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Canadian Social Trends

Winter 2010

The Winter 2010 print edition of *Canadian Social Trends*, released today, includes nine articles previously released in the online edition. Titles in this issue include:

"Foreign nationals working temporarily in Canada" examines the growing number of non-permanent residents who work temporarily in Canada.

"Migration from central to surrounding municipalities in Toronto, Montréal and Vancouver" looks at movements of persons aged 25 to 44 between central and suburban municipalities.

"Emigration from Canada to the United States from 2000 to 2006" examines Canadian emigration to the United States.

"Making fathers count" examines the sociodemographic, family and conjugal characteristics of fathers in Canada.

"Sharing their lives: women, marital trends and education" examines how the propensity to form unions has changed for women with university degrees.

"Help with activities of daily living for people with a disability" examines the proportion of individuals who get help, the type of help they get, and who provides it.

Additionally, there are three articles examining Aboriginal children: "Participation in sports and cultural activities among Aboriginal children and youth", "Family, community and Aboriginal language among young First Nations children living off reserve in Canada", and "Child care for First Nations children living off reserve, Métis children and Inuit children".

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Production and disposition of tobacco products

October 2010

Canadian manufacturers produced 1.8 billion cigarettes in October, down 7.5% from September. The total number of cigarettes sold fell by 5.6% to 1.7 billion and closing inventories increased by 3.7% to 2.5 billion cigarettes in October.

Note: This survey collects data on the production of tobacco products in Canada by Canadian manufacturers and the disposition or sales of this production. It does not collect data on imported tobacco products. Therefore, sales information in this release is not a proxy for domestic consumption of tobacco products.

Sawmills

September 2010

Lumber production by sawmills increased 4.5% to 4 594.9 thousand cubic metres in September. Compared with the same month in 2009, lumber production was up by 10.6%.

Sawmills shipped 4 655.4 thousand cubic metres of lumber in September, up 9.7% from August.
