New Housing Price Index

March 2003

The New Housing Price Index (1992=100) rose 0.1% in March from February. On a 12-month basis, this index of contractors' selling prices increased 4.8%, down slightly after three consecutive months of annual increases of 5.1%.

Of the 21 urban centres surveyed, 12 registered monthly increases, led by Saskatoon (+1.3%), London (+1.1%), Hamilton (+0.8%) and Winnipeg (+0.8%). Home builders in these urban centres noted higher prices for labour and building materials, such as shingles and drywall; builders in Winnipeg also noted higher land values. Increases were also observed in Calgary (+0.6%) and Victoria (+0.6%).

Elsewhere, new house prices rose 0.3% in Québec and Vancouver. The index was up 0.2% in Halifax and 0.1% in Toronto, Kitchener–Waterloo and Regina.

Montréal registered the largest monthly decrease (-0.8%), followed by Sudbury–Thunder Bay (-0.4%), Ottawa–Gatineau (-0.2%) and St. Catharines–Niagara (-0.1%). Competitive pricing along with the offer of bonuses and upgrades resulted in these decreases. Five urban centres registered no change.

The largest 12-month increase for new houses was in Québec (+9.2%) followed by Montréal (+8.2%) and Hamilton (+7.6%). There were no annual decreases.

The revised Canadian manual for the North American Industry Classification System, *NAICS Canada 2002*, is now available.

This volume represents a revision to the North American Industry Classification System (*NAICS Canada 1997*), first published in March 1998.

This is a minor revision, as only two of the 20 industry sectors — construction, sector 23, and information and cultural industries, sector 51 —

have changed. These changes are entirely within the boundaries of the sectors.

In addition to these updates, there have been other changes that do not affect the structure of the classification. These include revised example titles, clarifications in the introduction and in industry definitions, and a NAICS 2002 to NAICS 1997 concordance table.

The Instituto Nacional de Estadística, Geografía e Informática (INEGI) of Mexico, Statistics Canada, and the United States Office of Management and Budget, have jointly developed this revision. This makes industrial statistics produced in the three countries even more comparable.

This revision is scheduled to go into effect for the reference year 2002 in Canada and the United

States and for 2003 in Mexico. NAICS was developed to provide a consistent framework for the collection, analysis and dissemination of industrial statistics used by government policy analysts, academics and researchers, the business community and the public.

A CD-ROM version (12-501-XCB, \$125 for a single user, up to 3 workstations) will be released in the summer of 2003.
