# **Farm Input Price Index**

Second quarter 2010

The Farm Input Price Index (FIPI) is a quarterly indicator of the change in the price of farm inputs faced by Canadian farmers. The FIPI was last released in 2008 (covering 2007). Since that release, the index has been redesigned and its structure and data sources have changed. As part of the redesign, the index has been rebased to 2002=100.

The FIPI was down 0.2% in the second quarter from the previous quarter. The decline followed a 2.1% increase between the fourth quarter of 2009 and the first quarter of 2010.

The category that contributed most to the quarterly decline in Canada was crop production, which fell 1.4%.

British Columbia was the largest contributor to the national decrease, with a 2.0% decline in the second quarter.

Canadian farm input prices fell by 2.2% between the second quarter of 2009 and the second quarter of 2010. Alberta (-3.5%) was the largest contributor to the national decline in farm input prices during the period.

Animal production (-6.8%) was the category with the largest decrease between the second quarter of 2009 and the second quarter of 2010. The decline was moderated by higher prices in the machinery and motor vehicles category (+2.8%).

Note: Until 2007, the Farm Input Price Index (FIPI) was published annually, and the geographic information provided was limited. The index was then redesigned and the methodology used to compile the data revised. With the changes in methodology, the FIPI will now be published quarterly and provide more detailed geographic information. National data sources are used for some major components of the FIPI (such as, depreciation on machinery, fertilizer, grains and oilseeds). In reality, input prices may fluctuate differently from province to province. Users should exercise caution in interpreting the data. 
