1999. Americans accounted for about three-quarters of this total, and overseas travellers the remainder. (All year-over-year data are seasonally unadjusted).

About 15.1 million Americans made overnight trips to Canada in 2000, down 0.4%. However, travel by overseas residents increased 4.9% to 4.4 million, breaking the previous record set in 1996. Travel from the United Kingdom, Canada's largest overseas market, jumped 10.9% to a record high of 914,000 in 2000. Although the Asian market expanded 6.8% to 1.4 million, travel levels remained below the 1.5 million recorded in 1996 prior to the Asian crisis.

from Travel South Korea 37.2% rose to 149,000 in 2000, the largest percentage increase Canada's top 12 overseas among About 180,000 travellers arrived from Australia, up 11.4%, and 147,000 came from Mexico, a 10.6% increase. However, travel from Italy declined 2.8%, as well as from France (-2.5%) and Germany (-2.1%). About 540,000 people came from Japan, down 1.9%.

For their part, Canadians made 19.1 million overnight trips abroad in 2000, up 4.1% from 1999. About 14.6 million were to U.S. destinations, up 3.5%. During the year, the number of overnight trips by Canadians to overseas destinations reached a record 4.5 million, up 6.2%, breaking the previous record set in 1999.

Same-day cross-border car trips by Americans dipped 2.5% to 26.6 million in 2000, while the number of such trips by Canadians remained unchanged at 27.1 million. Over 2000, the value of the Canadian dollar averaged US\$0.67, unchanged from 1999.

In December, foreigners took just over 4.0 million trips to Canada, up 0.7% from November. Canadians took 3.7 million trips to foreign countries, a drop of 4.8% from November. (These monthly data are seasonally adjusted and cover both same-day and overnight trips).

Americans travelled for at least one night to Canada on 1.3 million occasions in December, up 1.3% from November. The number of Canadians making overnight trips south of the border fell 4.1% to 1.2 million.

Canadians took 420,000 trips to the United States by plane in December, down 5.3% from November, the largest month-to-month percentage decrease for air travel since January 2000. In December, Americans took 320,000 trips by plane to this side of the border, a

drop of 1.8%. Americans made 2.5% more overnight trips by car to Canada in December, the fifth consecutive monthly increase. Canadians, however, took 3.6% fewer overnight auto trips to the United States.

Same-day cross-border car traffic by Canadians fell 3.1% to 2.1 million in December, the lowest monthly volume recorded over the past decade. The number of car excursions by Americans dipped 1.0% to 2.2 million.

Canadians made 394,000 trips to overseas destinations in December, 2.7% more than the previous (revised) record high of 391,000 in October. Overseas residents took 386,000 overnight trips to Canada, 0.8% more than in November.

Travellers from 7 of Canada's top 12 overseas markets took more trips to Canada in December. The Netherlands led with growth of 20.6%, followed by Mexico (+15.2%) and Hong Kong (+13.4%).

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
