New Housing Price Index

September 2002

The New Housing Price Index (1992=100) rose 0.2% in September from August. Although this monthly increase was down from August's change of 0.5%, it still reflects a healthy new housing market. Compared with September 2001, this index of contractors' selling prices advanced 4.2%. This represents the fifth consecutive annual rise of 4.0% or greater.

A sustained robust demand for new houses, combined with increased costs of skilled labour and building materials, continued to push up prices nationally.

Monthly rises occurred in 14 of the 21 urban centres surveyed. St. John's and Winnipeg vied for the largest monthly advance, at 1.0% each. Both cities reported that building and labour costs, as well as the cost of servicing land, were up. In Manitoba, the provincial government

has imposed a tax on some labour services, helping to push up prices.

Four cities shared second place — Québec, Montréal, Sudbury–Thunder Bay and Victoria — each posting increases of 0.5%. Higher construction costs and land prices were mainly responsible for these increases. Following closely were Hamilton, London and Edmonton, where prices rose 0.4%.

New house prices went up 0.2% in Calgary and Vancouver in September. Halifax, Saint John–Moncton–Fredericton and Toronto each increased 0.1%.

Five urban centres showed no monthly change: Charlottetown, Ottawa–Gatineau, Windsor, Regina and Saskatoon.

Kitchener–Waterloo (-0.3%) and St. Catharines–Niagara (-0.8%) posted decreases from August as a result of builder incentives.

On an annual basis, Ottawa–Gatineau (+8.3%) kept top place, with the largest 12-month increase for new homes. Edmonton followed closely at 8.2%, and Montréal was next with 6.2%. There were no annual decreases in September.

Construction type plywood

August 2002

Firms produced 176 415 cubic metres of construction type plywood in August, up 11.5% from 158 215 cubic metres produced in August 2001.

Year-to-date production at the end of August totalled 1 454 894 cubic metres, up 6.5% from 1 366 660 in the same period of 2001.

Shipments of solid fuel-burning heating products

Third quarter 2002

Shipments of solid fuel-burning heating products totalled \$33.0 million in the third quarter, down 5.6% from \$35.0 million in the third quarter of 2001.

Year-to-date shipments at the end of September totaled \$65.5 million, down 17.1% from \$79.1 million in the same period of 2001.


