Aircraft movement statistics: Major airports

November 2007

For the 18th consecutive month, aircraft take-offs and landings at Canadian airports with NAV CANADA air traffic control towers and flight service stations increased in year-over-year monthly comparisons. These 95 airports reported 480,451 movements in November compared with 427,798 movements at 96 airports in November 2006, an increase of 12.3% (+52,653 movements).

Itinerant movements (flights from one airport to another) increased by 9.3% (+27,974 movements) in November compared with November 2006.

Local movements (flights that remain in the vicinity of the airport) increased by 19.3% (+24,679 movements) in November compared with November 2006.

Computer and peripherals price indexes October 2007

In October, the index for commercial computers decreased 0.3% from September to 33.0 (2001=100). The index for consumer computers also declined, down 2.9% to 13.4.

In the case of computer peripherals, monitor prices decreased 0.4% to 50.3, while printer prices fell, down 0.4% to 46.8.

Couriers and local messengers industry

2004 (revised) and 2005 (preliminary)

The couriers and local messengers industry provides various services, from the delivery of letters by messengers on bicycles to the delivery of high-tech equipment in Canada and abroad. In 2005, total industry operating revenue was \$7.2 billion, an increase of 6% over 2004.

Operating expenses for the industry were close to \$6.6 billion, which represented an increase similar to that of revenues (+6%). The operating expenses that rose most compared to 2004 were the salaries, wages and benefits category and the other operating expenses category, both of which rose 10%, followed by depreciation (+7%) and rental and leasing expenses (+7%).

Higher growth in revenue compared to expenses led to a rise of 10% in the operating margin, which reached \$591 million. Despite this, the operating ratio (operating expenses divided by operating revenues) remained at 0.92.

The couriers segment, which offers national and international delivery services, remained the largest-earning segment, with total operating revenue of \$5.8 billion, 10% higher than in 2004. Even though it represents only 7% of the number of establishments in the industry, this segment had 80% of total operating revenue and an average operating margin of \$288,000.

The local messengers segment, which offers delivery services within a more restricted geographic area, reported \$1.4 billion in revenue, which was 5% lower than in 2004. This segment included 93% of the number of establishments, but only 20% of the industry's operating revenue. Local messengers recorded an average operating margin of only \$10,000, mainly due to the fact that the segment is dominated by self-employed workers.
