Canadian potato production

2003, 2002 (revised)

Saskatchewan's potato yield for 2002 has been revised, resulting in a 5.6% increase in their production to 3,563,000 hundredweights (161 600 metric tonnes). This increases Canada's 2002 production to 103,731,000 hundredweights (4 705 200 tonnes).

There were also revisions to the 2003 estimates of three provinces, based on additional information since the November release. Production was increased for Quebec (+1.8%) and Alberta (+1.7%), while Saskatchewan's production was decreased 3.7%. The net effect at the Canadian level was an increase of 0.3%. Canada's record high production is now estimated to be 117,754,000 hundredweights (5 341 200 tonnes).

Steel primary forms — weekly data

Week ending January 10, 2004 (preliminary)

Steel primary forms production for the week ending January 10 totalled 313 109 metric tonnes, up 10.9% from 282 420 tonnes a week earlier and 10.7% from 282 903 tonnes in the same week of 2003.

The year-to-date total as of January 10 was 434 146 tonnes, up 12.1% from 387 309 tonnes in the same period of 2003.
