
- **Urban transit, 1995** 2
Changes in expenditures on taking urban transit; Canadians are riding it less and less. In 1996, each Canadian took an average of 860.6 or 1.6 ps on some form of urban transit, the lowest level in the past 22 years.
- **Productivity, hourly compensation and unit labour cost, 1995** 4
Growth in productivity among Canadian businesses was relatively weak again in 1996 accompanied by sluggish gains in employment and slow economic growth during the year.
