
New motor vehicle sales

September 2010

The number of new motor vehicles sold rose 4.2% to 134,845 units in September. Stronger truck sales were the main contributor to the overall increase.

thousands of units




Preliminary industry data indicate that the number of new motor vehicles sold remained unchanged in October.

Sales up for both trucks and passenger cars

Sales of trucks (which include minivans, sport-utility vehicles, light and heavy trucks, vans and buses) increased 5.8% to 77,885 units in September after declining the previous month. Trucks sales remained higher than passenger car sales, as they have been for most months since the second half of 2009.

Sales of passenger cars rose 2.0% to 56,960 units in September. The main contributor to the advance was a 2.9% sales increase of North American built passenger cars. Prior to this gain, sales of this vehicle type have followed a downward trend since late 2009. Sales of overseas-built passenger cars rose 0.9%.

Sales up in all provinces

Sales of new motor vehicles increased in all provinces in September.

Sales of new motor vehicles in Ontario rose 6.8%, partially offsetting the decline in August.

In Alberta, sales advanced 2.4% in September, a fifth consecutive monthly increase.

The largest percentage increase was in Nova Scotia, with sales up 8.8%. Despite stronger sales in August and September, these gains have only partially offset the losses reported in July.

Aircraft movement statistics: Small airports

August 2010

The number of take-offs and landings at the 132 airports without air traffic control towers reached 72,146 movements in August. Welland/Niagara Central, Ontario (3,223 movements) and Guelph, Ontario (3,072 movements) were the most active sites in August. Year-over-year increases were reported by 74 of these airports.


