### Household Internet Use Survey: Erratum 2001

More than 5.8 million households, or 49% of all 12 million households, had at least one member that regularly used the Internet from home in 2001, up 1.1 million from 2000. The July 25 issue of *The Daily* reported incorrectly that this represented a 9% growth rate from 2000. The growth rate was in fact 23%.

Similarly, the gain of 1.4 million households from 1999 to 2000 does not represent a growth rate of 11%. The correct figure is 42%.

### Stocks of frozen and chilled meat products July 2002

Total frozen and chilled red meat in cold storage at the opening of the first business day of July amounted to 77 902 metric tonnes, down 4% from 81 537 tonnes in June and up 25% from 62 445 tonnes in July 2001.

### Production and disposition of tobacco products June 2002

Cigarette manufacturers decreased production and sales in June. Although production outpaced sales, inventories declined because of adjustments (goods damaged, destroyed, stolen or reworked, and inventory adjustments).

The number of cigarettes sold in June was 3.5 billion, down 9% from May (3.9 billion) and 6% from June 2001. From January to June, sales totalled 21.2 billion cigarettes, down 1% from the same period of 2001, when sales stood at 21.4 billion.

Cigarette production decreased a slight 1% to 3.6 billion in June. This amounted to a 10% drop from June 2001, when manufacturers produced 4.0 billion cigarettes. Year-to-date production totalled 21.9 billion cigarettes, down 4% from 22.8 billion manufactured in the same period of 2001.

Despite the significant decline in sales, the closing level of inventories was down 7% from May because of inventory adjustments. The closing level of inventories in June was down 16% from June 2001, when it was 5.8 billion cigarettes.

### Placement of chicks and turkey poults June 2002 (preliminary)

Chick placements were estimated at 58.0 million birds in June, down 2.4% from June 2001. Turkey poult placements decreased 6.4% to 2.1 million birds.

**Pulpwood and wood residue statistics**

May 2002

Pulpwood receipts in May totalled 987 398 cubic metres, down 18.2% from 1 207 603 cubic metres in May 2001. Wood residue receipts increased 1.5% from 7 574 923 cubic metres in May 2001 to 7 689 483 cubic metres in May 2002. Consumption of pulpwood and wood residue totalled 9 615 117 cubic metres, up 2.2% from 9 406 841 cubic metres in May 2001.

The closing inventory of pulpwood and wood residue totalled 12 291 838 cubic metres, down 13.5% from 14 208 728 cubic metres in May 2001. Year-to-date consumption of pulpwood and wood residue at the end of May was 47 135 369 cubic metres, a decrease of 4.6% from 49 431 285 cubic metres in the same period of 2001. Figures for 2001 have been revised.

**Aircraft movement statistics: Small airports**

February 2002

There were 44,320 take-offs and landings recorded in February at the 111 airports without air traffic control towers, down 7.5% from February 2001 when 109 airports reported 47,938 take-offs and landings.

**Annual Survey of Engineering Services Industry**

2000

The engineering services industry is comprised of establishments primarily engaged in applying principles of engineering in the design, development and utilization of machines, materials, instruments, structures, processes and systems.

In 2000, the industry earned revenues of \$9.4 billion, up 4.4% from 1999 (revised). Fee income accounted for 75.8% of these revenues. The industry's 2000 profit margin was 9.4%, a slight drop from 9.6% in 1999 (revised).

The province of Quebec was the largest contributor to the revenue growth.

### **Annual Survey of Automotive Equipment Rental and Leasing**

2000

In 2000, the automotive equipment rental and leasing industry earned revenues of \$5 billion, up 12.6% from 1999. The profit margin for the industry was 10.8% in 2000, compared with 7.5% in 1999.

Results from the 2000 Annual Survey of Automotive Equipment Rental and Leasing are now available. These data provide information such as the industry's revenue, expenditures, salaries and wages, profit margin, and the percentage distribution of revenue earned by type of service and client base.

### **Carbon dioxide equivalent emissions by the iron and steel industry**

1998

The study *Carbon dioxide equivalent emissions by the iron and steel industry* is the first Statistics Canada study to examine the distribution of emissions by manufacturing industries based on establishment size, energy use, and related carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>) emission levels.

Results show that the six largest establishments accounted for over 90% of carbon dioxide total emissions from energy use. By province, over 87% of total emissions originated in Ontario.

This release is based 1998 data from the Industrial Consumption of Energy Survey and the Annual Survey of Manufactures.

Detailed emission data for the iron and steel industry are now available on a quartile basis.

Despite the problems of taking urban transit, Canadians are using it less and less. In 1996, each Canadian took an average of about 6.1 trips on some form of urban transit, the lowest level in the last 25 years.
