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# Crude oil and natural gas: Supply and disposition

June 2008 (preliminary)

Domestic production of crude oil and equivalent hydrocarbons totalled 12.5 million cubic metres in June, down 0.5% from June 2007.

Deliveries of crude oil and equivalent hydrocarbons to the export market increased 3.5% compared with the same month in 2007. In June 2008, 71% of Canada's total production went to the export market.

Domestic sales of natural gas rose 3.1% from the same month in 2007. This increase was led by higher sales to all three sectors (residential, commercial and industrial).

Marketable natural gas production in June declined 9.7% from June 2007. Natural gas exports made up 61% of marketable natural gas production.
