Pipeline transportation of crude oil and refined petroleum products

May 2001

Net receipts of crude oil and equivalent hydrocarbons totalled 14 267 103 cubic metres in May, up 7.7% from May 2000. Year-to-date receipts to the end of May 2001 were 68 814 133 cubic metres, up 6.2% over the same period in 2000. Net receipts of liquefied petroleum gases and refined petroleum products in May were 6 305 260 cubic metres, down 8.8% from May 2000. Year-to-date receipts decreased 6.4% to 31 877 532 cubic metres.

Pipeline exports of crude oil totalled 6 678 160 cubic metres, down 0.02% from May 2000, and pipeline imports were 2 472 311 cubic metres, an increase of 12.7%. Year-to-date exports at the end of May totalled 31 707 328 cubic metres, up 5.7% from the same period in 2000. Year-to-date imports stood at 11 740 142 cubic metres, a rise of 15.5%.

May deliveries of crude oil by pipeline to Canadian refineries totalled 5 296 876 cubic metres, down 7.4% from May 2000. May deliveries of liquefied petroleum gases and refined petroleum products fell 32.9% to 390 589 cubic metres. Year-to-date deliveries of crude oil to refineries at the end of May totalled 28 848 158 cubic metres, up 0.6% from the same period in 2000.

Statistics on aircraft movements for the 43 Nav Canada air traffic control towers are now available for June. The number of take-offs and landings at these airports was 467,563 in June, down 0.4% from June 2000.

Trends in personal gifts and charitable donations

1969 to 1997

Canadians' generosity has been rising slowly, both in constant dollars and as a proportion of household income, for the past several decades, according to a recent study. The rise in donations to charitable organizations is slowing, however, while giving gifts to individuals is accelerating.

The average annual value of gifts and contributions for each household rose steadily from \$986 in 1969 to \$1,700 in 1996. This total giving accounted for 4.5% of the average disposable household income in 1996, up from 3.3% in 1969.

The study, *Generosity in Canada: Trends in personal gifts and charitable donations over three decades, 1969 to 1997*, shows that the manner in which Canadians give gifts and make charitable donations has been changing. For example, of the monetary giving that goes to organizations, a shrinking proportion is going to religious organizations compared with non-religious organizations.

This report is based on household spending data from Family Expenditure Surveys between 1969 and 1996, and the Survey of Household Spending since 1997.

The study provides information about regional and income quintile patterns in gifts and charitable donations. It reveals that the gap in giving (as a proportion of household income) between low-income and high-income households is narrowing.

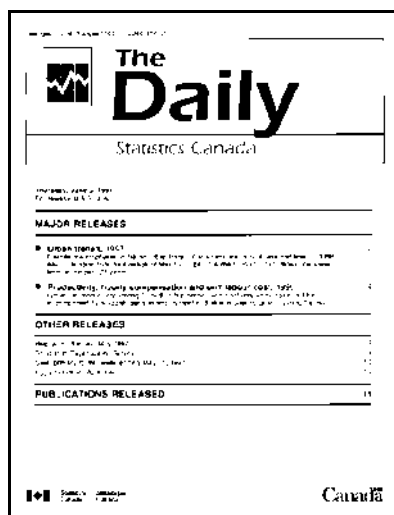
