August 2008 (correction)

Monthly lumber production by sawmills decreased 8.7% to 4 378.7 thousand cubic metres in August.

Sawmills shipped 4 557.9 thousand cubic metres of lumber in August, down 12.0% from July.

Lumber shipments were down 22.9% in August compared with the same month a year earlier.
