# Electronic, commercial and industrial machinery and equipment repair and maintenance services

Businesses that repair and maintain electronic, commercial and industrial machinery and equipment earned operating revenues of \$5.9 billion in 2004, an increase of 8.0% from 2003. About 85% of the growth in operating revenues occurred in Alberta, in large part due to increased oil producing activity in the province.

Total operating expenses for the industry grew by 7.3% in 2004. In Ontario, a 13% increase in operating expenses dampened the industry's profit margin from 8.5% in 2003 to 6.7% in 2004. Meanwhile, the sharp increase in operating revenues in Alberta boosted the industry's operating profit margin in that province from 6.5% in 2003 to 10.2% in 2004.

At the national level, the operating profit margin showed a modest increase, rising to 8.2% in 2004 from 7.6% in 2003. The profit margins of large firms did not markedly differ from those of their smaller counterparts.

Over 80% of the industry's 2004 operating revenues were generated by firms located in three provinces — Alberta (31%), Ontario (29%) and Quebec (21%). The industry's operating revenues grew most rapidly in Alberta (+26%) and Ontario (+11%) but decreased in Quebec (-8%).

Four-fifths of the industry's total revenues came from establishments that repaired and maintained commercial and industrial machinery and equipment. Of these establishments, the larger ones tended to be based in the western provinces.

The remaining one-fifth of industry revenues were earned by establishments primarily engaged in the repair and maintenance of electronic and precision equipment. Larger establishments classified to this industry tended to be based in the eastern provinces and were involved in the repair and maintenance of computer equipment. Clients of these establishments tended to be businesses, governments and financial institutions, of which 11% were foreign clients.

### Steel primary forms, weekly data

Week ending June 10, 2006 (preliminary)

Steel primary forms production for the week ending June 10 totalled 326 542 metric tonnes, up 1.8% from 320 674 tonnes a week earlier and up 11.3% from 293 286 tonnes in the same week of 2005.

The year-to-date total as of June 10 was 7 018 436 tonnes, down 1.5% from 7 125 771 tonnes in the same period of 2005.


